During the morning of 4/23/68, SA WALLACE A. CROSSMON received a telephone call from SA COLIN DUNNIGAN of the Phoenix Office, at which time SA DUNNIGAN advised as follows:

IRENE FARR, Proprietor of the Farr Motel, 4450 Grand Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona, advised that an individual registered at the motel on the night of 4/22/68, under the name of L. R. HUMMEL, 5500 Martin Lane, El Paso, Texas. HUMMEL was driving a white Ford Bronco, 1968 Texas license CLB 94. Mrs. FARR indicated this individual checked out of the motel at 7:30 a.m. on 4/23/68. She said he fit the same general description of JAMES EARL RAY. She noted that his left ear protuded, that he was thin, and that he wore glasses.

SA CROSSMON ascertained that the white Ford Bronco with 1968 Texas license CLB 94 was registered to LON R. HUMMEL, 5939 Falcon Street, El Paso.

The 1967 City Directory reflected that the Crown Plastic Products, Inc., was located at 5939 Falcon Street in El Paso.

SA CROSSMON telephonically contacted the Crown Plastic Products, Inc., telephone 751-1239, at which time he was advised by the switchboard operator that LON R. HUMMEL resigned from the employ of Crown Plastic Products, Inc., about two weeks ago, and went to Wilcox, Arizona, where he planned to contact a Mr. TATE, an employee of a lumber company in Wilcox.



Prison Buddy' Tells-About Man Sought

Says Suspect Ray Said He Would Collect Big Sum

United Press International

DALTON. Ga., April 23.—A prison buddy of James Earl Ray said Tuesday that when Ray heard there was a "million-dollar bounty" on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., he smiled and said "I'll collect it."

Ray, a 40-year-old fugitive from the Missouri State Prison, is accused by the FBI of assassinating King in Memphis on April 4.

In the Dalton jail, Raymond Curtis, 40, awaiting appeal on a murder sentence, said he has known Ray in the Kansas City jail, in Federal prison in Leavenworth, Kan., and in the state prison at Jefferson City, Mo.

He described Ray as likeable, addicted to "dope," a "loner" and a man concerned only with money.

ON THE DAY President Kennedy was associated—Nov. 23, 1963—Curtis said he, Ray, and about 150 other prisoners were in an exercise yard when they heard the news.

He said Ray remarked "Well, somebody made a pretty penny on that."

About a week later, Curtis said, he and Ray were in the yard when "a new man just in off the street" told them "the Businessmen's Association has a million dolar bounty cut for Martin Luther King."

Ray smiled, Curtis recalled, and said "If there's a million dollars out for King, I believe if I ever get out I'll collect it."

CURTIS SAID HE never figured out what the "new man" meant by the "Businessmen's Association." He said he couldn't remember who the man was.

"I didn't think much about it at the time. In prison, you hear all sorts of hellacious ideas," said Curtis, a tall, rawboned

Authorities in Jefferson City confirmed that Curtis and Ray were imprison at the same time. Authorities in Dalton said the PBI had interviewed Curtis on
