The Memphis Division has forwarded the following lead concerning captioned case:

In connection with the identification of JAMES EARL RAY as subject, the source of his funds becomes of paramount interest. Memphis, therefore, suggests that RAY may have been involved in some robbery or burglary not within the FBI jurisdiction and may be of interest to local police departments.

Each SRA should contact major law enforcement agencies to determine if they might have latent prints in unsolved armed robberies or burglaries perpetrated by individual fitting RAY's description. If so, Memphis suggests that these latents be forwarded the FBI Identification Division for comparison with fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI # 405 942 G.

ILLINOIS. THIS MAN KEPT RAY IN SPENDING MONEY WHILE RAY IN PRISON AND WOULD HARBOR RAY. RAY HAD ANOTHER CLOSE FRIEND (NAME UNRECALLED) OF ITALIAN DESCENT, APPARENTLY "A BIG MAN" IN SYNDICATE. THIS ITALIAN HAD APPARENTLY OPERATED WITH RAY IN PAST AND ENGAGED WITH RAY IN HANDLING STOLEN POST OFFICE MONEY ORDERS AND TRAVELERS CHECKS. AFTER SIX TO SEVEN MONTHS AS CELL MATES, JACKSON COUNTY JAIL, RAY SENTENCED TO THREE YEARS ON POST OFFICE BURGLARY CHARGES, TRANSFERRED TO LEAVENWORTH FEDERAL PENITENTIARY. TWO WEEKS LATER, CURTIS RECEIVED SIXTEEN YEARS SENTENCE FOR BANK ROBBERY AND SENT TO LEAVENWORTH. WHILE CONFINED LEAVENWORTH DURING THIS PERIOD, RAY SPOKE OF NO GIRL FRIEND AND CORRESPONDED WITH NONE. RAY MENTIONED HE "OPERATED" FREQUENTLY OUT OF QUINCY, ILLINOIS, WHICH MEANT "ENGAGED IN BURGLARY AND PAYROLL JOBS." WHILE HE AND RAY WERE INCARCERATED, THEY ENGAGED IN CROOKED POKER GAMES AND TOOK FELLOW PRISONERS FOR MONEY. RAY GOOD POKER PLAYER AND EXCELLENT CARD HANDLER. RAY MENTIONED UNDER WORLD AND HOODLUM CONNECTIONS (NAMES UNRECALLED) IN CHICAGO, DETROIT, TAMPA, AND TIJUANA, MEXICO AREAS. SERVING SEVEN TO EIGHT MONTHS WITH RAY AT LEAVENWORTH, CURTIS TRANSFERRED U.S. PENITENTIARY, ATLANTA, GA. CURTIS SERVED U.S. PENITENTIARY, ATLANTA, AND IN JUNE, SIXTYTWO, SENT BACK MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI, TO SERVE

ON ARMED ROBBERY CHARGES. WHILE IN STATE PENITENTIARY JEFFERSON, MISSOURI, AGAIN INCARCERATED WITH RAY. ON OCCASIONS IN SAME CELL TOGETHER IN "B" HALL AND "C" HALL. SERVED TOGETHER FROM SIXTYTWO TO SIXTYSIX. WHILE IN "B" AND "C" HALLS, THEY WERE TOGETHER IN THREE-MAN CELL, WITH THIRD INDIVIDUAL (WHOM CURTIS STATED COULD VERIFY FOLLOWING FACTS, BUT WHOM CURTIS REFUSED TO IDENTIFY). DURING THIS INCARCERATION PERIOD, PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY ASSASSINATED AND WORD CAME FROM OUTSIDE THIS PROBABLY CONSPIRACY, AND KENNEDY HAD "BOUNTY" ON HIS HEAD. CURTIS, UNABLE TO GIVE FURTHER DETAILS ON "BOUNTY". HE STATED IN SIXTYTHREE TO SIXTYFOUR, DR. KING'S MOVEMENTS BECAME TOPIC OF CONVERSATIONS AT STATE PENITENTIARY AND WORD GOT AROUND TO PRISONERS THAT "KK OF THE SOUTH" WHO APPARENTLY WENT TO BUSINESSMEN HAD RAISED ABOUT MILLION DOLLARS FOR "BOUNTY" ON KING'S HEAD. CURTIS, UNABLE TO GIVE FURTHER IDENTIFICATION OR INFORMATION OF KK OF SOUTH. FROM 'SIXTYTWO TO 'SIXTYSIX BEFORE CURTIS RELEASE, RAY MENTIONED A DOZEN TIMES "HAD HE KNOWN ABOUT A BOUNTY ON JOHN F. KENNEDY'S HEAD AND HAD HE BEEN OUT, HE WOULD HAVE COLLECTED IT". RAY STATED A DOZEN TIMES THAT "IF HE GOT OUT IN TIME AND IF KING WAS STILL ALIVE, HE WOULD LIKE TO GET THE BOUNTY ON KING". RAY NEVER MENTIONED WHOM HE WOULD CONTACT TO GET BOUNTY BUT ADVISED

CRIMINAL ELEMENTS KNEW HOW TO CONTACT SUCH PEOPLE. ABOVE STATEMENTS BY RAY OVERHEARD BY THIRD CELL MATE MENTIONED ABOVE. RAY HAD FRIEND IN NEW ORLEANS (FIRST NAME UNKNOWN), COIN (PHONETIC) SPELLED LIKE "QUARTER OR DIME", WHO APPARENTLY A FENCE, WELL CONNECTED WITH HOODLUM ELEMENTS AND WHO IN 'FIFTYFIVE WAS FIFTYFIVE OR SIXTYFIVE YEARS OLD, WHOM WOULD HARBOR RAY. CURTIS KNEW NO CLOSE FRIENDS OF ASSOCIATES OF RAY. RAY ALLEGEDLY THRU PRISON GRAPE VINE HAD WIFE, BUT NEVER MENTIONED BY RAY; HOWEVER, FEW PRISONERS MENTION FAMILY CONNECTIONS. RAY ALSO MENTIONED GAMBLING IN LOS ANGELES. RAY WAS "HIGH LIVER" WHEN OUTSIDE AND WOULD ASSOCIATE WITH PROSTITUTES, TAKING ONE FROM TOWN TO TOWN. RAY WITH REGARD TO KING'S KILLING INDICATED HE WOULD MAKE ALL RULES AND WOULD IN ALL PROBABILITY DEMAND BOUNTY MONEY BE PUT IN BANK. RAY MENTIONED THREE FOREIGN COUNTRIES WHICH HE HAD READ ABOUT, WHICH CURTIS ASSUMED RAY WOULD GO TO IF OUT OF UNITED STATES. THESE ARE NEW ZEALAND, BRAZIL, AND SWITZERLAND. CURTIS OF OPINION, NOT OVER THREE PEOPLE WOULD BE INVOLVED IN ACTUAL ASSASSINATION. IT WOULD HAVE BEEN WELL PLANNED WITH DIVERSIONARY MEASURES AND SECOND INDIVIDUAL, NOT RAY, WOULD HAVE DRIVEN GETAWAY CAR TO ATLANTA AS DIVERSIONARY MEASURE. CURTIS WILL NOT TESTIFY, AS HE FEARS FOR HIS LIFE, IF INFO GETS OUT. HE DEMANDED IDENTITY BE PROTECTED. IN SPITE OF ABOVE, SHERIFF MAULDIN ADVISED CURTIS HAS ALSO GIVE ABOVE INFO PRIOR TO INTERVIEW BY FBI TO LLOYD GULLEDGE, REPORTER, DALTON NEWS

CITIZEN NEWSPAPER, DALTON, GEORGIA. MAULDIN NOT PRESENT DURING THIS INTERVIEW AND DOES NOT KNOW WHAT INFO CURTIS GAVE GULLEDGE. MAULDIN STATED CURTIS THREE TO FOUR DAYS AGO RECEIVED LETTER WITH RETURN ADDRESS, MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY. CURTIS KNOWS NO SPECIFIC RACIAL HATREDS BY RAY, WHO IS MEAN IF CROSSED, BUT NOT AGGRESSIVE INDIVIDUAL. HE SAID IF RAY RETURNED TO ATLANTA AFTER ASSASSINATION, IT WOULD PROBABLY HAVE BEEN TO COLLECT BOUNTY.

Polk's City Directories for the greater Miami area from 1959 to 1968, and telephone directories for the same period checked and contained no information regarding WILLIAM LAMPHERE. Voter registration, motor vehicle and tax records reviewed and were found to be negative concerning WILLIAM LAMPHERE.

KAISER stated that this individual was wearing a blue checked shirt with dark trousers and white socks and that his left ear protruded out from his head more than his right ear. KAISER stated that if he should see this individual again, he would recontact the office and advise as to his location.

In response to the telephone call of THOMAS KAISER, 8409 Apple Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, this Agent went to meet him at 527 Canal Street.

KAISER provided the following information:

About 9:30 A.M., KAISER saw a man who looked like RAY walk past 527 Canal Street, toward the River. This man went to Decatur Street, then turned around and passed KAISER again as he walked back toward Rampart Street.

KAISER described this man as a White male; mid 30's; five feet, nine or ten inches tall; slim build; dark hair; left ear stuck out more than right; and a sharp nose. He also had four to six long scars running up and down on his forehead, from the middle to over his right eye. He was wearing a blue and white plaid shirt with the tail out, dark slacks, white socks and black shoes.

This Agent cruised the area from 10:00 to 10:50 A.M. with negative results.

KAISER saw RAY's picture in one of the local newspapers.

At approximately 8:00 p. m., 4/21/68, Mr. JOHN P. MULVEHILL, Room 802, Maison Blanche Building, New Orleans, La., who is a practicing attorney in New Orleans and a personal acquaintance of SA REED W. JENSEN telephoned SA JENSEN advising that he had just called his answering service (529-2647) and there was a message for him to call a E. GAULT at the Audubon Hotel, New Orleans, La.

Mr. MULVEHILL stated he does not know anyone by the name of GAULT but in view of the current FBI investigation regarding the subject he felt it was possibly some friend leaving this message with his answering service as a "joke". He stated he has not returned this call. He also advised that he has primarily a civil practice and knowing the location of the Audubon hotel he felt it was very unlikely that any individual frequenting this hotel would have business with him.

At approximately 8:30 p. m., 4/21/68, DON WALL, night manager, Audubon Hotel, 1225 St. Charles Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana, and also the bartender at the Bambino Lounge, which is connected to the Audubon Hotel, was exhibited a photograph of the subject and he stated this individual has never been at the hotel or bar to his knowledge. Mr. WALL also checked the subject's name and known aliases with his hotel register and there was no one by that name registered. He stated he knows every guest at the hotel personally as there are only 10 registered quest and they are all on a weekly or monthly rate.

While agent was at the Audubon hotel he observed no one in the hotel or the Bambino Lounge resembling the subject.





On this date JOSEPH TRUDELL, 5619 Magazine Street, New Orleans, La., advised the writer that on the morning of April 3 or 4, 1968, between the hours of 10am and 11:30am, while he was in the lobby of the Sheraton Charles Hotel, he noticed an individual, whom he described as a white male, 40 years old, 5'8" to 5'10", 125-135, and wearing a white straw Panama hat, gray suit coat, blue slacks, white shirt and tie, acting very strangely. TRUDELL stated this person seemed to be in a highly nervous state, chain smoking, constantly changing seats, walking around and frequently looking up toward the balcony. TRUDELL also noticed this person, when purchasing a pack of cigarettes, pull out a large roll of money from his pants pocket. When this person left the lobby he did so by himself and walking at a fast pace. TRUDELL did not see this person talk with anyone in the hotel lobby nor did he see the individual leave with anyone nor see where he went once he left the hotel.

TRUDELL does not recall who was on duty when this individual bought the cigarettes, and he did not tell anyone of his observations until PURNEL BARKER, Hotel Chief of Security arrived on duty.

TRUDELL observed two photo's of JAMES EARL RAY, and stated that the individual he observed in the hotel lobby may have been identical, noting that the facial features, as he recalls them, were about the same, but he could not see the person's hair because of the hat which the person did not take off. TRUDELL advised the person he saw was clean shaven and neat, but TRUDELL did not notice if he had one ear more protruding than the other, nor did he recall observing the individual tug at one of his ear lobes in a nervous fashion.

TRUDELL is retired, has no home telephone, and can usually be located in the lobby of the Sheraton Charles Hotel, Common Street. TRUDELL had never seen this individual prior to this one time nor has he seen him since.
