

It is to be noted there are two klaverns of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) in the area covered by the Dothan RA. These Maverns are located at Dothan and Kinston, Ala.

MO 177-R, who is in the Dothan Klavern and has reported on members of this Klavern since June, 1966, has advised he knows of no member of this Klavern who has a potential for violence. He has reported on members of the Kinston Klavern since it was organized and knows of no one in this Klavern who has a potential for violence.

Investigation of Klan matters and klansmen in the Dothan and Kinston areas has failed to identify any klansmen involved in acts of violence or having this potential.

MO-177-R has advised that COLBERT RAYMOND MC GRIFF, JR., Dothan, does have a potential for violence, and MC GRIFF is a former member of the Dothan Klavern. He had advised that MC GRIFF was suspended or expelled from the Klavern because he was a trouble maker.

MC GRIFF is a bombing suspect and his whereabouts during the pertinent period of this case is already being checked.

In view of the above, it appears the only person in the Dothan RA territory to be checked out as far as his whereabouts during the pertinent period is concerned, is COLBERT RAYMOND MC GRIFF, JR., who is the subject of Mobile file 157-1677.



At 2:45 PM, 4/9/68, SA ROBERT RAY, RA, Syracuse, N.Y., who has been handling liaison with the Textile Marking Co. relative to the laundry marks found on the boxer type shorts and tshirt, size 42 to 44, allegedly left by the subject at the scene of the crime, called and stated that in addition to the 12 outlets in Alabama, six of which were in our territory as given by Birmingham on 4/5/68, the following laundries had purchased machines from Textile Marking Co. These individual laundries, however, were not being serviced by the Textile Marking Co. and there was a possibility that these laundries had sold the machines, had converted them to some other type of marking, or some such thing. The laundries, together with the model and serial numbers, are as follows:

1. Bishop Cleaners and Laundry Dothan, Ala.

Model #H5M4Bl SN 33095

2. Chin's Laundry 361 St. Louis Street Mobile, Ala.

number on the tape was O2B-6, with the O being cut almost in half, lending to the possibility that this might be a "D". He stated that in our investigation it should be noted that the tape was not centering, that it is one-quarter inch wide by one and one-eighth inch, but the machine was cutting off one-sixteenth of an inch short, which accounted for the fact that part of the O or D was cut off.

After talking to RAY, I called the Birmingham Office and requested that they send a colored picture of the laundry mark, which they have in their possession, which SAC GAMBLE said they would do.



On 4/9/68, EUSTACE BISHOP, Bishop Cleaners and Iaundry, 900 Blvd. St., Dothan, Ala., advised that approximately five or six years ago he had tried as a demonstrator such a Textile Marking Co. machine as above, but it was returned to the company's representative after a short trial period. BISHOP stated he could not locate the record on the machine but believed it possibly was purchased through the James E. Cox Co., Atlanta, Ga. The machine was never paid for but was returned to the company's representative.

BISHOP further stated that numbers 02B-6 or D2-6 are definitely not symbol numbers used by the Bishop Co. in Dothan, Ala.

The following additional investigation, not incorporated in re airtel is set forth:

On 4/8/68, Mrs. MARIETTA ADAMS, Clerk, Selective Service Headquarters, 474 S. Court St., Montgomery, Ala., advised the only record she could locate of an individual by the name of RAY CLINE, or CLENE, is a RAYMOND CLINE, who registered for the 1940 Selective Service Act. This individual resided at Belle Mina, Limestone County, Ala. His date of birth was and is described as a white male, 5' 11", 152 pounds, eyes blue, hair red, complexion ruddy. In 1940 when he registered he listed a CHRISTINE JOHNS CLINE as his wife, and residing at the same address. In 1940 he was employed by Dr. J. J. PETTUS. According to the registration card CLINE's left eye was no good.

On 4/8/68, Mrs. DAVID POLKE, 3321 Loch Haven, Montgomery, Ala., a neighbor of RAY H. CLINE, advised that RAY CLINE has been a neighbor of hers for about the past three years, and that he is in the AF, but is not positive as to whether he is located at Gunter AFB or Maxwell. She stated that CLINE's wife is from North Carolina, and that he is believed to come from North Carolina or Georgia. His ex-wife resides in Georgia. She stated that CLINE has been in Miss., or Fla., on some type of military training and that he returned home about three or four weeks ago. She said the last time she had seen him was about a week or ten days She said up until that time they had two automobiles, one a late model car, make unknown, but white in color, and a rather old blue Ford. She described CLINE as being about 40 to 45 years of age, slender, balding, dark hair receding in the front, 5' 10" to 5' 11", 140 to 150 pounds, and medium complexion. She said as far as she knows he is eligible, or will be eligible for retirement from the AF in the near future.

SAC JOSEPH GAMBLE, Birmingham, called at 10:50 AM, 4/9/68, and stated above captioned individual giving the address of 2608 Highland Ave. South, Birmingham, had registered at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, on 4/3/68, and had checked out on 4/4/68. He allegedly was driving a Mustang automobile.

GAMBLE stated that a check directly with the Montgomery RA had located a drivers license for GALT, describing him as WM, American, born 5'll", 175 lbs., blue eyes, brown hair.

GAMBLE indicated that 2608 Highland Ave. South, Birmingham, was a rooming house and GALT had stayed there from Sept. 1967 through Nov. 1967, but had not been seen at this address since that date. Inquiry at the address also indicated that telephone call had been made to Mobile in Nov. 1967, concerning a job aboard a ship as a merchant marine, and GAMBLE desired that records of the Coast Guard be checked.

Check of our indices on the nose and several variations negative.

A check with the Coast Guard by SA HARRY J. DEGNAN was negative and it was indicated that they would have a name card on anyone who had ever applied for merchant marine license through the Mobile Office; however, they would not have a record of the individual unless he had signed on some ship in which the Coast Guard was interested, had let his license expire and had same re-newed, or any such transaction with the Coast Guard. The Seafarers Institute Union (SIU) was checked by SA DEGNAN and was negative.

NMU was closed due to Dr. KING's funeral. Check is being made on 4/10/68 concerning their records. Credit and

criminal was checked, but no information developed.

ASAC REED checked the Catholic Maritime Club and it was negative from memory of the individual contacted. SA WILLIAM VARDELL checked the records on 4/9/68, and could find nothing identifiable with the suspect.

SA DAN O. STEPHENS later advised that a check of the records of the Ala. Dept. of Public Safety, at the request of Birmingham, was made and these records reveal that GALT in Sept. 1967 had made application for drivers license, saying he was unemployed and giving his occupation as Merchant Marine and the description as indicated above. He had applied for duplicate drivers license on 3/1/68; however, the application was immediately destroyed after the re-issue of the duplicate license. There was no violation recorded against his license.

Auto registration indicated that GALT had registered a 1966 Mustang on 8/30/67, a transfer from a WILLIAM D. PAISLEY, and had 1967 Ala. tag 1A-88354, and had been re-registered by GALT in Jan. 1968, allegedly now bearing 1968 Ala. tag 1-38993.

SAC GAMBLE called back and indicated that the Bureau had requested that all available handwriting concerning GALT be obtained from Montgomery. SA G. ROBERT MARTZ was dispatched to handle same and the officials of the Ala. Dept. of Public Safety would not let the originals out of the file, so copies, as well as photos, were taken; given to a pilot of a plane going from Montgomery to Atlanta and Atlanta was advised to get this handwriting on the next plane to Washington, to contact WFO and have plane met and the package taken to the Document Section of the FBI Lab.
