This is to advise that on 4/27/68, JOHN MC\MILLAN, Reporter, States Item Newspaper, home telephone 835-7491 advised he was furnishing the following for our information:

He said his paper carries articles written by LOUIS LOMAX, and that LOMAX is currently traveling from Los Angles with CHARLES STEIN, who has furnished information regarding his association with JAMES EARL RAY. LOMAX and STEIN were in Houston, Tex., on Friday and they were suppose to go to San Antonio on Saturday. STEIN is allegedly pointing out to LOMAX pay telephone booths from which RAY made calls during their trip in 12/67. MC MILLAN said the rumor among newspapermen is that CHARLES STEIN has told LOMAX that the reason RAY made the trips to New Orleans was because RAY was dating a relative, not further identified, of STEIN's. MC MILLAN said that it is evident that some of the information in LOMAX's articles is erroneous. He cited a claim by LOMAX of a mysterious blond who had disappeared from a hotel in Milwaukee. MC MILLAN stated he contacted the Milwaukee Journal and was told by a reporter that the paper and the FBI had found this mysterious blond of LOMAX's and she was "just a broken down broad." MC MILLAN said in the event LOMAX comes to New Orleans he would provide any information he might receive regarding LOMAX's activities.

Om 4/29/68, an individual identifying himself as Colonel GEORGE D. RENKOPF, telephonically advised he is a member of the USAF and is assigned to an Air Force base in Oklahoma. He said that he is the uncle of Delta Airline Stewardess RITA REHKOPF, and that his niece is in a higly nervous state. He was inquiring for any information in regards to her being contacted in regards to this case in order that he could get the straight information as his niece has told so many conflicting stories. Cobnel REEKOPF was informed that his niece was only one of many people in the transportation business whom the FBI has shown photographs of an individual we were seeking. These individuals included persons in the airline business, shipping industry, and so forth, to determine if these persons might have seen the subject or anyone similar in their employment.

Col. CALLAHAN advised that Major BERNARD RENKOPF, presently stationed in Thailand, contacted OSI Thailand and expressed concern over the following matter concerning his daughter, RITA E. REHKOPF, 6805 Veterans Highway, Metairie, La., who is employed as a stewardess with Delta Airlines.

OSI Thailand advised that she called her father twice, once 4/24/68 and again on 4/26/68 (Thailand time). She alleged that she was queried by the FBI as to the identity of particular passengers and she conveyed that this interest had to do with the MARTIN LUTHER KING matter (how this conclusion was reached is unknown).

On the call made on 4/28/68, she advised her father she was calling from her home and that an FBI Agent was present and that she was presently in the protective custody of the FBI.

She advised she was going to fly to Florida soon (purpose not stated) and said that when her parents were going to return to the U. S. in June, she would be unable to meet them as originally planned, until after the trial. (no elaboration on trial).

Major REHKOPF requested OSI to check on the validity of this matter without contacting his daughter.

Col. CALLAHAN advised that he had been in contact with his Washington office and advised them according to the remarks previously made to OSI by ASAC SYLVESTER.



\$972,889 Total Sought by New York Bank

Two suits were filed Monday in federal district court against Sam J. Recile and others seeking a total of \$972,889.64 which is allegedly due on promissory notes endorsed by the defendants.

Both suits were filed by the Meadow Brook National Bank of New York.

One action is against Recile and Frank Spalitta charging that \$400,592.04 is due on a note executed Aug. 25, 1954, for \$420,000 by Southern Land Title Corporation which is now seeking corporate reorganization under federal law.

It is charged that the installment due on Oct. 25, 1966 was not paid and that none has been paid since.

The other suit is against John.
B. Massengill, Mario M. Bonfanti, Julien E. Hatard, James
H. Phster, Charles L. Mammelli, Spalitta and Recile.

It claims \$572,297.60 is due on a \$600,000 note executed by the West Jefferson Professional Medical Plaza, Inc., and endorsed by the defendants. This suit also alleges that the Oct. 25, 1966 installment was not paid and no payments have been made since.

In both instances it is claimed that the acts of mortgage provide that if any installment is not paid at the due date it constitutes a default and the entire amount due becomes due at the option of the bank.

ED GAUDET, Manager, Sheraton-Charles Hotel, advised 1/11/67 that LOUIS KARNATZ is currently in New York and will return to New Orleans on Thursday, 1/12/67, allegedly with the identity of the group backing him who are ready to offer the State of Louisiana fifty million dollars in cash to build the dome stadium.

GAUDET stated that KARNATZ had advised him that when his group became interested in possibly building the stadium, he had been referred to MARSHALL BROWN as a contact to get to Governor McKEITHEN with this offer. BROWN had endeavored to shake him down for \$5,000 on two or three occasions and KARNATZ advised BROWN he would not give him any money but in the event they could get the right to build this stadium, he would be more than willing to furnish Governor McKEITHER \$100,000 for his next campaign.

GAUDET stated information has it that SAM RECILE and Mayor SCHIRO are trying to work out a land-swap deal with the ICRR for property RECILE owns in Baton Rouge, and RECILE will in turn sell this property to the State for a dome stadium, thereby pulling him out of the hole he is in because of his current financial problems.

GAUDET advised in confidence that the group reportedly headed by KARNATZ, was not considering the ICRR place. He stated there are only three or four people who know the area that is being considered and he did not want this information to become public knowledge. The area they are considering is Lincoln Beach. They hope to build close to the airport. The land is currently owned by the Levee Board and there would be no cost to the city for the land; there is possibility of tying in a marina area; there is plenty of parking space. They are also considering building into this stadium, hotel accommodations. KARNATZ is supposed to be able to swing it to get a professional baseball team in as well.

"This informant has not expressed a willingness to testify, nor is he considered available to testify in regard to the reported reasons for the

LCN meeting or matters reportedly discussed at this meeting.

"NY T-10 has advised that he had determined that the recent meeting of leading hoodlums in New York was called because of a loan manipulation in New Orleans involving CARLOS MARCELIO and SANTO TRAFFICANTE. Informant stated that the loan had been granted to one, LOUIS POUPIER, who fronts for CARLOS MARCELIO. MARCELIO bought back into this deal for 60% of the loan plus a vendor's fee of \$80,000.00 to be paid to one WAYNE HAUSER.

"Informant stated that some of this money was to go to TRAFFICANTE and TRAFFICANTE was not paid. Informant believes the meeting in New York was to straighten out these finances. Informant also stated that one SAM RECILE, a real estate dealer in New Orleans, had recently gone bankrupt because

MARCELLO had backed out of his operation.

"This informant has not expressed a willingness to testify, not is he considered available to testify in regard to the reported reasons for the LCN meeting or matters reportedly discussed at this meeting.

"The New Orleans Division has advised that RECILE, prominent Louisiana builder and developer, is currently involved in numerous civil suits throughout the country, relative to his finances. RECILE, according to New Orleans, is associated with numerous leading political figures in La.

"Under date of April 7,1967, the New Orleans Division advised that SAMUEL J. RECILE, President, Plaza Towers, Incorporated, and Southern Land Corporation, both New Orleans, Louisiana, is 35 years of age and was born and raised in Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana, and has been engaged in the oil leasing business and real estate speculation and development businesses for the past 13 years.

"Starting in October, 1966, the New Orleans newspapers began reporting that RECILE is in financial difficulty with Plaza Towers, Incorporated, a 45 story office apartment complex, in New Orleans, which is approximately 80% complete. The Meadowbrook National Bank and Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company, both New York, New York, in December, 1966, according to New Orleans, foreclosed on their 21 million dollar loan to RECILE to build

this structure through his Plaza Towers Corporation. Bankruptcy proceedings reportedly have been instituted by these banks relative to RECILE.

"On April 5, 1967, in Federal District Court, New Orleans, Louisiana, RECILE and Bank Attorneys reportedly agreed that the value of Plaza Towers Incorporated, was 21 million dollars. Appearing with RECILE were Attorneys for the Teamsters Union Pension Fund, Chicago, Illinois, who filed a petition stating that they were willing to invest 16 million dollars in this project. No decision had been taken by the Federal District Court regarding that matter as of April 7,1967.

"The New Orleans Division also advised that in December, 1966, RECILE's Southern Land Corporation, described as a holding company for numerous realty corporations controlled by RECILE, also filed Bankruptcy proceedings.

"The most valuable piece of property owned by this corporation, reportedly is the Bourbon Orleans Hotel, a newly constructed 500 room hotel in New Orleans. This suit was dismissed by Federal District Judge on February 3,1967, due to 'essentially lack of good faith in the matter on the part of RECILE'. RECILE has appealed that decision.

"On April 4,1967, the United States Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals took under advisement, RECILE's appeal from a dismissal of his petition seeking reorganization under Federal Bankruptcy Law.

"In March, 1967, Civil Sheriff, New Orleans Parish, seized and sold several small parcels of realty owned by RECHE in the French Quarter of New Orleans. This reportedly was done to satisfy State Realty Taxes long overdue.

"New Orleans further advised that in March, 1967, RECILE commenced construction of a 300 thousand dollar home in Covington, Louisiana."

On 3/13/68, NO 1232-C-TE reviewed material obtained during the raid of VINCENT TIMPHONY's residence, Belford Street, by the FBI on 2/29/68.

As to the figures appearing in the address book after the words Bank, Doc, Food, 10, St. Jude, and others, it appeared to the informant these were code names or numbers for customers and the figures are probably a day-to-day compilation of bottom figures. He felt that the figure number 10 is the code number for DCUGLAS FONTENOT, Lafayette, La., gambler who informant knows uses the code number of 10 with the TIMPHONY book. He had no observations of pertinence regarding the other material.

Regarding the material seized at the search of the residence of FRANK TIMPHONY on Esplanade Ave., New Orleans, informant stated that the sheet of paper having the figure 3108 at the top left corner is probably a small recap sheet and that the figures on the left are the amount bet into the book and the figure on the right, the amount the book owed at the end of a day or possibly a week.

As to the sheet of paper seized with the name VINCENT at the top and the first name "CUZZ" appearing thereafter, informant felt this "CUZZ" is a known nickname for BILLY BOSWORTW, a local contractor who bets heavily on sporting events and the horses. He stated that the name DILEO is probably a denist in the City of New Orleans, who is a close friend of SAM RICELI's, the recently bankrupt real estate developer. The name ROGER W., informant felt might be a FOGER WILSON, an oil man who runs several good race horses. Informant had no comments of particular significance regarding the other items of evidence seized.

day but stayed another daybecause of what Ray called "business."

RAY STAYED at the Provincial Motel, 1027 Chartres. Charles Stein Stayed with Mrs. Lee.

Describing Ray's actions, Mrs. Lee said:

"He kind of hung his head. He just stood there and didn't say anything."

She described him as skin, ny, with light hans to think his eyes were light colored."

SHOWN A PICTURE of Rays steel said the man she knew as Galt "doesn't even look like the guy." However, Charles Stein has reportedly

identified Ray and Galt as the same and the FBI has tied them together through fingerprints.

Mrs. Lee said her brother described Ray as "a god-send. He's a swell buy. He won't let me pay for anything."

Charles Stein told his sister he left California with a \$20 bill and still had it when he reached New Orleans.

MRS. LEE said both her brother and their cousin, Marie Martin, work at the Sultan Room, a Los Angeles bar. She said Ray agreed to drive Charles to New Orleans if he Marie and another sister, Rita Rosas, would sign a petition to get Alabama ex-Gov. George C. Wallace on the California presidential ballot on the American Independent Paragraphics

They agreed and Ray agreed to bring Stein and his two nieces, (Rita Rosas' daughters) ages 7 and 8, to Los Angeles from New Orleans.

Mrs. Lee said she last saw Gault the morning of the 19th when he drove the Mustang to her Burgundy st. apartment and honked the horn. She looked out and said.

"Charlie, there's that guy.".
They loaded the car and Charles and Ray picked up the girls from Mrs. Lee's mother, who also lives in the French Quarter. The four then left for Los Angeles.

Mrs. Lee said the mother, Mrs. Clovina Alonzo, has been questioned several times by the FBI, first on Easter Sunday, then again several days ago. (Personnel at the Provincial motel were also questioned on Easter Sunday.)

But Mrs. Lee, the only member of the family besides Charles to actually see Ray here, has never been questioned.

Mrs. Lee is an attractive brunette, with a dark complexion and brown eyes.

The disappearance of the Hollywood blonde, identified only as "Jerri," was reported by Louis Lomax, a writer for the North American Newspaper Alliance. Yesterday, Lomax identified the woman as a close confidente of Ray. Today, he said she vanished from the Milwaukee hotel room after he placed a long distance telephone call to her. I homax said the woman moved into the hotel three weeks ago with a man whose disagraphon is similar to that
