Page 1, line one, should read "SUSPECT ERIC STARVO GALT,".

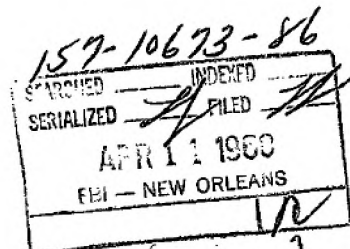
Page 3, line one, should read "INCOME TAX RETURN ERIC GALT".

[SAC JOSEPH GAMBLE of the Birmingham Office advised they had received a teletype from Los Angeles indicating they had some laundry marks at Hollywood, Calif. that "looked good" and samples had been had carried to the Lab; that the laundry was located one block from the place where the needle point pliers were traced to and had been run by one JAN WALLIS VERNON, aka. JEROME WALLIS VERNON, who matched the description of UNSUB.

While talking SAC GAMBLE advised he had received a teletype from the Bureau just then saying the fingerprints did not match.

WILLIAM MARTINDALE, Division VI, whose unit is handling this investigation, advised the Bureau desired the negative type of information we were forwarding by teletype on a daily basis. He stated it was their theory, based on the variances in descriptions in Birmingham and Memphis, there might be two persons involved.

SAC GAMBLE of Birmingham advised that when GALT purchased the automobile he had used the term "barger" which was unknown to the persons he purchased the car from and they asked him what he meant and he said he worked on a barge. GAMBLE said there is some indication this would be the type of language used by a foreigner in describing his work and that when we were checking out leads on the waterfront we should keep this in mind to determine whether or not this is a colloquial term used by people in the U. S. or whether it would be someone who is not from the U. S.

GERTRUDE FRITH, Lake Providence, Louisiana, advises son, BILLY RAY KING, left Lake Providence area on 4/4/68 and was driven to Greenville, Mississippi, by girl friend. She has not heard from KING since. MARJORIE KENNEDY, Lake Providence, Louisiana, girl friend of KING, advises she drove KING to Greenville, Mississippi, 4/4/68, to catch a bus for Quincy, Ill. They drove in KING's 1967 Mustang and subsequently on 4/4/68 she received a call from KING, who said he was at Clarksdale, Mississippi, where his bus had broken down. She then drove to Clarksdale, picked up KING, and returned to Lake Providence, Louisiana, at about 1:00 p.m., 4/5/68. She subsequently drove KING to his employer's office at Greenville, Mississippi, where he was to obtain transportation.

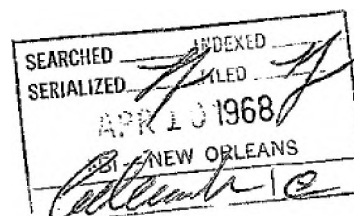

A memorial service was held at the Zion Baptist Church, Morris and Second Street, Franklin, Louisiana from 2:00PM to about 3:pm on 4/7/68. After the service Negroes gathered in front of the church where a march was formed. The march began about 3:50 PM and they marched to the court house where they sang hymns and prayed. They then marched to the community center where the march ended. SA LYNN observed the march, and no incidents happened, and only three white persons were noted in the march. Two of the white persons were ROSE MARY BROUSSARD, and her husband BEVERLY BROUSSARD. The other white man was not known by the Franklin Police Department.

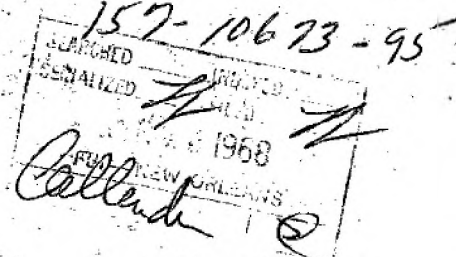

Petty Violence Continues to Plague City

Police said today that New Orleans continued to be plagued by minor incidents of firebomb attempts, vandalism and break-ins during the night.

At least 20 arrests were made. There were 15 minor arson attempts.

Most of the arrests last night were made by police against congregating groups refusing to move on when ordered to do so.

This group included 13 Negroes. Disturbances, in the last six days have come in the wake of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, the civil rights leader, in Memphis, Tenn.

Nine were arrested at Washington and Willow about 9:15 p. m. They are Jocelin Chatters, 25, 2425 Delachaise; Walter Pleasant, 19, 3726 Bruxelles; Elmo B. Cornelius, 30, 1024 Cherokee.

Norbert Ralph Jr., 27, 3418 S. Robert; Horace Register, 23, 1355 St. Anthony; Rogers R. Nelson, 17, 2023 Jackson; Willie Hamilton, 28, 1132 Carondelet; J. A. Labran, 20, 2801 LaSalle, and Earl J. Matirne, 20, 1821 Foucher.

POLICE ARRESTED James Warren, 21, 2309 Baronne, and Emanuel Dangerfield, 18, 2724 First, in the 2700 block of S. Claiborne and booked them with using obscene language and refusing to move on.

Two persons were arrested at S. Claiborne and Washington for disturbing the peace by yelling and screaming. They are Robert Lee Course, 20, 420 N. Johnson, and Teddy Wilson, 17, 1308 S. Tonti. Both are Negroes.

Lionel Joseph, Negro, 25, 1015 Washington, was arrested in the

3000 block of Laurel and booked with armed robbery in connection with the holdup of \$15 from Robert Lowe, 16.

Police said Lowe pointed out Joseph and three other Negroes who fled after they had taken \$15 from him forcibly about midnight.

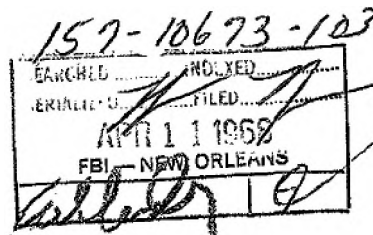

On the evening of 4/4/68, an anonymous telephone call was received by the New Orleans Office of the FBI. The caller claimed that on 4/3/68, he had overheard BERNARD LANSKY make a statement which the caller felt might have a bearing on the assassination. LANSKY was observed to give money to an unknown white male at the Downtowner Motel, Memphis, Tennessee. Hotels and Motels at Alexandria, La., contacted and names of registered guests indicating addresses as Memphis, Tenn., and other areas in Tennessee obtained.

EDITORIAL**To our responsible citizens**

Violent outbursts, triggered by the death of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., have swept over many Northern and Eastern cities in the last three days, and the damage from these scenes of riot and arson will mount into the millions of dollars.

It is, in our opinion, a tribute to Lake Charles citizens of both races that Lake Charles has been free of violence connected with the slaying of the civil rights leader.

Leaders of both races have expressed shock and dismay at the slaying, but there have been no outbreaks of violence, and no talk of violence.

Quite the contrary.

We attribute this to the fact that there are reasonable men in positions of authority who can speak and act for both races, and who have labored unceasingly to keep the relationships between the races peaceful and to keep the lines of communications open.

Early in his administration as mayor, Alfred Roberts set up an informal interracial committee to keep him informed on the needs and feelings of his constituents. Mayor James Sudduth has maintained that practice.

Those in authority have worked quietly but effectively to increase the number of public jobs open to Negroes. They have sought to upgrade Negro education where it has needed to be upgraded. Public support has been afforded such programs as Head Start, the Job Corps, and the Gulf Assistance Program.

Negroes in the Lake Charles area achieved the ballot years before most Southern Negroes did so, and they have used the ballot well. They have been able to make their position known, and they have become strong enough politically to be important in the eyes of the politicians.

Lake Charles is far from perfect, of course, as far as a majority of its Negro citizens are concerned. They would like to have better streets, better living conditions, less crowded schools and everything that a majority of the city's white citizens want.

As far as they are concerned, Lake Charles still has a long way to go. But they also have the feeling that they are part of the community here. They are not forgotten ciphers, dehumanized and hopeless, as are so many Negroes in the ghettos of the great cities.

We think this feeling was manifested in many of the speeches that were made at memorial services for Dr. King, held Sunday in Walden Stadium. It was a memorial in which both black and white took part.

The mayor was one of the speakers, and most of the members of the City Council attended.

"We live in a community where members of both races, are able to live together in harmony, and we thank God for it," one of the Negro speakers said.

"Looting and rioting and pillaging are a dishonor to the memory of Dr. King," another pointed out.

A representative of the Junior NAACP said: "There is nothing to be gained by violence. We say to all: 'Throw away your knives. Throw away your guns. Only through nonviolence can we gain the equality and justice that we seek'."

Still another speaker, quoting from the Gospel for Palm Sunday, reiterated that "he who lives by the sword shall die by the sword," and said that the goal of the Negro should be justice for all men, of whatever race, creed or color.

It has always been our experience that the Negro citizens of Lake Charles and of Calcasieu Parish have preserved a mature attitude toward their responsibilities as citizens.

The fact that there was no violence here as a result of the slaying of Dr. King came as no surprise to us. We did not expect any. Those who did expect violence were doing an injustice to a group of citizens who have always proved themselves to be upright, just and charitable.

We think that the events of the past few days have proved that there are strong bonds linking the people of Lake Charles, and we believe that these bonds will be strengthened during the days and the years ahead.

As for Dr. King, we can all join in denouncing the deed that took his life, and we can reflect that we still have a long way to go before we have achieved a society that is safe for white and black together.

Violence in any form is stupid and useless, because it usually brings about the very things it hopes to prevent. Violence against a man of the cloth is particularly abhorrent, and carries with it a particular stigma.

One of the chosen of God, dedicated to God's work, was struck down by a man, and such a deed must indeed have provoked God's grief and wrath. Insofar as we are children of God, we may share in the sorrow. Insofar as we are men, we must face the wrath.

NEAR STANDSTILL

Quiet, Tense City Mourns King's Death

With many public and private institutions closed or operating with skeleton crews, New Orleanians paid tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King today in an atmosphere that was basically quiet, but tense.

While final rites for the slain civil rights leader were being held in Atlanta, some Negroes marched to the Civic Center here for a noon memorial service.

All public and parochial schools and universities in the city shut their doors for the day and many businesses and civic groups delayed the start of their activities until after the funeral.

ONE GROUP of young Negro students, about 200 strong, walked quietly from London ave. and N. Broad toward the Civic Center. The students, from Dillard, Xavier and Louisiana State University in New Orleans, carried a black flag and coffin, on the top of which was painted, "I Have a Dream—1929-1968."

Its spokesman, Harold Vann, who identified himself as a sophomore student at Dillard, said the group was a "cross-section of interested students."

Civil rights leaders also were using the occasion to press demands for more job opportunities and better housing.

Mayor Victor H. Schiro, who yesterday met with Negro leaders of what is called the Negro Summit Conference, announced today he has agreed to hire a Negro aide and put him into his office within 10 days.

The mayor said his biggest problem would be "finding room in my front office for a new desk" and he said the City Council had agreed "to put up the money to hire a new man."

MEANWHILE, municipal services were hard hit today by officially sanctioned absenteeism, after the mayor agreed to grant leave for those workers wishing to take part in the memorial services.

A spokesman for the sanitation department said that 220 out of 300 men assigned to garbage routes did not report for work. There was no garbage and trash pickup today but the department expected to make collections on the usual Wednesday routes tomorrow.

ONLY STANDBY emergency crews were on duty in the street department and the Sewerage and Water Board.

Street maintenance reported 90 per cent of its workers absent with leave. About the same situation prevailed at

the Sewerage and Water Board.

The Parkway and Park Commission gave leave to 95 per cent of its approximately 340 employees and operated with skeleton crews and office staff.

One of the businesses remaining open was the Greyhound Bus Station, which held two memorial services in the station this morning. A priest from St. Joseph Church officiated.

In his press conference today, the mayor said the Negro aide he plans to hire would have the title of coordinator.

"HIS JOB will be to coordinate relations and activities between my office and the Negro community.

"Inasmuch as the population of the city is more than 40 per cent Negro, I think a Negro coordinator would fulfill a great need," he said.

The mayor said he doesn't know whom he will hire.

"I'll have to review my mind," he said. He noted

that the city employs about 2,000 Negroes, 500 of whom are on the Civil Service list.

Yesterday, the Negro leaders contended that department heads consistently pass over qualified Negroes in selecting Civil Service employees.

On this, the mayor said, "We are going to follow through on our directive that department heads hire on the basis of merit, not color. It is my hope that if a Negro is among the top three applicants for a given job that he will not be passed over."

ON HOUSING, Schiro again blasted the Municipal Courts. He said the city takes violation cases to court and there finds that "the enforcement is terribly lenient. Landlords find that it easier to pay a light fine than to fix up their slums."

The mayor said he wasn't sure of the legality of current proposals that the tenants be empowered to withhold rents when landlords refuse to remedy substandard dwellings.

"However, this is a situation that the landlords cause and they are going to have to confront it. Too many unscrupulous landlords have been permitting tenants to live in vermin-infested dwellings.

"The city is doing what it can to correct the situation. Our forces are limited, though."

AMONG THOSE converging on the Civic Center were the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, which marched from the Union Bethel A. M. E. Church at 2321 Thalia.

The Retail Merchants Bureau of the Chamber of Commerce of the New Orleans Area said member stores closed their doors until noon "out of reverence and respect" for the Negro leader.

Members of the Retail Grocers of the Greater New Orleans Metropolitan Area also opened their stores at noon.

ORLEANS PARISH School Board President Victor H. Hess Jr. said the board had decided to close schools today to respect the "feeling of students and teachers who wish to pay tribute to Dr. King."

All public schools will reopen tomorrow, he said.

In Jefferson Parish, parochial schools were closed but public schools remained open.

The Rev. Louis F. Genere, superintendent of Catholic schools, said that classes suspended today would resume tomorrow.

Murray C. Fincher, president of the Chamber of Commerce of the Greater New Orleans Area, said:

"We must reaffirm our determination to follow the path of law and order and to reject violence. Now of all times is the test of our belief in brotherhood and our dedication to peaceful solutions.

"Irresponsibility now can only compound the tragedy and postpone longer the attainment of the goals of justice and humanity which are the aspirations of people of all races and creeds."

Classes at Dillard, Loyola and Tulane universities, Louisiana State University in New Orleans, Southern University in New Orleans and Delgado college were all suspended today. Tulane will resume classes April 16, while Loyola and SUNO open again on April 17. LSUNO students return to classes tomorrow.

Xavier University also closed its doors today and will reopen April 17.

The march ended at City Hall where a petition containing "demands long sought by Dr. King for the poor people of America" was to be presented to city officials.

Facilities at the YMCA were closed. The city's new Human Relations Committee canceled its meeting scheduled today. Some of the committee members reportedly attended Dr. King's Atlanta funeral. The meeting was rescheduled for Thursday at 11:30 a.m.

The LSU Medical Center was closed. More than 4,000 mem-

bers and officers of the International Longshoremen's Association Local 1419 delayed work until after services. The night shift was scheduled to report at 4:30 p.m.

THE CEMENT Masons Local 567 were observing today as a day of mourning. The central office and all projects of the Housing Authority of New Orleans as well as all Total Community Action were shut down today.

Archbishop Philip Hannan said all schools of the Archdiocese of New Orleans were being encouraged to conduct religious services in "behalf of Dr. King and the cause of justice and charity among all men for which he lived and died."

St. Bernard Parish public schools were open.

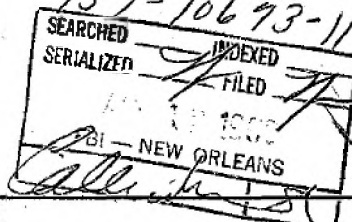

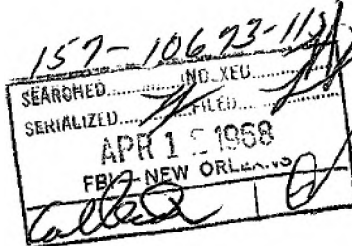

Inspector SULLIVAN said he had forwarded photographs to the office and the employee at the binocular store likes picture #2. This picture looks like JEROME WALLIS VERNON.

He said that they had GALT going in through Laredo, Texas, out of Birmingham on 10/7/67, giving his destination as Mexico City; saying he was single and employed in Birmingham. They do not show what he used for identification to get into Mexico. U. S. authorities show no Mexico exit at this time. Los Angeles allegedly had him in Los Angeles on 11/14/67.

The difference in the description between GALT and VERNON is that GALT allegedly has piercing blue eyes and VERNON has brown eyes. According to SULLIVAN, VERNON's description is too large. They are looking into the possibility of contact lenses.
