Captions descriptive of the activity involved should be used in accordance with instructions in the FBI Handbook, page 154h of Part III.

For example, in reporting information concerning disturbances that may have occurred in Albany the caption "Racial Disturbances Following Assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., Albany, New York, April 9, 1968, Racial Matters" could be used.

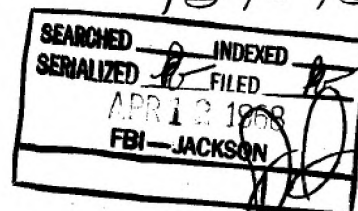

On 4/12/68 Mr. REX P. ARMISTEAD (NA), Chief Investigator, Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, Jackson, Miss., was interviewed by SA'S JAMES A. ABBOTT and L. DEAN PAARMANN. ARMISTEAD, who is completely cooperative with the Jackson Office, advised that he is the same person who was formerly the Security Officer for U. S. Overseas Airlines, formerly based at Cape May, New Jersey. ARMISTEAD, who is now almost bald, now bears little resemblance to the individual described in the composite drawing of Reverend KING's murderer. ARMISTEAD further advised that at the time of Reverend KING's murder, he was in a conference with other law enforcement officers regarding armed robbery matters at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and did not return to Jackson, Miss., until the evening of April 5, 1968.

In view of ARMISTEAD's current law enforcement position and whereabouts at the time of Reverend KING's murder, no further investigation regarding this suspect being conducted.
