

POSSIBLE SUSPECT SUBGESTED BY MILTON (NO MIDDLE NAME) LAMOUREAUX, 135 & E. SPEEDWAY, TUSCON, ARIZONA

On April 6, 1968, MILTON (NO MIDDLE NAME) LAMOUREAUX, 135½ E. Speedway, Tuscon, Arizona, advised the Phoenix Office of the FBI that on or about January 29, 1964 he was staying at Smitty's Motel, Hartford, Alabama, when he was beaten and robbed and left unconscious on top of a heater in his room. He said that prior to the beating he was with the owner of the motel, SMITTY (LAST NAME UNKNOWN), when he observed a white male, age 31 to 33, 5'10" to 6' tall, dark blond hair, medium build, 165 pounds, regular style haircut, neatly combed, very clean and dressed neatly, to wit, a white uniform, possibly a laundry truck driver. He said that this individual presented an excellent likeness to an artist's sketch of the assassin of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which he had observed on April 6, 1968.

The following investigation was conducted by SA RAY-MOND J. MAXWELL:

AT HARTFORD, ALABAMA:

On April 8, 1968, HOUSTON A. SMITH, owner and Operator, Smitty's Hotel, advised that he remembers MILTON LAUOUREAUX of Tuscon, Arizona, staying at his hotel for two days around January, 1964. He stated that when LAMOUREAUX checked into the hotel on a Saturday night he was very dirty and told him he had been beaten by three men at Leon's Restaurant, Dothan, Alabama. He advised that after this person checked in on Saturday night he did not see him over the weekend. He went to LAMOUREAUX's room on Monday morning and found him passed out on the floor with the heater in the room turned up all the way with no windows open for ventilation. LAMOUREAUX had been drinking and taking some sort of pills. He was taken to a hospital and subsequently released to his mother who came from Arizona.

SMITH stated LAMCUREAUX subsequently tried to bring suit against him, charging he had been beaten and robbed at his, SMITH's hotel, but investigation showed he was not beaten in Hartford, but was involved in a fight at Dothan, Alabama. Dr. SAM WINDHAM of Dothan had treated him.

SMITH stated he recalls no one coming to the hotel wearing a white uniform. He stated that on occasions he obtains linen supplies from the Fensacola, Florida, Linen Supply

Company, but the drivers for this firm do not wear white uniforms. He stated they wear regular clothing. He advised he has no idea who LAMOUREAUX might be referring to as a person resembling the artist's conception of the killer of KING. He stated he, SMITH, saw this sketch in the Montgomery Advertiser, and it did not look familiar to him.

This is to record that at approximately 2:15 PM, 4/16/68, HARRY McDONNELL, Reporter for the Mobile Press Register, advised me that he had been advised by PETER F. SHEA, Harbor-master, City of Mobile, that he, SHEA, on 4/15/68, had received a telephone call from a reporter in New York. SHEA thought the caller was with the New York Times but was not sure. In any event, the caller wanted to know if the ship named "Red Star" had ever been in Mobile and SHEA advised the caller that he did not recall such a ship but would look it up in Lloyds Registry. He advised the caller that a check of Lloyds Registry did not indicate a ship by the name of "Red Star", but did indicate a Red Star Barge Line based in New York City.

The caller then requested to know whether or not approximately a year ago there had been some trouble aboard a German ship anchored at Mobile, and Mr. SHEA advised the caller that he could not recall any such trouble.

McDONNELL stated that he, McDONNELL, recalled, and refreshed SHEA's recollection, that on 1/18 and 19/68, the German cargo vessel, SS RHINE ORE, had been in the Port of Mobile and there was a suspected case of TB aboard the vessel and the entire crew had to have chest examinations at the X-Ray Mobile operated by the Tuberculosis and Health Unit of Mobile County.

McDONNELL produced a picture from the Mobile Press of Friday, 1/19/68, of the crew of said vessel lined up awaiting X-rays. In the forefront is one WERNER DREWS of Hamburg, a crewman aboard the German cargo vessel, who entertained his shipmates at the Port of Mobile while they were waiting for chest X-rays.

McDONNELL also produced artist's conception of ERIC STARVO GALT made by the artist at Mexican Police Hdqtrs. and it

was McDONNELL's opinion, as well as others at the press, that there might be some similarity between the picture of DREWS and the artist's conception of GALT.

McDONNELL indicated that he was sure the call from the newspaperman in New York was prompted by a UPI story which indicated that the German translation of ERIC GALT meant "Red Star."

Appropriate action should be taken to determine, if possible, whether or not DREWS is still aboard the ship and whether or not he might be identical with suspect GALT.



On April 15, 1968, FLOYD MANN, Shawmut, Ala., advised that he had just received some more information resa ding FLOYD BUDDY AYRES, and that JONES the attorney had called and said that in reconstructing everything that was said at their meeting he recalled that AYRES stated he had a high powered rifle behind the dresser in his hotel room. However, BUBBA DONES did not see the rifle. B ut he did see a revolver, cal. unknown in the belt of AYRES.

MANN stated that he just wanted to pass this along with the other information as he feels that Ayres may be a good suspect.

On 4/14/68, FLOYD MANN, Shawmut, Ala., telephonically contacted the writer at home and advised that he had observed an article in the Montgomery Advestiser, regarding "Uninvited Usher at Kings Funeral". went on to state that BUBBA JONES was with him and stated that ALOYD BUDDY AYRES, who was identified in the article as the uninvited usher who is an enclycopedia salesman, was arrested about two months ago in Lanett. Ala.

On 4/14/68 BUBBA JONES, stated he was a lowyer in Lanett, Ala. and had defended AYRES who had been arrested for DWI and viol. of prob. laws in Lanett, Ala. Jones stated that he had occasion to talk to Ayres and that Ayres appeared to him to be mentally unbalanced. During the talk Ayres talked of killing any SOB in the country with a high powered rifle and a scope. He also talked of how easy it was to kill some prominate person. He also seemed to be insenced with the racial problems. In his opinion JONES stated that AYRES was dangerous, an itenerant and a floater. He stated that the outsome was that he called Atty. Vennable in Atlanta who said to tell Ayres to get in his car and get back to Atlanta. Jones described Ayres as 37-38, 5'll" - 6'; 190 - 195 lbs, Hair light brown. Jones stated that Ayres should be considered a suspect in the King killing.

Above was furnished to Supr. Connors on 4/14/68 at which time a check of the indicies revealed that Atlanta was already aware of Ayres and that the Atlanta office wauld be aware of the univited guest that the funeral and the Mackground of Ayres.

He said that LENNARD had been in prison on a murder charge in Alabama for shooting a Negro. He described LENNARD as a white male, 35 - 36, 5'11" to 6', 175 to 180 pounds, brownish-red hair, home address, Birmingham, Alabama.

The following investigation was conducted on April 15, 1968, by Special Agent SPENCER H. ROBB:

On April 15, 1968, M. S. DEAN, Identification Officer, Alabama Board of Corrections, Montgomery, Alabama, made available his file on WILLIAM MADISON LEONARD, JR., Number 78492, which he stated was only former convict of this name or similar name he could locate in his files. He also made available a photograph of LEONARD made in 1965.

The offense report reflects LEONARD and two other men were reportedly forced off road in their car by three Negroes in another car. LEONARD then drove alongside the Negroes' car and fired a .32 automatic into the driver's side; this car then stopped, and LEONARD shot and killed one of the Negroes who he allegedly throught was reaching for a gun.

The file reflects LEONARD was paroled on July 13, 1959, revoked March 11, 1960, paroled February 10, 1964, revoked March 16, 1965, and was discharged November 10, 1965. He had a record of escape and several disciplinary actions while in prison.

He served at Draper Prison during the early part of his confinement in 1956 and 1957.


