On 4-11-68 STEVE KOVACS came to the Portland Office. He is a Hungarian by birth, has been in this country about twelve years, and is extremely difficult to understand. At this time he was telling about a man that had worked for him about two years ago in Salem, Ore., in the landscaping business, and he saw this man in the "skid row" area at the Farm Labor Office, and drank with him in the ####### "skid row" taverns. This man whose name he did not know, at one time offered him \$1000 to play cards in a tavern, but KOVACS refused -- KOVACS didn't know why the offer was made, but he didn't want to take it because the man once told him he was a This man was a Nixon supporter, and KOVACS was a Kennedy supporter, and they argued about the two. He didn't see the man around the Burnside area for a week after the King Murder, and felt this man was responsible for the Muder. He described him as 40-50, 6' to 6'3", reddish hair, slender build, uses good english, and neater than most alcoholics. He advised that this man is a "wino", and is constantly drunk.

KOVACS came back into the office again on 4-18-68, and said he hadn't learned the man's identity, but had seen him again, and he was drunk and in old ### clothes, and had a drink with him in a Tavern on N,W, Couch between 2nd & 3rd. Dr. King's name came up, and the man said something to the effect that "I told you'd we gettem, and we'll get Kennedy's ass, and the rest of them if they don't watch out". He was sure this man knew about Dr. King's murder, and probably was the one, who had done it.

KOVACS came back into the Office on 4-23-68, and exhibited a photo, it was the front of the Farm Labor Office, and people could be seen shanding in front of the Office, but no features could be seen. KOVACS advised that the man he was talking about was one of the people. He then told about another man, and an older man-and he felt they, or at least the younger man might be GALT. Photos were exhibited to him and he said it was not the man.

KOVACS apparently spends a lot of time on Burnside, and all of the people he talks about are "winos", and drunk all the time. KOVACS is extremely had to understand, and everytime he tells about an incident he tells it differently.

PD 582-R advised as follows:

Through additional contact with COLDEN BROWN, he has determined that the reason for BROWN's desire to go to Seattle, Washington; Eugene, Oregon; and San Francisco, California was to attend the Western Regional Alliance, Black Students Conference, also known as Black Youth Conference (BYC) to be held on the campus of San Francisco State

Source provided an agenda of the conference under the heading Black Youth Conference and provided written in structions issued to participants giving them details of how they should reach the campus.

COLDEN BROWN stated that the contemplated trip to Seattle, Eugene and San Francisco was cancelled and it was subsequently learned that the cancellation was made in that various Negroes from the Seattle area were in Portland the night of 4/9/68 to attend a speech by DICK GREGORY at the University of Portland in Portland, Oregon.

Following GREGORY's appearance at the University of Portland, he came to 3606 N.E. Garfield Street, where he met with approximately 40 other Negroes. The owner of this house is known only as SUZIE. GREGORY told of his travels throughout the United States and eulogized MARTIN LUTHER KING. GREGORY advocated violence, but told those present to do what they wanted to do in this regard. He would not make any direct recommendation as he would not be caught up in a conspiracy, but mentioned various things that had been done in other communities and spoke of an existing situation in the City of Chicago which had something to do with a gas line located near a subway or a freeway which could be utilized in paralyzing one or the other.

GREGORY said it was no sense to have children doing the looting and killing as this was the responsibility of adults if it needed to be done.

At this meeting, discussion was centered around the BYC at San Francisco State College. COLDEN BROWN said that he would not be able to go to San Francisco as expected, in that he had to be in Portland to attend a meeting of the United Black Front (UBF) on Friday, 4/12/68 at the Negro Elk's Lodge, but would possibly fly to San Francisco Friday night in order that he could attend the conference on Saturday and Sunday. ISAAC ALLEN, also known as ISAAC NOMMO, planned to travel to San Francisco with RAYMOND HOLLOWAY, who is obtaining transportation. ISAAC's brother, CHARLES ALLEN, also known as CHARLES NOMMO, would travel with them as would several others. It was expected that other individuals would go to the conference, as well as people from Eugene, Oregon and Seattle, Washington. ISAAC and his party were expected to leave Portland on the morning of 4/11/68.

ISAAC ALLEN is the apparent leader of the militant Negro element in Portland, Oregon, and resides at 339 N.E. Webster Street and COLDEN LEROY BROWN lives with ALLEN. There is considerable friction between ALLEN and BROWN as to what course of action to follow and it appears that this friction is a power struggle between the two as to who would be in charge.

Among those attending the meeting at 3606 N.E. Garfield Street were the following: SUZIE WARRICK, occupant of 3606 N.E. Garfield; DENNIS PAYNE, President of Black Students Union, Portland State College; ISAAC ALLEN; CHARLES ALLEN; COLDEN BROWN: COLDEN BROWN'S girl friend, BEVERLY (LNU); MELVIN SPENCER; HOWARD ANDERSON and three others from Eugene, Oregon; several

HOWARD ANDERSON and three others from Eugene, Oregon; several Negroes from Seattle, Washington, among them a DON DU PREE. This individual had some disagreement with GREGORY, the nature of which was not determined.

There were a number of other individuals at this meeting that were unknown to the source.

GAY GIRTHER stopped by ANDREW JOHNSON's house about 1:30 p.m., 4/7/68, indicating the package from HALPH NELSON had arrived Air Freight. Since the literature whatever it was, concerned the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, GAY GIRTHER indicated we should find means of getting the papers in he hands of Negro people. JOHNSON suggested going by MELVIN SPENCER's house and taking him out to the Air Freight Office - on the way he might be able to lend some assistance in distributing whatever the package contained. SPENCER rode out to the airport with GINTHER and JOHNSON and picked up the package. On returning to JOHNSON's house, it is, the package was found to contain 2,000 fly cheets from "The Worker" on MARTIN LUTHER KINE. The sheets were in pairs so JOHNSON, GINTHER and SPENCER separated the sheets. SPENCER suggested taking a bunch of these over to COLDEN EROWN at the Spirit House.

GAY GINTHER agreed to wait watil SPENCER and JOHNSON returned.

JOHNSON and SPENCER found COLDEN BROWN at the Spirit House along with some students from Eugene, Oregon. One of the students was leaving to go back to Eugene and agreed to take 200 of the papers on KING with his. 300 were left with COLDEN and some other persons, is not known who agreed to get them out in circulation.

GAY GINTHER, who had completed bundling papers in stacks of 100 each, said he was going over to Vancouver Avenue Baptist Church for services being held for MARTIN LUTHER KING. However, GAY did not take any of the papers. Was quite satisfied to leave the circulation to SPENCER, JOHNSON and COLDEN. JOHNSON, SPENCER and COLDEN drove around by the Vancouver Avenue Baptist Church, and no leaflets were passed out by anyone in this group. COLDEN and SPENCER being only interested in how large a number turned out for the occasion did not stop at the church. COLDEN and SPENCER mentioned they had spent considerable time in preventing any vandalism among Negro youth Friday and Saturday. Both stating they did not want any violence action here. Both COLDEN and SPENCER mentioned being under surveillance by the police. COLDEN indicated he could not drive his car without being followed. All returned to Sparit House. COLDEN gave SPENCER and JOHNSON copies of a paper printed in Cakland, California, called "The Black Panther". SPENCER mentioned having his car in the garage for repair and mentioned wanting a ride over to Harlan Griffin Ford to get a loan car to go to work in Monday. JOHNSON, COLDEN and SPENCER drove over to Griffin Ford. N.E. Sandy Boulevard. SPENCER after spending considerable time found that he could not obtain a loan car. Reasons being insurance companies will not insure cars on loan in the Albina area. After leaving Griffin Ford, it must have been about 6:30 p.m., COLDEN mentioned he was going home and get some sleep. While there she saw a man resembling JAMES EARL RAY enter her bus after waiting at Gate 23. She stated she believed him to have transferred to her bus from another bus rather than originating at San Francisco because of the appearance of the ticket he presented.

She also advised she did not recall seeing him after she left Portland, Oregon, on the same bus.


