Re memo of SA JOHN J. O'BRIEN dated 4/6/68

On 4/6/68 JACK BURKE, 2542 W. Knollwood, Tampa, Florida advised that during the early morning hours on 4/6/68 while in the VIP Lounge located on North Armenia just North of Sligh Avenue, Tampa he overheard an individual in the bar make several remarks over the period of about 1 hour concerning the killing of KING in Memphis, Tennessee on the night of 4/4/68. BURKE stated that this individual appeared to be sitting with 3 or 4 others at the bar when these remarks were made.

BURKE stated that he arrived at the bar at about 1:30am and stayed at the bar for several drinks until the bar closed at about 2:45am. BURKE advised that the individual began making the remarks about KING at about 1:50am or 2:00am and each time he made a remark the others around him would laugh.

BURKE stated that he was unable to recall any specific statements made but, he did mention something about being "in Memphis yesterday" and that he had lost a rifle. BURKE stated that he is unable to recall any other remarks made. BURKE stated further that he did not feel now that it is so serious as when he called after arriving home from the bar at about 3:00am 4/6/68 however, he feels that since this individual continued to make remarks for almost an hour that it was to say the least an attempt at very sick humor.

BURKE stated that the entire conversation was not continuously about KING but, this was brought up at various times during the conversation.

BURKE stated that he does not personally know this individual however, the barmaid DORIS may be acquainted with him.

DORIS TOMAS, 417 E. Hanlon, Tampa, barmaid, VIP Lounge, Armenia and Sligh Avenues, Tampa advised that she recalled that a regular customer of the bar who is known to her personally had been in the bar on the morning of 4/6/68 and had made "one or two" remarks about the slaying of KING.

0 / TOMAS advised that the person making these remarks was a BURT HARPER who resides on W. Hanna St. in Tampa about 8 blocks or so from the lounge. TOMAS stated that HARPER is in the bar several nights a week and on this occasion was with another individual known to her only as "BUSTER" who frequently appears in the lounge with HARPER.

TOMAS stated that she recalled no specific statements made by HARPER about the KING slaying but, stated that all of those she heard were said loudly and in a laughing manner and all customers in the bar who heard them laughed.

TOMAS stated that HARPER is known to her and other persons who frequent the lounge as a joker.

TOMAS stated that during the previous week HARPER was in the bar on Tuesday evening 4/2 and on Thursday evening 4/4 and then came in again on Friday evening 4/5/68. TOMAS stated that HARPER came into the lounge at about 8:30p or so on 4/4/68.

In addition, TOMAS advised that on 4/4/68 she saw HARPER in the early evening at about 5:00p or so when HARPER towed her car from Bond Auto on North Florida to a garage which he operates in Drew Park. TOMAS did not know the exact location of this garage.

TOMAS described HARPER as a White, male, Age 28, Italian features, dark hair and eyes, olive complexion, about 5'8" tall and stocky build.



On 4/13/68 WARREN MILTON GALT was re-interviewed by SA's ROBERT C. SMITH & THEODORE R. SEMAN at his place of residence, Holmes Beach, Fla, and furnished the following additional information concerning his relatives:

He was married in Paris, France, 11/46 while in the U.S. Army; he has no children of his own but has two step sons; JOHN DUPUREUR, 33 years, who is employed by an unknown bridge painting contractor at Linton, Iowa at the present time; and ALLEN DUPUREUR, 24 years, who resides at 2311 Gardner Dr, and is employed by American Insurance Co, St. Louis, Mo.

He advised that his father has no living brothers or sisters, but had two brothers, names unknown, but who died in infancy. If his father were alive he would be 67 years of age; and the brothers would be 65 & 70 years.

He advised that his Mother had only one brother, CLAUDE SNEED, who resides at 10013 Clairmont Dr, St. Louis, Mo.

He advised that his brother, HOMER GALT, was born [REDACTED], at St. Louis, Mo, and was married twice in St. Louis, Mo. The first marriage was in 1944 and divorced the same year, wife unrecalled; and married again in 1946 or 1947 to NELLIE (maiden name unrecalled). He does not know if HOMER still married to NELLIE nor whether they had any children.

He stated that HOMER had only two years of high school education but took an unknown night school course in some type boiler engineering and was employed at an unknown place in Los Angeles, Calif.

He stated that about 5 years ago he called HOMER in Los Angeles concerning their grandmothers funeral in St. Louis, Mo, but HOMER did not attend the funeral. He obtained the telephone number for HOMER from his Uncle, CLAUDE SNEED, and CLAUDE will probably still have the telephone number and possibly HOMER's address.

He advised the only other GALT's known to him are CHARLES GALT, great uncle, who resides on Washington Ave, St. Louis, Mo. CHARLES has a son, STEWART GALT, address unknown. Also is MARTIN GALT, great uncle, address unknown, Ferguson, Mo, who has a son, MARTIN GALT, JR, address unknown.

He also has a Great Uncle, ALBERT GALT, ~~address unknown~~, who was struck by lightning in Little Rock, Ark, on a golf course about 20 years ago; and ALBERT had only one daughter, BETTY, whose whereabouts is unknown.

He was formerly employed by American Car & Foundry, St. Louis, Mo, 11/65-9/67 when he moved to Florida.

He advised that the names JOSEPH or SIMONE GAULT; and ERIC STARVO GALT, are unknown to him.



On 4/6/68, JERRY HEDGEMAN, 1039-6th Ave., South, St. Petersburg, Fla., was located and interviewed by SAs JAMES DELK LELAND and ONNIE K. WALKER.

Mr. HEDGEMAN advised that he had worked for one BURNS LYMAND in 1963 or 1964 for approximately 7 to 8 months. He stated LYMAND was an expert tree trimmer. He stated that LYMAND was with his wife and baby. Further that they came to St. Petersburg, Fla., area, apparently from Utah. Further that they had come to Fla., to do tree trimming due to the freeze that occurred in late 1962 or early 1963. HEDGEMAN advised he did not know local address for LYMAND when he lived in St. Petersburg, and that LYMAND had "skipped out" and did not pay a number of outstanding bills and, in fact, skipped out owing him salary.

HEDGEMAN described LYMAND as W/M, age 23-24, (in 1963) 5'9", 140 lbs., sandy-brown hair, complexion light, peculiarities, did a great deal of drinking.

HEDGEMAN advised that LYMAND had 4 or 5 rifles and that almost all of them had scopes on them. According to HEDGEMAN, LYMAND told him that he had used these rifles to do bear hunting with in Utah. Further, that in conversation with LYMAND, he had expressed a great dislike for then President Kennedy and Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

HEDGEMAN advised that he has not received any information concerning LYMAND since he skipped out of St. Petersburg in late 1963 or early 1964. He stated that he believes LYMAND had a checking account at the St. Petersburg Bank and Trust Co., St. Petersburg, Fla.

It should be noted that it was observed by interviewing Agents that HEDGEMAN had ~~apparently been doing~~ considerable drinking.

Account was opened on 6/5/63 and closed on 2/13/64. Account was opened with deposit of \$60. His occupation was listed as tree trimmer. Mrs. SNEED advised that there were many return items in the account from July 30, 1963 through Nov. 19, 1963. She further advised from the account card that was available, that in all probability, a further check of records at the bank would reveal that the bank, in all probability, closed out the account due to the numerous return items.

On 4/8/68, a check was made at the St. Petersburg Credit Bureau and no record could be found for a BURNS LYMAND.

It is to be noted that the writer in telephonic contact with the Tampa Office on 4/6/68, was advised by SA HUGH J. SMITH that indices revealed a closed 88 case (Tampa file 88-2644) entitled THERAL BURNS LYMAND, who was described as W/M, Age 26, DOB [REDACTED], from the State of Utah, 5'9", brown hair, brown eyes, 310 pounds. Further there was indication in this file that his wife or a relative resided 714 1/2 Grove St., St. Petersburg, Fla.

It would appear from the above that in all probability that the weight of 310 pounds is a typographic error and that the weight should be 130 lbs, it being noted that both individuals are from Utah, both are tree trimmers, both have the name of BURNS LYMAND and the address of 714 1/2 Grove St., appear.



HOLLY stated that he recalled that on one occasion, GALT purchased two end tables, one coffee table, and a small pair of lamps for \$85 from the Abernathy Furniture Company, and GALT paid cash for this transaction. HOLLY stated this furniture was delivered by the Abernathy Company to GALT's residence which was located some where on Highland Avenue, Birmingham.

HOLLY stated that Mr. ABERNATHY's mother may recall GALT as GALT was in the furniture store on several occasions.

KNIGHT advised that they were listening to the car radio and the news of the shooting of MEDGAR EVANS was broadcast and the three of them were trying to figure out a route to Memphis which would bypass possible road blocks. During the conversation which took place KNIGHT recalled SPARKS and WING discussing the fact that SPARKS had been offered a \$10,000. payment to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. They did not elaborate on this other than to indicate that when both were in the state penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, some "agents" had come to interview SPARKS concerning this alleged offer and payment and that he had "run them off" meaning that he had refused to talk to the agents about the matter.

KNIGHT was quizzed thoroughly concerning this incident and advised that it was not discussed further, nor would SPARKS mention who had approached him with the offer.

KNIGHT stated that SPARKS is perfectly capable of committing a murder and is a known hater of Negroes. According to KNIGHT, SPARKS is not known to make jokes and it was believable to KNIGHT that an actual offer was made to SPARKS by someone.

For the information of offices receiving, DONALD EUGENE SPARKS is presently incarcerated at Fort Payne, Alabama and has been incarcerated during the period of the MARTIN LUTHER KING murder which would definitely eliminate SPARKS as a suspect.

King's Staying

Each hour that passes without the apprehension of the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. increases the possibility that he may not be caught. For the reported details of the killer's movements all point to a planned crime, executed with a cool—quite possibly a professional—skill.

So it may not be too early to suggest that if the trail of the suspected killer turns cold, and if his capture does not seem imminent, it could be advisable for a special commission to investigate the available information on the crime and make public disclosure of as much of it as may be possible without seriously interfering with the efforts of the appropriate law enforcement agencies.

We suggest this for the important reason that the monstrous deed—and the reaction to it—can profoundly affect the course of inter-racial relations across this nation for an immeasurably long time.

This may be particularly true if no culprit is brought to answer for it at the bar of justice.

Perhaps even now the suspected killer of Dr. King is under surveillance or on the verge of being arrested. Perhaps, as Attorney General Ramsey Clark suggests, lawmen have him on the run and may even be catching up with him.

But there is much reason to suspect that the actual assassination was the work of a hired gunman. It has many marks of the gangland-style slaying—where an anonymous killer—by-trade quietly moves in, executes and moves on. Such killings, as any big city police department well knows, are most difficult to resolve.

Most frequently, of course, murders by hired hoods result from rivalry between gangs of racketeers. But murder for political ends is not unknown in this country and indeed is a classic weapon, around the world, in the arsenal of the political extremist and of the ruthless Communist revolutionary.

Trained killer-agents do exist, and the possibility is real that the murder of Dr. King was the work of such.

To suggest this does not, however, explain the who or why of it.

As we have observed before, the violence in the hours following the assassination was predictable. So was a national expression of indignation and shame that this terrible thing can happen in a society committed to the right of its individual members to life, and the pursuit of happiness.

Who could hope to gain by the kind of response that followed the killing?

The obvious inevitability of an angry reaction in Negro communities and a deep resentment in the white community, it seems to us, lessens the likelihood that the King murder was the work of one of the country's pathetic little organizations of angry white supremacists.

Furthermore, the various groups of extremists are so thoroughly salted with FBI agents and informers that information about any plotted lynch-slashing would probably have gotten to the authorities by now — if indeed it had reached them in advance and enabled them to avert the tragedy.

Thus the suspicion mounts that Dr. King's death was coldly planned by other agents of subversion and disorder — and thus it becomes most important that facts about the deed be disclosed to the American people as soon and as fully as possible.

For now there is a feeling among many black Americans that all of "white society" is to blame, and a few who were moved to lash out in vengeance but senselessly brought looting, burning and destruction in many places in the country.

that kind of response to the memory of Dr. King, who devoted his life to believing by non-violent means a better life for the American Negro. It has served to alienate — from the cause of fuller rights and opportunities for a minority race — members of the majority race.

Yet it is just as unfair for the white citizen to blame Negroes as a whole for lawless and violent behaviour in the aftermath of the King's death as it is for the Negro to blame white people in general for his having been shot from ambush in Memphis.

We must not forget the possibility, which has ample historical precedent, that foreign enemies of America may seek to provoke chaos between the races by deliberate murder to create martyrs, skillfully arranging for the blame to appear to fall on other Americans. With over 60,000 troops presently tied down in riot control, the military advantage to our enemies of the present situation, however caused, is apparent.

And what if, as could happen, an admired white leader should be one day shot by an escaping, dark-skinned killer? What tragic response could be expected? Whose cause would be harmed? Whose purposes served?

Truly, this is a time of many trials for America, when we need a sense of unity, cooperation, patience and a measure of trust. It is not a time to allow any murderous plot by persons unknown to divide, disrupt, destroy.

HOOVER, GALT'S TRAVELS IN THE MUSTANG INCLUDED TRIPS TO LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA; NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA; BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA; AND MEXICO, AS WELL AS TO MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE, AND ATLANTA, GEORGIA. GALT WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN IN MEMPHIS ON APRIL 3 AND 4, 1968, AND TO HAVE DEPARTED FROM THERE FOR ATLANTA.

INTENSIVE INVESTIGATION BY THE FBI HAS DISCLOSED THAT GALT HAS CLAIMED TO HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AS A COOK ON MISSISSIPPI RIVER VESSELS AND AS A MERCHANT SEAMAN. HE IS SAID TO BE AN AVID DANCER AND TOOK DANCING LESSONS IN NEW ORLEANS IN 1964 AND 1965; IN BIRMINGHAM DURING SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER, 1967; AND IN LONG BEACH CALIFORNIA, FROM DECEMBER, 1967 TO FEBRUARY, 1968.

GALT LEFT LOS ANGELES ON DECEMBER 15, 1967, AND DROVE HIS WHITE MUSTANG TO NEW ORLEANS, WHERE HE CLAIMED HE CONTACTED EITHER AN ENGINEERING OR A CONTRACTING FIRM. HE LEFT NEW ORLEANS ON DECEMBER 19TH AND ARRIVED BACK IN LOS ANGELES ON DECEMBER 21, 1967.

WHILE IN THE LOS ANGELES AREA EARLY THIS YEAR, GALT TOOK A COURSE AT A SCHOOL OF BARTENDING AND WAS GRADUATED ON MARCH 2, 1968.

THE FUGITIVE IS DESCRIBED AS WHITE MALE. HE IS APPROXIMATELY 5 FEET 8 INCHES TO 5 FEET 11 INCHES TALL AND WEIGHS BETWEEN 160 AND 175 POUNDS. HE IS SAID TO BE A NEAT DRESSER AND HAS A MEDIUM BUILD.

PAGE FOUR

GALT HAS BROWN HAIR, WHICH HE WEARS IN A "BRUSH" CUT. HE REPORTEDLY HAS BLUE EYES; HIS NOSE IS STRAIGHT AND NARROW; HIS TEETH ARE STRAIGHT AND CLEAN; AND HE HAS GIVEN HIS DATE OF BIRTH AS .

THE FUGITIVE IS SAID TO HAVE A NERVOUS HABIT OF OCCASIONALLY PULLING AT AN EAR LOBE WITH HIS HAND. HIS LEFT EAR PROTRUDES FARTHER FROM HIS HEAD THAN HIS RIGHT EAR.

ACCORDING TO MR. HOOVER, PERSONS WHO HAVE MET GALT DESCRIBE HIM AS A "LONER" AND STATE HIS LANGUAGE AND DICTION HAVE A "RURAL" QUALITY AND SUGGEST THAT HE PROBABLY DOES NOT HAVE A HIGH DEGREE OF EDUCATION. HE IS SAID TO DRINK ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND HAS A PREFERENCE FOR VODKA AND BEER. HE IS A FAN OF WESTERN AND COUNTRY MUSIC.

GALT SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS. ANY INFORMATION CONCERNING HIM SHOULD BE FURNISHED IMMEDIATELY TO THE NEAREST FBI OFFICE.

On 4/18/68 Mrs. Robert [redacted], 200 [redacted] Island, Island [redacted] Fla. advised that she was having lunch at Woolworth's Dept. Store, Cleveland Plaza Shopping Center, [redacted] Fla. at approx. noon on 4/17/68 when an individual who she described as w/m, 35 yw. old, 5'7"-5'8", 160-165 lbs., light brown complexion wearing a dark suit white long sleeve dress shirt and tie, sat down next to her.

She stated that this individual seemed nervous and his attitude was weird. He gave the impression that "he was the cat cat just smelling the bird" and made sarcastic remarks about the food and the waitresses. She advised that he had a round face, pale complexion, clean shaven and kept rubbing the back of his right hand with the index finger of his left hand. Mrs. [redacted] advised that it did not appear that he was trying to make a pass at anyone.

Mrs. [redacted] viewed a picture of Eric Starvo Galt and advised that although

there were similarities between Galt and the individual at Woolworth's, she did not think they were identical.

The following employees at Woolworth's French Laundry, Cleveland Plaza Shopping Center, Cleveland were contacted on the dates indicated and shown ^a picture of Eric Starvo Galt. They advised that they had never seen this individual before, nor could they recall the individual about whom Mrs. Roche was speaking.

In view of the fact that the description of Unsub is not similar to Ray and the fact that Mrs. Roche and employees could not identify Unsub as being identical to Ray, no further investigation was wanted.

NOYES stated that he observed an individual resembling ERIC STARVO GALT on April 6, last on flight 180Y, Eastern Airlines in route from Tampa to Washington, D.C. NOYES further advised that this individual sat next to the window on the right side of the aircraft, 3 rows from the rear. NOYES advised that 2 other men were with this individual, all wearing dark business suits and appeared nervous. Individual resembling GALT had a tan case with him which he placed under the seat. NOYES stated that the end dimensions of this bag were approx. 1 ft. by 6 inches, appeared to him to be either a gun case or a musical instrument case. NOYES stated that this man's hair was short, but unlike the photograph, was wavy. NOYES stated that if further information was needed he could be contacted at the above address.

On 4/18/68, Mr. Howard Noyes, 306 19th Ave NE, St. Petersburg, Fla. advised that he was a passenger aboard Eastern A.L. flight #1804 from Tampa to WDC which departed Tampa 9:15 A.M. 4/6/68. Noyes sat next to the window on the right side the second row from the rear of the plane. Three other individuals all dressed in business suits, boarded the plane in Tampa. Two of these individuals sat directly in front of him in the 3rd row from the rear and the 3rd individual was believed seated directly in front of him in the fourth row from the rear. Noyes advised that one of the individuals the person who sat directly in front of him looked very similar to the picture he had seen in the newspaper of Eric Starvo Galt. Noyes viewed a picture of Galt has furnished by writer and advised that although there were similarities he could not positively identify this individual in the airplane as being identical to the picture of Galt.

He described this individual as being a w/m 30-35, 5'9" 170 lbs medium build slightly wavy short dark brown hair, wearing business suit.
