

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been added to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his earliest possible location.

Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fired from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division, succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a "loner" and "drifter" whose language and diction reflect a "rural" quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons.

He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.

On 4/16/68 HUBERT HENDERSON, Chief of Police, Forest, Miss., furnished the following information to SA RICHARD L. BROCK and SA JOHN B. RUCKER, JR.:

At approximately 7:15 AM on 4/16/68 Chref HENDERSON stopped a late-model white Comet automobile bearing 1968 Mississippi license HB 8230 in Forest, Miss., after another individual had reported that the driver of the Comet automobile had run him off the road near Morton, Miss.

Chief HENDERSON advised that the passenger in the Comet automobile was named PETE WALKER and remained at the Forest PD while the driver of the Comet was taken to Morton to appear before Justice of the Peace HOLLINGS-WORTH on a reckless-driving charge.

During conversation with WALKER, HENDERSON stated that WALKER related he had flown into Jackson, Miss., at 4:00 AM this date and had been met by the driver of the Comet, both of whom worked for an insurance company. WALKER related that his travels take him all over, and he specifically referred to being in and out of Tennessee on frequent occasions. In addition he mentioned travels to Birmingham, Alabama, and Atlanta, Georgia.

WALKER stated he lives in Pearl, Miss., where he built a home after purchasing three acres of land, in that he formerly resided in Magee, Miss. HENDERSON stated that during conversation with WALKER the weather was discussed and WALKER mentioned that it was raining "like hell the day that Nigger was shot." WALKER added he was in Meridian when KING was shot. HENDERSON advised he noticed that WALKER bore a striking resemblance to a sketch of the assassin of KING seen in a newspaper, and he attempted to elicit information from WALKER concerning his background while he and WALKER conversed at the police station.

HENDERSON recalls that WALKER may have been divorced at one time and that he had a nervous breakdown in the past.

ADCOX further stated that he has not seen a sketch of the assailant of KING and, therefore, could not compare the likeness of WALKER to the sketches.



Referenced Jackson communication set out lead for New Orleans at Donaldsonville, Louisiana, to contact pipelines, re identity of driver of 1961 Chevrolet with Texas license plates.

New Orleans is requested to discontinue this lead inasmuch as D'AVY has stated the driver of this vehicle is definitely not identical with the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and bears no resemblance to the photograph.

On 4/22/68, Mr. LEANDER "LEE" D'AVY, 348 Idlewild, Jackson, Mississippi, appeared at the Jackson Office of the FBI, and furnished the following information to SA SAMUEL N. JENNINGS:

D'AVY advised he is unemployed at the present time, but has previously worked as a cab driver and at numerous odd jobs such as selling fishing worms, acting as a doorman at some bars on Bourbon Street in New Orleans, and a variety of jobs, after receiving a General discharge from the U. S. Army for stealing a Government vehicle.

D'AVY said he was hitchhiking with his tenyear-old son, LEANDER D'AVY, JR., on April 9, 1968, at Brookhaven, Mississippi. He caught a ride in front of the Coca-Cola Plant in Brookhaven, with a man who acted suspicious, and who had the name "Ray" written on the back of the Texas Inspection Sticker on the windshield of his car. D'AVY pointed out this was the day of the funeral of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and after reading in the paper that JAMES EARL RAY was alleged to be the murderer, he believes this man whom he caught a ride with might be involved in the murder of Dr. KING in some way. identified man offering D'AVY and his son a ride from Brookhaven, Miss., to Baton Rouge, Miss., was driving about a 1961 Chevrolet, four door sedan, medium green in y sent for who color, with current Texas license plates, number not recalled or recorded. The unidentified driver claimed he

had recently worked on a pipe-line job near Grenada, Mississippi, and was presently enroute to another new pipe-line job in Donaldsonville, Louisiana.

During the trip, D'AVY started to comment about Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and this caused the unidentified driver to become very upset and pound his fists on the steering wheel. D'AVY claimed the driver never gave him any name whatsoever, but he believes his name may have been RAY, since that was the name on the back of the Texas Inspection Sticker on the windshield. He said the Miss. Highway Safety Patrol stopped them just outside of Brookhaven, Miss., on a routinetype driver's license check. The driver exhibited a Texas driver's license to the patrolman. The patrolman also noted that one of the headlights did not work on this car; however, allowed them to continue on without receiving any type of ticket. During the drive to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the unidentified driver gave D'AVY's ten-year-old son a cheap, inexpensive ring which was made in Mexico, and which he took from the glove partment of the car. D'AVY still has this ring.

D'AVY described the unidentified driver as follows: white male, age 25-35, 5' 9" in height, 180 pounds, blue or green eyes, sandy colored brown hair with a full head of hair combed straight, no glasses, did not smoke, had on no rings, and did not appear to be carrying anything in the way of suitcases or clothes inside the car. He spoke with a normal accent which was not particularly regional. He claimed to be from Orange, Texas, originally, but did not know several people named by D'AVY who are supposedly well-known in Orange, Texas.

D'AVY viewed several photographs, including the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, and stated the unidentified driver who picked him up is definitely not identical with the photographs and bears no resemblance to the photographs.

D'AVY theorized that as soon as the true identity of the killer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING became known to the public, it was necessary for those who had participated in the murder with RAY, to eliminate RAY in order that he could never identify them. D'AVY claims he has not only theorized about this, but he has dreamed about it also, and felt he should tell the FBI about it.



KNIGHT advised that they were listening to the car radio and te news of the shooting of MEDGAR EVARS was broadcast and the three of them were drying to figure out a route to Memphis which would bypass possible road blocks. the conversation which took place KNIGHT recalled SPARKS and WING discussing the fact that SPARKS had been offered a \$10,000. payment to kill They did not elaborate on this MARTIN LUTHER KING. other than to indicate that when both were in the state penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, some "agents" had come to interview SPARKS concerning this alleged offer and payment and that he had "run them off" meaning that he had refused to talk to the agents about the matter.

KNIGHT was quizzed thoroughly concerning this incident and advised that it was not discussed further, nor would SPARKS mention who had approached him with the offer.

KNIGHT stated that SPARKS is perfectly capable of committing a murder and is a known hater of Negroes. According to KNIGHT, SPARKS is not known to make jokes and it was believable to KNIGHT that an actual offer was made to SPARKS by someone.

For the information of offices receiving, DOWALD EUGENE SPARKS is presently incarcerated at Fort Payne, Alabama and has been incarcerated during the period of the MARTIN LUTHER KING murder which would definitely eliminate SPARKS as a suspect.

	Set forth hereafter is a recapitulation of investigation concerning DONALD EUGENE SPARKS (former Top Ten Fugitive) and his allegedly being offered money by the Ku Klux Klan of Mississipp to murder Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in 1964.

forwarded to the Bureau an original and 7 copies of a letterhead memorandum showing information received from JOHN ARTHUR CHAMBLEE, a detective of the Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, considered by Jackson a reliable individual who is acquainted with members or former members of the WKKKKOM. CHAMBLEE, in reporting this information that was overheard as general rumor among Klansmen and he did not know the source, was doubtful of its truthfulness.

The information in substance was that on 3/17/65, CHAMBLEE advised that he had received unverified information that in 1964, the original Knights of the KKK of Mississippi had hired a "killer" from the State of Oklahoma to murder MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. when KING was in Jackson, Mississippi. This "killer" was known as "TWO JUMPS" and came to Jackson, Mississippi to "case" the layout and while in Jackson, stayed at the Terrymore Motel. He was to use a high-powered rifle with telescopic sights. This deal allegedly fell through when the Klansmen could not raise the \$13,000 demanded by "TWO JUMPS."

CHAMBLEE also reported "TWO JUMPS" was allegedly also the killer of a Bureau Top Ten fugitive later identified as JOHN GIBSON DYLLON. "TWO JUMPS" allegedly killed DILLON at the Flamingo Motel in Jackson, Mississippi and thereafter transported the body to Oklahoma or Kansas where it was dumped in an old well.

The Oklahoma City Division by airtel of 4/8/65, advised Bureau and Jackson Division that complete background in the case involving Top Ten Fugitive JOHN GIBSON DILLON did not substantiate that DILLON was killed in Mississippi. From facts available to Oklahoma City, it was doubtful in fact if DILLON was killed in Mississippi.

The Jackson Division on 4/2/65 interviewed PCI CLENNIE JOE BUCHANAN, described by Jackson as a notorious confidence man and gambler who had at that time been under development as an informant of the Jackson Division for some two months.

BUCHANAN was asked if he knew an individual named DONALD SPARKS or GENE SPARKS to which he promptly replied, "Who, TWO JUMPS?" He was thereafter shown and photograph of DONALD EUGENE SPARKS, Tulsa, Oklahoma Police Department Number 38224 dated September 7, 1963. BUCHANAN promptly identified this photograph of SPARKS as being identical to the person he has known for many years as "TWO JUMPS." BUCHANAN went on to relate that SPARKS got the nickname of "TWO JUMPS from his ability as a cowboy and according to BUCHANAN, SPARKS was an excellent "Broncho buster" and could ride almost any horse. BUCHANAN considered SPARKS to be an extremely hard and tough individual who would not hesitate to kill anyone. Extensive investigation was conducted in several field offices to concretely identify "TWO JUMPS" and from the identification of PCI CLENNIE JOE BUCHANAN, Jackson, Mississippi, it was felt that DONALD EUGENE SAPRKS was identical to "TWO JUMPS."

Investigation by the Jackson Division at the Terrymore Motel in Jackson failed to disclose any registration that could be identified as being that of SPARKS. In addition to the above identification of SPARKS as "TWO JUMPS", Phoenix CI PX 737-C was interviewed at Phoenix on 1/26/65. This informant advised he knew DONALD EUGENE SPARKS and was well aware that SPARKS' nickname is "TWO JUMPS."

Based on this identification on 5/14/65, an attempt was made to interview DONALD EUGENE SPARKS, Inmate Number 71755, at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary. Following his being advised of his rights, SPARKS stated at the outset he would not furnish any information. He did deny being contacted by anyone at any time to commit a murder and said he did not kill anyone for money or any other reason. He denied ever being hired by anyone in the South and specifically in Mississippi to commit any murder. He denied knowing anyone connected with the Ku Klux Klan.

SPARKS at this time stated he had never cooperated with any police officers and did not intend to start doing so now. He said he had been contacted by numerous officers and would appreciate it if police officers would not bother him again since they wasted his time, as he was working in the plumbing shop in the Penitentiary and could not be away from his job. SPARKS terminated the interview by getting up and leaving the room.
