

Said Ray had trouble with his feet. Said worked on Miss. River as cook. When left, said going to Canada to look for job. A 10/8/68 p. 12 Said Rayns rented room 4/30/67; Rent Record books shows his writing. Occupied rear basement apartment - cost \$12 - \$13 a week. Stayed for about 3 or 4 weeks.

Said had bad feet; quiet; books; cooked; received one letter, from Canada. Said he was going to work there. Left @ 7:00 am each morning; did not notice he had car. Her aunt (now dead), rented apartment to him. Told her he Ad of room in local paper "The Booster." Left building before 5/17 or 6/17 when new man rented his room.

No I.D. of Ray from photos.

Gave rent record book to SA Burke 7/24/68.

Indian Trail Restaurant, 507 Chestnut St., Winnetka, Illinois - identified photos of Ray who worked for them as a diswasher and cook's helper from 5/3/67-6/24/67 as John L. Rayns. Furnished ledger sheet, Employee's Withholding Exemption Certificate, and payroll checks to SA Stratton 8/30/68. H. Klingeman signed the 7 checks. Says he sent last check (#5357) dated 6/25/67) to Ray's brother in Northbrook, Illinois, because Ray had already let to "work on boats."

Huie Story: Huie said Ray served 7 years of 20 year sentence at MSP. While there had 8 visitors, one of whom was brother.

While there, hid razor, green prison trousers dyed black, 12 Hershey bars before escape. Put \$300 in shoe, escaped in bread truck, walked to Chicago.

Ray read Ad for help at Indian Trail Restaurant. During employment at restaurant, recognized by an unknown who recognized Ray and threatened to reveal Ray if Ray did not work for him. Ray was given \$1200 in initial contacts and was ultimately paid \$15,000 but due to receive more. Told to investigate crossing Canadian Border and told to get names from paper for passport. Ray went to Canada 3 times.

Ray then given more money to buy a Mustang and told to drive to Acapulco for tourist sticker. Then drove through Mexico to West Coast and hid out there awaiting instinctions. Ray was frlown to Atlanta from West Coast, but time not right, so sent back. King was allegedly in Holiday Inn in Atlanta when Ray flown there.

Ray was given money to obtain binoculars, and gun and was to go to Memphis to be in room 312 or 313 at 3 pm. There were allegedly other individuals who came to this room.

Huie said Ray did not actually kill King and would identify killers at trial. Ray picked up rifle, ran to car and drove to rendezvous spot in Atlanta where he waited several days to get "bundle" of money. The plan was to go to Mexico and immediately fly north, but since money did not come, went directly to Canada and got passport to England.

Believed Ray came to work with Willie Perry and Fred Burns, fellow employees. No racial comments. Said was in Germany during war.

Galt said had been in Mexico, believed to be in early 1967. Arvidson thinks Galt said he had restaurant in Mexico. Galt always wore shirt and tie, often wore expensive alligator shoes, believed to be loafer style. Galt said he was Merchant Marine. When he quit, Galt said he wanted to attend bartender school so he could open a restaurant.
