HANAVAN stated that Budget Cleaners Company Unit 32368 shipped on 7/27/62 was probably shipped to Budget Cleaners, 45 Avenue B, New York, New York, and that New-Clear Company to which Unit 33495 was shipped was probably shipped to New-Clear Company, 172 Middle Neck Road, Great Neck, Long Island, New York, or the same company at 192-10 Lingen Boulevard, St. Albans, New York.

Mr. BROTON further advised that these machines may have been installed by Delta Cleaners and Equipment Company, 875 Prospect Avenue, Westbury, Long Island, who installed the majority of the machines for Pantex-Prosperity. He stated however that Delta Cleaners and Equipment Company is believed to be now out of business or in bankruptcy and those records particularly those prior to 1962 may not be available.

Mr. BROTON further suggested that if none of these avenues disclosed the locations of these machines, he suggested contact with ANDY DOBOS, 301 Fycke Lane, Teaneck, New Jersey, the Textile Marking Machine Company repairman who did the majority of repair work on machines installed by Pantex-Prosperity.

Referenced Milwaukee airtel furnished information received from an individual in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, who advised that on 3-28-68, while at the Sun Castle Motel, Pompano Beach, Florida, an establishment operated by a former FBI agent, he and his wife chanced to deal with a bellboy in the motel who apparently left the motel shortly after 3-28-68, and traveled to Tennessee to accept work as an electrician in an unknown city in Tennessee at a salary of \$500.00 a week. The individual providing the information believed the salary sounded absurd and after viewing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, both he and his wife felt the bellboy resembles RAY's description and photograph.

Referenced Miami airtel set forth results of initial contacts at the Sun Castle Motel wherein it was noted that EARL B. SHIELDS was employed there through 4-1-68. SHIELDS furnished Social Security No. [redacted] and a permanent address of 15 Almond Drive, Randolph, Mass. Boston was requested to conduct investigation at this address to eliminate SHIELDS as the subject in this matter.

On 4-30-68, HERB BLONSTROM, Assistant Manager, Sun Castle Motel, 1380 South Ocean Boulevard, advised he had located an application for EARL B. SHIELDS of Randolph, Mass., Social Security No. [redacted]. The application showed SHIELDS' previous employment as Plaza East, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and previous residence at 1325 N. E. 5th Terrace, Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

On 5-1-68, MARY BACHMAN, 1333 N. E. 5th Terrace, Fort Lauderdale, advised her records show that EARL SHIELDS resided in an apartment building managed by her for approximately a two-week period. She recalled SHIELDS and his roommate, DAVID WATTIER. WATTIER rented the room 3-16-68, and rent was paid through 4-6-68. After WATTIER moved in, BACHMAN met SHIELDS who informed her that he was staying with WATTIER. WATTIER is believed to have left on 3-30-68, and Mrs. BACHMAN cannot recall specifically which dates after WATTIER departed that SHIELDS remained. She believes SHIELDS stayed another day or two but the exact length of time is unknown.

When WATTIER left he was driving a dark blue automobile, make unknown, and believed to have Florida license plates. WATTIER indicated he was from Minneapolis and was en route Indiana. While at her residence, both WATTIER and SHIELDS drove in WATTIER's auto and were believed to be employed in the same motel.

Mrs. BACHMAN and her husband, ALBERT J. BACHMAN, viewed photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and expressed the opinion that SHIELDS and GALT are not identical. Mrs.

BACHMAN described SHIELDS as 5' 10" and heavy set.

On 5-2-68, Mrs. IRA M. WOLFE, Personnel Office, Plaza East Condominium, 4300 North Ocean, Fort Lauderdale, made available her records which contained the following:

EARL B. SHIELDS, Social Security No. [REDACTED], of 1313 N. W. 14th Court, Fort Lauderdale, was employed at instant condominium as an outside guard from 3/5-15/68. He listed his date of birth as [REDACTED], height, 5' 10½"; weight, 170; brown hair, blue eyes, and marital status as divorced. SHIELDS listed previous employment at Dunworth Electric, Fort Lauderdale; Hotel Kenmore, Boston, Mass., as doorman; Yankee Fisherman, Boston, Mass., as bartender; and 1280 Beacon Street, Brooklyn, New York, as bartender. He indicated in case of emergency JOSEPHINE BUTLER, 15 Almond Drive, Randolph, Mass., should be contacted.

DAVID H. WATTIER, Social Security [REDACTED], who furnished his address as 1325 N. E. 5th Terrace, Fort Lauderdale, was employed at Plaza East Condominium at approximately the same time as SHIELDS, having apparently begun employment 2-13-68. WATTIER listed his DOB as [REDACTED], 6', 170 pounds, brown hair, blue eyes. He indicated he was from Randolph, Nebraska. He listed previous employment as December, 1967, Dunworth Electric.

On 5-2-68, JOE BLEIER, Head Doorman, Plaza East, advised both SHIELDS and WATTIER worked under his supervision. Both individuals reportedly resided together and definitely came to and departed work in WATTIER's 1966 Chevelle Super Sport, light blue in color.

Both BLEIER and Mrs. WOLFE viewed photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and both stated in their opinion SHIELDS is not identical with GALT. SHIELDS was a trouble-maker and caused employee discontent over low wages and left after an argument with the management.

Re investigation concerning DONALD STOUT,  
possible co-conspirator.

DONALD STOUT has been identified as a "car jockey" employed by National Car Rentals and other car rental agencies on an informal basis during 1966 and 1967, driving cars across the country for such agencies. STOUT, who was described as a white male, 5'8", 210 lbs., with dark hair, with a wave in the front, and a pronounced southern accent, allegedly transported two college students from Oakland, California, to Kansas City, Missouri, in Sept., 1966. He "ditched" the students in Kansas City and took off with their clothing and other personal property in the car he was delivering. The car was eventually delivered <sup>by stout</sup> to National Car Rentals, Logan Airport, East Boston, Mass., in Sept., 1966 and one of the students who had been "ditched" had contacted National Car Rentals and the Massachusetts State Police, Logan Airport, in an effort to retrieve his stolen property.

Trooper HARDIN (PH), Massachusetts State Police, was contacted by the college student regarding the alleged theft of his personal property by STOUT. HARDIN subsequently interviewed STOUT without placing him under arrest.

Will display attached photograph of STOUT to employees, National Car Rental Agency, and other logical car rental agencies to determine STOUT's current whereabouts.

Will display photograph of STOUT to Trooper HARDIN, Massachusetts State Police, in an effort to determine whether he has any additional information concerning STOUT.

Re Bureau telephone call to Boston, 5/8/68, advising of telephone call to Bureau (SA HUNTER HELGESON) from JAMES LEWIS, Boston, regarding lookalike.

JAMES LEWIS, War Memorial Auditorium, Prudential Center, Boylston St., Boston, Mass., was interviewed on 5/9/68, concerning the individual he had seen on 5/8/68, in the vicinity of the War Memorial Auditorium. At this time, most recent photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to LEWIS who was of the opinion that they did not resemble very closely the individual he had seen. Dissimilarities between RAY and the person seen by LEWIS include color of hair and height.

LEWIS could furnish no information as to the identity of this person and stated that he disappeared into the pedestrian traffic on Boylston St., which is a busy Boston downtown street. LEWIS stated he would be on the alert for a reappearance of this person and in that event he would attempt to obtain more specific information concerning him.

No further investigation in this matter is contemplated by Boston, UAC.

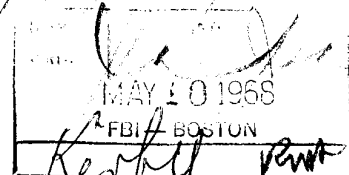

On 4/19/68, ROBERT GREEN, 50 Bradshaw St., Dorchester, Mass., advised that on the evening of 4/16/68, at approximately 9:10 pm, he picked up a person, whom he believed fit the description of ERIC STARVO GALT with a girl companion in his taxicab. He stated that he picked up these two individuals across the street from the Boston City Hospital and was told by the man to take them to Beacon St., to the best of his recollection, to the 300 or 400 block. As they were proceeding to that destination, when they reached the corner of Commonwealth Ave., and Massachusetts Ave., Boston, the man told GREEN to let them off there, stating that he planned to pickup something at the liquor store, across the street.

According to GREEN, the man had a southern drawl and seemed to be feigning an Irish or Scottish accent when he talked. GREEN could not remember any of the conversation carried on between the man and the woman while they were in his taxicab and when questioned closely concerning the original destination of the couple, he stated that he was not at all sure that it was the 300 or 400 block on Beacon Street, but

He stated that he could not recall a man and a woman coming into that store that evening who fit the description furnished by GREEN. GILBERTSON advised that he has been conducting the management of this liquor store for several years and after seeing photographs of GALT, he advised that he knew of no one in the area who resembles the photos. He stated, however, that he would be on the lookout for anyone resembling GALT and would notify the FBI expeditiously, if anyone came to his attention resembling GALT.

On 4/19/68, CY KASSEL, and GLADYS SPRAGUE, Karmore Pharmacy, 65 Mass. Ave., Boston, Mass., were interviewed for any information concerning the unsub, and his companion with negative results.

Union Hall told him there was no immediate work. He left Chattanooga, Tennessee, on 4/3/68 and went to Hamilton, Ohio, and checked into the Country Club Motel on Route 4 on 4/3/68. He secured work through the Union with Armco Steel Corp., Middletown, Ohio, where he worked for about two weeks.

In order to cover the possibility that subject may have died since commission of the crime, the U. S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and they advised that no central records of unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested that each state may maintain such a record in their Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency.

There is no known Federal law requiring the maintenance of such information; and it is possible that if any record of unidentified dead is maintained, it would only be maintained at local police departments, morgues, medical facilities, or the like.

Each office covering state capitals should check to ascertain if such records are maintained, and if so, should check records for the period from 4-5-68, to date, for any information which might possibly identify subject Ray with unidentified deceased person over that period.

If there is no central record repository maintained in the various states or nationally in the case of Mexico and Canada, you should, in connection with your contacts with law enforcement agencies on this case or other Bureau matters, make appropriate inquiries relative to

**WANTED BY THE FBI**

**JAMES EARL RAY**, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted, determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on March 10, 1928, Ray is 5'10" tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. 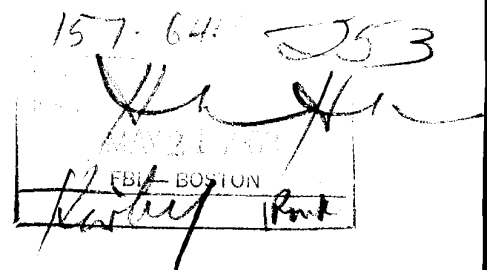

Mrs. Kincaide was personally contacted on 5/20/68 and stated that she first saw this man on Main Street in Camden, Maine about 3-4 weeks ago and has ~~in~~ seen him 2-3 other times since. She has since determined that he uses the name of Jack Beatty and was employed for a short time in the paint store of Howard Thomas. He was staying in Taylor Inn until about 2 weeks ago when he suddenly left the area without notification to Mr. Clifford Taylor.
