Upon scarching the premises, the officers confiscated one (1) large caid board box containing hundreds of slips of paper upon which are written girls names and phone numbers, men's names and hotels and hotel room numbers which the officers believe to be records of past prostitution dates, which the officers will attempt to confirm and should confirmation be made, these supposed records will be used in court as evidence.

Also confiscated was:

One (1) pair of Eincculars bearing U. S. Havy Bureau of Ships number Mark 32 Model 4 (N) 227444-1943 which is believed to be stolen property.

Mr. Regis Kennedy of the F.B.I. was notified in regards to the field glasses and is conducting an investigation in regards to their being stolen.

Relative to the above conversations carried on by Messina and Stien, Officers Frederick A. Soule, Jr. and Henry Spako, members of the Narcotics Squad were concealed under the house and heard the following:

(Phone conversation, Medina talking to an unidentified person)
"You got three guys, O.K. how much do they want to spend? \$20.00 a piece,
9.K., I'll call you back."

Numerous phone calls placed by Medina in which she attempted to locate girls.

Numerous phone calls placed by Medina in which she attempted to locate Charlie Stien.

Medina, in a very excited state, cursing Charlie Stien, when she was unable to find him, she stated as follows: "That dirty N---R F----R, he ain't playing cards, he's out F-----G his society whore. Well, I'm not going to take any more of his S--T."

Conversation between Medina and white male informer:

Medina: "Don't let nobody in, find out who it is first."

White male informer: "It's all right, it's Charlie."

Conversation between Medina and Stien:

Medina: "You M----R F----- C---------R you, you just lost me sixty bucks, three guys want to turn tricks for twenty bucks a piece and I can't find no girls, where the F--K have you been, out with your society whore?"

Stien: "For Ch---t sakes are you going to start that S--t again, I was out playing cards then I got some clothes. How come you can't find no girls? Hell, send them out to the "place."

Medica: "Why don't you send them to your society where" I got a guy in the bedroom right now, that got batter than a hundred with him."

Conversation between Medina and her mother and Officer Mahonev:

Medina to Mother: "Charlie will take you some and I ll see you tomerrow."

Mediau to Officer Mahoney: "You go with them, I got something to do."

Conversation overheard by Officer Frederick A. Soule, Jr. only, by Medina who was attempting to contact a person named Kay, when she was unable to do so, she left word for Kay to call her.

Conversation between Stien and white male informer in which Stien instructed the white male informer to take Officer Mahoney to the "8 Son's Bar" on Franklin Avenue where he, Stien, would contact them and have a deal set up for some girls to meet them.

Conversation between Medina and Stien after Officer Mahoney and the white male informer had left, in which Stien and Medina discussed Stien's whereabouts for the last night, during which Medina accused Stien of staying with a girl named Fredda May.



At approximately 18:15 TM on the night of Friday, April 13,1862, the undersigned officer, in corpany with Patrolmen James Whyte and Junes Tyler instituted a surveillance of the 2100 black of Daughine Street after receiving information that a stag show was to be held in this vicinity. The officers parked cheir police vehicle in the 2100 block of Royal Street, keeping the 2100 block of Daughine Street under surveillance by observing activity with block lars through Washington Square.

During the surveillance, and at approximately 10:35 FM, a white female with dark hair, wearing a black dress, tall and heavily built, was seen alighting from a taxicab and enter the residence at Z199 Dauphing Street. This woman was later identified as Setty Maddox, 1727, residing at 3045 Dauphine Street.

A few minutes later, at approximately 10:50 FM, another write female, with dark hir, who was recognized as mickey Messian, was seen entering the said residence. The Messian woman was observed during the surveillance exiting the residence at 21192 Dauphine Street, and entering the residence at 2119 Dauphine Street. This activity by the Messian woman occurred several times during the surveillance, and it was later learned that the was going into the residence at 2119 Dauphine Street in order to use the telephone.

The investigating officers maintained their surveillance on foot, approaching the residence in order to gain entry whenever someone would leave or enter. However, this was to no avail. Withdrawing from their close surveillance of the residence, and at about 11:50 FM, a white male left the residence, walked to the corner of Elysian Fields Avenue and Dauphine Street, then through Washington Squake, to a barroom on the corner of Royal and Frenchmen Streets, where he purchased a package of cigarettes. As the white male, later identified as Dominick George Maenza, Wh29, residing 2919 Grand Route St. John, left the barroom to return to the residence, he walked on Franchman Street to Dauphine Street, turning right on Dauphine Street, and again entering the residence. The officers attempted to arrive at the same time as Haenza, but were foiled in this attempt because the exit gate from Washington Square on to Dauphine Street was locked, and the officers were forced to walk to Elysian Fields Avenue and Dauphine to get cut of the Square, which incidentally, is surrounded by a six foot high iron picket fence.

After Maenza re-entered the residence, the officers returned to Fatrol Car #430, which was still parked on Royal Street directly opposite from 21192 Dauphine Street, and continued their watch.

At approximately 12:25 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962, Maenza and another white male, later identified as William Paul Trouard, WM32, residing 3433 Havana Street, were seen leaving the residence and proceed or foot up Dauphins Street to Frenchmen Street, where they turned right and walked on Frenchmen Street toward St. Claude Avenue. The investigating officers moved immediately to stop these two white males in order to question them about the curious happenings thus far observed. The two men we seen entering a Bulek automobile parked on the left hand side of Frenchmen Street, in the middle of the block, between Dauphine Street and Eurgundy Street. The investigating

officers pulled in front of the two white calles as the entered the Duick intoibile, observing that Macras entered the vehicle on the driver's side and
was seated be into the steering whisel, while Trouard entered on the passenger
side. Questloring the two men, they identified themselves as above stated.
Then questlored about the activition going on within the residence from which
they just came, Misman told the officers that he and his friend Trouard, had
just brought their dates home, and that they were preparing to go home themselves.

However, as the officers were questioning thece two men, an ther white male, who later identified himself as Julius Louis Wallfarth, age 32 residing 5745 Wilton Drive, case running up, and in an excited voice, asked Maenta and Trouard how much morey they had spent in the house. Before they could answer, Wollfarth blurted but that he had spent \$30.00 and had gotten. This occurred at approximatily 12:30 AM on Sabiday, April 14, 1962, and it was at this point that the officers again induitified themsulves to Wollfarth, and directed all three to return to the residence to assist the officers in gaining entry in order to conclude the investigation.

The undersigned officer and Patrolman James Tyler account the three men to the front door of the residence, while Patrolman Jones have submoned Patrolman Van Flynn, Grover Cunningham and John Sahuque to meet them at the residence. Officer Whyte immenuately re-joined the undersigned and Officer Tyler as they reached the doorway of 21192 Dauphine Street, upon which Maenza knocked twice with his fist. As he knocked, Maenza called out the name of "Nickey", and a female voice from within the room inquired, "Who is it?" Them Maenza replained, "Dominick", Nickey (Messina) opened the door, Whereupon the three men and the three officers entered.

It was noted that the time was about 12:35 fK on Saturday, April 14, 1962 when the officers entered the residence at 21192 Daughine Street. Officers Flynr, Cunningham and Sahmone reached the residence about two minutes later, whereupon all persons in the residence were asked to identify themselves.

The five white females on the premises identified themselves as

follows:

- 1. Marie Wilson (alias Mickey Messina) age 30, 7613 Lucerne St.
- 2. Louise Imman, Age 37, 1337 Leonidas Street
- 3. Lynn D. Gonzales, alias Rose Delong, age 22, 1331 St. Roch Ave.
- 4. Lydia C. Chaisson, alias Lydia Cropesa, age 18, 506 S. Rocheblave St.
- 5. Betty Ann Haddox, age 27, 3045 Deuphine Street.

Each of the women were questioned as to which one of them resided in the residence, each denied living there, or aying rent for the premises. When asked what they were doing in the residence, none would reply. None of the women would give any explanation to the officers regarding their activities nor would they answer any other questions propounded. In addition to Lambes, Traused, and Wollsfarth, who were rotuined to the residence with the investigating officers, three other white values were found on the previous when the officers entored. Those were identified as follows:

- 1. Salvatore G. Gaglio, age 35, 5735 Dorian Street.
- 2. Peter J. Schafani, Jr., age 20. 1501 N. Causeway Blyd., retairie.
- 3. Fordisend H. Jerruti, age 31, 369 Navarre Avenue.

Macras was first to admit that they had come to the recidence to see a stag show, and that the woman ramed Sickey charged them ten dollars at they entered. Gazlio corroborated this information formished by macras, and these two men talked the others into congresting with the officers in their investigation. In verbal statements remiered on the scene of the investigation, the men, when questioned, stated the following:

- Jaglio pointed to Louise Iran and told the officers that she had performed a crime against nature upon his person, as well as on two of the other men.
- 2. Trusard stated he had after he had given her ten dollars. Later, he gave Melby Maddox ten dollars and had with her.
- 3. Maenza told the officers that Louise Imman performed a prime against nature on his porson, and on other men present.
- 4. Wollfartr stated he had with Lyona Charsson and that Lynn Gonzales had performed a crime against nature on his person.
- 5. Schafani and Corruti decied having relations with any of the women, but confirmed that they had witnessed Louise Innan perform a crime against nature on the person of Mickey Nessina.

When confronted with the foregoing verbal statements, the women denied having relations with any of the men, and stated they were just having a party. They were adviced that they were under arrest, and after suscening a patrol wagon from the Fifth District Police Station, the women were transported there and booked as hereinbefore stated.

The six men agreed to make written statements encerning the scall them which went on at the stag show, and were transported in their private whiches to the office of the Headquarters Special (Vice) Smooth where they detail and signed the fellowing statements.

My name is Salvatore G. Gaglio, and I live at 5730 Dorian Street. Puring the week of Henday, April 19, 1962 the runor was round the store where I work, at Professional Pharmacy, 4440 May olia Street, that there was going to be a stag show somewhere in town on Priday night, April 13, 1962. I overheard a couple of follows talking about this stag show.

A friend of mine firelly found out where the stag show was going to be held and when, and he told we. At about 8:15 He on Friday, April 13, 1962, I mat this friend of hime at the head, and he told me the stag show was going to be held in the 2100 block of Sauthine Street. I drove down there with him and got there at about 9:00 FM, and just went into the house.

My friend and I just sat around for a while, and the girls put on an act. There were four girls in the place and they took all their clothes off. One of the girls, a Chinese-looking girl, was in her alip and bra. They were all mude, and a redhaired woman by the name of Louise hallows there. By

, that is,

We were not charged anything for we had to pay ten dollars to get in the place. We gave the ten dollars to Mickey at the door, as we went in. I was there about 45 minutes, and I left to go see another friend of mins. I came back at about 12:25 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962 to give my friend Ferd the keys to his car. I was there about five minutes when the police walked in and took all the woman to jail.

The foregoing statement was dictated by Salvatore Gaglic to the undersigned officer and was completed at about 1:50 AM on Saturday, tril 14, 1962, and was witnessed by Patrolum James Whyte.

The fullowing statement was distated to the undersigned officer by william Paul Trouged, and was taken at 2:47 AF on Saturday, April 1, 1962 in the office of the Peadquerters Special (Vice) Dauad, and witnessed by Patrolman James Whyte.

PMy name is William Paul Trouserd and I live at 3433 Havana Street. I work for mymelf, and with my father in real estate. On Friday, April 13, 1962 at about 6:45 FM, my friend, Dominick Reenes, called me and asked me if I wanted to go to a stag show. He talked me into going with him. He picked me up at my house at about 8:00 PM. At the same time, my friend, Julius, came over at about the same time Dominick arrived, and I was sleeping at the time. I got up, got dreesed, and told Julius to come with us. Dominick took up toward the place and told up the show would not be until 2:30 or 9:00 PM.

While driving toward the place, we told Julius where we were going and he said okay. We arrived there about 8:30 or 8:45 FM. I noticed that the place was around a playground, but I didn't know the name of the street. We saw Kickey's car, and we pulled in behind it. She took us to the house and we went inside with Mickey and four other girls. After we got in, Dominick gave the girl, Mickey, ten dollars for me and ten dollars for himself, and ten dollars for Julius. As we walked in, some other sen showed up and they came in too, and Mickey collected ten dollars from them also. Mickey left to go get some beer at about 9:15 FM.

We went in the next room to the front room, and the red haired girl named Louise invited Dominick into the room and got and and Then a couple of other guys who were there.

I got to talking with the girl named Lee and she wanted ten dollars and lee and she wanted ten and

Deminish Facture rendered the following signed statement, dictating his version of the happenings in the residence at 21192 Daughine Street to the undersigned officer at 2:25 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962.

Ply rame is Dominish Teorge Jacobs and I live at 2919 Grand Route St. John. I am employed at Vincent Machae Eanane Company located at #55 - #57 French Market Place.

I colled Mickey at 282-1586 and 288-3701 hast hight just before 5:00 fill on Friday, April 13, 1962, and before I could say engiting, she told me she was woing to have a stag show tonight. She told me to call back about 7:30 FM and she would give me the address. I got hold of my buddy, Billy, and Julium, who was at Billy's house after I called Mickey book, and the told me the address of the stag show would be at 21192 Dauphine Street.

I called my friend Billy and told hir I would rick him up at about 7:15 FM, and I told him I was going to a stag show and I asked him if he wanted to come along, and he said all right. At about 7:45 FM I want to pick billy up at his house, and Billy's wife and a friend of his by the name of Julius were there. He was alsoping at the time, and Julius was looking at IV. Julius asked us where we were going and I told him we were going to Jefferson Downs. He said he would come with us When we got in my car, I told Julius we weren't going to Jefferson Downs, but that we were going to a stag show. He raised hell with us and didn't want to go, but he was sitting in the middle between me and Billy, and we took him along with us.

We drove to the address at 21192 Dauphine Street, and we saw Mickey there. She told us to park the car and follow her into the house. There were three other girls besides Mickey in the house, and Mickey went out to buy some beer, but before she left she told the girls to go right on with the show, that she would be back in 30 or 45 minutes. She also charged us each \$10.00 to get in to see the show.

After Mickey loft, three other fellows came in and they sat around while the women put on the show. Two of them got undressed and started the fellowe, and. We went back in the room next door to the stag show, and that's when got out of a taxi cab and went into the house at 21192 Dauphire Street.

just sat down because said didn't know anyone and had just care here from out of town. That's when makked in, and and the red haired woman named put on a show. The red haired woman

Billy and I walked to my car and that's when the police stormed us and asked us what was going on in that place.

Then Julius came running up and asked on how much we had spent, and said he had spent \$30.00 in the place. The lice were talking to up at the time, and Julius said. That's when the police told up all to go with them back to the house at 2119. Dauphine Street.

Then we got to the house, I knocked on the door and aske. For Micrey. A voice from inside asked who it was, and I told her Dominick. She opened the door and the police walked in and arrested the woman."

The above statement by Dominick America was dictated to the undersigned officer in the presence of ratrolman James Whyte.

Julius Tollfarth rendered the fullowing statement concerning the activities in the stag show at 2119 Daughine Street.

"My name is Julius Louis Wollfarth and I live at 5745 Wilton Dr. I am em. loyed as an incurance calesman for Union Batical, 1410g l. Frond Avenue.

At about 7:15 PM on Friday, April 13, 1962, I went to my friend Billy's house on Havana Street, and at about 7:45 PM, Dominick Maenza arrived and they told me they were going to the race track and asked me if I wanted to go with them. We got in the car, and then they told me they were going to a stag show.

At about 8:30 PM we drove around the place where the stag show was going to be held and when we saw a girl by the name of Mickey with some other girls, she parked her car and Dominick parked his car behind her. When she got cut with the other girls and went in the house, we followed her. They introduced themselves, and said they had more fellows coming, and Mickey said she would go and get some beer. Dominick gave Mickey \$30.00. She left to get the bser.

The red haired woman named Louise

gave her ten dollars.

The little red head named Lee ne, so
I gave her ten dollars and Mickey came
in later with some beer and I drank a beer or two and
then later on, the red 'aired woman named Louise
Mickey. Then the little skinny broad, a Chinese

We sat around for a few minutes then decided to leave. When I talked up to the car where Billy and Dominick were, I acked them how much they sent in the place. I teld them I and spent about \$20.00. At this time, three wen standing there with my buddies said they were police officers and told as to take them hack to the house. We went back to the house with the officers and Dominick knowed on the door and acked for Nickey, either likely opened the door, the office went in an arrested them.

The above statement was dictable to the undersigned officer, in the presence of Estrolman James, Hayta, in the diffice of the Readquistors Special (Vice) Squad, and was conflicted at 2:11 All to Estrolay, April 15, 250.

Peter J. Sclafani, Jr., 1820, residing 1901 r. Caucerdy Blvd., Metairie, a ployed by his father at hestaurant Schafahi recated at 1901 N. Caucerdy Blvd., hetairie, dictated the following statement to Je Lueroiped officer, in the presence of Patrolman James Whyte.

"A few mays ago, I heard a rumon about a stag show that was going to be held somewhere. My friend, Ferd Cerruti found, out where the show was going to be held on Friday, April 13, 1962. At about 2:15 or 3:30 PM on Friday, April 13, 1962, Ferd and I left the restaurant together and he drove to Elysian Fields Avenue and parked by a park. We walked over to the house and went in. We sat around for a while and the show was hard to get started because hobody wanted to do anything. Finally, one of the guys

The small red haired girl named Lee and

I gave Mickey ten dollars to get in the place, and I only had five dollars left. Actually, I just wanted to see what it was all about. Then someone

Then the old red haired woman named Iouise

Ficke, came back at about 10:00 EM and
we sat around for a long time. Then a black haired
girl came in, a tall, heavy set woman, wearing a
black dress. We talked some more, and the tall woman
and finally

Before this, Mickey and the red haired woman maned Louise hickey. Before this, the same woman Then we sat around for a while, and then the police came in and raided the place. I forgot to mention

that the little Chinese-looking girl wise fellow tearing glasses.

The little skirny Chinese broad with the bal eye and who were glasses.

The following statement was illustred to the undersigned officer by Ferdirand P. Communi, West, residing 659 havener avenue, in the office of the Mondouarters Special (Vice) Squad, and was completed at 4:5% AV on Saturday, April 14, 1962. This statement was witnessed by Febrolmen James Tolor and James Wayte.

"No mano is Ferdinand B. Cerroti and I live at 869 Navarr Ave. I work at Restaurant Schafani, 1301 F. Causeway Blvd., Metairie.

Last weekend, on Saturday, April 7, 1962. I was in the Swamp Room on Caral Street, and I heard about a stag show that Mickey was going to put on during the cening week. A fellow I know by the name of Joe told me about the stag show. I knew Mickey because I went to one of her stag shows before, about a year ago, which she held at the Continental Room on Dakin Street in Jefferson Parish.

I called her on several occasions at the telephone number 282-1586 to get fixed up with a girl. I met different girls each time, and I paid her, each girl I would date, \$15.00 to A couple of times when I would call this number, a fellow by the name of Charlis would answer the phone, and I would tell him that I wanted a girl, and he would call Mickey to the phone. On one occasion, I remember I called and Mickey wasn't there, and Charlie told me where to go to meet the girl. One time I went to an apartment house on Josephine Street, right near Commander's Palace. It was the first apartment on the right hand side as you entered the building on the ground floor. On the occasion I talked to Charlie, when Mickey wasn't there, he told me to go to a hotel on Poydras Street, right off St. Charles. I remember I had to go upstairs to a room all the way in the back, and it was in the second room from the back, on the right hand side. I don't remember the girl's name,

but she was a nice looking girl, with black hair, about 18 or 19 years of age, well built. She charged me \$15.00

I calle! Nickey at the telephone number 182-1586 on fuerday, April 10, 1962 or Wednesday, April 11, 1962, and acked her about the stag show she was going to put on. The teld me it would be Friday, April 13, 1962, but that I would have to call back to find out whereit was going to be held. I called back during the afternoon of Friday, April 13, 1962, and she teld me at first that it was going to be called off, but then she said it was not really called off, but that the girls weren't in the mood. She teld me to call back in a couple of hours and she would let me know for sure. I called back a few hours later and she teld me the show was going to be held about 8:30 PM, and she gave me the address as 2119 Dauphins Street.

At about 9:30 PM, I went there with my friend rete Schafani and there were three girls already there. Mickey was there, Lee, a nice looking red head girl, young, and a thin, small black-haired Chinese-looking girl. After a few nimutes of conversation, I gave Mickey ten dollars and my friend Pete also gave her ten dollars.

A few minutes later, an old red haired woman named Louise came in. At this time, Mickey said she was going to get some beer and digarettes, and she had to go to her house out at Schwegmann's on the highway, and said she would be back in about 20 minutes. She told the other woman go shead and start the show, and that she wouldn't be too long.

The red haired woman named Louise started to take her clothes off, and a little while later, the other woman also removed their clothing. They finally

they had jut on the floor in the middle of the second room, and the red haired woman named Louise went over for a few seconds and the men the

Louise went over to some other guy and job, and then he left. She also Sal Gaglio and Peto Sclafani.

Three of the follows, Billy, the gay with the bad eya, and the Italian fellow said they had to leave. A few minutes after they last, we heard a knock on the dwor, and Mickey said, Who is it", and a male woice answered, "Dominick". She opened the door and the police came in and arrested the women.

I didn't have any money after I paid the ten dollars to Mickey to see the show."

When verbal statements of Easenza and Cerruti indicated that they had made previous telephone calls to Mickey Messing at the telephone numbers 282-1586 and 288-3701, this information coincided with a previous investigation conducted by the undersigned officer whereir it was established that these telephone numbers were servicing a residence at 4101 Stephen Girard in the Gentilly Woods residential arcs. This investigation, which was conducted and finally reported under NOFD Item Humber G-6524-61, coordinated with the officers of the Department's Narcotics Squad, resulted in the arrest of the Messina woman and Charles J. Stein on charges of narcotics possession and possession of stolen property.

According to Cerruti's statement, he had made frequent calls to the telephone number 282-1586 to arrange to next various woman for purposes of prostitution, the said arrangements being handled by Mickey. Cerruti also recalled speaking to a man at this telephone number, whome he identified as Charlie, and who on one occasion, told him where to go to meet a woman.

Upon learning this, Patrolmen Van Flynn, Grover Cunningham, and John Sahuque were dispatched to the residence at 4101 Stephen Girard to apprehend Charles Stein in connection with the present investigation. These

officers rejerted by telephone that they had checked the residence and found no one at hime. They were directed to check at the Fifth District-Police Station, and then if Stein was not found there, to check some of the night clube Stein was known to frequent. The officers rejerted by telephone a few minutes later that they had found Stein in the Fifth District Police Station arranging for the release of the women who had been arrested earlier from 2119 Dauphine Street. Stein was arrested at this point, and was booked as hereinbefore stated.

During the afternoon of Sati rday, April 14, 1962, the undersigned officer received a telephone call from Patrolman Arnold Ricey, assigned to the Detective Pureau, who advised that he had information that a warrant was outstanding for Betty Maddox as a fugitive from Tangipahoa Parish. Officer Pisey advised that he had placed a "FUZITIVE HOLD" on the Maddox woman pending arrival of police authorities from that Parish. On Wednesday, April 16, 1962, the following report was received from Officers Joseph Vitari and Artold Risey, and is mosted beginbelow and made part of this report.

"Patrolmen Joseph Viteri and Arnell Risey recort of receiving orders at 2:00 AM, April 14, 1962 to go to the Fifth District and question a white female, one Betty Maddox WF27 yrs, residing 3645 Dauphine Street, who was arrested with some other white females and two white males after the Vice Squad raided a sex party at 21192 Dauphine Street. Through checking it was learned that there was a stopper in the Bureau of Identification in Betty Maddox's police jacket stating that she was wanted as a Pugltive from Justice from Mobile, Alabama, and Livingston Parich, La. This stopper was put on her in March 1961 by Ptns. Vitari and Risey. For full particulars on this arrest by the Vice Squed, see white paper report made under item D-5829-62.

'. Officers questioned Betty Maddox whose real name is Elizabeth Ethel Maddox, and she said she is not wanted in Mobile, Alabama, and she was picked up once before for Livingston Parish, La., and check out all right there. Officers sent telegrams at 7:30 AM, April 14, 1962 to Mobile, Alabama, and also to Livingston Farish La., notifying them of Betty Maddox's arrest and to learn if she is wanted. Officers received an answer from Mobile, Alabama stating that Betty Maddox is not wanted by their Department. Also received a telegram from Sheriff Taft Faust stating that Betty Maddox is wanted by his Department. Elizabeth Ethel Haddox, alias Betty Maddox, was rebooked at the Fifth District as a Fugitive from Justice from Livingston Parish, Ia. at 3:40 PM, April 16, 1962. Betty Maddox was turned over to Deputies Donald Hoover and Oswald Johnson of Tangipahoa Parish; Arrest Book so marked."

A recapitulation of of onses committed within the premises tearing Funicipal Number 2119h Dauphine Street on the evening of Friday, April 13, 1962 through Caturday morning, April 14, 1962, between the hours of Scool Fr or April 13th, and 12:35 AM on the 14th of April, according to the signed statements quoted hereinbefore, is an follows:

- 1. Nickey Messina, with alignes, engaged in abrormal sommal relations with Louise Invan; was in charge of putting on the sex show, collecting ten deliars from each male who entered; falsified Department records by causing incorrect information pertaining to her residence to be entered in the Arrest Book of Record. She was also responsible, with Charles Stein, for organizing the stag show. Our B of I #67931.
- 2. Lydia Chaisson, alias Lydia Secelia Oropeza, alias "Lee" our E of I #105-886 performed an act of prostitution with at unidentified white male who left the premises before police arrived; performed an act of prostitution with Eillam Trouard; performed a crime against nature with Yulliam Trouard; performed a crime against nature with Julius Holfarth.
- 3. Lynn D. Gonzales, alias Rose DeLorg, alias Rose Sedillo, alias Roslyn Diane Sedillo. our D of I #82135, also referred to in foregoing statements as the "Chinece-locking girl", performed crime against nature with Julius Wollfarth, and crime against nature with Peter Schafani, Jr.
- 4. Louise Imman, our E of I #107-686 performed crimes egainst nature on Dominick Kaenza, Salvatore Gaglio, Peter Schafami, and Mickey Messina. She also committed crimes against nature on at least two other white males who left the premises before arrival of investigating officers.
- 5. Retty Maddox, alias Blizabeth Ethel Maddox, our B of I #99708 performed an act of prostitution with William Trouard. (She was returned on Fugitive Warrant to authorities of Tangipahoa Farish).

(tharles Stein, our B of I #55122, resided with the Messima woman at 4101 Stephen Girard since July 1961, and was familiarly known as Mickey's "cld man", having worked closely with her in the operation of a prostitution racket from their residence situated in an otherwise respectable neighborhood in the Gentilly Woods subdivision, sharing with her the proceeds from these illegal activities.

The fact that Charles Stein was arrestal at the Fifth District Police Station while attempting to gain the release of the Messian woran, and others arrested in the raid at 2119) Dampine Street, leads took suggest to the fact that Stein was not only familiar with the operation of the stag of a, but was implicated and absociated with the bessire woman in its organi cation as well.

Criminal Records from the files of the Department's Bureau of Identification, listing post offences of those persons accused herein; are attached hereto for study by the office of the Henerable Dimerict Atterney. and proper affidavits will be filed following this concultation.

It was further learned at this time that there was unusual amount of traffic to this residence, some of the vistors being known investigating officers as narcotics users.

Upon questioning the Medina woman about the marajuna cigarette retrieved from the sewer, she denied having made a stooping motion as she went out to the cab driver, and denies further that she had no knowledge of how the cigarette got there.

buring the search of the premises, narcotics of ficers found a quantity of white tablets and pink and brown capsules wrapped in tin-foil. These items were later submitted to the City Chemist and after being checked no presence of narcotics were found in the pills.

The two rings listed above were found contealed in a cotton swab box in the bath room by Officer Comstock. Charles Stein and the Medina woman when questioned about the hidden rings both stated that they knew nothing about the rings, that they did not own them and did not know how the rings got in the box. Both denied owning these items.

When questioned about other items confiscated from the premises, neither Stein or the Medina woman could produced any writter receipts showing purchase or ownership of these articles.

Continuing their search of the premises, the investigating officers found a number of photographs of the Medina weman in the nude, and one photograph of a nude white male.

Angeline Joseph, the colored maid, told the officers that she had been working for the Medina woman for about two weeks and stated that she knew nothing about stolen property or narcotics.

The three were transported to the Third District Police Station where they were booked as hereinabove stated.

At this writing, the Medina woman is free on bond while Stein and the Joseph woman are still held in the Third District Folice Station.

Investigating Officers are still checking out the property listed herein, but at this time efforts to locate proper owners, and efforts to establish positively whether or not this is stolen property, have been to no avail.

Information developed establishing these facts will be submitted in a supplementary report.

The Office of the Honorable District Attorney to be consulted at this time so that Charles Stein and Angelina Joseph may be avail the opportunity of securing their release from custody.

On Friday, July 14, 1961, Mercedes Miorano, with alias Mickey Messina. alias Marie Wilson and others, WF30, residing 4101 Stephen Grand Street, Angelina Joseph, CF37, residing 1237 Kerlerec Street and Charles J. Stein will 32, residing 4101 Stephen Girard Street were arrested from 4101 Stephen Girard Street, after officers of the Headquarters Special (Vice) Squad and Narcotics Squad had conducted an investigation and secured a Search Warrant which subsequently resulted in the arrest of the three aforementioned subjects, the full details of which is reported under Item No. G-6524-61.
