While on the telephone with his brother FRANK, FRANK invited him to visit him in Memphis, or to meet him at Hot Springs, Arkansas. LIBERTO advised that his brother, FRANK, follows the race horses and likes to go to a race track at Hot Springs, Arkansas, and bet horses. FRANK LIBERTO discussed his winnings and loses on the telephone with SALVADOR LIBERTO. SALVADOR LIBERTO does not recall the exact amounts of money he discussed.

Mr. ANTHONY/LIBERTO located and interviewed at his residence, 2211 Almonaster, New Orleans, Louisiana, and advised as follows:



Miss KATHY BLACK, bartender, stated that she recalls the incident involved as described above and stated that PLATO was in an inebriated condition while in the bar. Miss BLACK was exhibited a group of photographs in which there were two pictures of RAY. BLACK could not identify any individuals as RAY nor could she identify the photograph of any of the individuals who were in the bar on that morning.

At the time of his death he was executive vice-president of American Desk Company in Tampa, Florida. Since his demise she has resided at 635 St. Ann Street and operated her antique business.

At about 7:00 p.m., April 16, 1968, an unknown man walked up to her in front of her shop on the street. She described this unknown man as male, white, 5' 5" tall, slender build, sandy hair brushed to the right side, dressed in yellow short-sleeved sport shirt and blue-green trousers. She stated this man was about 35 years old and had a tattoo on the lower left forearm almost at the wrist. She believes this was a U. S. Marine Corps tattoo; however, she is not sure. She stated this individual was clean-shaven and physically clean, however, his clothes were filthy.

This unknown man told her that he had been on a one-week drunk and that by occupation he was a seaman. She stated he carried a napkin and had about 15 slices of ham in the napkin. This unknown man sold her the ham for fifty cents, which he said he needed to get out of town. He told Mrs. KELTON that he was given the ham by the cook at the Roosevelt Hotel, where he had just finished washing dishes for the day. They spoke for one minute about all the ships' horns blowing on the river at that time, as Mrs. KELTON wanted to know why all ships' horns were blowing at the same time.

The unknown man stated that he was on the river a week ago when MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed and it was noisy on the river then. He stated he did not know anything about KING's death.

LEO F. GRABLER, Chef, Roosevelt Hotel, advised he hires spot labor everyday to wash dishes. In return, these men are fed and paid a few dollars. Mr. GRABLER stated they were mostly alcoholics and other derelicts. Mr. GRABLER viewed a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and advised he had no one working on April 16, 1968, who resembled that photograph. Mr. GRABLER does not believe he has ever seen anyone resembling that photograph.

Mr. LIONEY HARRIS, Steward, Roosevelt Hotel, advised he directly supervises the spot labor used for dishwashing. Mr. HARRIS advised the photograph of ERIC STARVO CALT, which he viewed, did not resemble anyone working on April 16, 1968. Mr. HARRIS believed he had never seen anyone resembling that photograph.

Mr. GRABLER and Mr. HARRIS viewed the napkin furnished by Mrs. KELTON. Both stated this is not a napkin that would ever be used by the Roosevelt Hotel and it did not come from their stock of napkins.

Mr. WEEMS exhibited his record book reflecting that EVERETT became a tenant at that address on March 1, 1968, and was presently residing there. He stated that he believes EVERETT drives a green Volkswagen, with Louisiana license plates. He described EVERETT as a White male: 30 - 31 years of age; five feet, seven inches tall: 170 pounds: had blue eyes and light brown hair. He stated that he recalled seeing a rack slip with the name ERIC STARVO GALT on it and had called the name to the attention of MARK WELLS BOYD, another room clerk, pointing out to him that the name STARVO was similar to the name of a character in a James Bond novel. SALINGRE believed he viewed the rack slip with GALT's name on Monday, April 15, 1968, as he was off Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. WOLFGANG viewed the photograph of GALT and the wanted flier and stated he had never seen any individual similar in appearance.

Miss MARTHA MERLE HODGES was contacted at 1616 Ute Drive, Apartment F.

HODGES advised that she contacted the FBI Office because her sister, THERESA YOUNG, was interviewed by FBI Agents at Birmingham, Alabama, because her sister worked on Highland Avenue in the general area where ERIC S. GALT allegedly lived.

HODGES advised that she found out from her sister the description of GALT and she thought that possibly this individual once frequented Mamaie's Pancake House on Highland Avenue.

HODGES advised that the name GALT was entirely unfamiliar to her and that she was basing her comments strictly on the description as she heard it from her sister.

HODGES advised that she came to New Orleans about January, 1967, and that she lived at 2812 or 2816 Highland Avenue, approximately two to three years ago. She advised, however, that she has made frequent trips back and forth to Birmingham and that she generally visits that area at least once a month.

HODGES advised that she frequented Mamaie's Pancake House where her sister worked on numerous occasions and that she recalled an individual who drove a white Mustang talking to her on at least six occasions and that he generally would call her "PAT". She advised that he stated on one occasion that she reminded him of PAT and that PAT had possibly modeled for this individual. She advised that she did not know anyone in that area by the name of PAT and that she had no idea what he meant when he said PAT had modeled for him. HODGES advised that she saw this individual in the Mustang during the summer of 1967 and possibly during the summer of 1966.

CARL CURCIE PIER¢E EAVES furnished the following information after being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and after reading a waiver of rights form, which he stated he understood:

Mr. EAVES advised that his full name is CARL CURCIE PIERCE EAVES but that he has not used the name PIERCE for many years and he is known as CARL C. EAVES both at his place of employment and in the Denham Springs community. EAVES advised that his wife's name is SARAH KATE/EAVES, nee DAVIS. He stated he is employed as an operator for the Ethyl Corporation in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and has been so employed for approximately 25 years.

EAVES stated that he has never used any aliases or nicknames and the name HARRY GUALD is unknown to him.

He stated that he has a fourth sister, FREDA (LAST NAME UNKNOWN), whose whereabouts is unknown. EAVES advised that he has not seen FREDA in approximately 25 years and had had only infrequent correspondence from her during that time. He advised that he believes she is married, but he has no idea what her husband's name is or his location.

EAVES further stated that he is not a preacher or minister and never had been, and that he is not associated with a religious group in any way.

EAVES advised that he keeps a calendar in his home and makes notations on this calendar as to his days off and any pertinent events or appointments which he might have. He stated that although he could not recall his whereabouts on either March 29, 1968; March 30, 1968; or April 4, 1968, his calendar indicated that he worked the evening shift at Ethyl Corporation on March 29, 1968, and was off on March 30, 1968. He further stated that the calendar indicates that he worked the night shift on April 4, 1968.
