For the information of Dallas and WFO, referenced
airtel enclosed a copy of the pre-sentence report for
JAMES EARL RAY, dated 4/26/68 from the Western District
of Missouri, Kansas City, Missouri.

This pre-sentence report indicated that JAMES
EARL RAY, WALTER TERRY RIFE and an unknown woman companion,
in March, 1955, engaged in passing numerous stolen U. S.
Postal money orders in Missouri, Arkansas, Florida,
Tennessee, and New Orleans, Louisiana.

In March, 1955, exact date unknown, RIFE passed
a U. S. Postal money order, number 557, (last 3 digits only)
at Wright Tailors; that on 3/21/55 RIFE passed U. S. Postal
money order number 558 (last 3 digits only) at Schneiders;
and on 3/16/55, RIFE passed U. S. Postal money order number
559 (last 3 digits only) at Todd's Sportswear Shop. These
three establishments are all located in New Orleans, La.
The first two money orders passed were in the amount of \$75
and the last money order in the amount of \$50.

The money orders were apparently made payable to WILLARD J. MC BRIDE with the purchaser listed as VERNON MC BRIDE.

One money order passed in Kansas City, Missouri contained the full number 742239568 and these first six digits may be the same numbers attributable to the above mentioned money orders for which the last three digits only were furnished.

On 4/24/68 U. S. Postal Inspector, THOMAS E. DAILEY, New Orleans, La., advised that any investigative report prepared by his office concerning the passing of the three money orders in New Orleans would now be located in either Ft. Worth, Texas or Washington, D. C. He stated that he assumed this report would be at the Regional Office in Ft. Worth, Texas, which is located in Room 202 of the main Post Office Building, Ft. Worth.

On 4/23/68, Mrs. MARY JAMES, 1413 West Walnut Ave., Gastonia, N. C., (Protect Identity), advised that she learned from a reliable source that on 2/1/68 MURKIN WALTER JAMES, 1335 Elm St., Durham, N.C., departed Durham allegedly to go to work on a boat at New Orleans, Miss. She is not certain if MURKIN did go to work on a boat but she knows that he never has worked on a boat in the past and has never had any gainful employment to amount to anything in recent years. He has been in trouble with law enforcement authorities in the past and less than a year ago shot and killed a white male, name unknown, at Durham, N.C., and as far as she knows, has never been tried for same as of this time. She learned that he returned to Durham about 10 or 12 days ago where he is presently staying. She said that her source wondered why he did not return to his employment which was allegedly on a boat. MURKIN is a relative of her husband, WALTER JAMES, who resides at 1311 Elm St., Durham, N.C., with his sister, OLD MAM JAMES. Mrs. JAMES and her husband are presently separated.

Mrs. JAMES also advised that she learned from her source that MURKIN always has a large sum of money in his possession, which seems very strange since he had no gainful employment to account for this. She does not know if he is a member of any hate group but that he would be capable of killing MURKIN WALTER JAMES and might have done so if paid enough. She described MURKIN as follows:

Mrs. HARRIS went on to say that about six years ago and she believed it to be 1961, a Negro male was murdered at Poplarville, Miss., and thrown into a small river near there. The river separates Mississippi and Louisiana at that point and is near Bogalusa, La. She believes there were six white males who went to a jail at Poplarville, beat and abducted the Negro prisoner from his cell. The Negro had been accused of raping a white woman in the State of Mississippi. She further advised that none of the six whites were ever arrested and she does not know if any of the six were Klansmen. She said that she knows the identity of two of the boys who were involved at the time. One was a white male by the name of MARK HARRIS, age 23, of Bogalusa, La. She declined to name the other male at that time since he is a friend of one of her daughters who is presently visiting in Bogalusa, La. She said that she would disclose this name after her daughter's return to Canton, N. C.

She further advised that HARRIS has had psychiatric treatment as a result of being bothered by the murder in which he participated. He admitted taking part in this murder and named the other boy whom she knew, but declined to identify at this time. She said that she learned from a very reliable source that HARRIS had participated in this murder and HARRIS admitted the murder to this source. She further advised that she never heard that any of these individuals were arrested for the murder or tried for same.

It should be noted that Mrs. LEWIS is obviously referring to the murder involving one MACK CHARLES PAKER which occurred 4/25/68.

About eight or nine months ago, the white male, whom she declined to identify at that time, made a statement before a group of people at a club near Bogalusa, La., that KIMB, referring to MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was on their list next. She declined to relate where she learned this information but stated she would give further details when her daughters return from Bogalusa, La.

Mrs. LEWIS said that her daughters, VICKIE LEWIS, age 18, and MARINA GAIL LEWIS, age 16, have been residing at 244 Montgomery St., Bogalusa, La., since 1/68 and VICKIE is employed at J. E. Henry & Co., and GAIL at the Anne Restaurant, both in Bogalusa. They are allegedly returning to Gastonia, N. C., about Saturday, 4/27/68, but she declined that they not be contacted directly until such time as she had an opportunity to ascertain their feelings toward divulging any information that might have come across while residing at Bogalusa, La.

Mrs. LEWIS also stated that her husband's brother-in-law, LAWRENCE BROWN, who lives near the river at Bogalusa is a member of the KKK. BROWN's wife is BARBARA BROWN, who resides at 1025 West St., Bogalusa, La.

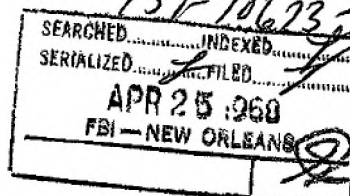

HERBERT STONE is a carnival worker, presently unemployed.

KENNETH STONE, husband of THERESA STONE, is currently confined at Angola State Pen.

HERBERT RODRIGUEZ, son of LORRAINE CALLOWAY and husband of DALE RODRIGUEZ, is an ex-prize fighter and bar bouncer in the French Quarter, and is presently unemployed.

Above all reside at 4019 Royal Street.

MARIAN de GRASSE resides at 2529 Cambronne Street, New Orleans. (need to determine who she is residing with and telephone number.)

In Los Angeles report of SA LEROY W. SHEETS dated 4/18/68, page 157, an interview with CHARLES J. STEIN, STEIN indicated that during the time in December, 1967, he was in New Orleans, he talked on the telephone to ERIC S. GALT from his sister's residence in New Orleans. His sister's residence at that time was 1429 Burgundy. STEIN identified his sister as MARIA LEE, who has since moved from the Burgundy address to 2001 Clair Avenue, Gretna, La.

Los Angeles teletype 1:35 a.m., 4/25/68, contains a reinterview of MARIE MARTIN on 4/24/68. She advised she believes RAY and STEIN were gone from Los Angeles approximately seven days on their trip to New Orleans in December, 1967.

RAY came to MARTIN's room in St. Francis Hotel shortly after he graduated from the bartender's school. MARTIN gave RAY a box of phonograph records to deliver to her mother, LORRAINE CALLAWAY, 611 Bartholomew Street. MARTIN stated she learned on 3/25/68 RAY left the box at the residence of her sister THERESA in New Orleans. MARTIN said RAY said he stayed at some friends who lived at or near the Chef Menteur Highway in New Orelans; RAY and STEIN went there to pick up RITA STEIN's children in December, 1967. (Provincial Motel records show RAY stayed at that motel December 17, 18 and 19, 1967).

Los Angeles advised RAY checked out of the St. FRANCIS Hotel 3/17/68, rather than in February.

RITA STEIN furnished the following background info on 3/25/68 to the Los Angeles Office.

Married at 18 in New Orleans to ALBERT DEMEN; to the best of her knowledge still lives in New Orleans. Had twin girls by this marriage. Later married STAN ROSA of New Orleans, used car salesman in business with brother CHARLES STEIN in New Orleans and in Los Angeles. Two boys by this marriage. STEIN stated ROSA died two years ago in Hollywood due to overdose of narcotics.

Neither STEIN nor brother CHARLES STEIN are employed. Receive Social Security payments from deceased husband.

RITA STEIN has no personal knowledge of second trip to New Orleans. MARIA MARTIN told he did make it in March.

[REDACTED] RITA STEIN's eight year old twin girls, questioned about December trip; recalled nothing except RAY used to hum loudly accompanying car radio music, sounding like a train whistle. Stayed in no motels, children ate in car. Remembered they stopped to throw snowballs somewhere in Texas during trip.

Los Angeles teletype of 10:41 p.m., 4/24/68, advised that CHARLES STEIN on reinterview advised there were about six telephone calls all during trip, mostly in Texas area. One call he believed completed was just west of Houston at a service station type establishment, just off Interstate 10 and it was at night.

STEIN also recalled person whom RAY was to contact in New Orleans was a contractor or engineer whose business was located near Industrial Canal. STEIN said in talking to MARIA MARTIN he learned a better location, that this individual may be located near Chef Menteur Highway and Jackson Barracks area.

According to STEIN, he stated he learned from LOMAX that RAY allegedly dated a white female named JERI.

STEIN further advised LOMAX had learned that RAY made a second trip to New Orleans about Valentine's Day, having picked up clothing from MARIA MARTIN which belonged to MARIA MARTIN's daughter. The daughter was identified by STEIN as MARION EISMAN (ph).

MARIA MARTIN said she gave RAY a box of records and wearing apparel to be delivered care of LORRAINE CALLAWAY, 609 Bartholomew, New Orleans, and that she, MARTIN, telephonically contacted her mother in New Orleans (on the 24th or 25th?), who advised some clothing had arrived in the mother's absence, time not recalled, which were taken from someone sent by MARIA by her sister, THERESA STONE, who was at the mother's home.

She then stated she recalled hearing RAY making reference to someone he knew who was located on Chef Menteur and Jackson Barracks, New Orleans. She had no idea as to whom RAY was referring.

UNRESOLVED QUESTIONS

Mrs. LORRAINE CALLOWAY, mother of MARIA MARTIN, on 4/24/68 advised she recalled CHARLES STEIN appearing at her house in possibly February, 1968, leaving a box of clothing belonging to MARIAN de GRASSE, 18 year old daughter of MARIA MARTIN.

STEIN was driving a small white car, no further description recalled. Accompanied by white male who did not leave car. STEIN left immediately. CALLOWAY did not observe STEIN's companion.

This appears to be December and Los Angeles has not furnished information indicating STEIN drove anywhere but to his mother's residence on Royal Street.

deGRASSE received call from mother on 3/16/68 saying box of clothing would be delivered in a couple of days by a friend she called ERIC. deGRASSE said she got the second box on 3/24/68 from grandmother CALLOWAY.

(on 3/24/68 RAY paid first week's rent in Atlanta rooming house. On 3/17/68 he checked out of the St. Francis Hotel in Los Angeles).

Mrs. DALE RODRIGUEZ advised in New Orleans her husband HERBERT received a telephone call in either February or March from a man advising he was bringing a box of clothing from MIMI in Los Angeles. At 10:30 the same night DALE answered knock on front door and took clothing. Furnished no description.

(MARTIN says sister THERESA accepted clothing at mother's residence for her mother. DALE said she got them. DALE, according to Agents, was reluctant and appeared to be lying).

QUESTION: How did RAY get address of 4019 Royal to deliver clothing.

At this time she apparently knew RAY was going south and asked him to drop off a box of phonograph records at her mother's home, LORRAINE CALLAWAY, 611 Bartholomew Street, New Orleans.

According to MARIE MARTIN, she found out from her mother that her mother was not at home so RAY brought them to her sister THERESA's house.

Re the first trip RAY made there with the STEINS, when they came back MARIE questioned RAY about the trip, what area did he stay in, etc. He stated he stayed with some friends. All she could get was it was near the Chef Menteur Highway, nothing else.

She was also asked about the girl friend, and said she did not know anything about any blonde.

She finally admitted she had a set of barbells that RAY left there on the day he left on the second trip.

She stated she is under treatment by a doctor for "pink eye".

Investigation has determined that JAMES EARL RAY left Los Angeles, Calif., on 3/17/68, and subsequently delivered a package of personal items to an individual at New Orleans. The date of delivery is unknown; however, this person states that delivery was made at about 10:30 P.M. We know that RAY was in Atlanta, Ga., on 3/24/68, and paid a weeks rent on a room.

RAY has mentioned this to persons knowing him in the past in the area of the Chef Menteur Highway. It is conceivable that on this trip RAY could have stayed somewhere in New Orleans, and possibly at one of the motels on the Chef Highway, as it is on the direct route from New Orleans, to Atlanta. There is no reason to believe that if RAY did stay at one of these motel he did not use the name ERIC S. GALT.

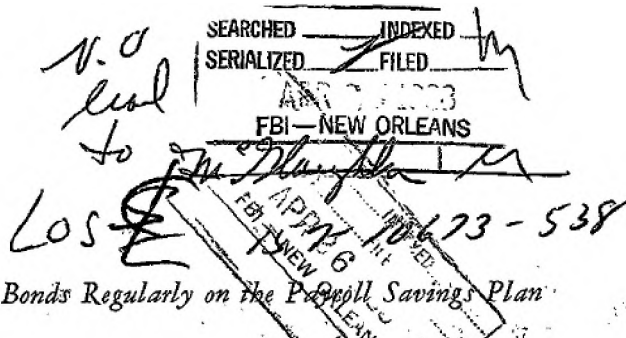

SUBJECT: MURKIN

At approximately 12:05 p.m., 4/19/68, an anonymous telephone call was received at the Shreveport Resident Agency from an apparent white male, who stated that late in the afternoon of 4/18/68, he was parked on a road eight miles east of Vivian, La., with a companion. Parked next to his vehicle was a white Volkswagen bus with an unidentified Tennessee license and a dealership sticker from a Volkswagen dealer, not identified, in Dalton, Georgia. The caller stated that his companion exhibited to him a photograph on the front page of the Shreveport Times newspaper and told him that one of the two white males sitting in the Volkswagen was identical with ERIC STARVO GALT. The caller stated he observed this white male and he identified him as being GALT.

The caller refused to provide his name or any other information and hung up the telephone during subsequent questioning.

On 4/19/68, the following investigation was conducted by SA RONALD W. BEINNER and SA JAMES W. SMITH:

While conducting investigation immediately south of Vivian, Louisiana, a white Volkswagen bus bearing a Tennessee license plate was observed proceeding south on U. S. Hwy. 71. Agents surveilled this vehicle into downtown Shreveport, Louisiana, and then to Bossier City, Louisiana, where the occupants of the Volkswagen bus stopped at a Gulf Gasoline Station.
