Contact with warden's office, Jefferson County Jail, Birmingham, revealed it would be practically impossible to determine the identity of an inmate by nickname only during the year 1963 since there are confined daily an average of 250 inmates.



William Bradford Buie, author, has written a second article for "Look" magazine concerning the travels of James Earl Ray glace Ray's escape from Rissouri State Ponitentiary on April 23, 1967. The second article appears in Rovember 26, 1968, issue of "Look" (circulated Hovember 12, 1968) and alleges the involvement of an individual by the name of "Raoul" in the King assausination. According to the article, Bay contacted "Maoul" in New Orleans, Louisians; Selms, Alabams; Birmingham, Alabams, and in a metel across the border in Bexico.



Mr. CHARLIE TRONCALE, owner-manager, Granada Hotel, 2230 Fourth Avenue, North, made available the guest registration cards for his hotel during the period August 22 - 28, 1967, inclusive. A review of these cards resulted in the location of guest registration No. 9022 for one JOHN L. RAYNS, residence 1825 Lafayette St., St. Louis, Mo., who checked in at 9:05 a.m. on Saturday, August 26, 1967, and was assigned to Room 210 by Desk Clerk ADRIAN M. KOONCE at a rate of \$4.50. No record was maintained as to the time of checkout or method of travel. The card reflected the guest had luggage. The original of this card has been forwarded to the FBI Laboratory at Washington, D. C., for appropriate handwriting comparison.

A record was obtained of the names and addresses (where recorded) of the approximately 150 guests, other than permanent residents, during the period for which the cards were reviewed and two copies of the list are being transmitted to the Memphis FBI Office. No guest card was observed for any "RAOUL" or similar name during the period involved.

Upon observing the guest registration card of RAYNS, Mr. ADRIAN M. KOONCE identified his initials as having roomed RAYNS, but stated that due to the elapsed time he had no independent recollection of him. He stated he had previously been exhibited a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was unable to identify that individual.

No further information was obtainable from Mr. KOONCE or other personnel of the Granada Hotel.

### IN MASAZINE ARTICLE

NEW YORK--Iames Earl Ray, e man accused of slaying If Nartin Luther King, Jr., said that he probably became involsalid ved in a plot to murder King as he agreed, as a start, to haul packages of narcotics across the Canadian border.

Ray's own admission of possible implication in a murder plot was revealed in an article published in the current issue of Look magazine. The article, by author William Bradford Huie, details Ray's actions and movements after he left Canada.

While a fugitive in Canada, said Huie, Ray had met a man who called himself Raoul. After 8 meetings with Ray, Raoul offered the accused assassin living expenses, a good car, suitableidentification, eventual travely papers and \$12,000 if Ray would return to the United States, establish himself in Birmingham, Ala., and make himself "availa-ble".

Part of the mysterious offerwas that Ray would bring some pack ages into the U.S. via automobile across the Windsor-Detroit border before proceeding to Birmingham. The trip was carried out by Ray on August 21, 1967.

Of that trip for Raoul, wrote:

"I suppose I became involved, in some sort of plot to kill King when I first took those packages into the U.S. from Canada. would think it had all been detided before the car (the white 1966 Ford Mustang) was bought in Birmingham, as no one would have given me \$3000 in Birming

ham just to haul narcotics pss the border. But hobody told me anything about any planned murder of King or of anyone else In the article, Huie said that he has reached the conclusion that Ray is telling the truth, that although the plot to murder King existed as early as August 15, 167 Ray knew nothing of the planned murder right up to less that two weeks before the assassination actually took place. King

slain on April 4, 1968.

f Huie said that the "outline" of the plot to murder King be-came "visible to me" after analwing months of investigating re-search. Some of the features of the plot, as stated by Huie:

#Dr. King was to be murdered for effect by calculating who wanwid to use his murder to trigger violent conflict between white and Negro citizens.

#He was to be murdered dur-

ing the election year of 1968.
#There was no need, after the assassination of King, for the plotters to murder the actual kil er or killers in order to silence them forever. If he or they were raught, a trail could yield extra dividends of hatter and violence. (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

Mrs. BESSIE BARRETT, owner and operator of the Flamingo Motel, Highway 30 East, Selma, Alabama, telephonically furnished the following information:

She recalls locating a registration card for one ERIC S. GALT, which she believed was dated March 24, 1968. She stated that she recalls locating this card because she was contacted by an ARTHUR HANES, who is an attorney from Birmingham, Alabama. She advised that Mr. HANES came to the motel and asked her if she recalled an individual by the name of GALT staying at her motel. She stated that HANES had indicated to her that this individual, by the name of GALT, had been identified as the killer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She told HANES that she would never knowingly permit any individual such as this to stay at her motel and she could not recall any individual that looked like the photographs of this person, which appeared in the paper, as staying at the motel.

HANES requested that she review registration cards for the dates of March 1, 1968, through March 25, 1968, and after reviewing these cards she found a registration card for an ERIC S. GALT. HANES requested that she allow him to take this card with him. Mrs. BARRETT said she relinquished possession of the card to Mr. HANES and she believes it is in his possession at the present time.

Mrs. BARRETT stated that the bookkeeper for the motel is a Mrs. THELMA GARDNER, Services Unlimited, 1353 Madison Avenue, Montgomery, Alabama, and Mrs. GARDNER would have a "sheet record" of the motel occupants which would show the date, name of person, room he occupied, and charges; however, would not contain any information concerning make, model or license number of the individual's automobile or the address he listed as being his home.

She stated that the motel would have no records of

any prepaid calls received by GALT or calls made by GALT unless he received a collect phone call at the motel or made calls from the motel room, which calls would be placed on his bill and he would be charged for same. She stated that any calls made by GALT from the motel room should be shown on the "sheet record" or on a billing card in possession of the bookkeeper.

Mrs. BESSIE BARRETT, owner and operator of the Flamingo Motel, advised as follows:

She and her husband maintain some handwritten notes relative to telephone billings of various individuals who stay at the motel and who might make a local or long distance call from his or her motel room. She reviewed these notes for March 22, 1968, when an individual named ERIC S. GALT occupied Room Number 3 at the motel for a one day period. She could find no record of this individual making any calls for which he was billed. She stated that she could not review the original registration card as it is still in the hands of ARTHUR HANES, an attorney in Birmingham, but a copy of this card appeared in a Look magazine article of recent date. She pointed out the copy in the magazine article and commented that on the edge of the card is marked only "Pd". She stated that if any additional charges were to be added to the room charges, the word "over" is usually placed on the edge of the card.

Mrs. BARRETT furnished the registration cards from the motel for the month of March, 1968. A review of all of these cards for March, 1968, failed to locate any name such as "RAOUL" or JOHN L. RAYNS.

The following list of occupants at the motel was obtained through a review of the Flamingo Motel records which list covers the period of March 19 through 25, 1968;
