

Er. J. C. SPIEKERMAN, JR., Plant Manager, Joseph Schlitz Brewing Company, Longview, Texas Plant, advised canned beer produced by this plant is stamped on the bettom of each can at the time of packaging with a code number which designates the date, month, and year it was produced. He gave the following code number as an example:

Code No. <u>03</u>

The number 03 refers to the month and the 15 refers to the day of the month while the 8 refers to the year.

Therefore, this particular stamp on a can of beer produced by this firm means it was produced on March 15, 1968.

Mr. SPIKKERMAN stated that no other stamps or markings are placed on the beer can by this firm when produced and packaged. He stated that the lide which are placed on the bottom of each can of beer produced for the sale in the State of Mississippi bear markings showing the Mississippi State Tax as being paid. These markings are in the form of black lettering showing "Mississippi Tax Paid", the Great Seal of Mississippi, and the assunt of the tax, "4 Cents" or "5 1/3", this latter amount depending on the size of the beer can, 12 or 16 fluid ounces as the case may be. This lettering is within a black circle. The other marking on the can which is different from other cans used by Joseph Schlitz: Brewing Company is that the can shows the beer was produced at a particular plant. The beer produced by the Longview plant shows Longview, Texas.





On April 9, 1968, J. T. ROBINSON, Chief of Police, Natchez Police Department, Natchez, Mississippi, advised that they had arrested JOHN A. ANDERSON, and that he was being held in the City Jail. ROBINSON stated that RUTH RAND, a barmaid of the Fountain Lounge went to open up the lounge at approximately 11:30 AM this date and found the door unlocked. ROBINSON stated she went in, turned on the lights and saw ANDERSON. RAND advised that ANDERSON ran out of the building and dropped a money bag containing \$29,00 in change. ROBINSON stated that the subject was seen getting into a GBC Truck Line truck and heading west across the bridge to Vidalia, Louisiana. ROBINSON stated that the Vidalia Police Department stopped the truck in Vidalia and arrested ANDERSON. ANDERSON was returned to the Natchez Police Department.

On April 9, 1968, JANES BURK, driver for GBC Truck Lines, advised that he was proceeding west on Route 84 en route to Ferriday, Louisiana, when he saw this man whomhe later learned to be JOHN A. ANDERSON hitchhiking. BURK advised that it is against the law for them to pick up hitchhikers but that it was raining very hard and that he stopped anyway. He stated that he crossed the bridge with ANDERSON in the truck and that he stopped immediately on the other side for the Vidalia Police Department and that they arrested ANDERSON. BURK further stated that he had never seen ANDERSON before and that ANDERSON had made no comment to him other than asking him where he was going.

On April 9, 1968, JAKE B. GUERCIO, Owner and Manager of the Fountain Lounge, Natchez, Mississippi, advised that he was about to close up the Fountain Lounge when he noticed JOHN A. ANDERSON in an intoxicated condition. GUERCIO stated that he knew ANDERSON from Woodville, Mississippi, and that he asked ANDERSON where he was going to spend the night. GUERCIO stated that ANDERSON told him that he had expected a ride into Woodville but that it apparently was not coming. GUERCIO stated that he told ANDERSON that he should go into the Fountain Lounge and sleep in there so that he would not be arrested for public intoxication. GUERCIO advised that he left ANDERSON in the Fountain Lounge, locked the door, and went home.

ROBINSON advised that a search of the premises revealed a note initialed J. A. A. stating, "I killed M. L. K. in Memphis, Tenn. The Mayor is next. The Klan."

ROBINSON further advised that RUTH RAND, the barmaid of the Fountain Lounge, advised that this note was not behind the bar before she left.

ANDERSON was interviewed.

On April 9, 1968, BURNELL MC GRAW, Sheriff, Wilkinson County, Woodville, Mississippi, advised that he is familiar with JOHN A. ANDERSON. He stated that ANDERSON has a history of mental illness and that ANDERSON is not a responsible individual. MC GRAW further advised that ANDERSON has been in Woodville for approximately a week and that he is living with his aunt, LUCILLE BUCKEL.

MC GRAW stated that he intended to contact LUCILLE BUCKEL and request permission to have ANDERSON committed to Whitfield for psychiatric treatment.

JOHN A. ANDERSON was interviewed at his place of incarceration, Natchez Police Department, Natchez, Mississippi. ANDERSON was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, and was immediately advised of his constitutional rights. ANDERSON waived these rights by executing the waiver of rights form and voluntarily provided the following information:

ANDERSON stated that during the evening of April 8 and April 9, 1968, he was at the Fountain Lounge in Natchez, driving heavily. He stated that the owner of the Fountain Lounge, JAKE GUERCIO, whom he knew from Woodville, Mississippi, recognized that he was in an intoxicated condition and asked how he was going to get to Woodville. ANDERSON stated that he told GUERCIO he had intended to ride down with a truck driver but that it appeared that he had forgotten him. ANDERSON stated that GUERCIO told him that he would let him sleep in the Fountain Lounge and "sleep it off" so that he would not be arrested by the police for public intoxication. ANDERSON stated that GUERCIO left him in the Fountain Lounge, locked the door, and apparently went home.

ANDERSON advised that after he was left alone in the lounge, he continued to drink beer and become even more intoxicated. He stated that he found a notepad and decided to write a note and leave it in the lounge as a joke. He stated that he found a pen and wrote the following on a notepad, "I killed M.L.K. in Memphis, Tenn. The Mayor is next. The Klan." ANDERSON further stated that he had written the note he dropped the pad and misplaced it and could not find it again. ANDERSON advised that he was very drunk at the time and did not realize that the note would be taken seriously.

APWR, JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI:

Source advised that the weekly meeting of the APWR, Jackson, was cancelled for 4/9/68 since the church normally used for weekly meetings is having a revival. There is supposed to be a fish fry instead of a weekly meeting, but source does not know the location of the fish fry since he does not plan to attend.

BOMBING OF BLACKWELL REAL ESTATE COMPANY; FERRALL MC CORMICK; ERNEST GILBERT:

Source advised he has just read in the newspaper where nine people were arrested in Mississippi this week charged with being involved in the bombing of the Blackwell Real Estate Company. Source stated he knows most of these persons arrested personally and based on his knowledge of their background, he feels certain they are involved in the bombing. He added that he knows of two other people in the Klan at Jackson, Miss., who he believes might be involved in this bombing, but who were not arrested this week. They are: FERRALL MC CORMICK, SR., and ERNEST GILBERT.

Source stated he learned on 4/11/68, that all of those arrested had made bond of \$10,000 each, except for J. L. HARPER, who remained in the Hinds County Jail.

HOWARD LA CROIX:

Source advised that he worked with one HOWARD LA CROIX at Vicksburg, Miss., during 1967 and he considered LA CROIX extremely radical and the type person who would commit most any act of violence in connection with racial matters. Source described LA CROIX as follows:

Source knows LA CROIX as a former auto parts man at Lamar T. Lowe Pontiac-Cadillac Agency, Vicksburg, Miss. He worked there under the supervision of JIM CRIBBS and at one time had telephone number 948-5028, which is a Jackson, Miss., number. Source stated that based on newspaper accounts of the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, he believes LA CROIX should be considered a good suspect, since he often talked about committing acts of racial violence, including the fact that somebody should kill MARTIN LUTHER KING.

HARRY KELLEY, ATTORNEY:

Source advised that HARRY KELLEY is representing DAVID L. CUTCHENS, a Klan member, in a suit against the Hinds County SO, for false arrest. The suit is for \$10,000 and is based on arrest of CUTCHENS about a month ago in connection with a debt which CUTCHENS owed.

J. L. HARPER:

Source advised that J. L. HARPER, member of WKKKKOM, Jackson, Miss., whose case for illegal possession of dynamite was scheduled for 4/12/68 in Hinds County Court, has now been delayed until next month. Source stated he has talked to HARPER's attorney and the attorney seems to think HARPER will be found not guilty.

A. H. WALTERS or A. H. WATKINS:

Source advised that he knew an individual named A. H. WATKINS and not A. H. WALTERS, who was a member of Unit #111, OKA, Jackson, Miss., for a short time during the Summer of 1967. WATKINS was working for a construction company building a highway and was driving a low-boy type truck. He lived on Shaw Road west of Jackson until about 12/67. He is no longer active in the Klan and his whereabouts

is unknown. He is believed to still be in the Jackson, Miss. area.

H. D. WHITE:

Source advised that H. D. WHITE, a Klan leader in the Mississippi KKK, headed by B. C. CUPSTID, as Grand Dragon; is still active in the Klan and has advised several of his friends that he expects to be appointed a deputy sheriff in Hinds County in the very near future.

AUBREY NUNNERY:

Source advised that AUBREY NUNNERY is presently the treasurer of the Mississippi KKK, Jackson, Miss., which unit is headed by B. C. CUPSTID.

JIMMY SAVELL:

Source advised that JIMMY SAVELL, Jackson, Miss., is Acting EC of the Mississippi KKK unit at Jackson anytime CUPSTID is not present. He is considered EC of the local unit and CUPSTID is the Grand Dragon.

FERRALL MC CORMICK, SR.; CHUCK GARNER:

Source advised that he considers CHUCK GARNER, a member of the OKA, to be extremely dangerous. He said GARNER is almost always around with at least one gun and has in his home many guns of different types. GARNER has recently been traveling around Jackson with FERRALL MC CORMICK, SR., and more or less acting as a bodyguard for MC CORMICK. GARNER is believed to continue to work at an appliance company as a service man. The company is owned by DON JACKSON and is located on Lynch Street, just east of Ellis Avenue, Jackson. Source considers GARNER extremely fast in handling a gun and the type person not to be discussed in any way where racial matters are concerned.

CECIL PATE:

Source advised that CECIL PATE was formerly the Vice-President of the Mississippi KKK at Jackson, Miss., but has completely dropped out of the Klan recently due

to some disagreement with the Grand Dragon, B. C. CUPSTID.

L. E. MATTHEWS; PRICE GRAY:

Source advised he knows L. E. MATTHEWS, JR., a Klan official in the WKKKKOM and also PRICE GRAY, a former EC of a WKKKKOM unit at Jackson, Miss. He said GRAY and MATTHEWS were formerly extremely good friends and may still be. Source believes they would do anything to protect each other due to their friendship. Source stated PRICE GRAY is believed still working at Thames Auto Company, South Gallatin Street, Jackson, Miss., but source does not know if GRAY is active in the Klan at the present time.

Source advised he is closely associated with Klan attorney HARRY KELLEY and is making efforts to develop this friendship further so he can obtain more information regarding Klan members.

On instant date, MARRY FEDUCCIA, Motor Vehicle Comptroller's Office, Jackson, Miss., advised that the alphabetical listing for 1966 tag receipts discloses a registration for JAMIE GALT, 1912 20th Avenue, Gulfport, Miss., for 1957 Plymouth Plaza, 6 cylinder, 2 door, and white in color. G-2/48/

He stated his records also disclosed an alphabetically for BAZILY GALT, Baldwyn, Prentiss County, Miss., for a 1958 Ford, 8 cylinder, 6 passenger, 2 door sedan. 59-4799,

He advised that his records also disclosed a listing for Mrs. RAYMOND GAULT, Hinds Co., Miss.

Mr. FEDUCCIA stated alphabetical files disclosed no listing identifiable for ERIC STARVOW GALT. He further advised that he has no alphabetical listings for tag receipts for the years 1967 and 1968. 157-9586-214

On 4/9/68, Mrs. RAYMOND GAULT, 840 Arbor Vista Boulevard, Jackson, telephone 352-9836, advised she has no knowledge regarding ERIC STARVOM GALT. She advised that her husband died about 10 years ago and that he was not employed when he resided in Jackson. She stated that the above mentioned name is completely unknown to her.

Informant stated that recently a ROBERT ADAMS, Pontotoc, Miss., showed him a card from the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. Informant stated that ADAMS told him he had joined the OKKKK while he was doing construction work in Laurel, Miss., however, informant stated that he does not think that ADAMS is presently connected with the Klan. Informant described ADAMS as in his early thirties, 5*8", 170 pounds, residing Randolph, Miss.

Informant further stated that he will maintain contact with ADAMS and in the event it appears that ADAMS is active in any Klan organization, he will advise the FBI.

At 8:35 p.m. on 4/5/68, MARK LEDBETTER, Reporter, WLBT, Channel 3, Jackson, Miss., advised that RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT had just stopped by this television station and dropped off a news release. He said BARRETT told him that he had sent a telegram to Governor JOHN BELL WILLIAMS at the Capitol in Jackson, on the afternoon of this date. Mr. LEDBETTER provided the following text of BARRETT's press release:

"For Release 7:00 P.M., 4/5/68:

"We respectfully request that you name this Sunday, April 7, a special memorial day for Mississippi soldiers killed in Vietnam, lest we allow mourning for a single regrettable death, the late Martin Luther King, overshadow the daily heroic sacrifice of our fellow Mississippians with their lives on the battlefield.

> /s/ "Richard Barrett For America's Victory Force"

Mr. LEDBETTER said he would advise of any further developments in this regard.



EFFIE LEE WALTON, nee JEMKINS, Route 2, Box 119, Potts Camp, Mississippi, was located and interviewed in Marshall County, Mississippi. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents, WALTON volunteered the following information:

WALTON explained she is employed at Jack's Truck Stop located on Highway 78, between Holly Springs and Potts Camp, Mississippi. She stated that in conjunction with her employment, she was at work on Thursday, April 4, 1968.

WALTON stated that on April 4, 1968, at approximately 6:30 P.M., just before dark, she was standing in the front window at Jack's Truck Stop. She explained that she had just heard a few minutes prior about the shooting incident involving Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She further pointed out that she is relatively certain of the time being approximately 6:30 as she gets off of work at 7:00 P.M., and the incident she has in mind occurred prior to her quitting time of 7:00 P.M.

WALTON stated as she was looking out the front window at Jack's Truck Stop, she observed a white Mustang which she believed to be a 1967 model, pull off of Highway 78 onto the driveway of Jack's Truck Stop. She stated that two white males were sitting in the front seat of this vehicle, and that
