Curtis said Ray told him "he always Interested in money," a lways interested n money," Curtis said, but never mentioned racial matters.

"HE NEVER MADE no statements of any kind in a group," Curtis said. "He was a loner."

Ray couldn't "make a long conversation unless he was planning something," said C u r t i s. "If he was planning something, you could bet they'd be thorough plans." Ray, he said, masterminded things "that would be small things outside, but were pretty big jobs in prison"—such as the theft of eggs and drugs and cigarets.

He said Ray told him that if he ever wanted to kill someone, he would buy a gun under a false name, and have everything ready for an escape. "He used to talk a lot about escaping to New Zealand, Brazil and Argentina." Curtis said.

"I wouldn't consider him dangerous," Curtis said. "He didn't look for trouble.

"OF COURSE, I'm not saying he wouldn't shoot you if you ran up on him now."

Curtis said he first met Ray in. 1955, when he was serving time for bank robbery, and Ray for forging postal money orders, in the Kansas City jail. He said they were transferred to Leavenworth, where Ray "played a lot of miniature golf."

They met again when Curtis was sent to Jefferson City on a 10-year armed robbery conviction.

"He was there with a 20-year bid when I got there. I wouldn't say he was a friend," Curtis said. "A friend in a penitentiary is different than a friend on the street. But I was about as close to him as anybody in Jeff City." CURTIS SAID he was hospitalized for six weeks with hepatitis and "he came to see me just about every day."

Asked about Ray's habits, Curtis said, "He talked about beer — He liked beer, I knew that." He said he never heard him talk about dancing, but that he "did a lot of weightlifting" at Jefferson City.

"I never heard him do much cussing. I just saw him get mad once and that was in a poker game. He liked to play poker. His favorite game was lowball.


"He talked about having lots of women. None special. He'd pick 'em up and leave 'em," Curtis said.

"YOU COULD pick him out of a crowd of 2000 men in the prison yard. He would be off to himself walking and his mind would be somewhere else."

Curtis, convicted of shotgunning a man in the holdup of a poker game here last year, said when he heard of King's death he did not connect it with Ray because he didn't know Ray had escaped prison.

If others were in the plot with Ray, Curtis said, Ray "would go to his grave with the secret.

"From what he said, I would consider he was an expert with a gun. I never heard him talk about a brother," Curtis said.

Ray Talked About Million-Dollar Deal

DALTON, Ga., April 24. — Fugitive James Earl Ray once said he would collect a "million-dollar bounty" put up by a mysterious "Businessmen's Association" for the death of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., according to a prison friend.

Ray, an escaper from the Missouri State Prison, has been charged with conspiracy and murder in the assassination of King at Memphis April 4.

Raymond Curtis, in jail here awaiting an appeal of a murder conviction, said he had served with Ray in jail once and in prison twice and the matter of King first came up shortly after President Kennedy was assassinated in 1963.

"WELL, SOMEBODY made a pretty penny on that," Ray told the state prisen at Jefferson Curtis after hearing of Kenne- City, Mo. dy's death.



James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been added to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his earliest possible location.

Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fired from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division, succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on ______. He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a 'loner' and 'drifter' whose language and diction reflect a 'rural' quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons. He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.

THE CRIMES: Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. He subsequently allegedly conspired, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shot to death on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel on April 4, 1968.

THE CRIMINAL: A 40-year-old white native of Illinois, who is known as a "loner" and "drifter" and has taken elaborate steps to establish a false identity, Ray has an extensive criminal record, including convictions for burglary, robbery and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders. Outstanding characteristics include a straight narrow nose, straight and even teeth, a noticeably protruding left ear and a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe. He has taken dancing lessons, attended bartending school, enrolled in a correspondence course in locksmithing and traveled widely in a 1966 Mustang recovered in Atlanta, Georgia, a week after Dr. King's murder. Ray likes western and country music, drinks vodka and beer and has worked as a baker. laborer and color matcher.

PROCESS: A Federal warrant issued at Jefferson City, Missouri, on July 20, 1967, charges Ray with unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement for robbery. Another Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, as Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen.







On 4/23/68, DICK CAULER, Coronado State Bank, El Paso, Texas, telephonically contacted this office and advised that the bank had made a loan to one JIMMY RAY ADAMS, which was now in default. A part time collector for the bank, LARRY PARKS, 5833 Macaw, telephone 755-0259, told CAULER that ADAMS closely resembled the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, whom the FBI is seeking as a fugitive. The only address known to the bank for ADAMS was P.O. Box 299, Canutillo, Texas.

On the same date, Career Clerk JAIME SCOTT (PROTECT), Canutillo Post Office, advised SA CLYNICK that there is no JAMES EARL RAY or any variation of the name in Canutillo, Texas. Further, P.O. Box 299 was registered to a JIMMY SCOTTY ADAMS, who moved and left no forwarding address. He was employed at the Upper Valley Clinic Hospital in Canutillo. Box 299 is presently closed.

Attempts to contact LARRY PARKS on 4/23/68, were negative.

On 4/24/68, Mrs. SOCORRO ALDAZ, head of the business department, Upper Valley Clinic Hospital, 400 Talbot, telephone 987-3193, advised SAs CLYNICK and DONN K. SICKLES that ADAMS was employed by the hospital from December of 1966 through July of 1967 as an orderly. His address is shown as 309 Mills Street, El Paso, Texas, and he is currently residing in Vado, New Mexico, in care of P.O. Box 53. and date of birth His Social Security No. is After viewing the glossy photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, Mrs. ALDAZ, who was personally acquainted with ADAMS, advised that they are definitely not the same person.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted.

For information those offices not receiving reairtel, it was pointed out therein that Subject JAMES EARL RAY, aka. was last known to be in the Atlanta, Georgia, area on 4/5/68. Intensive investigation by Atlanta to date has not established mode of transportation RAY may have used after 4/5/68. Receiving Offices were requested in reairtel to check cars recovered their division that were stolen from the State of Georgia subsequent to 4/4/68, and where the transporter of same was not identified or otherwise accounted for, investigation should be conducted to determine if RAY was person who may have stolen and transported same.

Investigation reflects Subject RAY can be placed in the Atlanta, Georgia, area 3/24/68.

In view of the above, all Continental Offices are requested to review car recoveries within their respective territories of cars stolen from the State of Georgia subsequent to 3/23/68, and where the transporter of same is not otherwise eliminated or accounted for, consider Subject RAY as suspect. Where there is any remote indication that Subject RAY may have been person transporting such a car, exhaustive and intensive investigation should thereafter be conducted.

JAMES EARL RAY

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his prompt location. Ray has been the subject of a massive search since the gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom FBI wanted notices have been posted determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery.

Possessing an arrest record dating back to 1949, Ray has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders.

A 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on Ray is approximately 5'10" tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably.

Described as a "loner and "drifter," with a "rural" quality in his speech, Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.

Officer TOMMY OWENS, Midland PD, advised 4-24-68 that while having lunch with an acquaintance by the name of DAVID MC CORD, the rame of JAMES EARL MAY came up as the killer of KING.

OWENS said MC CORD stated he had attended school with an individual by the name of JAMES RAY and the possibly is identical with the JAMES RAY being sought by the FBI.

DAVID MC CORD, Installer for the Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. was located 4-24-68 and interviewed. He stated about 30 years ago while he was attending Roosevelt High School in Altus, Oklahoma, he knew a fellow student for a bout a year whose name was JAMES RAY. He said he was about 10 or 11 years of age at the time. MC CORD said RAY's father was employed digging cellars in Altus and also worked for a time for the Santa Fe Railroad. He said RAY had no brothers or sisters and lived in an old house built on stilts. He said RAY had blond hair. He come ted that it would be a one in a million chance that the JAMES RAY he knew is identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

Available information reflects that JAMES EARL RAY attended school in Alton, Ill. through the 10th grade.

Inasmuch as the above is all the info MC CORD could supply re the JAMES RAY he knew in grade school and has not seen him since that time and in view of the above info that JAMES EARL RAY assarently attended school through the 10th grade in Alton, Ill., this is being reported only for info purposes.
