The following investigation was conducted at Ozark, Alabama, on April 24, 1968, by Special Agent CLARENCE W. SLAUGHTER:

Records, Dale County Sheriff's Office, show that on November 19, 1967, one BILLY JOE FAULKNER, white male, age 39, 5'10", Midland City, Alabama, was arrested for Public Drunk, Case Number 11603, and Assault with Intent to Murder, Case Number 11604. He was released on bond, November 25, 1967, and on January 3, 1968, he pled guilty to Public Drunk, fined \$10.00 and costs, and On January 3, 1968, the Assault with Intent to Murder there was reduced to Assault and Battery. FAULKNER pled guilty to this charge and paid \$25.00 and costs.

Deputy DEWEY CHESTNUT, Dale County Sheriff's Office, advised that the Dale County Sheriff's Office holds a Grand Larceny warrant, dated April 5, 1968, for BILLY JOE FAULKNER, same issued by Holmes County, Florida authorities, Bonifay, Florida, and the warrant charges that FAULKNER and one SUE KELLY, also known as SUE KELLY FAULKNER did on April 3, 1968, steal \$348 in cash and currency and \$79.00 in merchandise, the property of EVELYN WOOD and CHARLIE HALL.

CHESTNUT stated that his department had attempted to execute this warrant, but their investigation had determined that FAULKNER is presently not in the Midland City, Alabama area.

CHESTNUT stated that FAULKNER is reportedly a homosexual.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent HOWARD R. LINSCOTT on April 24, 1968:

Mrs. FRANCIS GODWIN, nee FAULKNER, with residence at Route 2, Box 420-A, Dothan, Alabama, advised that her brother, BILLY JOE FAULKNER, a white male, age 40, height 5'10", 180 pounds, gray hair, brown eyes, is presently incarcerated in

the Dallas County Jail, Dallas, Texas. GODWIN advised that FAULKNER was living with SUE KELLY, a former Pensacola, Florida barmaid who allegedly is with FAULKNER. GODWIN stated that she did not know the circumstances regarding his arrest; however, she stated that she had received a telephone call at her residence from her brother in which he said that he was in jail in Dallas and that it was the fault of SUE KELLY.

GODWIN stated that FAULKNER has a mental condition and has threatened to kill members of the FAULKNER family. She stated that FAULKNER has on occasion assaulted her mother.

GODWIN advised that FAULKNER managed "My Place," a tavern near Graceville, Florida, owned by CHARLES HALL, and has worked in various hospitals in Graceville, Florida and Chipley, Florida as a therapist.

BENNY TICE, Assistant Postmaster, Midland City, Alabama, advised that he is personally acquainted with FAULKNER's family but has not seen BILLY JOE FAULKNER since about March 1, 1968. TICE stated that besides his parents who live on the old Dothan Highway, a sister, DORIS SERBER, lives across the street from her parents, and FAULKNER has a sister Mrs. FRANCIS GODWIN, of Dothan, Alabama. TICE advised that one time FAULKNER worked for a Dr. TYSINGER, Dothan, Alabama, and has done various promotion advertising work in the Dothan, Alabama area.

JOHNNIE DANIEL, Midland City, Alabama, advised that he last saw BILLY JOE FAULKNER approximately two or three weeks ago in Midland City, Alabama.

DANIEL stated that FAULKNER came into his drugstore and mentioned that he was still working in the same area as he was before, which according to DANIEL would be Chipley and Graceville, Florida. DANIEL stated that FAULKNER has worked in various hospitals as an inhalation therapist, a skill that he learned while working in a sanatorium in Texas.

DANIEL stated that FAULKNER does not have a high school education and that to the best of his knowledge is not a doctor.

DANIEL stated that FAULKNER appears to be mild tempered and to his knowledge, has never been involved in any violence whatsoever.

DANIEL stated that when he last saw him FAULKNER was driving a light green automobile which had Florida tags mounted on it.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent RAYMOND J. MAXWELL on April 24, 1968:

DARLENE HUTTO, Credit Bureau of Dothan, Alabama, advised that BILLY JOE FAULKNER, date of birth was placed in her files in 1950 and there is very little information in the file regarding FAULKNER between the years 1950 and 1960. She stated that in June of 1960, he resided at Route 1, Midland City, Alabama and previously resided in Panama City, Florida. In February of 1964 FAULKNER was divorced from SYBIL FAULKNER; and in May of 1955 he applied for a marriage license to marry BETTY SUE HOBBS, 802 Greenwood Street, Dothan, Alabama. Prior to January of 1959, FAULKNER reportedly was in the military service. In 1959-1960, FAULKNER reported to be a physical therapist throught the training he received while in the military service. The file lists the following employment which was not verified:

American Tobacco Company; Civil Service, Ft. Rucker, Alabama; Montgomery Ward, no location shown; Stan Back Company, as a salesman, no address shown.

She stated that FAULKNER was once listed as being employed at General Hospital, Dothan, Alabama, but stated that the hospital advised the credit bureau that FAULKNER was never employed there. He reportedly worked one time with one Dr. DONALD TYSINGER, Dothan, Alabama. He reported to have attended Troy State College, Troy, Alabama, and the University of Georgia. The file revealed that his father is listed as W.G. FAULKNER, a farmer. The file revealed that he was arrested

at Panama City, Florida, as follows:

In November of 1949 on a charge of Drunk Driving;

In April of 1954, Drunk and Disorderly Conduct;

In August of 1956 for Road Drunk;

He had an arrest in Dothan, Alabama, in February, 1954, for Breach of Peace.

The file revealed the last inquiry on FAULKNER was in November of 1965 by General Motors Acceptance Corporation, Dothan, Alabama.

Lieutenant JAMES E. DEAL, Dothan Police Department, advised that BILLY JOE FAULKNER, white male, born at Dallas, Texas, height 5'10", weight 160, frown hair, blue eyes, with a tattoo of a horseshoe on his right arm, FBI #725 199 A, was arrested by the Dothan Police Department for investigation on October 8, 1955 and was released. The records do not reflect the nature of the investigation charge at the time of the arrest. FAULKNER was listed as being in the U. S. Army at Fort Rucker, Alabama, and residing at 1209 East Greenwood Street, Dothan, Alabama.

ELAINE LOVE, Circuit Clerk's Office, Dothan, Alabama, advised that BILLY JOE FAULKNER, no other description or address, was arrested in Houston County, Alabama on January 4, 1956, for driving a vehicle without proper lights. She stated that he was arrested February 23, 1954 for Breach of Peace, but the case was nol-prossed.

PECGY ALBRITTON, Houston County Sheriff's Office, Dothan, Alabama, advised that her files reveal no record identifiable with BILLY JOE FAULKNER.
