"TEN MOST WANTED FUGITIVES" PROGRAM

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been added to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his earliest possible location.

Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fined from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons
on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division,
succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on March 10, 1928. He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a "loner" and "drifter" whose language and diction reflect a "rural" quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons. He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.



THE CRIMES: Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. He subsequently allegedly conspired, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shot to death on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel on April 4, 1968.

THE CRIMINAL: A 40-year-old white native of Illinois, who is known as a "loner" and "drifter" and has taken elaborate steps to establish a false identity, Ray has an extensive criminal record, including convictions for burglary, robbery and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders. Outstanding characteristics include a straight narrow nose, straight and even teeth, a noticeably protruding left ear and a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe. He has taken dancing lessons, attended bartending school, enrolled in a correspondence course in locksmithing and traveled widely in a 1966 Mustang recovered in Atlanta, Georgia, a week after Dr. King's murder. Ray likes western and country music, drinks vodka and beer and has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

PROCESS: A Federal warrant issued at Jefferson City, Missouri, on July 20, 1967, charges Ray with unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement for robbery. Another Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, as Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen.



Reference is made to information previously furnished the Legat by the writer concerning an article appearing in "El Imparcial", Hermosillo, Sonora newspaper 4/18/68 edition, which in substance stated that a Boston attorney planned to travel to Mexico to represent DAVID KENNEDY, a North American who was arrested by Sonora State Judicial Police as a suspect in captioned case.

On 4/30/68 Mr. ARNOLD DENYS, Protection Officer, U. S. Consulate, Hermosillo, Sonora, telephonically advised that KENNEDY (who was cleared as a suspect in captioned case) had appeared that date at the Consulate in an extremely agitated condition. KENNEDY had learned of the "El Imparcial" article; stated that neither he nor any member of his family had contacted this attorney in Boston; that he had no plans to take any legal action against the Mexican Government or FBI, and was primarily disturbed because he felt Mexican authorities would blame him for initiating this activity.

According to DENYS, KENNEDY was requesting assistance in how he might go about taking some legal action against the Boston attorney.

DENYS was informed that to date this attorney has not contacted the U. S. Embassy in Mexico and it was suggested he might inform KENNEDY that he probably had no intention of doing so inasmuch as he had not contacted KENNEDY, the alleged client in the matter.

DENYS stated he would discuss the matter further with the writer upon his return to Hermosillo on 5/1/68.

MELVILLE EUGENE GIBSON was max contacted on the afternoon of 4/29/68 at his residence, Prado Norte 314 concerning this thephone call and allegation.

In summary he advised that he had been on a two-day drunk and that the telephone call had been made by some drunken friends from his residence. He refused to identify the friends claiming he wished to contact them first and ascertain the facts. He noted that he had known LESLIE for years and had made reservations for him in Acapulco.

Concerning reports that subject was in Guatemala he advised that his friends could only have received this information from him and the only information he had was that he had heard in Acapulco that subject was headed for Cuba and that he was in Guatemala city preparing to go to Cuba. He was pressed as to the source of this report and indicated it was just something he had heard there. He then called his "compadre" in Acapulco, RICARDO PARIA (Phonetic) and reported that PARIA concurred that he had heard this report but had no real information as to subject's whereabouts'

He later made several calls to inform of his difficulties in locating his friends and their subsequent denial that they had made the calls.

Finally on the morning of 4/30/68 he called to advise that his children had advised him that he made the call. He said he was too drunk to remember doing it or why he did it or what he said. He apparently had a wrong number for LESLIE and therefore maust have called the police. He was extremely apologetic and advised he was consulting with a doctor concerning his drinking problem.

CHECK OF IDENTIFICATION RECORDS

Upon receipt today of identification orders searches were caused to be made of the Identification sections of the following organizations:

Mexico City Metropolitan Police Judicial Police of the Federal District Federal Judicial Police Office of Special Investigations, Bank of Mexico.

These are the only organizations with identification experts and sections. Mexican Immigration maintains fingerphints but does not classify or file by classification.

The listed departments claim to have latent or single fingerprint sections but are actually considered to have little capability in this regard. They actually maintain a small numbers of latents from pending cases of importance. The Federal Judicial Folice also have a classified section based on the right thumb.

Above searches negative and IO's will be retained in files as stops.

None of the latents are in cases in which an American is a suspect. Identification Officers and Department heads have expressed willingness to conduct any further searches desired and to conduct searches against latents if so desired.

It is considered that particularly in the case of the Metropolitan Police and the Judicial Police of the Federal District any such request would run a risk of newspaper publicity in Mexico relating to this case and this could problably not be controlled in spiteof assurances by department heads?

ALFONSO FRIAS of the Office of Special Investigations of the Banco de Mexico advised that he hadno record of any bank robberies in Mexico in Oct. or Nov. 1967. It is noted that such robberies fall in his jurisdiction and argovery NDEXED rare occurrences in Mexico.



At approximately 12:30 a.m., on 4-25-68, JOHN SCAFE, USIS Director, Hermosillo, Sonora, telephonically advised SA KAISER that a local reporter for the "El Sonorense" newspaper, ANGEL MARTINEZ, had informed him that an individual had been detained in Caborca, Sonora, the previous evening and was being considered a suspect in captioned case.

SCAFE subsequently called again on three or four occasions, stating that he was being swamped by telephone calls from numerous reporters in the U.S. attempting to obtain further details concerning this arrest.

MEX-59, on 4-25-68, advised that he had contacted Municipal Police authorities in Caborca, Sonora, who stated that at about 6 p.m., the previous evening, 4-24-68, Lt. ROBERTO FLETCHER had detained a North American named DANIEL DAVID KENNEDY, inasmuch as he answered the description of JAMES EARL RAY, aka. According to the source, Sonora State Judicial Police were transporting KENNEDY to Hermosillo, Sonora, under utmost secrecy, and that he would be interrogated by police officials at 8 a.m. that morning.

General TALAMANTE, Chief of the Sonora State Judicial Police, informed SA KAISER that KENNEDY was in custody, and requested assistance in determining whether he was identical with RAY.

In subsequent contact with State Judicial Police officers, KENNEDY's prints were taken, classified and compared with the classification of RAY, and were determined to be entirely different. (Fingerprint card, photograph, and other identifying data for KENNEDY placed in 1-A section instant file.)

For information of file prior to his departure for Campeche to cover leads in this matter SA PAGE was furnished with the identity of Capt. MARIO MENA HURTADO of the Federal Highway Police in Campeche. He has previously been of aid to this office in matters of mutual interest and shown himself to be capable. I addition the Consulate at Merida has recommended him as an official in Campeche who has been of aid to them and in fact the only police official there who has been shown to be somewhat responsible.

He has been in them area sometimes and in effect seems to operate as the Director of Public Safety for the state. He has his own private airplane in and has used it for patrols, etc.

"In addition Inspector HECTOR ZERMENO of Gobernación advises that his father-in-law MANUEL GONZALEZ VERDAD is the "Delegado" for the Federal Highway Police in Campeche sharing responsibility with Mena, with Mena in charge of patrols, etc. He advised GONZALEZ is very honest and competent and has been in that area about a year. ZERMENO said to he his name in contacting GONZALEZ and he was certain full cooperation would be offered.

In addition he advised that MARIO VALENZUELA has recently been named or will be named as Chief of the S_{t} ate J_{u} dicial Police, but problably has not as yet taken office.

At 3:15 p.m., 5/2/68, SA JOHN MILLER, Monterrey, advised that MEX-26 had located one of the two drivers of Monterrey-Mexico City bus of the Transportes del Norte line and had talked to him. The driver stated that when bus #359 stopped at San Luis Potosi one passenger got off. After waiting 20 minutes for him to return, the bus took off en route to Mexico City without that passenger. The driver could not identify the photographs of subject RAY as pertaining to any of the passengers on the bus and he was unable to describe or identify the passenger who got off the bus at San Luis Potosi. He merely knew that a "count of heads" when ready to depart San Luis Potosi showed that one passenger was missing.

SA MILLER points out that the unknown passenger who got off the bus at San Luis Potosi may have been subsequently picked up by bus #382, which is a through bus from Nuevo Laredo to Mexico City and which came along sometime after bus #359. MEX-26 has been trying to find the drivers of bus 382 to ask them if they picked up a passenger ist San Luis Potosi who had been on the previous bus. MEX-26 has identified the drivers of bus 382 as one DE LA ROSA and FRANCISCO DAVILA. DE LA ROSA is on eight days' leave and cannot be located; however, FRANCISCO DAVILA, whose Monterrey address is Calle Sierra de Santa Gertrudis #126, Fraccionamiento los Fuentes San Nicolas de los Garza, is at the present time en route driving a bus from Monterrey to Mexico City. DAVILA's bus is due to arrive in Mexico City at 8:00 p.m. tonight. SA MILLER is not sure if it is a bus from Monterrey or from Nuevo Laredo but it is the statek bus due to arrive from that area in Mexico City at Transportes del Norte at 8:00 p.m.long,

SA MILLER suggested that arrangements be made to have DAVILA interviewed at the Transportes del Norte station upon his arrival to ascertain if his bus picked up the missing passenger from San Luis Potosi on 4/6/68.

Reference is made to the leads that RAY was in San Pedro and <u>Capileo</u>, near Mexico City, during the period 4/23-25/68.

The following investigation was conducted by MEX-180, accompanied by the writer, on 5/1/68:

San Pedro (Martir), D. F., is on Hwy. 95 just south of the Caseta of the Cuernavaca toll road. Various individuals advised there have been no Northz Americans in the area and had not seen the individual in the photos. JONGE LIMA VAZQUEZ, Sub Delegado in San Pedro for the Tlalpan District, advised he had not seen any North American in the area and would Advise MEX-180 by telephone if he did.

LIMA said the presence of a "gringo" in the area would be "notorious" since they seldom come there.

No town named <u>Capileo</u> could be located. The town of Topilejo, D. F., is located at Km. 19. Inquiry there produced the same response as in San Pedro, i.e., that no North Americans had been seen in the area. Sub Delegado GUADALUPE MARTINEZ could not be located but MEX-180 will get in touch with him.

LTM VAZQUEZ had remarked that the Hotel 20 km. on the old Cuernavaca Hwy. receives many tourists and keeps records of the license plates. MIGUEL CRUZ, Owner, Hotel 20 km., which is really a cheap motel, advised he has not seen any North Americans in recent months and there had been no cars at the motel with U. S. plates during the entire month of April, 1968.


Following is information received by telephone from SA KAISER who received the information from MEX-156 this date.

Senorita JOSEFINA CALDERON, ticket seller, Bus Terminal at Ciudad Obregon, Sonora, for all bus lines, including one called Tres Estrellas de Oro, advised as follows: On the 25th of April an individual approached her ticket window, whom she described as follows: North American, white male, wearing a western style white hat with a type of brim that was more narrow than most, green or blue eyes, height 5'10", 35-40 years of age, wearing a white western style shirt (type with decorative buttons on pockets, collar, etc.), light blue ranch type pants, black boots, western type black heavy belt with a large metal buckle, and carrying a brief case.

She said this individual was similar to the person in the photograph exhibited to her (the one where he is wearing a tie), but definitely did not have a scar on his forehead.

Observations of the source were that this senorita is not too sharp and she commented that the only reason she noticed him was that he was good-looking. When he arrived at the ticket window he spoke very poor Spanish, and all he asked was "When the next bus left for the south of the country." She told him that the next bus was the line known as Expresso de Lujo No. 14, which was scheduled to leave at 1:55 that afternoon. He asked her where the bus would come in, and she pointed out the area where it would load and unload. He did not buy a ticket, he just left the ticket window and walked around in the terminal building in the vicinity of the place where the bus was to arrive. He made no mention of Guadalajara. She made the comment that he paced around in the terminal in what she described as acting somewhat nervous.

Further interview was conducted with a taxi driver who operates from the bus terminal into the city by the name of CARLOS LOPEZ. He recalled that on April 25 he recalled a North American, clothing described as the same as by Senorita CALDERON, and all other physical characteristics the same, including the fact that he did not have a scar on his forehead. The North American approached him and asked him in English if the taxi driver could speak English. The taxi driver said no, and the man shrugged his shoulders, left him and entered a small store which sells ice cream in the terminal, where he got an ice cream cone, and was still walking around in the area the last time the taxi driver saw him. This all took place, according to LOPEZ, during the hours of 1 to 2 p.m.

Investigation at the ice cream store reflects no one who remembers the man.

Numerous individuals in the bus terminal were interviewed and no one could verify the fact that this man boarded any bus. It is possible to purchase a ticket aboard a bus after boarding same from the driver.

Source checked some 18 hotels and probably 30 restaurants in the area, and all over Obregon, all negative to identify this individual.

With regard to the driver of Bus No. 14, he assumed that the best way to identify him would be either through the main office in Mexico, D.F. or at the termination of the trip, which apparently is Guadalajara. (Expresso de Lujo No. 14 is apparently one of the Tres Estrellas de Oro Lines). There are a number of other buses that go to Guadalajara from Ciudad Obregon.

These are all tentative identifications, and both persons were not certain that the individual in the bus station is identical with Subject.

Supervisor JOE KELLEY called from the Bureau at 9:50 a.m., 5/2/68, to inquire if full publicity had been given this case in Mexico. He was advised that widespread publicity had been given in all of the areas under investigation. It is to be noted that the Consul in Mazatlan previously advised me that widespread, repeated publicity with photographs had appeared in the west coast newspapers to the point the Consul was sure that if anyone saw RAY they would recognize him. SA MILLER in Monterrey also advised that widespread, repeated publicity with pictures had appeared in the Monterrey, Durango, and Torreon areas and, in fact, a new picture had just been published in the papers last Monday. Mr. KELLEY was told that we were awaiting information concerning the proposed reward which could be used as a basis for further publicity since something new is needed.

He inquired concerning the use of wanted flyers and was advised that those are of limited utility since the most important thing we need are IO's with fingerprints. He was requested to forward additional copies of the IO's.

Mr. KELLEY was also requested to have the pending investigation in Houston expedited and to have Houston and San Antonio resolve the question as to whether the individual identified as SMITH on the bus was the person reported by the Deputy Sheriff as possibly being subject RAY.

Mr. KELLEY was also requested to have Phoenix expedite the information requested in last night's cable concerning the suspect who was dressed in cowboy clothes and who had taken the west coast bus.

At 3:05 p.m., 5/1/68, Assistant Director AL ROSEN telephoned from the Bureau to inquire if we were sending an Agent to Campeche. He was advised that existing arrangements were to send an experienced investigative informant who had excellent contacts in that area (MEX-34) who would be leaving on the first available plane.

Mr. ROSEN instructed that the developments in Campeche be followed very closely.

He also instructed that extensive publicity be given to this case with frequent reproductions of photographs, especially in Campeche and the areas where we had outstanding investigation.

Mr. ROSEN also called attention to the fact that a cablegram would be coming through concerning possible reward for information leading to the apprehension of RAY and he suggested that this angle be utilized in publicity in order to stimulate interest and possibly bring information to the surface regarding RAY's whereabouts.

At 11:00 a.m., 5/2/68, Mr. ROSEN again called to instruct that the widest possible circulation be given to the flyers and 10's. He inquired if such had been circulated in the general area (near Campeche) and he was assured that photographs and appropriate material had previously been sent to the Consulate in Merida. He was also told that the Agent (JACK PAGE) who is leaving for Merida and Campeche, is taking along an additional supply of wanted notices, flyers, and photographs. It was pointed out to Mr. ROSEN that this office had made many copies of the photographs for circulation in the areas where we are handling investigations. He was told that concentrated efforts would be made to give widespread dissemination to the police agencies involved in the areas where we have active investigation going.
