



ON APRIL FIVE, NINETEEN SIXTY EIGHT, PROFESSOR CHARLES B. SCHILDECKER, CHAIRMAN, POLICE SCIENCE DEPARTMENT, MIAMI DADE JUNIOR COLLEGE NORTH, MIAMI, FLORIDA, ADVISED THAT AT ABOUT TEN AM THIS DATE, A GROUP OF APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED NEGROES STAGED A "SIT-DOWN" IN THE AREA OF THE STUDENT CENTER LOUNGE RESERVED FOR THE FRATERNITIES. APPROXIMATELY SIX OR SEVEN NEGROES THEN STOOD UP AND MADE SPEECHES DEPLORING THE ASSASSINATION OF KING AND BLAMING WHITE PEOPLE WHOM THEY CALLED "CHARLIES" FOR CAUSING THIS TRAGEDY. APPROXIMATELY TWO HUNDRED WHITE STUDENTS GATHERED AROUND AND WHEN IT APPEARED TEMPERS WERE RISING, COLLEGE VICE PRESIDENT AMBROSE GARNER MADE AN APPEARANCE. ASSASSINATION OF MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. RACIAL MATTERS

On April 4, 1968, a confidential source, who holds a leadership position in the Miaml Communist Party, advised that a meeting of the newly formed Coordinating Committee of the Miami Communist Party was held on the evening of April 4, 1968. This meeting was attended by leaders of the Miami Communist Party. At the inception of this meeting, the group discussed the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and everyone was shocked.

The group together decided to have all Communist Party members in Miani make contact with peace groups, senior citizen groups, and the Conference of Concerned Democrats, a pro-Senator Eugene McCarthy organization, to protest King's death. They are to encourage these groups to call for martial law in Tennessee until the murderer or murderers are found. They are to encourage a mass memorial meeting for King, mass marches for him, and are to urge all persons involved in protests to wear black bands in mourning for him.

The following were advised of the above information on April 5, 1968: 111th M. I. Group, Miami; U. S. Secret Service, Miami; U. S. Attorney, Southern District of Florida; Miami Police Department; and Dade County Department of Public Safety.

Copies of this memorandum are being furnished to the lllth W. I. Group, Orlando, Florida; U. S. Secret Service, Miami, Florida; and the U. S. Attorney, Southern District of Florida.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Many offices are using above caption in communications to the Bureau concerning a variety of activities and racial incidents arising out of the killing of Martin Luther King, Jr. This is creating problems from administrative and filing standpoints and should be discontinued immediately. Captions descriptive of the activity involved should be used in accordance with instructions in the FBI Handbook, page 154h of Part III.

For example, in reporting information concerning disturbances that may have occurred in Albany the caption "Racial Disturbances Following Assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., Albany, New York, April 9, 1968, Racial Matters" could be used.

At 3:54 pm, this date, KATHRIN HOBSON, Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company, 17851 NW Mismi Court, Mismi, Florida, 625-0491, (Residence 525 East 14th Street, Hislanh, Florida, 888-4253), telephonically advised the Mismi Office she had ordered some stationary from A. L. GARBER Company Printers, Ashland, Ohio through the Pittsburgh Plate Company and it had arrived this morning postmarked 4/5/68.


MRS HOBSON related she had opened the outer package and removed one inner package and started to remove the second package when she observed a 3 inch long by & inch wide white piece of scratch paper, which had been ripped from a "package copy." She stated someone had printed in pencil the following "Dr. Rev. Martin L. King will be dead by 4/4/68."

She stated the package and paper was contained in shipment #52360. She advised she was the only one in the office who was aware of the note.

MRS HOBSON was instructed to place the packages and note in a safe area and an agent would be sent out to interview her at Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company. She advised she would do so and would not converse with her fellow employees about the note.

On 6/25/76, GEORGE BRACKETT, friend of retired SA GAY SHAHAN, advised telephonically that he had been contacted on several occasions by DAN CHRISTENSEN, a reporter for the "Miami Magazine", 3361 S. W. 3rd Ave., Miami, Fla., who desired to question BRACKETT concerning the activities of one WILLIAM SUMMERSET, alleged FBI informant. CHRISTENSEN told BRACKETT he was investigating the assassinations of JOHN F. KENNEDY and MARTIN LUTHER KING.

BRACKETT advised he is general manager for Hecker Electric Co., Hialeah, Florida, telephone 888-3205, and located 10430 N. W. 36th Court, Miami, telephone 836-4828. . He was a friend of WILLIE SUMMERSET, who has been dead for 7 or 8 years. He intends to see CHRISTENSEN, but has no knowledge of SUMMERSET's activities that he feels would bear on this matter. His purpose in calling was to notify the FBI that such an investigation was being conducted.

Indices check reflect SUMMERSET was informant, 137-363-231. SHAHAN has moved to Virginia, but his son, PHIL SHAHAN, works at Central Bank of North Dade.



FURTHER DISCUSSIONS WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TASK FORCE HAS RESULTED IN THE FOLLOWING CHANGE REGARDING REPRODUCTION OF FIELD OFFICE SERIALS IN THE MURKIN INVESTIGATION, AS OUTLINED IN REFERENCED TELETYPE,

IT WILL BE NECESSARY ONLY TO XEROX THE FIRST PAGE OF ANY DOCUMENT IN YOUR MURKIN FILE IF A COPY OF THAT DOCUMENT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO FBIHQ. On December 22, 1976, PAT KEOHANE, Chief Correctional Supervisor, Federal Correctional Institution (FCI), Perrine, Florida, advised the following information was developed by a member of his staff during a recent conversation with an inmate ROBERT BYRON WATSON, Number 19210-101, regarding his failure to adhere to FCI mailing procedures.

WATSON, who was sentenced to six years on October 6, 1972, for violation of Federal Narcotics Laws, indicated that he expected to be released from the prison prior to the inception of his full term as a result of a demonstration to be conducted in his behalf by DICK GREGORY at the White House. He requested to be confined to the FCI Segregation Unit in protective custody during the last week of January, 1977, since it is then that the demonstration will take place.

RICHARD CLAXTON GREGORY, also known as DICK GREGORY, is a well known nightclub entertainer and civil rights activist who recently has turned his attentions to the re-investigation of the MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. assassination.

Records of the FCI revealed that in 1976, A. REGINALD EAVES, Public Safety Commissioner, Atlanta, Georgia, commenced an investigation after GREGORY supplied him with a forty-two page statement attributed to WATSON by his mother, regarding the MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. assassination. EAVES indicated that he planned to return the results of his investigation over to a correctional committee.

WATSON's statement contained an allegation that in 1968, while he was employed at Magellans Art Gallery in Atlanta, Georgia, he overheard GENE PURCELL and JERRY ADAMS, co-owners of the establishment, planning to kill KING approximately one week before the assassination. PURCELL at the present time is believed to be living in Clinton, Tennessee, and may previously have been employed with the then Atomic Energy Commission.

FCI records reflected that WATSON is a white male, date of birth August 8, 1953, FBI Number 260-514-J10. He has had numerous arrests since 1970, primarily for narcotics violations.

Congressional Staff Interrogates Ray

PETROS, Tenn. — The staff of the House Select Committee on Assassinations met with James Earl Ray for seven hours Monday and agreed to arrange a lie detector test for the convicted killer of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr.

The meeting was the sixth held with Ray since March 22 at Brushy Mountain State Prison, where he is serving 99 years for pleading guilty

to the 1968 slaying.

Robert Lehner, spokesman for the four committee staffers who met with Ray, said the lie detector test will be given Ray after the curgent series of interviews. Another interview will be held Dec. 2.
