For information, identification orders and Spanish language wanted flyers have been furnished to police and immigration officials either personally by Central American road trip agent or through cooperating Consuls and Chief Public Safety officers in each of the five Central American countries covered by Mexico City. These items were furnished personally by SA MILLER to immigration and police officials in San Salvador, El Salvador; Tegucigalpa and San Pedro Sula, Hondurad; Managua, Nicaragua; through Chief Public Safety Officer PETER COSTELLO in Guatemala, and through Consul DENMAN STANFIELD in Costa Rica. It might be noted that special attention was given to the Caribbean coast—that is the north coast of Honduras and Costa Rica, inasmuch as the inhabitants of the costal region and off—shore islands in both countries are primarily English speaking people. These areas are also inhabited by permanent and transient U. S. visitors who receive little or no attention from the local inhabitants.

Lt. HUBERT BODDEN, in charge of the Department of National Investigations for the north coast of Honduras, advised he would circulate all men assigned under him in the areas covering the Bay Isles (Islas de la Bahia) and in the principal port areas of Puerto Cortez, Tela and La Ceiva, Honduras.

On receiving information that Americans had been noted in the off-shore island area of the Corn Islands and Bluefields areas of Nicaragua, contact was made there and flyers left with Mr. JOHN COUSENS, who operates the only hotel covering the Corn Islands. The one Nicaraguan National Guard agent assigned to the island was ascertained to be illiterate and thus coverage was effected through COUSENS. COUSENS stated that Americans are coming and going through that area at all times, many with no permission from the Nicaraguan government, and that he would be on the lookout for anyone answering Subject's description. Consul MARIO CALVANI of the American Embassy in Managua, stated that COUSENS is in regular contact with him and he will follow this matter with COUSENS.

As regards reportings that Subject JAMES EARL RAY has been seen in Guatemala, MEX-65 made available copy of the Guatemalan Judicial Police report dated 5/5/68 concerning the allegations made of a sighting of an individual possibly identical to RAY, made by Mr. PAULINO JARQUIN RICHEME, owner of the Katok Restaurant, located at Kilometer 87, within the jurisdiction of the municipality of Tecpan, Guatemala, state of Chimaltenango.

When first interviewed by Agents of the Interpol Section of the Judicial Police of Guatemala on 5/4/68, JARQUIN was reported to have stated that he recognized RAY from photographs which had been published in various Guatemalan newspapers and alleged also that the individual which he believed to be RAY had scars on his forehead and on his right hand.

JARQUIN was interviewed at length by Judicial Police Agents again on 5/5/68 for additional details of his identification. When pressed for details JARQUIN changed his story and stated that he did not know the date when this individual supposedly had breakfast at his restaurant, did not know the manner in which this individual was traveling, and did not know whether the individual was headed toward or away from Guatemala City. He denied, in fact, having ever seen any such person and denied having conversed with any North American regarding his alleged identification of RAY. The Judicial Police Agents questioned all the employees of the Katok Restaurant without obtaining any information regarding the alleged identification of RAY.

MEX-65 advised that the Judicial Police investigation determined that JARQUIN had in fact, talked to numerous people and numerous newspaper reporters concerning his alleged identification of an individual believed to be RAY. The stories and dates given by JARQUIN were completely inconsistent and as a result of this investigation, JARQUIN was arrested by the Judicial Police on 5/8/68 and charged with furnishing false information. As of 5/16/68 JARQUIN remained in the custody of the Judicial Police.

MEX-65 stated that as a result of another report that an individual believed possibly identical with RAY was seen entering the Edificio Elgin, located at 4a Avenida 20-71, Zone 14. in Guatemala City, a search of the entire five-story Elgin building was carried out by elements of the Judicial Police MEX-65 stated that in fact the entire block was cordoned off and all vehicle and foot traffic was stopped in and out of the area until the search was completed. result of this search, the individual believed possibly identical with RAY was located in apartment #52 of the Elgin Building and taken to the Judicial Police headquarters until his identity could be established. This individual was subsequently identified as ARNULF HERMAN HAAC, a German technician who had arrived in Guatemala City the previous week and rented the apartment in the MEX-65 stated that the information regarding Elgin Building. this individual originated with the building guard, ANDRES OSUNA ESTRADA, however, Subject's photograph was exhibited to other building occupants who originally believed also that HAAC might possibly be identical with Subject. MEX-65 observed that as a result of their obtaining Subject's actual fingerprints, which were furnished to the Judicial Police through PETER COSTELLO, as indicated previously, any future suspects could be more easily eliminated.

YOLANDA DE ROSAL, Consular Assistant, American Embassy, Guatemala City, recalled that PAULINO JARQUIN had been involved in prior years in at least two other incidents involving U. S. citizens. She stated approximately one year and a half ago, an American tourist couple were followed after having eaten at the Katok Restaurant, their vehicle stopped and they were robbed of all their possessions and their car and left tied to a tree. She indicated that JARQUIN had a questionable reputation at best.

It might be noted that this matter has received considerable publicity in all newspapers throughout Central America. From contacts with the various Embassies during May 1968 road trip, it was determined that photographs of Subject first utilizing the name GALT and then under the correct name of RAY, as made available by the Associated Press, were prominently featured in almost every newspaper. The publicity resulting from the alleged sightings in Guatemala received front page publicity through Central America. Example of this publicity is the clipping from the May 8 issue of "Prensa Libre", which was headlined on page 1 regarding the search of the Elgin Building, and the first and second pages of the May 7, 1968, issue

of the "Diario Latino", published in San Salvador, El Salvador, regarding the alleged sighting of RAY at the Katok Restaurant.

On 5/20/68 fifty additional Spanish language Wanted Flyers were forwarded to the Public Safety Officer in Guatemala and Honduras, who had each indicated they would make a copy of the flyer available to each police delegation in each of the countries.

It was emphasized in all contacts throughout the five Central American countries that a substantial reward is outstanding within the United States for the person or persons who capture RAY. It was emphasized also that the reward was payable for RAY alive.

ALLEGATIONS CONCERNING JAMES ANDERSON

JOAQUIN LUGO of the Perez y Perez/Travel Agency, Londres 47, Mexico City was contacted/concerning an American who arranged for a trip to Isla Mujeres through that agency. He ammediately said that this was Mr. Anderson, since this is the only # individual recently traveling to Isla Mujeres through their aid. not recall this individual's first name or find any record concerning this transaction. He recalled ANDERSON was staying at the Hotel Alfer, although he might have stayed at the Maria Isabel one night. ANDERSON claimed to be and seemed to be quite prosperous and said he had several supermarkets and wanted to check the possibility of such an operation in Mexico. He was brought to the agency by a tourist guide from the Hotel Alfer, name unknown. He had a letter to this agency from his bankers in the U.S. requesting courtesies. Harmananan e traveled to Merida on flight 601 of Mexicana, date unknown, sometime in May. In Merida he was to stay one night at the Hotel Merida and continue to the Hotel #############Zazil-Ha Mujeres. He was then to return to Merida and continue by Pan American to Miami on an international ticket he already had)

He described ANDERSON as about 32 years, medium height, about 5'8", not tall, brown hair, most noticable characteristic a bad limp. He was shown a representative group of photographs including various of RAY and advised problematy he was positive that ANDERSON was not among this group.

ANDERSON was malso in contact with a Santa secretary of this agency IRMA FRANCO who was shown the same photographs and was equally positive ANDERSON was not among this group. ANDERSON told her he had broken his leg in fiveplaces and was in great pain. She took him to the Clinica San Jose to Drawson. Ricardo Espinosa for a pain reliever.
