

He stated this Bureau would be immediately advised if any identification made.

Sgt. JOHN LAPINTO, Burglary Division, NOPD, advised that he had no unsolved burglary case in which there were fingerprints which could logically be compared with latents developed in this matter.

While this man was satting next to O'DONALD, O' DONALD had a current Times Picayune newspaper in front of him. said later when this man left the bar he saw RAY's picture on the front page of the Times Picayune and was sure the man next to him was identical to JAMES EARL RAY. advised he had some conversation with this man that sat next to him, who he believed was identical to JAMES EARL RAY, but he could furnish no information as to his occupation, place of birth or other background data. O'DONALD described this man as about 35 to 39 years old. between 5' 8" and 5' 11" tall, 165 pounds, brown hast and a ruddy complexion. O'DONALD thought his nose may have been broken at one time and he especially noticed this individuals front teeth were protruding and "looked rotten".

It should be noted the picture of RAY, which O'DONALD saw in the Times Picayune, was not particularly distinct and O'DONALD did not give this writer the impression his information was particularly reliable.







This defendant on April 1, 1955 entered a plea of guilty to an Information in 🦿 one count which charges that he on or about March 21, 1955 at Kansas City, Mibsouri Fnowingly, wilfully, unlawfully, and isloniously for, ed a material endorsement on a G. S. Post Cifice Department Honey Indon No. 7-12,239,597. On this seme date a companion, Valter Terry Rife, entered a place of guilty in Dockah No. 19169 to an information in one count charging him with the formery on March 21, 1955 of postal money order tio. 7-62,239,500. Imposition of sentence as to defendant and his companion was deferred and this presentence investigation les ordered.

The facts of the case are as follows: In March 7, 1955 the 8. 3. Fost Office at fol'erville, Illinois was burglarised and sixty-six blank W. S. Postal Konsy Orders, Serial Wos. 7-62,237,535 to 7-62,239,600 inclusive, and the office validating stamp were stolen. On Harch 8, 1955 at Alton, Illinois en unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of thems stolen money orders. On March 21, 1953 one of the stolen money orders, order No. 7-h2,239,597, was presented to Askin's Clothing Company, 1276 Grand Avenue, Kansas City, Misecuri, by an unknown person in payment for a suit of elothes which was never licked up after alterations had been made. This money order, which was in the amount of \$75.00 was tade payable to killard i. McBride with the purchaser being shown as Vernon iciride. On this same date an unknown person prosented stalen money order No. 7-12,237,568 to the Chaffer Office Machina Company, 1810 Grand Avenue, Eaneas City, Missouri, in regment for a used portable Remington type-criter. This money order, too, was in the ascent of \$75.00 payable to Willard J. LeBride with the vurchaser being shown as vernon McBride. The manager of this lim, being suspicious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the custom: The employee moted the model and make of the automobile entered by the customer and the license number of the car. Later when this money order are ascertained

to have been stolen a description of the customer and his automobile was given to post office inspectors who alerted the Missouri State Highway Patrol. A highway patrolman on March 23, 1955 at Mannibal, Missouri arrested in this automobile Malter Terry Mife, Jemes Earl Ray, and a woman companion with his been released. Thirty-four of the money orders stolen from the Kellerville, Diincis Post office were found hidden under the dash above the glove compartment in this automobile. All of them had been stamped with the validating stamp. Some were made out ready for cashing while others were not.

On March Ch, 1955 Rife executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he admitted he had prepared, forged and uttored the postal money order presented to the Chaffee Office Sapply Company in Manses City. He adulted preparing the nume, order which was attered on forged endorsement at askin's clothing Company, Langar Clity, Missouri. He additued that he and prepared the isce of the money orders made ready for cashing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other money orders on forged andorsements in the states of Florida, louislana, Arkaneas, ami Fissouri. We recalled unsuccessfully attempting to cash the money order at Altar, Illiquia on March 9, 1955. In his statement he admits that he purchased in Coincy, Illingis the stolen comey orders. They were sold to him by an unidentified man for \$20. On March 2h, 1955 Ray, declining to excente statement for postal insyrctors, did verbally state that he had particleated with "die in the enshing of the stolen money orders in the various states. He devied noticelly knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he exhittedly presumed that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for (22. He admitted that it was be who forged and hittered the consy order presented by Askin's Clothing Company in Kansas City, Missouri. He stated that he curchased for Il in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willard J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two mency orders attered by Rife and Ray in Fanses City, lies are as well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illians have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the mency orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 15, 1955 when reinterviewed by tostal inspectors Rife and Ray gave particulars relating to the coshing of twenty-seven additional stolen money orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. The particulars are as set out in the following table:

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rife and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the rosm which they occupied a quantity of merchandics they had acquired by passing the stolen memby exters. Defendent refuses to identify his several cents and uncles the reside

in Cuincy, Illinois.

### IV. HOME AND NEIGHBORHOOD:

When not incarcerated defendant has lived principally in Alton and Quincy, Illinois. Since his release from the Illinois State Penitentiary in March 195h has been rather transient. His last known residence for any period of time was at the Virginia Rotel in Quincy, Illinois.

### V. EDUCATION:

Defendent states that he completed the lot through the 6th grades at St. Kary's School in Alton, Illinois. He states that in 1952 while residing in Chicago, Illinois he attended the Academy of Adults and obtained the equivalent of a two-year high school education.

### VI. RELIGION:

Defendant danies any effiliation. His mother was Cathelic, and his father was Protestant. While in military services he infrequently attended Cathelia services.

## VII. INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

None.

#### VIII. HEALTH:

Defenient is 5' 10g" tall, voighs 170 lbs., has a raidy emploxion, blue eyes, and brown hair. There are no apparent marks or scars of identification. He apparently is in good health. He states that before becoming involved in the instant offence he was in the process of potitioning for similtance to a Voice and Hospital in Illinois for a general physical chackup. He desire a history of current other than a tennillactory in Chicago in 1952. He desire a history of veneral disease or the use of newcotics. He states that he is a "madernia drinker."

#### IX. EMPLOYEENT AND MILITARY HISTORY:

Defendent states that at Alten, Illinois on February 19, 1946 he enlisted in the U.S. Army. He received his basic training at Comp Crember, Miscouri. He was then transferred to Comp Ailmer, New Jersey to await transportation to the European Theater of Operations. He states that he left the continental limits of the United States for Germany in July of 1946. Gverseas he was attached to the 382md Military Police Batialion. He edmits that he was once ANGL for a period of two days which resulted in a suspended contence to confinement for period of sixty days. He returned to the United States from Commony in December of 1948 and was, he states, on December 23, 1948 given a general discharge under honorable conditions.

Defendent states that his last employment was with an uncle when he refuses to identify but who resides in Quincy, Illinois. He worked for this uncle as a painter for a period of time in the summer of 195h.

He claims that from August 1951 to May 1953 he was employed by the Borg Erickson Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. This employment was terminated when he was arrested for robbery, which eventually resulted in a penitentiary sentence.

He states that from July of 1950 to June 1951 he was employed by the Arbey Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. He was discharged from this employment for absenteeism caused by his arrest in Alton, Illinois for vagrancy when visiting in that city.

He claims that from April 1950 to July of 1950 he was employed as a laborer of a wage of 90¢ per hour by the Noo Produce Company, Chicago, Illinois. Es claim to have left this employment to accept more lucrative employment.

From July 19h9 to September 19h9 defeatant states he was employed as a laborer at a wage of \$1.10 per hour by the Dryden Rubber Company, Chicago, Illinois. He quit this job to move to California.

He purports that from May 19kk to Describer of 19kK he was employed at a wage of 65¢ per hour by the International Shoe Company, Hartford, Illinois. He indicates he was laid off by this employer in a general reduction of forces and that he then entered the error.
