

Re Firestone Tire Purchased in Mexico

At 10:05 a.m., 5-6-68, BEN COOPER, local Firestone Manager, called to advise that he had continued efforts to locate the point at which this tire was sold and had checked with their distributor in Puerto Vallarta.

This man, MANUEL FREGOSO, told COOPER that the tire was bought there last year and that the sale was recalled because the purchaser did not have a tube for the tire and a General Popo tube had to be obtained from a nearby outlet. COOPER said this dealer did not seem to wish to furnish any further information about this matter over the telephone.

This information was furnished to SA RUSSELL JEAN GRAY, JR. in Puerto Vallarta at 6 p.m., 5-6-68. He said he would check into it, but had not personally conducted the interviews which had earlier been unproductive in attempting to locate the place where the tire was sold.

On 5-7-68, at 7 p.m., SA GRAY advised that he had talked personally to TERESA FERNANDEZ, who is the clerk at the Firestone store in Puerto Vallarta at Avenida Mexico No. 50. She identified the photograph of the Subject wearing sunglasses.

The store is owned by JUAN MANUEL FREGOSO GUTIERREZ, but is run by the leader's wife, GENOVEVA. The clerk recalled the sale, but was uncertain regarding the date, stating that she thought it took place sometime after Christmas, 1967. She stated that a man came into the store in the morning and wanted to buy a 7.45 x 14 tire for a white Mustang. Since

the dealer did not have this size, he was sold a 7.50 x 14 tire which did not exactly fit the rim on his car. They told him that he should have a tube to correct this problem, and since none of this size were available, athrirestone, he went to the General Popo store two doors down the street and got the tube himself. Mrs. FREGOSO's brother mounted the tire on the car, and those interviewed recalled that the old tire had been badly bruised by road damage which necessitated its replacement.

At the General Popo store, Avenida Mexico No. 32, a clerk named ANA MARIA MADERO did not remember anything about the Subject or his car. She did search her records and found that a G-7 General Popo tube was sold for 57 pesos cash on 10-26-67, and the name on the sales slip was "M. Fregoso." She explained that whenever an employee of the Firestone store or another individual who had been sent to General Popo from the Firestone dealer completed a purchase, she always put the name of FREGOSO on the sales slip. The only other sales slip for a G-7 tube with the name FREGOSO which could be located was dated 1-13-68.

SA GRAY returned to the Firestone store and an extensive search was made for sales slipsexecuted on 10-26-67. He advised that the records in this store were not well kept and that it appeared a number of sales had been made by someone who neglected to place a carbon in the sales book and thereby lost the record of that particular sale. The clerk, TERESA FERNANDEZ, said that the serial number of a tire which was sold to a non-Mexican would not be placed on a sales slip. This is because the store did not anticipate having any problems with the warranty on the tire. She said she did not know the Subject's name, and remembered that she did not put the serial number on the sales slip.

She did have a special reason for recalling the sale, because the Subject expressed displeasure that the store did not have the proper size tire and asked for a discount on the tire he bought for this reason. The clerk remembered that she had to go upstairs to the office to ask Mrs. FREGOSO whether this 10% discount could be allowed.

TERESA FERNANDEZ also advised that she lives near the Casa Susana, and that she had seen the white Mustang parked there on three or four occasions about 8 a.m. She said the car was parked around the corner on the next street from the Casa Susana. She said she also saw the Subject about Noon one day driving up the hill toward the Casa Susana in the car, but that she never saw him with anyone else.

Re Suspect at Ciudad Obregon

In order to determine whether additional information concerning this suspect might now be available to the Domestic Field, a call was placed to the San Diego Office at 10:30 a.m., 5-6-68.

The ASAC, CLARK F. BROWN, said he was familiar with this allegation, but could not remember having seen anything further concerning it. He said he would follow up on it immediately and see that the Agent on the scene conducted additional interviews with the sources of this allegation if this had not already been done.

At 11:20 a.m., 5-6-68, ASAC JAMES J. ROWAN, Phoenix, advised that, to his knowledge, no additional pertinent details had been developed at Sonoyta, Sonora, where the suspect allegedly hid from Immigration inspectors at the time the bus on which he was a passenger was being processed through the check point. ROWAN said that pictures of the Subject had been shown at Sonoyta to both Mexican and U.S. Immigration officers, but that efforts to locate the driver of the bus had not been productive up to that date. ROWAN stated that additional work would be done on this aspect and that this Office would be advised through the Bureau.



JEAN GRAY, JR. advised that he had been told by the Mexican Immigration Agent in Puerto Vallarta that a person resembling the Subject had been there for several days during the latter part of April. This is the allegation regarding A. D. STANGE, JR., of Redding, California, which was furnished to the Bureau in Mexico City cable 5-6-68 with the request that STANGE be checked out by the Sacramento Office.


GRAY said that he had personally spotted a man resembling the Subject while at Yelapa that day, 5-6-68, and had determined the motel in which this individual was staying. He said that he would conduct further inquiry regarding this suspect.

On 5-7-68, GRAY stated that he and the local Immigration Agent had interviewed the individual above, and that he had identification as a doctor from Colorado, and a Colorado driver's license with his picture issued in 1966. He said that this individual, after viewing the picture of Subject wearing sunglasses, agreed that he resembled the Subject. GRAY said that the interview provided the first opportunity to see this individual without sunglasses and that he noted that the man's eyes were brown. He also had the opportunity to look at the left index finger of this doctor, and determined that the pattern was not similar to that which the Subject is known to have on this finger.



ATTEMPTS TO ESTABLISH DEPARTURE OF GALT FROM MEXICO

As has been reported, Attorney JORGE VAZQUEZ ROBLES, Chief of the Inspection Service of Mexican Immigration, caused a search to be made of all departures from Mexico to the United States during November, 1967, and could not locate any record of a departure from Mexico for GALT or any of the other names utilized by Subject. The only possibility he could furnish was a departure at Nogales on 11/13/67 for one ERIC G. THOMPSON. He considered this a possibility because of the coincidence of the name ERIC, the initial G, the age 38, the destination California, and the consideration that the departure through Nogales on this date might coincide with Subject's plans.

He furnished a copy of Mexican tourist card FM-5, which was issued to THOMPSON. The signatures on this tourist card were photographed with the polaroid camera and are being made an exhibit to this file.

According to this tourist card, it was issued 11/11/67 at Nogales, Sonora, to ERIC G. THOMPSON; male, age 38, married, born Los Angeles, California; address Ventura, California. He identified himself with a birth certificate. He indicated he was traveling by car to Guaymas, Sonora. He entered Mexico at 8:20 p.m. The card indicates he departed Mexico at Guaymas on 11/13/67.

Since this card demonstrates entry and departure from Mexico in a 3-day period, there does not appear to be any possibility this corresponds with Subject.

At 10:25 a.m., 5/10/68, SA JOHN MILLER telephonically furnished the following information from Monterrey:

The checks of logical hotels and motels where subject JAMES RAY could have overnighted during his October 1967 trip to Mexico have just about been completed. MEX-33, who is making the check, has found no record of anyone registering as GALT and the only possibility he has found so far was a man who registered at a motel in Matehuala under the name JAMES A. SASSMAN, Route 1, Box 195-A, Citronelle, Alabama. SASSMAN remained at the motel in Matehuala (SA MILLER was unable to advise the name of the motel, although that information will be available when MEX-33 returns to Monterrey) on October 11, 12, and 13, 1967. According to motel employees, he was driving a 1967 Ford car which one of the motel clerks recalled was white. The motel employees could not recall having seen a man similar to the photographs displayed to them but did recall that SASSMAN was accompanied by a pretty girl who wore a mini-skirt.

MEX-33 will complete his check in San Luis Potosi this afternoon.

SA MILLER pointed out that hotel and motel records are confused and it is very difficult to locate records which are not necessarily kept in chronological order. Each hotel and motel is required to furnish the local Poblacion representative as well as the Secret Service daily lists of persons registered. Both Poblacion and Secret Service, however, merely review the lists for any persons of interest, retain the lists for a day or two, and then discard them so that permanent lists are not available. After the daily lists are made up, the hotel or motel normally retains the registration cards but since they normally have no further use for such cards, they are not filed chronologically.

SA MILLER was instructed to expedite this check and have it completed as soon as possible.

Re: Suspect at Guisamopa, Sonora

On 5-13-68, SA RICHARD W. KAISER advised that MEX-156 had completed the investigation concerning this suspect. The informant traveled first to Guisamopa and, at one stage of the investigation, traveled on foot for approximately 12 miles in an effort to locate Captain BAUDELIO JAIME GLEZ. The Captain was located in the Guisamopa area, and it was determined that he is not associated with the police, but is a retired Army Captain who is practicing medicine around Guisamopa. He was shown the most recent photographs of the Subject, and stated that the man he had in mind bore a slight resemblance to the photographs, but was definitely not identical.

He also explained that he had furnished information concerning this individual after seeing him in Vicam, Sonora, where the suspect was a friend of MANUEL CRUZ RAMIREZ, who is the operator of a tire repair shop in the latter community. Vicam, Sonora, is located a short distance off the highway between Guaymas and Ciudad Obregon. It is, according to KAISER, about 30 miles north of the latter city.

MEX-156 went today, 5-13-68, to Vicam, and located and interviewed the person considered a suspect. He identified himself with a tourist card, FM-5, No. as ARTURO FUGATE, and gave two addresses, one at 111 Chapaia Street, Santa Barbara, California; and the other at 9336 El Dorado Avenue, Sun Valley, California. He is driving a 1954 Buick with California plates LGN-383, and entered Mexico on 4-12-68 at Nogales, Sonora, with his wife, HELEN MARGARITA FUGATE, and two children, aged 7 and $1\frac{1}{2}$ years.

Informant also reported that FUGATE does not match the description of the Subject, and is approximately 45 years old, and bald with no scars. He said FUGATE appears to be somewhat mentally unstable, and is living in Vicam, in a shack made from wooden sticks, with local Indians.

At 2:50 p.m., 5/13/68, SA JOHN H. MILLER furnished the following information telephonically from Monterrey:

The Monterrey RA does not have complete information on the Mustang car driven by GALT to Mexico but submitted the following information as possibly being pertinent:

According to MEX-33, on 10/25/67 one PAUL M. HERRON had a 1967 Mustang serviced at the Agencia Central Potosina at San Luis Potosi. This car had license # TDV 670 (state and year unknown). The car was recorded as having VIN FRDIC-→138997. MILLER pointed out that if the actual VIN was FROIC it would be good for a 1967 Mustang and possibly an error was made in recording the VIN at the service station. MEX-33 reported the above information because it involved a 1967 Mustang and HERRON was one of the aliases used on occasions by RAY, alias Galt. MILLER suggested that the file be reviewed in order to determine whether this was actually GALT's car. MEX-33 displayed the wanted notices and photographs of RAY, alias Galt, to the personnel at the service station but no one could remember having seen such an individual. MEX-33 obtained the above information in a check he has been making of all garages in San Luis Potosi, Durango, and Matehuala.

MEX-33 has checked all of the motels and hotels in San Luis and Matchuala but there is no record of GALT's having stayed at any of those places between the time he crossed the border and the time he arrived at Puerto Vallarta.

Checks of hotels and motels in Monterrey have almost been completed. The check has not yet been finished because of unavailability of records of some hotels and motels.

At Durango MEX-33 is finishing his hotel and motel check tonight and will not call MILLER unless he finds something of significance.





Gen. RAMON JIMENEZ DELGADO, DFS, had attached cc of a report in Spanish when I went to see him yesterday. Contains a description of unknown American with beard and scar over his right eye who might have crodded into Guatemala illegally on 5-3-68 sometime after 10:00 PM (This was the hour the "gasolinera" (actually a store where they have drums of gasoline for retail) closed and attendant there reported the American was still sitting on a bench at a soft drink stand 15 to 20 meters from where the gasolinera was. Gen. JIMENEZ said the gasolinera man only saw this American at night.

At 12:15 PM today, Gen JIMENEZ advised he had been in contact with Agent SANTIAGO BARRUETA in Tapachula. The Taxi Driver, MIGUEL ANGEL CONSTANTINO, had been shown RAY&s photo or photos and stated the American described in Gen. JIMENEZ' report was definately not RAY. Gobernacion Agents had reportedly shown CONSTANTINO a photograph of an American involved in a BR at the Banco de Londres (when, where, etc. not known) and the American looked much more like the BR subject. Also, CONSTANTINO told BARRUETA that 4 Americans, presented to be FBI Agents, had been trying to contact CONSTANTINO, but, as yet, had only seen his wife.

If BARRUETA develops further background regarding the American, Gen. JIMENEZ will notify us. The only additional descriptive data today is the American has a very wide face and the beard and mustache are now described as not false, and definately not recent growth.

At 7:15 a.m., 5/11/68, Supervisor RICHARD LONG of the Bureau telephonically requested that the fingerprints from Acapulco be submitted as soon as received.

With regard to our airtel of 4/23/68 with the guest list of the Del Rio Hotel, Mr. LONG advised that the Mrs. PALMER whose name appeared on the list from Seattle had been located and it had been determined she was on a business trip to Mexico with scheduled flight to Mazatlan but due to plane trouble it was necessary for the plane to return to Puerto Vallarta and she had no knowledge of GALT.

With regard to the lead from Guatemala to obtain more information from DAVID GORDON FOX, Mr. LONG advised that FOX had stated he could furnish no more information than that originally submitted but referred us to Mexico City file 100-2981 for information concerning FOX's identity (that file shows that FOX was reportedly in some way connected with CIA in Guatemala). Mr. LONG said that he would furnish us the information sent from Detroit on 5/3/68 but was not forwarding us Detroit's current reply since it contained nothing of value.

At 12:20 p.m., 5/11/68, Duty Agent JOSEPH TRIMBACK in Assistant Director ROSEN's office was telephonically advised that the fingerprints had been received from Acapulco, that a preliminary examination showed those fingerprints to be very illegible and that no determination could be made either as to whether they were or where not identical. He was advised that the prints would be forwarded along with the blood sample received from Acapulco through the pilot of the first available plane to Washington and that he would be advised later as to which plane and when.

At 4:55 p.m., 5/11/68, Duty Supervisor J. R. ADAMS in Mr. ROSEN's office was telephonically advised that the fingerprints and blood sample received from Acapulco would be forwarded by Eastern Airline flight 910 scheduled to arrive

Mr. ADAMS was advised that if additional prints were needed, there would probably be some legal problems in exhuming the body in Acapulco. He was also told that some of the Mexico City newspapers were tying the case of the unidentified murder victim in Acapulco into this case.

At 10:30 p.m., 5/11/68, SA ROBERT J. OGLESBY, JR., telephonically furnished the following information from Guadalajara:

The prostitute MANUELA has been located and again interviewed. The only comment she had to offer was that the most recent picture of subject RAY shows him to be fatter than he was when she knew him.

SA OGLESBY pointed out that RAY had reportedly made long distance calls in the United States but that while he was in Puerto Vallarta there was no record of any telephone calls from his hotel. It has been ascertained that records of long distance calls made from the telephone company at Puerto Vallarta or from other pay areas were kept at Mazatlan. He is, therefore, making arrangements for one of his informants with credentials to go to Mazatlan to check the telephone company records. En route the informant will also check hotels and appropriate places in Tepic and Compostela. This matter will be handled over the week end and SA OGLESBY expects to have a report from the informant by Monday, 5/13/68.

At 9:30 p.m., 5/11/68, Supervisor WILBUR MARTINDALE telephoned from the Bureau to advise that a study of the fingerprints received from Acapulco by two of the Bureau's best single fingerprint experts had shown that it was impossible to determine whether the prints were or were not identical with subject RAY. He advised that consideration would be given to sending a fingerprint expert down from the Bureau to take legible prints.

At 12:20 a.m., 5/12/68, Mr. MARTINDALE telephonically advised that GEORGE J. BONEBRAKE, one of the best-qualified single fingerprint technicians, had been designated to make a trip to Mexico, leaving Washington at 5:25 p.m., that evening and arriving in Mexico City on American Airlines flight 25 at approximately 10:48 p.m., 5/12/68. Mr. MARTINDALE requested that we meet BONEBRAKE and assist him. The only provisal in connection with BONEBRAKE's trip was to be sure that he would be able to obtain another set of fingerprints. It was pointed out to Mr. MARTINDALE that we would have to immediately take steps to arrange matters relating to BONEBRAKE's trip. Mr. MARTINDALE advised that if any difficulty developed that he be advised immediately since it was only four hours to BONEBRAKE's plane time.

Mr. MARTINDALE also advised that Assistant to the Director C. D. deLOACK wants the Bureau's participation in the Acapulco fingerprint problem kept out of the press if at all possible. It was recognized by the Bureau and it would not be possible for us to control the Chief of Police in Acapulco but it was desired that we insure that there be absolutely no newspaper quotations emanating from us.

At 2:30 p.m., Mr. MARTINDALE was advised that preliminary inquiries at Gobernacion showed that it was not expected that there would be any problem with BONEBRAKE's trip and, therefore, he should continue his plans to come to Mexico.


