

on or about March 21, 1955 forged a stolen U. S. Postal Money Order. This money order was one of sixty-six such orders stolen in a burglary of the U. S. Post Office, Kellerville, Illinois on March 7, 1955. Defendant emphatically denies the burglary of the post office. He states that his companion in the instant offense, Walter F. Rife, whom he met at a bar in Quincy, Illinois, suggested that he accompany Rife and cash the money orders which Rife reportedly had purchased from an unknown person. Defendant states that he purchased for \$1 the identification he and Rife used in uttering these stolen orders in various states. When arrested for the instant offense defendant was in possession of thirty-four money orders which had been stolen from the Kellerville, Illinois Post Office. He admits the forgery and uttering of fourteen money orders. His companion, Rife, has admitted the forgery and uttering or attempting to utter eighteen of the stolen money orders.

Approximately one year before becoming involved in the instant offense defendant was released from service of a sentence of one to two years for armed robbery in the Illinois State Penitentiary. In August of 1954 he burglarized a cleaning establishment in East Alton, Illinois. Although he admittedly was charged with burglary he apparently has never been before the appropriate court and apparently is not presently wanted on this charge. In 1949 in Los Angeles, California he was convicted of burglary and sentenced to eight months in the county jail. After serving ninety days of this sentence he was released on probation for a period of two years.

Defendant shows absolutely no remorse at this time. He anticipates receiving a substantial sentence for the instant offense. In writer's opinion he is a confirmed criminal and a menace to society when in the free world.

Re Kansas City airtel to Memphis, 4/23/68, which enclosed a copy of a presentence report from the Western District of Missouri, Kansas City, Mo., dated 4/26/55. Information in this presentence report indicated that JAMES EARL RAY, WALTER TERRY RIFE, and an unknown woman companion, in March, 1955, engaged in the passing of numerous stolen US Postal Money Orders in Missouri, Arkansas, Florida, Tennessee, and New Orleans, La. The specific information relating to New Orleans, indicated that RAY, on an undisclosed date in March, 1955, passed US Postal Money Order #557 (last 3 digits only), at Wright Tailors; that on 3/21/55, RIFE passed US Postal Money Order #558 (last 3 digits only), at Schneiders; and on 3/16/55, RIFE passed US Postal Money Order #559 (last 3 digits only), at Todd's Sportswear Shop. The first two money orders were in the amount of \$75 and the last money order in the amount of \$50. They were all passed in New Orleans.

The known names for which these money orders were utilized were apparently normally made payable to WILLARD J. MC BRIDE, with the purchaser as VERNON MC BRIDE.

One money order passed in Kansas City, contained the full number 7-42,239568, and these first six digits may be the same numbers as attributable to the above-mentioned money orders for which the last three digits only are furnished.

Office indices are negative in the name WILLARD J. MC BRIDE and VERNON MC BRIDE.

The current New Orleans Telephone Directory contains no listing in the name of Todd's Sportswear Shop or Schneiders, but there is a current listing in the name of Wright Tailors, 166 S. Rampart St., which may be the business establishment where RAY passed his money order.

It would appear that the US Postal Inspector's Office in New Orleans, would have a report of investigation in this matter.

At 1:15 p.m. this date USA LOUIS C. LACOUR called me from Washington, D. C. where he is attending the Attorney General's Conference of the U. S. Attorneys.

Mr. LACOUR stated that he had just received a telephone call from VETTERS, his Assistant, saying that VETTERS had just heard over the radio an announcement that a New Orleans industrialist had hired RAY to assassinate Dr. KING.

I told Mr. LACOUR there was a headline in this regard in the Red Comet edition of the States-Item this date by LOUIS LOMAX under the News Service NANA.

Mr. LACOUR asked me to read him the article, which I did.

Mr. LACOUR asked me about the matter and I explained to him that I had been on sick leave and was not familiar with this case, that SYLVESTER had handled the matter but that I did recall in a press release made by the Director it was stated that GALT left Los Angeles on 12/15/67 and drove his white Mustang to New Orleans. He left New Orleans on 12/19/67 and arrived back in Los Angeles on 12/21/67.

Mr. LACOUR said that he was familiar with LOMAX and said in the event any information is developed that a New Orleans industrialist was actually involved in this matter he would appreciate a telephone call.

A contact with a variety of sources in the New Orleans area determined that the New Orleans Port Authority would probably have the best mailing list for utilization in this matter.

Mr. MC CABE, Captain of the Port, New Orleans Port Authority, International Trade Mart Building, phone 522-2551, extension 292, was contacted in this regard and he stated his office would cooperate in every way possible and referred the writer to Mr. WILFRED MYLIE, extension 211, who is in charge of the New Orleans Port Authority Mailing Room.

Mr. MYLIE advised 4/23/68, that their mailing list is not all on Addressograph plates, but the complete list is compiled on an IBM Univac Address Label System. He stated the New Orleans Port Authority puts out a monthly magazine to approximately ten thousand individuals. He advised that there are approximately two hundred addresses which would include steamship companies and exporters out of the Port of New Orleans. There is another list of concerns on his mailing list which would cover approximately two thousand firms that utilize in some way facilities of the Port of New Orleans.

Mr. MYLIE advised that if ^{we} they desired to do so he would make any of the aforementioned mailing lists available so that it could be taken to Mailers and Printers, Inc. to be placed on our IO's.

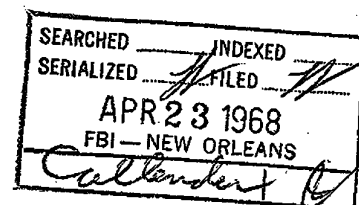
