The following investigation was conducted by SA J. L. MARTIN on 4/19/68 in an effort to identify and eliminate WILLIAM GRANTHAM, Route 3, Sumrall, Miss., who holds Miss., Driver's License [REDACTED] date of birth [REDACTED] and who is described as a white male, brown eyes, black hair, 5 feet 9 inches tall, weight 159 pounds, as a suspect in this case.

NELL EATON, Hattiesburg Credit Bureau, Hattiesburg, Miss., advised that her files reflect that WILLIAM DAVID GRANTHAM, Route 3, Sumrall, Miss., wife EVELYN GRANTHAM, was employed at Tom Black, Inc., Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and had a bank account at the Lamar County Bank, Purvis, Miss. EATON advised that her files did not reflect the age of GRANTHAM.

DON FAUSE, Tom Black, Inc., Highway 98 West, Hattiesburg, Miss., advised that DAVID GRANTHAM is employed by him as a bulldozer operator. FAUSE advised that GRANTHAM is approximately 36 years of age, approximately 5 feet 10 inches in height, would weigh approximately 165 or 170 pounds. FAUSE advised that he did not have an application or any record which would reflect GRANTHAM's date of birth or full description. He stated, however, that GRANTHAM is employed by him in Picayune, Miss., and that he has worked regularly during the month of April, 1968.

O. B. BLACK, Assistant Vice President, Lamar County Bank, Purvis, Miss., advised that DAVID GRANTHAM, wife EVELYN, maintains a bank account at the Lamar County Bank, however none of his records reflected the exact age, date of birth, or description

of DAVID GRANTHAM. BLACK stated that WILLIE STUART, owner, Stuart's Farm Supplies, Purvis, Miss., would probably know DAVID GRANTHAM as he had cosigned notes for GRANTHAM.

WILLIE STUART, owner, Stuart Farm Supplies, Purvis, Miss., advised that he was well acquainted with DAVID GRANTHAM and that he believed GRANTHAM's first name was WILLIAM inasmuch as he was the son of W. L. GRANTHAM who was known as BILL GRANTHAM. STUART described DAVID GRANTHAM as being approximately 35 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighing approximately 165 pounds.

The records of the Lamar County Health Office as reviewed by SA J. L. MARTIN reflect that a male child was born to W. L. GRANTHAM in Lamar County, Miss., on [REDACTED] and that this child has birth certificate number [REDACTED]. The child was not named at birth and the birth records do not reflect a name for this child.

T. S. SAUCIER, Circuit Clerk, Lamar County, Miss., advised that his records reflect that DAVID GRANTHAM is a registered voter in Lamar Conty, Miss., in Beat Four, and that GRANTHAM was 24 years of age when he registered to vote in 1955.

CARL PARKER, Postmaster, Sumrall, Miss., advised that his records reflect that DAVID GRANTHAM receives mail at Route 3, Sumrall, Miss., under the name of W. D. GRANTHAM and DAVID GRANTHAM. PARKER advised that he was sure that GRANTHAM's name was WILLIAM DAVID GRANTHAM.

SUBJECT: MURKIN

On 4/15/68 LEONARD WARREN, owner, Warren's Grocery Store, located on Highway 21, north of Philadelphia, Miss., telephonically contacted the Meridian Resident Agency and stated that on the morning of 4/15/68 an unknown white male about 50 years of age weighing approximately 170 to 180 pounds with sandy brown hair driving a 1958 or 1959 light Ford with 1968 Tennessee license, number unknown, came into his store and wanted to trade three cases of "Mr. Terrific" cleaner for three gallons of gasoline. WARREN related that this unknown person later came back into his store and wanted to trade one can of the cleaner for a package of cigarettes.

WARREN stated that this person looked something like the picture in the newspaper that was the person that killed Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING. WARREN further related that he would not be in his store on 4/16 and 4/17/68 but would be available for interview on 4/18/68.

On 4/18/68 WARREN viewed photographs of MURKIN suspects exhibited to him by SA DONALD J. CESARE at his place of business in Philadelphia, Miss. He advised at this time that none of the photographs exhibited to him were identical to the individual who attempted to trade him the cases of cleaner for merchandise on 4/15/68.

He further asserted that he had never heard of any individuals having any of these names residing in Humphreys County.

On 4/18/68, HILDA SHAPERO, Deputy Chancery Clerk, Humphreys County, Belzoni, advised that she has never heard of any individuals living in Humphreys County having the names ERIC STARVO GALT (or GAULT), HARVEY LOWMEYER (or LOWMYER), or JOHN WILLARD. FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date April 19, 1968

WILLIAM E. REYNOLDS, Route One, Burnsville, Mississippi, after being advised of the nature of the inquiry and the identity of the interviewing Agent, advised that on April 4, 1968, he visited Memphis, Tennessee, and stayed at the Linden Lodge Motel in Room 206 and checked out of the motel on April 5, 1968. Mr. REYNOLDS recalled that when he checked into the motel, he listed his license number as Mississippi N1126 inadvertently and stated that his correct license number is F/6 N1128. He described his vehicle as a 1965 black Ford pickup.

Mr. REYNOLDS stated that his reason for being in Memphis, Tennessee, was for an appointment he had at the Kennedy Veterans Administration Hospital, Memphis, Tennessee. He stated he is drawing 100 percent disability social security benefits plus 40 percent Veterans Administration benefits.

Concerning his whereabouts on April 4, 1968, he stated that at approximately 6:00 p.m., he was in his room watching television. Mr. REYNOLDS denied any knowledge of the individual(s) responsible for the shooting of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and stated that he did not know anything about the shooting until he saw it on television at approximately 6:00 p.m.

Mr. BOYETTE advised that he normally just uses the name HENRY BOYETTE but his full name is HENRY JUNIOR BOYETTE and he currently resides at 1003 Van Buren Street, Tupelo, Mississippi.

Mr. BOYETTE advised that he is District Sales Manager in Tupelo, Mississippi, for the American and Efird Thread Mills, Incorporated, 819 Harrison Street, Tupelo, Mississippi, with their home office in Mount Holly, North Carolina. He stated that on April 3, 1968, he left his home with his wife and drove to Memphis, Tennessee, where he registered at the Holiday Inn on Lamar Avenue, since he had business with the Inn Keeper Supply Company, 3762 Lamar Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee.

On this particular date, he also had a meeting with the Vice-President of the company from Mount Holly, North Carolina, EDWARD WOWELL. He said this meeting took place at the airport in Memphis, Tennessee, during the early evening hours.

BOYETTE advised that on April 4, 1968, he had business with ROY GILLIA, of Inn Keeper Supply and also with a representative of the Operman Manufacturing Company, 706 Royal Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee. He related that he believes it was somewhere between 9:00 and 9:30 P.M. when he and his wife checked out of the Holiday Inn and his wife traveled with him in the automobile around Memphis and he believed he made his last contact sometime prior to 3:00 P.M. on April 4, 1968, after which time he and his wife

En route to Tupelo, he and his wife stopped at his mother-in-law's home, Mrs. VIRLIE TUNES, at Wallerville, Mississippi, near New Albany, to pick up their two year old child who was being kept by Mrs. TUNES while he and his wife were in Memphis. He said when they left Mrs. TUNES' house they drove directly to Tupelo, Mississippi, and went to their residence where they had sandwiches for the evening meal and then went to a gospel singing at the Community Center in Tupelo.

Mr. BOYETTE related that neither he nor his wife were aware of the murder of Doctor KING until after they returned home in Tupelo from the gospel singing sometimes after 9:00 P.M. in the evening.

DICKSON said that he is not responsible for the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, nor can he furnish any information in that regard.

He stated that the 7-11 Store purchases its beer from the Service Beverage Company at Clarksdale, Mississippi.

He stated that the Schlitz delivery man appears at that store every Wednesday.

He advised after examining his stock of Schlitz 12 ounce pop top cans that he had two six packs in his refrigerator with the date March 15, 1968. He stated that this 7-11 Store uses Toreador paper sacks. He advised they do not utilize a number or size 20 paper sack.

He was displayed artist's conception drawings from Birmingham and Memphis, Tennessee.

SEWELL recalled that in the latter part of March, 1968, a white male approximately 5'9" to 5'10" in height, age 27 to 28 years of age, small frame, with a dark crew hair cut, wearing a gray suit with black pin stripes, glasses with black rims, purchased beer at that store.

SEWELL stated that he could not recall what brand of beer this individual bought or how he paid for it.

SEWELL stated that he recalled this incident as the authorities in Memphis, Tennessee, had put a curfew on beer and liquor sales and that at the same time this individual was in the checkout line, a highway patrolman came to the store and told him to cut off beer sales.

the name ERIC STARVO GALT, and pointed out that his last name is spelled GAULT and not GALT. EVERETT GAULT observed photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and advised that he had never seen this individual, and that this person is definitely not a member of his family or a relation thereof. He stated that he has a brother by the name of CURTIS HOPE GAULT, and his last known address was Pioneer, Louisiana. EVERETT GAULT stated that his brother, CURTIS GAULT, was employed by the Ford Bacon and Davis Construction Company, Monroe, Louisiana. He stated he has not been in contact with his brother for some period of time, and is not sure of his present whereabouts.

He also commented that MALCOLM A. GAULT and EZRA GAULT are both brothers of his. EVERETT GAULT stated he could furnish no information concerning anyone who resembles the person in the photograph identified as ERIC STARVO GALT.
