The following investigation was conducted at New Orleans, Louisiana, by SA PATRICK J. DENTE on May 9, 1968:

Mr. DONALD J. HYDEN, Supervisor, Personnel Department, McDermott International, Incorporated, 615 de Montluzin Building, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that JOE BAILEY MUSGROVE has been employed with McDermott International as a pipeline welder since October 9, 1967, under a one year contract to be served in Nigeria. Mr. HYDEN further stated that Mr. MUSGROVE departed for Nigeria in 1967 and is due to return at the termination of his contract in October, 1968.

A review of the personnel file of JOE BAILEY MUSGROVE revealed the following identifying and background information:

CHARLES METHVIN, residing at George's Rooming House, advised that for a period of about two months during the Spring of 1967, he occasionally hired two individuals, whom he described as a two-man band, to play a couple of nights a week in the Music Box Bar on Canal Street in New Orleans. He said the smaller of the two, name not recalled, who played the guitar in somewhat of an acceptable manner, but not expertly, resembled the photograph and description of JAMES EARL RAY as appears in the 1968 photograph on the Identification Order of RAY.

He said this individual dressed similarly to RAY in this photograph and always wore a bow tie.

He advised he does not recall the name of the taller of the two; however, this individual played the harmonica and drums.

He said he believes this pair also played in the area of Denham Springs, Louisiana. He said they may have played elsewhere in the New Orleans area, but he does not know where.

He said he paid them cash for each night they played, \$25.00 per night for the two of them. He said he thought it somewhat unusual that they could travel in a late model white Cadillac convertible and play for such low wages. He said he believes the car had California license on it.

He advised that he had a bartender, an ex-convict from Ohio, named <u>BILV MILLER</u>, who last resided at Dutch's Hotel, 2800 to 3000 block of Magazine Street in New Orleans about three weeks ago, who would have paid more attention to the two musicians and possibly MILLER could provide more information.

METHVIN said BILL MILLER has a son, NICKIE MILLER; that both are married and their wives sometimes during hard

times are prone to hustle to make ends meet.

METHVIN stated that a reliable barmaid at the Music Box who possibly could provide some information concerning the two musicians is DIANE BHAW, residing in New Orleans. Her telephone number is 247-2009, and she resides at the following described residence: a green residence one-half block past a grocery on the left side, the grocery being before coming to the Missile Lounge, going out of town.

LARY KENT HALE, Route 1, Box 20, Calhoun, Louisiana, who is a student at Northeast State College, Monroe, Louisiana, and who is employed part time in the mail room of the Fourth Street Branch of the Central Savings Bank & Trust Company, Monroe, Louisiana, furnished the following information:

HALE observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and stated he had never seen RAY and could furnish no information relative to RAY except what he has learned from public news sources. He stated he could furnish no information that might assist in an investigation to identify or locate the person or persons connected with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HALE stated he had never been connected with any klan-type organization.

HALE stated that when he was a junior in high school, in May, 1965, he and four other students prepared a letter one day at school and in the letter, which was addressed to the Imperial Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan, the students offered to exterminate MARTIN LUTHER KING for \$5,000,000 and they also offered to kill the President for an additional \$1,000,000. It was never intended that the letter would be mailed and it was merely prepared as a joke. One of the boys lost his wallet with the letter in it and the letter was turned in to the police. Subsequently, in the summer of 1965, the five students were interviewed by Secret Service Agents. Of those five students, three are college students still residing at Calhoun, Louisiana; one is married and living at Calhoun and one is married and living about 20 miles away at Ruston, Louisiana.

HALE stated he and the other boys involved in the writing of the letter in May, 1965, did not know how to send a letter to a Ku Klux Klan organization and they were not serious in the offer to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING and the President. He stated he had never been connected with a klantype organization.

HALE stated he was at Northeast State College on April 4, 1968, that he worked at the Bank in Monroe that day and that he spent the night with his father, KENNETH B. HALE, and family near Calhoun that night. He stated he could furnish no information pertinent to an investigation to identify or locate the person or persons connected with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

RICHARD HENRY "DICKIE" McINTOSH, student at Northeast State College, Monroe, Louisiana, and a resident of Calhoun, Louisiana, furnished the following information:

McINTOSH and four fellow students in high school at Calhoun, in May, 1965, wrote a letter to the Ku Klux Klan offering to exterminate MARTIN LUTHER KING for \$5,000,000 and to kill the President for an additional \$1,000,000. It was not intended that the letter be mailed or be delivered to the klan and there was never any intention on the part of the boys to harm MARTIN LUTHER KING or the President. The letter was merely written by them as a joke one day when they were in a classroom at school. Later the boys were interviewed by Secret Service Agents, after the letter was lost in the wallet of one of the boys and turned in to the police. The boys were about 16 or 17 years old at the time. Four of the boys still reside at Calhoun and three of them go to nearby colleges; one lives at Ruston, Louisiana, and operated a service station. McINTOSH is reasonably sure that none of them know anything that might assist in an investigation of the murder of MARTLY LUTHER KING. McINTOSH resides with his father, FLOYD H. McINTOSH, at Calhoun and he commutes to Northeast Louisiana State College at Monroe, Louisiana, daily.

McINTOSH observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and stated he had never seen RAY and could furnish no information regarding him except what he has learned from newspapers, radios and television.

McINTOSH stated he had never been connected with a klan-type organization.

McINTOSH stated he could furnish no information that might assist in an investigation relative to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

DALE TAYLOR, student at Louisiana Polytechnic Institute, Ruston, Louisiana, who resides with his father, J. CHESTER TAYLOR, Calhoun, Louisiana, furnished the following Information:

TAYLOR observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and stated he had never seen RAY and could not furnish any pertinent information relative to RAY. He stated he knew nothing that might assist in identifying the person or persons responsible for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

TAYLOR and a group of his fellow classmates in Calhoun High School in May, 1965, prepared a letter in the classroom one day just before school was out; they addressed the letter to the Imperial Wixard of the Ku Klux Klan and they proposed to exterminate MARTIN LUTHER KING for the sum of \$5,000,000; they then added a postscript to the letter suggesting they would also kill the President for an additional \$1,000,000. The five boys who prepared the letter were juniors in high school and they had no intention of mailing the letter, the preparation of which was a mere frivolity with which they occupied a few moments of their time during an English class when the teacher was away. They thought the letter had been destroyed and they did not even know how to address a letter to send it to the Imperial Wizard of any Ku Klux Klan group. None of them was ever a member of a klan-type organization. The fixe boys who particlepated in preparing the letter were WILLIAM R. DAVID, DALE TILER, G. E. JOHNSON, DICKIE MCINTOSH and KENT HAZE, four of whom still reside at Calhoun, Louisiana, and one, WILLIAM R. DAVID, resided at Ruston, Louisiana, and operates a service station.

TAYLOR stated he was in school at Louisiana Polytechnic, Ruston, Louisiana, during the day on April 4, 1968, and he was staying at home with his parents at night during that time. He stated he could furnish no information whatever pertinent to the investigation relative to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

WILLIAM ROBERY DAVID was contacted at David's Mobil Service Station, 901 Georgia Avenue. He was advised of the nature of the investigation and the identity of the interviewing Agents.

DAVID advised that sometime during his Junior year at the Calhoun High School, Calhoun, Louisiana, he and several of his friends were writing notes in class as a joke. He recalls starting one to the Imperial Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan. This note was started by him, but he passed the note on to several of his friends. They all wrote something on the note and the final form was a note to the Imperial Wizard saying that the undersigned were willing to exterminate MARTIN LUTHER KING for the sum of \$5,000,000 and would also exterminate President JOHNSON for an additional \$1,000,000. Then he and his friends all signed the note.

DAVID stated this note was written as a joke and no threat against the life of either KING or JOHNSON was intended. He cannot recall at this date exactly why he put the note in his wallet, but he had forgotten the note was there until he lost his wallet a short time later. An agent of the Secret Service then contacted him concerning the note. DAVID advised he completely forgot the note existed until these agents asked him about it.

DAVID advised he does not know anything further about the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., other than what he has read in the papers. He does not know or recognize the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and certainly has not conspired with RAY, or any other person, in connection with KING's death. He denied ever having been a member of the klan or any hate-type group and further denied knowing anyone who was connected with such a group.

G. E. JOHNSON, Calhoun, Louisiana, observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and advised he had never seen RAY and could furnish no information that might assist in locating him. He stated he could furnish no information which might assist in identifying or locating the person or persons responsible for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

JOHNSON stated that in May, 1965, he and four of his classmates in high school at Calhoun High School, prepared a letter to the Imperial Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan suggesting they would exterminate MARTIN LUTHER KING for \$5,000,000 and then for an additional \$1,000,000 they would kill the President. The letter was prepared as a joke, he said, and there was never any intention of mailing the letter or killing the President or killing MARTIN LUTHER KING. JOHNSON stated that in the Summer of 1965, Secret Service Agents interviewed and reprimanded him and the other boys connected with writing the letter, after one of the boys lost his wallet with the letter in it and the wallet and letter were turned in to the police.

JOHNSON stated he was never connected with any klantype group. He stated he is now married and he was at home in Calhoun with his wife and baby on April 4, 1968. He said he is employed as a switchman with Illinois Central Railroad at Monroe, Louisiana, and he was probably on the job at Monroe, Louisiana, on April 4, 1968.

JOHNSON stated he knew absolutely nothing pertinent to an investigation relative to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.
