Marrell McCollough was a high school dropout who entered the Army and was given training as a military policeman. He served on active duty for approximately three and one-half years and spent a couple of these years serving in West Germany. After McCollough left the Army in 1967, he was eventually hired by the Memphis, Tennessee Police Department and has been employed with them to the present. His most recent assignment has been working as a detective with the Narcotics Division on the 4:00 P.M.--midnight shift. While working for the MPD, McCollough was also able to attend Memphis State University where in May, 1972 he earned a B.A. in law enforcement/police administration. McCollough's minor is in journalism and overall, he made a commendable 2.6/4.0 gpa. In addition to being a police officer and student, McCollough also found time to infiltrate the Invaders (Memphis equivalent of Black Panthers) and the Students for a Democratic Society. McCollough was able, in fact, to achieve some responsibility within the Invaders power structure.

CTP and OS consumed our employment discussion. I would like to see him placed in the former initially because of the contribution I think he would be able to make to his class. McCollough is an ambitious fellow who is looking for ways to improve his lot and he feels this might best be done thru federal employment. In addition to having made our application, he also has some paper with the FBI. According to my recruiter colleagues in the FBI, I understand they now have a freeze on agent hiring and in addition they will be looking for the law--accounting background. I did suggest to McCollough that he should not make application with us if he were to learn that he was under current active FBI consideration for I would see this as a course that could jeopardize his FBI applicant standing. He was to have made inquiries and retain our forms if he were now under consideration.
