However, if you have not already checked this matter, you might want to do so at this time.

Also, I have no direct knowledge of this incident but heard about it from a friend. The incident concerns a phone call placed by this man to the office of Dr. King several years ago in which he stated that Dr. King would be killed within a few days. I do not know if such a call is a federal offense or not; however, I do not believe that any purpose would now be served by presecuting on this late date. My only point in montioning it now is that, knowing how this man felt and also knowing that he shot a local Negro shortly after this call, I wondered if by any chance he might have paid for the killing of Dr. King.




The following investigation was conducted by SA BILL E. PEMBERTON:

BLOCK, 1920 South Benton, Denver, Colorado, for a 1966 Ford, VIN 6N64C184666.

On April 93, 19(8, MELVIN LESTER, owner, High Spot Bar, 3905 Bouth Santa Fe, Englewood, Colorado, was Pisp'ayed wanted flyers regarding JAMES EARL RAY and ERIC STARVO GALT. LESTER stated that to the best of his knowledge he had never seen any individual in his place of business resembling the wanted flyers of GALT and RAY. LESTER stated that he was not acquainted with DWAYNE C. KIRK or a MELVIN J. BLOCK.
