On April 9, 1968, El Paso T-1, an official of the University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP), who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that at approximately 11:45 a.m., April 9, 1968, an employee of UTEP, who misunderstood his instructions, hoisted the United States flag to the normal position after completion of the television broadcast of the funeral of Doctor Martin Luther King. Shortly thereafter, a group of Negro students appeared in the college square where the flagpole is located, and the flag was lowered by them back to the half-mast position.

After lowering the flag, these 30 to 40 students marched around the UTEP campus, into the Administration Building, where they stood around the doorway leading to the office of the President, and they quietly sang the song "We Shall Overcome".

After singing this song, the group marched through the library and the various dormitories on campus, all the while singing.



On the evening of 4/9/68 an obviously drunk "sergeant" called SPC LEROY TEITSWORTH, advised he knew who had killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On the evening of 4/9/68 an attempt was made by SA PAUL S. PULLEN and SA DXVIS to interview SP/6 JACK G. BENNETT, A Battery, School Support Command. BENNETT was so drunk he could not remember his own name, did not ecall why he had called the FBI, did recall making a call.

On the morning of 4/10/68 JACK GROSSMAN BENNETT, age 43, ASN RP 14 008 321, was interviewed at the PMO, Fort Bliss. At 10 A.M. MEMPHIS — A possibly fake Memphis police report which was broadcast shortly after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. last Thursday night has given rise to speculation that the civil rights leader was the victim of a murder conspiracy.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation and Memphis police for several days have claimed that the killing was done by

ne man.

Memphis police who were searching for King's killer on the night he was shot were drawn to the north side of the city 34 minutes after the shooting by a false report from "Police Car 160" that a white Mustang automobile, believed to be the getaway car, was speeding along city streets.

Detectives have been investigating the possibility that the report was relayed by an accomplice of the killer to the central police radio in an effort to keep attention away from Southern Memphis where the killer may have actually fled.

The fake police report may be another in a series of apparently false clues which has confused the investigation.

Frank C. Holloman, director of the Memphis Fire and Police Departments, said that the fake police report is under "intensive investigation."

"We have this aspect as well as some other aspects of this case under investigation at this time," Holloman said. "Beyond that I cannot comment."

Holloman, who is a retired FBI inspector, refused to say if he now believes that more than one person was involved in the slaying of King.

"I just can't comment on that," he

Last week, Holloman agreed with a statement by Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark that the slaying appeared to have been done by only one person.

Although both Holloman and Clark have said that the slaying was extremely well planned, they said there had been no evidence gathered indicating that more than one person was involved. Holloman also declined to predict an early solution to the murder. The false police report broadcast at 6:35 p.m., a little more than a half-hour after the fatal shot was fired at 6:01 p.m. and while police were in the process of setting up road blocks around the city, said that a white Mustang was headed east in north Memphis and was being chased by Police Car 160.

At 6:35 p.m., the police radio reported that a blue hardtop 1966 Pontiac had joined the chase for the White Mustang.

In the next 10 minutes, several progress reports on the "chase" were relayed through the headquarters radio to other police cars headed to the area.

At 6:47 p.m., the police radio broadcast a report that someone in the white Mustang was shooting at the blue Pontiac.

That ended the broadcasts concerning the chair.

The Commercial Agreed, a Memphis

newspaper, Wednesday quoted Police Lt.
R. W. Braddhaw, who was assigned to
Police Car 180 that night, as saying that
he did not see a white Mustang and did
not chase one that night.

A review of the telephone directories covering the Clint, Texas, a rea fails to show any mention of any person by the name of RETZOLKA as does the Fabens, Texas, and the El Paso, Texas, directory.

On 4-11-68 Mrs. FERN C. FIELDS, Postmistress, U. S. Post Office, Clint, Texas (protect identity) advised that there is no family by the name of RETZOLKA served by the USPO at Clint, Texas. There is no record of any person by the name of RETZOLKA, RUTH RETZOLKA, or any variation of the name receiving mail at the General Delivery window of the Clint Post Office. There is no route 80 in Clint, Texas.

On 4-11-68 Mrs. BERNIECE CORNWALL, U. S. Post Office, Fabens, Texas (protect identity) advised that there is no person by the name of RUTH RETZOLKA or any family by that surname receiving mail through the Fabens Post Office. Further there is no rural route under the jurisdiction of the Fabens post office.

A review of the mail boxes along Highway # 80 enroute to Clint and Fabens failed to show any with the name of RETZOLKA.
