Source remarked that although Attorney MARK HAWES was able to obtain a court order directing State Beverage Department to sign over the Yellow House Bar Liquor License to FAUSTINO GONZALEZ as executor of PRIMO LAZZARA's estate, the license has not been transferred. He stated that according to HAWES, HAWES has sent MIKELJOHN a registered letter warning him that if the license is not signed over by May 15, then he, HAWES, intends to obtain a court order citing MIKELJOHN for contempt of court. He remarked that TONY ALONSO is presently operating the Yellow House Bar as PIC and that because of differences between ALONSO and CONNIE GARCIA, CONNIE has quit as barmaid at the Yellow House Bar.

Source stated that in connection with the bolita operation from Pinellas County which LAZZARA had, it is apparently being brought from St. Petersburg to various locations in Tampa, where a Negro employee of the Yellow Cab Co., meets with the runner from St. Petersburg and then delivers all of the material to CHARLIE MENENDEZ! place, where it is then picked up by ALBANO. Source stated that the Negro runner from St. Petersburg is a heavyset, dark-skinned Negro but as yet, source has been unable to identify this individual by name. He stated that MENENDEZ has commented that the writers in St. Petersburg have been in touch with him by telephone indicating that, on occasions, the calls are placed from St. Petersburg and that, on occasion, he himself, has placed the calls. Stated would continue his efforts to further identify all individuals in the operation. He stated that apparently, in the past, the pickup day has been changed every few weeks and beginning the week of May 13, the pickup day is supposed to be Friday. Source stated that the slips apparently are taken into CHARLIE's place through a side or rear entrance and are kept in the back part of the house until ALBANO arrives to pick them up. Source stated he gathered from talking with MENENDEZ, that the operation although having been taken over by ALBANO, is actually now a part of SAM TRAFFICANTE's operation.

Source stated that RICK PAULINE recently had a burglary occur at the Riviera Night Club, in which the burglar obtained \$250 in cash and some apparently very valuable papers. Source stated that PAULINE had contacted SCARFACE RIVERA, telling RIVERA that he, PAULINE, knew that ROQUE and HAYES had pulled the burglary and that he did not care about the money but would like the papers returned and hoped that RIVERA would be able to contact MAYES and ROQUE and advise them of PAULINE's request. Source stated that RIVERA later talked with HAYES about the matter, and HAYES mentioned that he was not theone to see but that maybe someone should talk to JOE BEDAMI. -Source stated that RIVERA apparently does not know what HAYES meant by this remark and does not know whether HAYES was implying that BEDAMI was involved in some manner or implying that BEDAMI was a channel through which matters of this sort had to be taken. Source stated that BILLY ROQUE and HAYES continue to be closely associated, and HAYES has mentioned that the FBI heat on him does not seem to be as hot as it was right after the big bank job in Bonita Springs. Source stated that BILLY ROQUE's current girlfriend is a tall brunette, who is employed as a barmaid at the Blue Penguin.

Source stated that on Sunday night, May 12, BEDAMI had claimed that SANTO TRAFFICANTE was in Tampa, Fla., and that BEDAMI and TRAFFICANTE were planning to meet with another individual on Monday but did not indicate what the meeting was to be about, although source gathered the definite impression that the individual to be contacted was SCARFACE RIVERA. Source stated that BEDAMI mentioned that he was going to later see his girlfriend. JOYCE.

JOE LAZZARA has returned from Spain and either the day he returned or the following day, had received a telephone call from the owner of the Tahitian Inn, indicating that JOE's station wagon had been parked at the Tahitian Inn for about 3 weeks. Source stated that apparently whoever stole the car was involved in some type of a wreck, as they damaged the left rear fender and the

left front door. Source stated that apparently JOE had not advised his/brothers of his return, as the individual calling JOE claimed that he had first talked with JOE's brother, JOHN, about the car just prior to calling JOE and that JOHN claimed that JOE was still in Spain. Source stated that JOE LAZZARA is very concerned over the fact that the FBI has been making open inquiry about him and seemed concerned that the FBI seemed to know exactly when he had left for Spain, where he was in Spain and the reason for his trip. Source stated that, although has not personally observed JOE's girlfriend, CONNIE, does know that CONNIE is back in the U.S., and that she and JOE made the trip back together.

Source advised had received a letter sent airmail on Wednesday, May 8, postmarked Paris, France from CANTRELL. Stated had also received a telephone call from CANTRELL's wife, BOBBIE, indicating that she, too, had received communication from CANTRELL and that CANTRELL claimed wanted a divorce as had met a girl in Paris that he was in love with. Stated knows that the person to whom CANTRELL referring is KATHY LITTLE, who is a model from New York, and who is supposed to be in Paris with CANTRELL.

Source advised that VINNIE LO SCALZO has commented that his brother, NINO, spent a few days in Tampa with him and that NINO had no more been out of town until the FBI had been around asking questions about him. Source stated that VINNIE claims that even on the morning when NINO left, the FBI had been at Lo SCALZO's family residence wanting to locate and talk with NINO but that the family had claimed they did not know where NINO was. Source stated LO SCALZO of the opinion that the FBI wanted to talk to his brother because they know his brother works for MARCELLO in New Orleans.

EDDIE CULLAR is now running Paul's Place (PAUL PERZIA's Place) on 15th Street in Ybor City but apparently FRANK FAZA, former Peach Bar, owner, is trying to get the license from PAUL's widow. Source does not know why

CULLAR running the place now and was of the opinion that perhaps FRANK DIECIDUE involved because of the close association between DIECIDUE and CULLAR.

Source stated that since PRIMO LAZZARA's death. there has apparently been some pressure exerted by FRANK DIECIDUE to have JOE LAZZARA put DIECIDUE's vending machines in JOE's two bars. Source stated that, at the present time, the machines in Castaways and Eden Roc belong to JOE PLESCIA and that, in accordance with the agreement entered into between JOE LAZZARA and JOE PLESCIA when they broke up their partnership several years ago, LAZZARA agreed to allow PLESCIA to place vending machines in LAZZARA's place of business with the agreement expiring in September this Source stated JOE LAZZARA does not appear to have very much regard for FRANK DIECIDUE and has indicated that now that his brother, PRIMO, is dead, he, JOE, does not intend to allow DIECIDUE to take over vending machines. Source stated that JOE has indicated that his brother may have had an obligation to DIECIDUE but that he be damned if he did. Source stated that the machines at the Eden Roc and Castaways are not the only vending machines owned by PLESCIA and that PLESCIA does business under the name Rex Vending (or Amusement) Co.

Source stated AUGIE PANIELLO has contacted numerous places in Tampa during the past few weeks and has indicated was again employed by Key Liquors.

Source stated that from association with a great number of the hoodlums and gamblers in the Tampa area has obtained no reason to believe that JOHN DE SALVO of Jacksonville, Fla., has recently been in Tampa and has not heard anyone whatsoever mention any associations with JOHN's brother, NICK. knows, MIKE ROMANELLO continues to be in the State Penitentiary and source knows of no one in the Tampa area who has visited ROMANELLO. Souce stated that ROMANELLO has many associates in the Tampa area and has a former wife and a sister residing in Tampa but that does not believe MIKE's former wife has any contact whatsoever with him and is of the opinion that MIKE's sister only has correspondence with MIKE. Source stated that MIKE had left Tampa several years prior to his last confinement and had more or less established himself in the Jacksonville, Fla., area.



On 5/23/68, Mrs. TIMOTHY (JAWET) PUTNAM, 11102 Florida Avenue, Sarasota, Florida, telephone number 955-8039, employed as a hair stylist at Andre's Haute Coiffure, 438 Harding Circle, Sarasota, Florida, furnished the following information:

She is off duty on Wednesday's, and usually takes her two children, ages 3 and 5 years, to the beach at Lido Beach, Sarasota, Florida. On 5/22/68, she went to Lido Beach at about 6:00PM, and while at the beach, a white male came over to her and tried to make a date with her. She said the man did not appear to be a complete stranger in the area, and claimed to be a traveling salesman. He was about 40 years of age, 5'9"-10", 165 lbs., medium build, medium brown hair, graying slightly, stained teeth, with one of his upper right molar teeth missing. The man wore a faded clive green bathing suit, and had only a small blanket with him. The man tried to pick Mrs. PUTNAM up, and claimed to have a car parked down the beach from where Mrs. PUTNAM was swimming with her children. The man asked her if she came to the beach every Wednesday at that time, and she told him she does, however she noted that she actually usually goes on Wednesday mornings.

After Mrs. PUTNAM left the beach, she recalled seeing a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY in the newspaper a couple of weeks ago, and stated she believes the man she saw at the beach resembles RAY. The photographs of JAMES EARL RAY which appear on Identification Order # 4182 were exhibited to Mrs. PUTNAM, and she said the side view photograph of RAY, which is on the left side of the IO, is the one which most nearly tooks like the man she saw at Lido Beach on 5/22/68. She said the man she saw had more hair, but he did have it in a grew cut style.

Mrs. PUTNAM stated that after observing the photographs of RAY as they appear on the Identification Order and Wanted Flyer, she can only say that the man she saw at the beach was similar in appearance, however there were differences in that the man at the beach had more hair on the side of his head, and she did not notice any difference between his ears, as RAY's left ear is obviously protruding more than his right ear.

Mrs. PUTNAM said the man she saw at Lido Beach did not identify himself to her, and did not mention where he was from, or where he was staying, and she has no information as to his present whereabouts. She said she was of the impression that the man would try to locate her at the beach the following Wednesday evening.

The above information has been furnished to the Sarasota, Fla. Police Department, and patrolling officers in the Lido Beach area will be alert for anyone of similar description and appearance to RAY.

As a result of investigation on April 30, 1968, to locate her at Columbia, South Carolina, Mrs. JOHNNIE BLACKWELL GENTRY, Apartment K-3, Lexington Apartments, West Columbia, South Carolina, telephonically contacted the Columbia FBI Office on May 9, 1968.

She was interviewed and advised as follows:

She has been married several times and is generally known as JOHNNIE BLACKWELL. About May of 1965, she and a girl friend, JUNE TAYLOR, were residing on Chestnut Street in Columbia, South Carolina. She was then working at The Lounge, 1103 Lady Street, Columbia, South Carolina, as a The Lounge is located in the same block as the Downtowner Motel in Columbia, South Carolina. Her roommate, JUNE TAYLOR, was dating a white male with the last name of BILLINGS and through BILLINGS, she, BLACKWELL, met a white male with the last name of BARBER. During May, 1965, these 2 men moved into the apartment with her and TAYLOR where they lived for several days. During this period, BILLINGS owned and drove a red Chevrolet convertible with what she believed was a Maryland license tag. She said during this period, JUNE TAYLOR was working at the Red Rooster Bar. in Columbia, South Carolina, and that the 4 of them for several days lived as man and wife.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she does not recall during this period or ever knowing 2 men by the name of JAMES and EDDIE, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning such individuals. She emphatically denied that anyone had ever asked her if she could get a machine gun for them and she is certain that BARBER never asked her such a question. She does not recall ever visiting the VFW Club in Columbia, South Carolina, when BARBER and BILLINGS were there. She said that she was unable to furnish any information concerning BARBER having sticks of marijuana in his possession but that she was told that he had recently been discharged from the Army. She said that she could furnish no information concerning a person with the first

name of JAMES who owned a 1964 or 1965 Lincoln Continental who was from Tennessee.

She did recall that on one occasion while (first name unknown) BARBER and (first name unrecalled) BILLINGS were living with her and JUNE TAYLOR, these men left for a couple of days in BILLINGS' car, but she does not know where they went, as they moved out shortly after returning to Columbia, South Carolina, and she has seen neither of them since. She said that she does not recall ever visiting a large drive-in restaurant in Columbia, South Carolina, with these persons, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning BARBER and BILLINGS taking a trip to Louisiana while she knew them.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she has never heard anyone discuss the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.; and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning any such conspiracy. She said that individuals such as JAMES and EDDIE were completely unknown to her.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were shown to Mrs. GENTRY, who said that as far as she can recall, she had never seen such a person. She said that she was of the impression that BILLINGS had been in Columbia, South Carolina, before the time she met him. She said that BARBER, during the time she knew him, did not own an automobile.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR, mentioned above, has been married or lived with numerous men and that she has used the names JUNE TAYLOR, JUNE JEFFCOAT, JUNE CABEAN, and NORMA MAE CABEAN. She said that she has absolutely no idea where JUNE TAYLOR is presently residing, but the last she heard, TAYLOR was reportedly married to a serviceman and living in Augusta, Georgia, where she was working at a night club.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR's step-father is named RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, and he presently operates a store just

outside of Wagener, South Carolina. JUNE TAYLOR has a brother named DEMPSEY JEFFCOAT, who lives in South Congaree, South Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLARENCE A. GROOMS, JR., on May 6, 1968, relative to locating JUNE TAYLOR:

WILLIAM R. BUSBEE, a long-time resident of Wagener, South Carolina, advised the only white TAYLOR family residing in Wagener was CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener. Mr. BUSBEE stated he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR presently receiving mail in Wagener, nor did he recall anyone by this name who in the past has received mail in Wagener.

Chief of Police FRANK W. GANTT, Wagener, South Carolina, advised he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR residing in Wagener or the immediate area.

Mrs. CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener, South Carolina, advised she had no children or relatives to her knowledge who were named JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, and that she knew of no one by this name in the Wagener area. She stated to her knowledge, she and her husband and immediate family were the only white family of TAYLORs in Wagener.

On April 30, 1968, Captain HARRY SNIPES, Columbia, South Carolina, Police Department, advised that he was formerly acquainted with JOHNNIE BLACKWELL and JUNE TAYLOR because they were well known prostitutes in Columbia, South Carolina. He said that he had no idea where they were presently located, but he is certain they are still working as waitresses and prostituting wherever they may be.

On May 10, 1968, PHYLLIS WATTS, clerk, Medical Records Section, Columbia Hospital of Richland County, Columbia, South Carolina, advised SA ROBERT R. JOHNSON that she could locate no record of a former patient by the name of JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, JEFFCOAT, or CABEAN.

On May 10, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, advised that she has a daughter who has used the name of JUNE TAYLOR and who formerly worked as a waitress at the Red Rooster in Columbia, South Carolina.

She said this daughter has also used the name NORMA LEE and the last names of JEFFCOAT, TAYLOR, and CABEAN.

She said that her daughter is presently using the name of JUNE SPELLMAN as she is now allegedly married to a soldier with the last name of SPELLMAN (first name unknown) who is stationed at Fort Gordon, Georgia. She said her daughter is possibly working at a night club in Augusta, Georgia, that she would attempt to obtain her exact address, and would furnish this to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

On May 13, 1968, Mrs. JEFFCOAT was again contacted and stated her daughter had visited with her on May 12, 1968; however she could not find the name or number given her to call, and thereupon told her daughter the FBI was looking for her. She stated her daughter was to report into the Columbia Office on May 13, 1968. She stated she did not ascertain where her daughter was living but that she was believed to be working at the Spar Club or Bar in Columbia, South Carolina. Mrs. JEFFCOAT was again requested to have her daughter contact SA GROOMS in the event she returned to Wagener.

Investigation at Columbia, South Carolina, on May 15, 1968, disclosed no concern named the Spar Club or anything similar thereto is located at Columbia, South Carolina.

On May 17, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, was advised JUNE TAYLOR had failed to contact the FBI Office at Columbia, South Carolina. She said her daughter could be "anywhere" and using "any name", and she could suggest no one who would know her whereabouts.

In view of the nature of the origin of the information from BILLINGS which was refuted by JOHNNIE BLACKWELL, no additional efforts are being made to locate JUNE TAYLOR since her whereabouts is unknown by her family and friends and considerable investigation has been conducted to locate her.

AT COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT R. JOHNSON:

On April 30, 1968, E. R. PAULK, Clerk, Business License Division, City Hall, reviewed the records and advised there was no record of a place doing business in Columbia as Chubby's Steak House. He stated this restaurant may possibly be identical with Chub's and Tub's, 1201 Lady Street, which is owned by a FRANK B. TAYLOR.

He also stated there was no record of a restaurant or club known as the Downtown; however, there is a business called the Downtowner Steak, House located at 1301 Main Street, which is owned by a CHARLES T. NOVELLESS or NOUELLESS.

He stated the Red Rooster is out of business, and when it was in operation it was located at 1632 Sumter Street. The owner was reflected as DOROTHY NAIRWOOD.

On April 30, 1968, Detective T. M. SHARPE, Columbia Police Department, advised that the business license of the Red Rooster was taken away several months ago. He also stated the business is owned by BARNEY LEE NAIRWOOD, 4716 Limbn, Columbia, South Carolina, and displayed a lengthy arrest record for Mr. NAIRWOOD.

On the same date ANN HULON, Rec ords Clerk, Identification Division, Columbia Police Department, advised no arrest record for CARLOS LEE BILLINGS, JUNE TAYLOR, JOHNNIE BLACKWELL or GLEN BARBER could be located. She also advised that no arrest record could be located for a JAMES BARBER who is described as a white male, approximately forty years of age, 5 feet 10 inches in height.

Linden, advised he formerly operated a club known as the
Red Rooster on Sumter Street. He stated a JUNE TAYLOR
was formerly employed there but left months ago. He stated
he had heard she was remarried, and did not know her new
last name, nor did he have a Social Security Number available
for her. He stated she may still receive mail at Wagener,
South Carolina. Mr. NAIRWOOD stated JOHNNIE BLACKWELL worked

be working there. He advised JUNE TAYLOR has a brother living
near Outlaws Garage in South Congaree, South Cardina, near a
junkyard and she used to work at the Club 21 in Augusta,
Georgia.

On April 30, 1968, CYNTHIA FROST, Records Clerk, Richland County Sheriff's Office, reviewed the indices of that law enforcement agency and advised they were negative concerning JUNE TAYLOR, JOHNNIE BLACKWELL, CARLOS LEE BILLINGS, GLEN BARBER, and JAMES BARBER.

The following investigation was conducted by SASTHOMAS N. CURRAN and ROBERT R. JOHNSON:

On April 30, 1968, EDNA OVERTON, barmaid, The Lounge, 1103 Lady Street, advised she had been working there since the last week in January, 1968, and that no person by the name of JOHNNIE BLACKWELL had worked there, as far as she knew. She stated the owner Mrs. DOROTHY HUFF, 3801 Eureka Street, maybe able to furnish more information.

On April 30, 1968, Miss HUFF stated her mother, DOROTHY HUFF, was too ill to receive visitors and she asked her mother about JOHNNIE BLACKWELL. She then advised that JOHNNIE BLACKWELL had worked at the Lounge but had quit some

months ago. She advised her mother could furnish no information about JOHNNIE BLACKWELL'S whereabouts.

She stated JOHNNIE BLACKWELL formerly worked at the Lounge, but quit some time ago. She advised she could furnish no information whatsoever regarding her whereabouts. She stated JEAN TAYLOR formerly worked at the Copa Cabana, a club which had been demolished several months ago. She stated JEAN TYLOR resides outside of Columbia at an unknown location on the Sumter Highway. She also advised JEAN TYLOR had been

CO 44-299 an in-patient at the Columbia Hospital from which she had been reeased several weeks ago. On May 1, 1968, inquiry at Medical Records, Columbia Hospital, was negative concerning the treatment of a JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR.

Re Bureau radiogram dated 5/21/68 regarding Drivers License Bareau checks for all drivers licenset applications for months of April and May, 1968.

Major C. W. KEITH, Department of Public Safety (DPS), Florida Highway Patrol, Tallahassee, Florida, advised on 5/23/69 that approximately nine hundred thousand new Florida drivers licenses were Issued in the State each year. For the months of April and May there would be approximately 150 thousand new drivers licenses issued,

The following is the procedure for the issuance of new drivers licenses in the State of Florida:

There are 110 examining points in the State. applicant appears at macrof these examining points and is furnished an application, a xerox copy of which is attached. After an applicant has successfully passed his tests, the application and the fee go to the County Judge's Office. At the County Judge's Office, the Plorida drivers license is issued. There is an original and two copies of this license. The applicant receives the original and a copy with the application is forwarded to the DPS at Tallahassee. The third copy is filed at the County Judge's Office.

The County Judge's Office forwards the copy of the license and application about every thirty days; some of the larger counties are more prompt, others go as long as two months before forwarding same. The licenses at the County Judge's Office, as are those at the DPS in Tallahassee are filed alphabetically and there is no numerical order of the record. The Department of Public Safety examining points file once a month, usually on the 5th, Form DL 16, which report lists the name of the applicants for drivers licenses for the previous mouth and if the fee has been paid. There is no other information on this DL 16. A copy of this form remains at the examining point. At this time, the only possible reasonable check that could be made would be as follows:

- 1. Contact made with the sonior examiner, who is an employee of the DPS, at the 110 examining points throughout the State of Florida.
- 2. With the senior examiner, go to the County Judge's Office and examine all Plorida drivers licenses that they have not as yet forwarded to Tallabasses.
- 3. With a copy of the DL 16 kapt on file at the examining point, check the names alphabetically with the drivers licenses on file at the County Judge's Office. For the month of April the DL 16 would be complete, while the month of May would only be partially completed and not complete until around 6/5/63.

Sach FBI Field Division in Florida, if the above system is practical, could cover their can leads after checking out the drivers licenses, which would save considerable paper work by one Division.

The above procedure is the only way that a complete search could be made at this time since it will be the end of June or the middle of July before such a search can be made at the DPS at Tallahasses.

In addition, it is to be pointed out that a search of the names of the DL 15 in the County Judge's Office would be much faster than a search at DPS. Tallahassee, as it would mean fewer licenses to be checked.

It should be noted that not all the names on the DL 16 will be found to have drivers licenses as many applicants file and don't return, while others fail to pass.

Major KEITH advises the following counties have not forwarded their license returns for April:

Bradford, Citrus, Manates, Pasco, Pinellas and Taylor.

The following counties have already made returns through 5/13/68:

Broward, Dade and St. Johns

Major REITH advised because of the present work load at the drivers license division of the DPS, it would be impossible for them to pull that many files during the regular work day. The Major explained that their personnel would have to be the ones to pull the files because of their new mechanical and electrical filing system although the PEI personnel could review the licenses.

The Major explained that some plan would have to be worked out to have their personnel work mights, which would mean time and a balf or double time, as far as pay is concerned.

He was unable to estimate the length of time, the number of personnel, or cost involved to review these license.

Due to the above, and since most countles still have their applications for May, it is suggested that necessary

information be obtained through examining points and County Judge's Offices rather than attempt to handle the review at the Sate Capital, Tallahassee.

For the Eureau's information, both Major KEITH and HOMER SMOTHERMAN, Senior Drivers License Ezasiner, Jacksonville, Ploride, have advised no identification is necessary to obtain a license and therefore a great number of licenses are issued using false names and addresses for faulty identification purposes. Daval County alone had between 3,000 and 5,000 applications submitted for the month of April according to Mr. SMOTHERMAN:

On 5/27/68, a conference was held with Major E. W. REITH, Cape. A. E. REDDICK, Mrs. ELLEN WARRISON and MYS. CANOLIN MARTIN, of the Department of Public Safety, Drivers License Division, Tallahassee, Fla., to make a more thorough and exhaustive study of details in reviewing all drivers liconse applications in the State of Florida. for the months of April and May, 1961, and a more accurate determination of numbers involved.

Major KEITE explained his figure of 900,000 drivers licenses issued in a year that he had previously furnished was erroneous and that was the number of examinations given, rather: than the number of applications received or licenses issued.

He advised this Elgure is high since several examinations are sometimes given to the same individual end a student or inexperienced driver will be given a visual and written examination before being issued a restricted license or learner's permit and thereafter return for a road test examination each of which is counted as an examination. On the same date, GEORGE BEMIS, Bartender, New Yorker Bar, 605 North Fifth Street, advised he recalled three men being in his cafe at approximately the time DENNIS had called the Milwaukee Office. He stated the three men were merchant seamen operating on the Great Lakes and had mentioned that they would be shipping out in the early AM of 5/28/68.

Following the interview with GEORGE BEMIS, efforts were made to locate and interview the three unknown males, which efforts were successful.

The man described by DYRELL DENNIS was determined to be ROSS WESLEY STEVENS, who gave his home address as 1021 Highview Drive, take wates, Florida. He stated he was a steward aboard the Edward S. Kendrick, a ship belonging to the Wilson Line, Cleveland, Ohio. During the course of the interview, STEVENS denied ever having been in Los Angeles, California, denied knowing DYRELL DENNIS, and denied any knowledge of JAMES EARL RAY. STEVENS is further described as a white male, 5'9", 180 lbs., date of birth brown hair, brown eyes (note: color of eyes listed as brown on his Florida Driver's License; however, visual observation relates eyes are gray).

On reinterview with DYRELL DENNIS, she stated she does not feel she is mistaken in stating she knew this individual by sight in Los Angeles, California, during early March, 1968.

Kendrick sailed from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on Sunday, 4/7 in the p.m., and its first port of call was South Chicago, Illinois, second port of call Silver Bay, Minnesota, to pick up ore and then it returned to Cleveland.

It is noted that records of Wilson Marine failed to reflect whereabouts of ROSS WESLEY STEVENS for the early part of March as requested in above-referenced air tel and Wilson Line records contain no information as to the whereabouts or activities of STEVENS from the time of his layoff on 11/10/67 until he returned aboard ship on 3/30/68.

The Los Angeles Office is opening an ITSP case inasmuch as individual identifying himself as SCHNEIDERMAN passed at least two out of state checks in Los Angeles.

No further investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office in this phase of MURKIN.
