Mr. ROY HARDY, Route 3, New Albany, Mississippi, was interviewed at his residence in the presence of Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol (MHSP) Investigator BURT DUNCAN.

HARDY was questioned concerning his activities on the afternoon of April 4, 1968, at which time he advised that he is employed by BILL PHILLIPS, a road contractor, doing road work near Highway 30, and stated on this date it was too wet to operate the heavy equipment. and therefore he was not working. He advised he took this occasion to take his pickup truck to Harris Body Shop in New Albany, and stated after his truck was repaired he stopped by to visit his first cousin. TOM NELSON DAVIS. who lives on South Acres Drive in New Albany. HARDY admitted that he was drinking prior to the time he decided to visit DAVIS, and stated after arriving at DAVIS' house he offered him a drink of whiskey. He recalled that TOM NELSON DAVIS suggested they drive out to the Barbecue Grill at the Beacon Hill community, located just east of New Albany, Mississippi. LAMAR T. LOE, JR., Lamar T. Loe Motor Company, Highway 80 West, advised that HOWARD LOYAL LAACROIX had been employed at Lamar T. Loe Motor Company as an assistant parts manager from June 9, 1967, to December 28, 1967. LA CROIX's record indicated that he had previously been employed for about three years at Kittle Pontiac, Memphis, Tennessee.

On July 11, 1967, while employed at Lamar T. Loe Motor Company, LA CROIX had purchased a 1962 Thunderbird hardtop which was to be purchased through General Motors Acceptance Corporation (GMAC) in Jackson, Mississippi. Mr. LOE had been the co-signer in the transaction. CROIX's departure from Vicksburg and the employ of Mr. LOE. LA CROIX had made no further payments to GMAC on the vehicle. Inasmuch as Mr. LOE had been the co-signer in the transaction, he had been required to continue these payments. Mr. LOE advised that he had also received several calls from various merchants in the Vicksburg, Mississippi, area concerning insufficient fundschecks which LA CROIX had cashed with them. Mr. LOE stated that he would not attempt to repossess the vehicle inasmuch as the expense of paying the repair bill to the garage in Memphis, Tennessee, and subsequently transporting the vehicle back to Vicksburg, Mississippi, would probably be more than the car was worth.

Mr. LOE stated that his dealings with LA CROIX had been on an employer-employee basis, and he had no idea what LA CROIX's dealings were with regard to racial matters. Mr. LOE was exhibited photographs of the two composite drawings based on descriptions from individuals in Birmingham, Alabama, and Memphis, Tennessee, and advised that neither picture resembled LA CROIX.

Mr. WALTER KOONCE, manager, Southern Greyhound Terminal, Clarksdale, Mississippi, furnished the following information:

He called the Downtowner Motor Inn in Clarksdale on the night of April 4, 1968, to determine if rooms were available, since buses bound for Memphis, Tennessee, were not being allowed to enter the city of Memphis due to the civil disorder there following the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that a bus from Vicksburg, Mississippi, which came through Greenville, Mississippi, arrived at Clarksdale on time — 9:41 PM. The bus did not proceed to Memphis.

One passenger, a white male, 45 to 50 years old, about six feet tall, 175 pounds, dark hair, with receding hairline, slightly protruding front teeth, attired in sports shirt and slacks, was upset because he was supposed to meet a boat in Memphis, Tennessee. This individual, name unknown, made a remark to the effect that MARTIN LUTHER KING "got what was coming to him," a remark which Mr. KOONCE stated he recalled because it was not appropriate for the time it was made.

Mr. KOONCE stated that the driver of the bus on which the above passenger arrived was Mr. HOOKER, who lives in Memphis, Tennessee.


