On April 18, 1968, Mr. WILLIAM DE MARTIN, 16 Garden Street, Meriden, Connecticut, advised that he is employed by the W. L. Walker Company, 21 Woodenbury Avenue, Bloomfield, Connecticut; however, he is presently employed in the Lakeville, Connecticut, area.

He stated that at approximately 3:30 p.m. on April 18, 1968, he was returning to his home in Meriden, Connecticut, from work at Lakeville, driving on Route 44. He stated in the vicinity of Salisbury, Connecticut, he picked up a hitchhiker, who related to him that he was on his way to Boston. DE MARTIN advised the hitchhiker that he was going in the wrong direction as he was heading south on Route 44 enroute to Meriden. This individual told DE MARTIN that he would accompany him to Meriden and then make his way to Boston from the Meriden, Connecticut, area.

DE MARTIN stated that during the course of their trip, while enroute to Meriden, this individual indicated that he traveled a lot and originally came from Burlington, Vermont; however, spent a great deal of time in Canada. The hitchhiker asked DE MARTIN if there were many colored people in Meriden and DE MARTIN said no. He further asked DE MARTIN if there were many colored people in Hartford, Connecticut, at which time DE MARTIN told him there were a few in certain sections of Hartford.

DE MARTIN stated that he dropped the hitchhiker off on West Main Street in Meriden, approximately one-half block from the railroad station, at approximately 5:30 p.m. on April 18, 1968.

DE MARTIN stated that after he dropped the hitchhiker off, he recalled a photograph of ERIC GALT in the newspaper and thought that this hitchhiker resembled him. He stated that this bothered him a little so he immediately went to the Meriden, Connecticut, Police Department and told the Desk Sergeant of this story relating to the hitchhiker who he had picked up; however, they did not take any action in this matter.

DE MARTIN described the hitchhiker as follows:

Age:	35 - 40
Height:	5'10"
Weight:	160 pounds
Complexion:	Ruddy
Hair:	Brown - semi-wavy, with a normal cut, and half bald
Characteristics:	Very neat in appearance; very nervous, smoking heavily
Dress:	Wearing a heavy wool, dark brown plaid sport coat, and a red sport shirt. Over his arm he was carrying an overcoat, and in the other hand, carried a dark blue "beat up" small bag

DE MARTIN stated the hitchhiker had a very rough voice, without an accent. He stated that by the hitchhiker's gestures and his manner of talk, he appeared to be a "homosexual."

On April 18, 1968, Mr. G. L. TRIPP, Station Master and Ticket Seller at the Meriden, Connecticut, Railroad Station, was shown a picture of ERIC GALT, at which time he could not make any identification. He further stated that he could not recall an individual with a brown plaid sport coat or with a red sport shirt, purchasing a ticket at this station. TRIPP made

available the following schedule of trains departing for New York: 8:40 p.m., 10:40 p.m., and trains departing for Hartford: 6:16 p.m., 7:07 p.m., 8:30 p.m., and 11:08 p.m.

The station platform was covered by SA MATTHEW STANKIEWICZ for the trains departing at 7:07 p.m., 8:30 p.m., and 8:40 p.m., in an effort to locate this individual; however, he was not observed in the area.

On April 18, 1968, the following places of business were checked by SA STANKIEWICZ in an effort to locate the unknown subject; however, met with negative results:

Cabin Restaurant, 103 Colony Street, Meriden;

He stated that when they arrived in Meriden, the unknown subject asked him where there was a good place to stay and the only place he could recommend was the YMCA on Main Street.

On April 20, 1968, Mr. DONALD J. GRAVES, YMCA, East Main Street, Meriden, made available his room registrations which reflected that on April 18, 1968, there were only three rooms which were rented out and they were as follows:

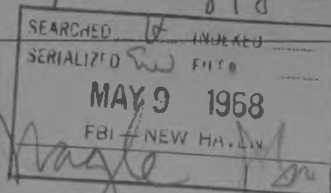

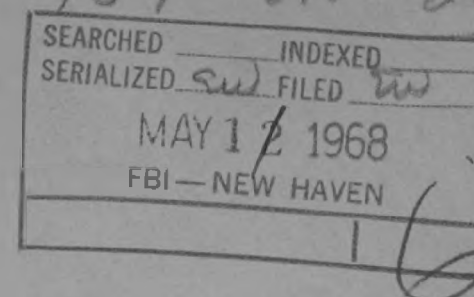
