#### FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date April 16, 1968

Mr. ROBERT EARL DAVIS, 101 McLaurin Drive, advised he is employed by the Mid-Valley Pipeline in Oxford, Mississippi, and in connection with his duties, holds a private pilot's license to fly company planes. He explained that he spends a lot of his time around the University - Oxford Airport and stated that on the morning of April 8, 1968, he was at the lobby in the airport where he observed an unknown white male in the lobby and stated he believes this person had just arrived on a Southern Airlines flight from Memphis, Tennessee. He advised he struck up a conversation with this person and recalls this individual claimed he was an Eastern Airlines pilot who flies DC-8 aircraft. He stated that during his conversation with this person, he was of the opinion that he was not an airline pilot since he apparently did not know much about flying. He also recalls this individual questioned him concerning the cost of a small plane.

DAVIS stated that this person used the Hertz Rent-A-Car telephone located at the lobby of the airport and talked with someone in Tupelo, Mississippi. DAVIS advised he was somewhat suspicious of this person at this time and stated he picked up an extension phone and heard only a brief portion of their conversation. He recalls the person remarked over the telephone, "I'm here; I'm not in Tupelo." He stated that sometime thereafter, someone driving a white Buick picked this person up at the airport and DAVIS assumed this was the person he contacted in Tupelo, Mississippi.

DAVIS stated that during the period of time this person was waiting around the airport, he observed him carrying a blue flight bag with a name stenciled on the side which he believes was either GAULT or GOLT.

Miss HOWARD furnished the following description of this individual, whom she refused to identify out of fear for her safety and because she would hate to see anyone punished for killing a Negro:

Miss HOWARD advised that she is a nurse at East Bolivar County Hospital, Cleveland, Mississippi. She is approximately 35 years of age, approximately 5' 6" tall, 115 pounds, blond, and lives alone. Miss HOWARD appeared to have been drinking heavily prior to the interview at 7:30 AM and did not answer the door when agents knocked. The door was open, screen was unlocked, lights on, her 1966 Chevrolet was parked in the driveway, and car keys were observed on the coffee table in the living room. She did not respond when her name was called. Her small white dog barked and should have awakened anyone who was sleeping.

Assistant Chief of Police LAW, Leland, Mississippi, appeared on the scene and entered Miss HOWARD's house and awakened her, after calling her name loudly several times. She was, from her speech and actions, obviously intoxicated or doped. There was no indication that her house had been ransacked.

After leaving the house, Miss HOWARD contacted the Leland Police Department and advised that she had decided that she would furnish the name of the man in question, provided that one FBI agent and one FBI agent alone would return to her house. The above two agents returned to Miss HOWARD's home and, after several statements which indicated her complete dislike for Negroes, she refused again to name the

individual who she claimed to be ERIC STARVO GALT, based on the sketch she saw on television.

Chief of Police JOE DEAN, Leland, Mississippi, advised that MARY ANN HOWARD is an alcoholic who frequently carouses all night. She is a very attractive girl who is well educated, is a nurse, and appears to be very intelligent when she is sober. She has made complaints to the PD on several occasions when she was not sober, and complained one time that she had been raped. She was taken to the General Hospital in Leland but refused to permit an examination after she learned that the doctor ordinarily on duty at that time of night was not at the hospital. She then admitted that she had furnished a false report.

In view of the description which Miss HOWARD furnished and her condition, the Jackson Office anticipates conducting no further investigation on this particular matter.

Memphis may desire to advise Inspector ZACHARY (NA), Memphis PD Homicide Bureau, of the above since HOWARD may again contact him.

At 7:35 AM, April 18, 1968, SA ROGER KAAS of the Atlanta Office telephonically advised that investigation at Atlanta had developed a latent fingerprint on the Mexican road map which matches the print found on the gun. He stated, however, that the landlord at the rooming house in which GALT stayed (previous information indicates he resided at this rooming house from March 24, 1968, until April 5, 1968) has consistently lied to Agents about small things. He stated that when GALT tried to get a room, the landlord had to open his other rooming house which had no occupants at the time to make a room available for GALT and that for one week GALT resided in this house alone. KAAS stated that despite this, the landlord gave Agents the wrong room number, which was searched, and then later told them the right one. He said there were other instances of furnishing false information, which although appearing/ to be minor, did not seem to have any reason.

KAAS stated the landlord is JIMMIE DELTON CARNER. born fulton, Miss., a white male, 67, 198 lbs., dark brown, almost black hair, blue eyes, and an alcoholic. He has a sister, ROBBIE CARNER, who is a school teacher at Atlanta. KAAS stated GARNER has said he ran a restaurant in Tupelo, Miss., for a number of years immediately prior to World War II until 1942 and immediately after World War II. He claims to have attended a small college, which they gather is at Fulton, Miss. He was dishonorably discharged from the U.S. Army in 1944 as an officer. He claims this was due to drinking.





Information was received at the Jackson Division that an anonymous individual intercepted two calls on their party line on 4/6/68 at which time the following information was received.

DELMA and DINA LA BELLA, operators of Dee-Dells Photo Studio in Walls, Mississippi, were calling B. B. CAMPBELL at 317-282-390, 1215 E. 14th Street, Muncie, Indiana. CAMPBELL is the sister of DELMA LA BELLA and LA BELLA was calling to check on CAMPBELL's health. The death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was also discussed at one time.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM P. LAWLER, JR. and SA RICHARD T. RABIDEAU on 4/8/68:

Mrs. C. A. ALDAY, Clerk, Walls Station, P. O., Walls, Miss., advised that DEE and DELLS, Industrial Photo Shop, Drawer 67, Walls, is operated by DEE or DINA ARANIAS and DELL PIERCE, both of whom live some place in Memphis. ALDAY further advised that ARANIAS mother, LORENA COUNT, works in the shop and lives on Starlanding Road, Lake Cormorant.

LORENA COUNT and SARA COUNT, mother and sister of DINA ARANIAS were interviewed at their home on Starlanding Road, Lake Cormorant, at which time they volunteered the following information:

Both LORENA and SARA COUNT advised that they also worked at Dee and Dells Photo Lab along with DINA ARANIAS and DELMA PIERCE. They further stated that DINA and DELMA were living together but had recently moved and did not know their present address. SARA COUNT advised, however, that both girls were presently traveling in connection with the Photo Shop and that she would have them call the FBI in Oxford as soon as she was in contact with them.

Both LORENA and SARA COUNT advised that they know no one by the name of LA BELLA

DEE ARANIAS telephonically contacted the Oxford Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation from Gulfport, Mississippi, at which time ARANIAS provided the following information:

ARANIAS stated that she and DELMA PIERCE were presently in Gulfport, Mississippi. ARANIAS stated that on Thursday night, April 4, 1968, she and PIERCE were at the Holiday Inn in Biloxi, Mississippi.

ARANIAS stated that prior to arriving in Biloxi on April 4, 1968, they had been at the Standard Walgreen Agency, in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, at about 5:00 p.m. on April 4, 1968.

ARANIAS further stated that DELMA was not with her, at the moment, but that DELMA had called her sister in Indiana twice on Friday, April 5, 1968. One call was made from Jackson and one from Memphis on Friday night. ARANIAS stated that DELMA had used the name IA BELLA when calling her sister, in order to avoid a family conflict due to a prior marriage.

ARANIAS stated that although she and PIERCE traveled a lot, they could always be contacted through the photo shop.
