Re: James Earl RAY and aliases

On Tuesday, June 18, 1968, Cpl. J.S.DUNLOP of the R.C.M.P. "O" Division, Toronto, Ontario, contacted the Laundry and Dry Cleaning identification examiner of this branch in regard to attempting to identify a laundry mark which appeared on a shirt collar. The mark was described as an encircled C over the digits 24, and when records search had been completed, appeared to be of the type employed by personnel of Community Cleaners, 789 Dundas Street West, Toronto, Ontario.

Subsequently, Sgt FULLERTON and Cpl. DUNLOP, R.C.M.P. officers attended this section on Monday, July 8, 1968, producing photographs of two separate laundry marks. One of the photographs related to the mark previously described. The second photograph portrayed the mark EG-C83 which appeared to be on the waist band of a pair of underpants. The investigating officers were of the opinion that a positive identification had been made in regards to Community Cleaners in the case of the shirt and requested that an examination be made of the second mark.

It is my understanding our examiner Mr. C.O. Byrne and the investigating officers are in complete agreement that both marks examined could have been made by personnel of Community Cleaners. I also believe that the investigating officers would like a report on this matter.

1. Further to para. #22 of PCR dated 17 JUN 68, Miss Marie Monique Marcelle MATHIEU (B.D. 18 DEC 40) was contacted and interviewed.
2. The phone bill in question was obtained from her and is held as item #1 on Exhibit Report 68/47. Copies of Exhibit Report are attached. This phone bill was initialed by Cpl. Power, Cst. MOUSSEAU and MATHIEU.
3. MATHIEU states that all calls shown on this bill were made by KIMBLE. MATHIEU does not know whom he was calling and did not hear any of his conversations.
4. Photostat copies of this phone bill are attached for further investigation by the F.B.I. At present, investigations are being conducted with the BELL TELEPHONE CO. to obtain all particulars concerning these calls.
5. MATHIEU stated that KIMBLE obtained his ownphone after the 15 SEP 67. The phone number he had, she no longer remembers. Further investigations are being conducted to obtain this number through the BELL at which time a further check will be made to obtain all particulars of any phone calls made.
6. During our general conversation with her concerning KIMBLE, she confirmed the information given by SALWYN as mentioned in para. #6(c) of PCR dated 17 JUNE 68.
7. Further to what she had told SALWYN, she stated that on one occasion, she noticed two (2) rifles and some ammunition in the trunk of KIMBLE'S car. She could not describe the rifles, however, in her opinion, the ammunition appeared to be shot-gun shells.
8. MATHIEU further stated that on one occasion, while she and KIMBLE were at the Orange Julep Restaurant on Sherbrooke St. E., Montreal, two (2) persons came and talked to KIMBLE. One was a white male, age 25, believed to be German and the other was a white female, age 25, believed to be French. The conversation was very short, no introduction was made and she did not hear any of the conversation.
9. MATHIEU'S present roommate Marie Claude ROUILLARD, (BD 25 NOV 39) was present. ROUILLARD also resided at 3420 St. Germain St. Apt. #3, with her sister Lucille (BD APR 36). ROUILLARD knew KIMBLE through MATHIEU. She corroborated what MATHIEU had stated except that she did not observe any of the rifles in KIMBLE'S car, nor was she present at the Orange Julep Restaurant. 12. It appears that an investigation is warranted in this matter, however, before interviewing any other persons, it is requested that a photo of KIMBLE be forwarded to this point.



2. Further to this airtel, the unknown Minuteman is believed to be Jules Rocco KIMBLE. Information that KIMBLE was connected with the Minuteman Organization was mentioned to me by DALWYN. The name of the lawyer will be ascertained later in the event it is required.

1. Mr. Andrew SALWYN (born 1 FEB 36) of 1225 St-Marc Street, Apartment 1206, Montreal, P.Q. (phone 932-6344), contacted this office in person to give information concerning a Jules Rocco KIMBLE wanted for questioning by the GARRISON PROBE into the John F. KENNEDY murder case. In return for this information, SALWYN wanted to know the following points concerning the case of:

68GIS 790-107  
68HQ 790-Q-60

- (a) Address where RAY alias GALT stayed in Montreal.
- (b) Duration of RAY alias GALT's stay in Montreal.

With this information, he hoped to ascertain what, if any, connection there was between the fact that KIMBLE had with RAY in that SALWYN had uncovered through his investigation, that KIMBLE had resided at 3420 St-Germain Street, Montreal, and also through the news media, it was reported in the majority of newspapers that RAY had also resided on St-Germain Street. However, the address for RAY on the street was not mentioned.

2. SALWYN further requested that before he gave any information concerning his investigation, he wanted also to have our cooperation in releasing to him on a first-hand basis any information that we may have or may obtain through our investigation concerning the information he had on KIMBLE in order that he may be able to release his investigation as a front-page headline, under his name.

3. It will be noted that no information was given to SALWYN but it was impressed on him that cooperation would be given to him should an investigation be made on the information which he intends to give.

4. SALWYN further stated that he is employed by the TORONTO STAR and is the Bureau Chief of this newspaper with office located at 1000 St-Antoine Street, Montreal, c/o THE GAZETTE (phone 866-9006).

5. It will be noted that SALWYN's main interest is to establish that RAY had resided in the same area and at the same time as KIMBLE during 1967 in Montreal and the possible connection of a conspiracy involving the murder of John F. KENNEDY and Dr. Martin Luther KING. SALWYN did not however mention the latest murder of Robert F. KENNEDY.

6. SALWYN stated that during a routine check of St-Germain Street to locate the address of RAY alias GALT, he located the address at 3420 St-Germain Street where KIMBLE resided. SALWYN having been aware of the GARRISON PROBE and the fact that GARRISON is presently looking for KIMBLE, SALWYN conducted an investigation on KIMBLE and came up with the following information:

- (a) John SUZ, janitor at 3420 St-Germain Street (phone 522-6530) which is a rooming house, was interviewed by SALWYN. SUZ has advised that a Jules Rocco KIMBLE, age approximately 25, white, 6'2" and 200 lbs, had resided at this address during the Summer of 1967. The exact dates were unknown to SUZ as the books for the rooming house are presently in the hands of his accountant who is on holidays at the present time. The description of KIMBLE as given by SUZ matches the description as known by SALWYN. SALWYN has no photo of KIMBLE as he has been unable to obtain one as of the 13 JUN 68. SUZ went on to describe KIMBLE as a girl chaser, unemployed, claimed to be a student and received long distance calls (not collect) every day from an unknown place. KIMBLE also made a few phone calls nearly every day (not collect) to New Orleans, Louisiana, U.S.A. KIMBLE did not pay for any of these calls and left without notice taking with him the janitor's watch and radio. KIMBLE during his stay at this address also received telegrams very often from the U.S.A., exact place unknown.
- (b) SUZ mentioned that KIMBLE was very friendly with a Marcelle MATHIEU, age 27, white, who resided in an adjacent room to KIMBLE's.
- (c) SALWYN located MATHIEU at 3280 Bélair Street, Apt. 210, Montreal (phone 721-9612). MATHIEU is a teacher of national science. She stated to SALWYN what she knew concerning KIMBLE and the following is the content of the notes made by SALWYN concerning his interview of MATHIEU.

"On our second date, he suddenly asked me how do I like negroes. I told him I had nothing against them and that I thought that some of them were in fact better than white men. I also told him that I had kissed a negro and it did not make any difference to me. He was living in the same boarding house at 3420 St-Germain Street and he asked me to go out with him, that must have been around September 5 last year. He took me out in his car, it was an ivory CAMARO with a black vinyl roof. He had a pink telephone inside and a special receiver through

which he listened to police radio messages. He asked me once what they were talking about because he could not understand French. This car also had a police siren and Louisiana licence plates. When I told him how I felt about negroes, he changed the subject and never brought it up again. He told me he was the son of a US Senator but I checked with the American Embassy and found out it was not true. I told him so and he said there were a lot of Senators in Louisiana and his father was involved in state politics. He also told me that he could hypnotize people and that he helped a doctor curing people with it. I told him not to try it on me. He said that he studying psychology at McGill University but I found that this was not true either. Some time he told me he did not have any money to take me out. When I told him that I had none myself, he used to go away for about an hour and came back with plenty in his pockets. Once, I managed to take him with me to mass at the St. Joseph Oratory. When we returned to the boarding house, there was a note from the Canadian National Telegram Office telling him that there was a telegram for him at the station. We went there and after he read the telegram, he said: "There are things that we did and that we should not have done". I asked what was he talking about and he answered: "Never mind". I once asked him where he got his money from and replied: "That is none of your business". He told me that he had tried some narcotics and made other people try it but that he gave it up. He also told me that he was in a airplane accident and had a big scar on his chest. This scar, I saw. In the beginning, he used to come to my room to use my phone and make long distance calls. Later, I received a bill for \$40 from the Bell Telephone people for these calls which he never paid. All the calls were made to New Orleans. I knew he had some friends in the area but I never met them. I believe he left the boarding house suddenly on the weekend after September 20. We were no longer going out together at this time. He and I also went to EXPO and the only thing he wanted to see was the Russian and American Pavilions. After that, he was never away from the house except for a maximum of three hours at a time during the week. He often went away during weekends. He made one weekend trip to Miami by aircraft."

- (d) The phone bill as mentioned by MATHIEU is still in her possession; however, she will not give it to SALWYN but only to the RCMP. SALWYN did not see this phone bill.

7. SUZ further advised that KIMBLE borrowed \$5.00 from a Pierre TULMOZZ, age 22, who resided in the next apartment building to KIMBLE. TULMOZZ was contacted by SALWYN and he stated that he never received the \$5.00 from KIMBLE and further stated that KIMBLE had a friend living on nearby Sherbrooke Street. He did not know the address as KIMBLE never took him along when he went to visit this male friend. TULMOZZ also stated that he went out with another girl and this girl's

name he could not remember. TULMOZZ said that this girl knows the friend who lives nearby Sherbrooke Street.

8. Further investigation by SALWYN resulted in the locating of this girl by the name of Lise ROBILLARD, age 19, white, unemployed, 155 St-Alexis Street, Charlemagne District, Montreal. Before contacting ROBILLARD, SALWYN was able to speak to ROBILLARD's mother who resides with her and she stated that KIMBLE was known to them as a doctor.

9. ROBILLARD was interviewed and the following is the content of SALWYN's interview with her:

"She stated that she met KIMBLE while she was hitchhiking from St. Mary's School to her residence. At this time, KIMBLE was driving the ivory CAMARO. When she was picked up by KIMBLE, they went to a small restaurant on Sherbrooke Street East, which she believes to be the ORANGE JULEP. Then he drove her home. For the next two weeks, he picked her up every morning and took her back every night. During these two weeks, he mentioned that he was expecting a call from a man. This man eventually called and according to the voice on the phone, he was between 30 and 40 years and English speaking. This phone call was received at her residence. There were no names mentioned and the call was believed to be a local one and no place was mentioned. He used her phone only once to make a local call. No names were mentioned and he said after this call, that he was wanted at the Montreal General Hospital on an emergency call where he worked. On one occasion, she went with KIMBLE at which time he told her he had papers to be signed. These were three identical sheets and they were to be signed by a notary which lived on Sherbrooke Street East opposite a Dominion Shopping Centre. After signing these documents, KIMBLE received \$250. This he had mentioned to her. He said he was leaving for Florida at the end of the month. He must have left as she had received a call from him later, saying that he was in Florida. This call was not a collect call. He said that he would come back to Montreal. She received another call, this time from New Orleans (not collect) a few days later. He said this time he had an accident and she understood it to be a car accident and was unable to come back to Montreal. He said he was working at a hospital in New Orleans called The MONTELEPRI HOSPITAL, 3rd Department. She phoned him on her own phone and reached him under the name KIMBLE at this hospital. At this time, he offered to pay for her fare to New Orleans which she refused. She received another call later from New Orleans (not collect) from KIMBLE and this was to pass on Christmass greetings. Lise ROBILLARD also stated that she also saw the scar on KIMBLE's chest and it was also mentioned by Mrs. ROBILLARD and Mr. ROBILLARD that they too also saw this scar on his chest. ROBILLARD further stated that she only knows the photo of RAY as having observed it in the newspapers."

10. SALWYN made further investigations and located the notary who is André COUTELLIER and resides at the corner of Léry Street and Sherbrooke Street East, Montreal. COUTELLIER does not recall the name KIMBLE. In the opinion of SALWYN, he states that this notary appears to him of a shady character. SALWYN established at this time that an American male, white, student from Michigan University stayed with the notary during the Summer of 1967. No further information could be obtained by SALWYN.

11. SALWYN advised that MATHIEU resides with a Marie-Claude ROUILLARD, age 27, white, believed to be a school teacher.

12. SALWYN through his investigation with TULMOZZ ascertained that KIMBLE returned to Montreal approximately a month after he had first left, at which time he was driving a yellow CHEVELLE with Louisiana licence plates.

13. SALWYN was advised by his office in Toronto that they had been in touch with GARRISON himself who advised that KIMBLE when last observed in the U.S.A. was driving a yellow CHEVELLE. GARRISON further stated that KIMBLE was wanted for impersonating a police officer. GARRISON further stated that KIMBLE had flown to Montreal on several occasions on an aircraft owned and piloted by FERRY. FERRY was the person who had committed suicide after being involved in the GARRISON PROBE. GARRISON also stated that SHAW who is another person involved in the GARRISON PROBE, was in Montreal meeting with KIMBLE and FERRY in regards to taking Cuban refugees from Montreal to New Orleans and apparently, these transactions were completed; however, the dates were not mentioned and the aircraft used was owned and piloted by FERRY.

14 JUN 68

14. SALWYN made an investigation at TIP TOP TAILORS on Ste-Catherine Street East where RAY under the name of GALT had purchased a suit. This information SALWYN received through a newspaper story which appeared in the MONTREAL-MATIN on the 12 JUN 68. Photostats attached. The only information he received from TIP TOP was that GALT lived on Notre-Dame Street East and he had purchased a suit on the 19 JULY 67 and that the RCMP had all documents pertaining to this purchase.

15. With this information, SALWYN located RAY's address on Notre-Dame Street East and spoke to a tenant who resided at this address during the stay of GALT. Through this tenant, he received the name QUINTAL and having already known that QUINTAL resided in Windsor, Ontario, this information having been mentioned in numerous newspapers, his Toronto Office phoned QUINTAL; however, QUINTAL would not talk to them and hung up. The only thing that QUINTAL wanted to know was how the TORONTO STAR got his name and address.

16. SALWYN further stated that through his Toronto Office, they were able to obtain from KIMBLE's lawyer, name not known at this time, however lives in U.S.A., that KIMBLE made two (2) trips

to Montreal during last Summer, means of transportation unknown. SALWYN further stated that they had made arrangements through KIMBLE's lawyer to speak to KIMBLE at 9:00 p.m. on the 13 JUN 68; however, this did not materialize. Apparently, KIMBLE's lawyer was the only one who knows the present whereabouts of KIMBLE.

15 JUN 68

17. SALWYN is very interested in establishing whether RAY alias GALT, actually lived on St-Germain Street as reported in numerous newspaper articles. He further advised that through his associates in newspaper media field, he ascertained that the information concerning St-Germain Street which appeared in newspapers was obtained from our Headquarters in Ottawa.

18. At the present time, SALWYN is canvassing St-Germain Street in the area where KIMBLE resided in an effort to establish where on this street RAY resided.

19. It will be noted that through Montreal investigations concerning the KING file, the street St-Germain was never ascertained.

20. This report is being submitted under this classification in order to protect the information received from SALWYN in the event that his information is factual and also this report is being submitted as SALWYN once he makes a connection that RAY resided or was an associated of KIMBLE's, he will through the TORONTO STAR have an article published asking why and for what reasons RAY and KIMBLE were in Montreal and the possible connection between the assassinations of President John F. KENNEDY and Dr. Martin Luther KING. Whether there will be any mention of the assassination of Robert F. KENNEDY was not mentioned by SALWYN.

21. SALWYN further stated that prior to the release of his story to the TORONTO STAR, he will give me a copy of his release.

22. At the present time, the only investigation/will be conducted by Montreal G.I.S. will be, contacting Miss MATHIEU in an effort to obtain the Bell Telephone bill(s).


23. Should further investigations be required concerning interviewing of the other persons mentioned by SALWYN, it is requested that instructions be received to do so. It is requested that a photograph of KIMBLE be forwarded to this point for identification by MATHIEU.

All documents were initialed by Cpl. POWER, Cst. G.W.J. MOUSSEAU and John WELCH. Originals held as exhibits this point with photostats attached to this report. Copies of Form C246 Exhibit Report #68/41 are attached.

5. The salesman involved with this sale was FRIGAN, however, no identification could be made of any photos of RAY. This applies to all the other employees of this firm also.

6. Further enquiries will be conducted at the Montreal Post Office in question and also at the Canada Customs in an effort to obtain the originals of all documents concerning the forwarding of this suit to GALT at 2608 Highland Ave., Birmingham Alabama U.S.A.

7. It will be noted that the order was placed on 21 JULY 67, the letter from GALT was dated 9-6-67 (believed to be 6 SEP 67 in the Canadian way) and the suit was shipped on the 9 SEP 67. It will also be noted that GALT paid cash for this suit.

8. It is requested that further enquiries be conducted at Birmingham, Alabama.

9. With reference to the letter in para #4 (e) above, the envelope in which the letter was sent could not be located.

10. Cst. PHARAND of the Montreal City Police (MCP) Ident. Section was contacted and advised concerning the laundry mark #TF-2307-2219. 16. CHEVARIS also advised that the original of this sales slip (white copy) would have been given to GALT and the second copy (pink) would be at the Head Office of Tip-Top. This second copy will be obtained later.

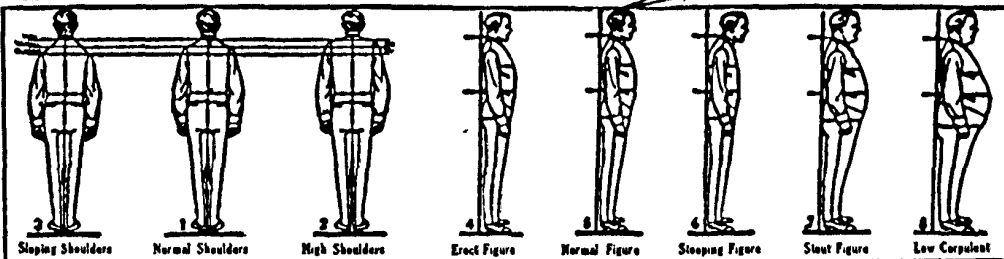

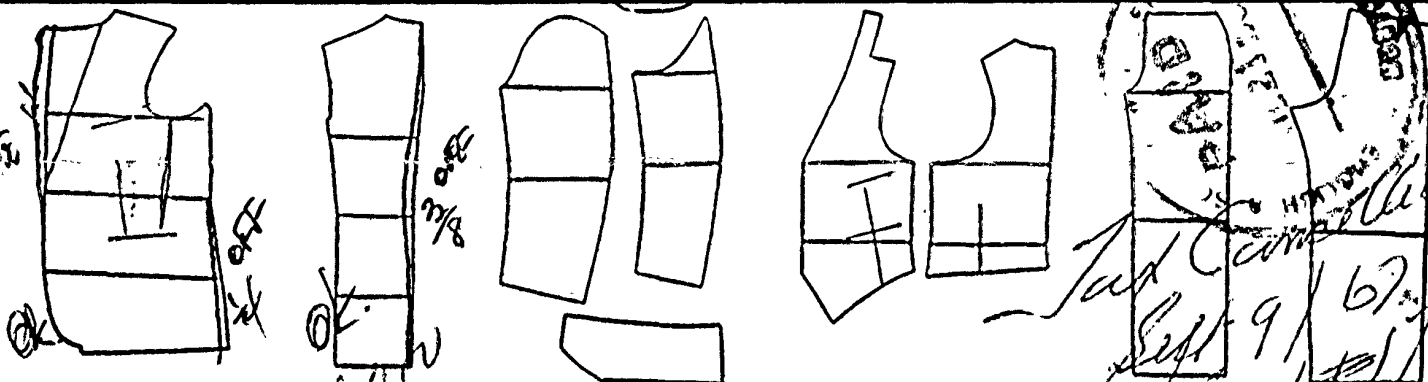



Enquiries have now been completed in Capreol, Ontario. The CNR Special Agent Joe FUGERE and Capreol Police Chief CLARK were contacted and shown the most recent photographs of RAY and BRIDGEMAN. They assured our investigator that they had not seen anyone who looked like the persons in these photographs in Capreol.

2. Further enquiries were made at the two hotels and the Y.M.C.A. The pictures were shown to the owners of the hotels, the bar tenders and the Manager of the Y.M.C.A. all with negative results. The registers at the hotels and Y.M.C.A. were checked but no familiar names appeared.

3. Enquiries were also made at the only two Taxi stands and the local restaurants. No one had seen anyone resembling the photographs of RAY and BRIDGEMAN.

1. As a result of a phone call from Cpl. Titus, "A" Division to "B" Division Information Desk, Cpl. J.E. Dunlop and I patrolled locally to determine the status of one, Raymond George SMITH, 968 Dundas Street West, Toronto, in relation to the captionally-noted case. Please see attached Form C.215.
2. A check was first made to locate 968 Dundas Street West, however, this address is non-existent; the numbers in this area go from 966 then to 982 Dundas Street.
3. Mrs. Sun Fung LOO, 962 Dundas Street West, Toronto, was interviewed, whereupon she advised that the man using the name SMITH had lived here for three weeks beginning 17 Apr 68. She could provide little information at this time, she didn't know where he worked, if he had any friends, owned a car or where he could be located. He did pay his rent in cash, worked somewhere at night and slept during the day. No further information was gained at this time. He apparently moved out because the children in the house made too much noise.
4. Mrs. ITTAS, widow, was located at 108 Ossington Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, where she lives with a young daughter. When questioned concerning one, Paul MILLICAN, she stated that he had not resided here during the fourteen years she has operated a small confectionery store on this site.
5. Enquiries at the AMENITY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD., 424 Bloor Street West, Toronto, Ontario, revealed that Raymond George SMITH, 962 Dundas Street West, Toronto, Ontario, had arranged on 16 Apr 68 for transportation from Toronto to London, leaving Toronto via 8443 Flight # 600 6 MAY 68 returning from London via 8443 Flight # 601 21 MAY 68. It was suggested at this time that Miss Lillian SMITH, Branch Manager, be interviewed when she was to return to the office 3 JUN 68.
6. The above information was telephoned to "A" Division this same date.

7. On this date, I was advised by the Officer i/c C.I.B. that the above particulars were to be thoroughly checked out.

8. Accompanied by Cst. G. Vandegraaf, I proceeded to REMMERT TRAVEL BUREAU LTD. and interviewed Miss Lillian SPENCER. She verified the information, as noted in para. 5 above, and added that she arranged the trip to London for SHAYD and also completely filled out an application for his passport on 16 APR 68, which he signed. SHAYD also signed a Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor at this time in Miss SPENCER's presence. This Statutory Declaration was filled out during the a.m. but notarized by Mr. Henry MOOS, Notary Public, President and owner of REMMERT TRAVEL BUREAU LTD. during the p.m. and some time after SHAYD had left the premises. Arrangements were made with SHAYD to return to this Agency after about two weeks to pick up the tickets and passport. SPENCER produced from her files a printed letter signed Raymond George SHAYD dated 4-20-68 to the effect that he was going to Coprac for several days on business and would pick up the passport on his return. Photostat copies of letter attached. Miss SPENCER stated that on 2 MAY 68 the tickets were issued and on this same day SHAYD picked up both the tickets and his passport, on payment of \$345.00 in Canadian funds. SPENCER failed to recognize any FBI pictures of James Earl RAY shown to her.

9. At the Office of Vital Statistics, 73 Lombard Street, Toronto, Ontario, a record of Raymond George SHAYD was found as follows:

10. It was subsequently learned that the SHAYD listed with Vital Statistics was a member of the Metro Toronto Police Department, employed at 433 Division. I called this Division and spoke with Insp. O'Hara, who verified that this member was working out of this Division. I told him briefly the reason for this investigation after which he confirmed the member under his command was working in May and did not make a trip to England on 6 MAY 68. SHAYD's holidays were not due until JUL 68, his address was given as 1731 Victoria Park Ave., Toronto, Ontario, phone 759-7562. I call SHAYD, told him the reason for the enquiry and asked him if he had any knowledge of this person using the particulars of the SHAYD born 6 OCT 32. SHAYD replied that he knew nothing of this situation, therefore, arrangements were made for him to view the photo that was expected later in the day. SHAYD sounded quite honest during this telephone conversation.

11. As a result of information supplied by Headquarters, a check was made at the ALAN & SHAYD STORES, 157 Yonge Street, Toronto, Ontario, under the names of both SHAYD and SPENCER. SHAYD proved

negative but it was learned a man using the name BRIDGMAN purchased a passport photo on 11 APR 68; a negative of this photo could not be found. A picture of this person was located and given to the investigator by Mrs. AGNEW, Proprietor.

12. Also from information supplied by Headquarters, Mrs. Feliksa SZPAKOWSKA, 102 Ossington Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, was contacted. She informed that a Paul BRIDGMAN resided at this address from 8-19 APR 68; however, he kept to himself and his employment was not known. Mrs. SZPAKOWSKA immediately advised the investigator that she had seen a picture of RAY in the newspapers connected with file subject and had requested her husband to call the police concerning BRIDGMAN; however, he laughed at her so she forgot the idea. SNEYD paid \$10.00 cash per week for his room, had no visitors, was not seen driving a car nor did she know where he went from here. SNEYD was thought to be a car salesman. She also added that a couple of days after the information regarding the suspect in the KING murder case was released, BRIDGMAN moved from this address.

13. Mrs. LOO was again contacted and shown a picture received from ARCADE STUDIO. She identified the picture taken as BRIDGMAN as the person who resided at her home using the name SNEYD. She then produced a small blue coloured flight bag containing the articles as shown on attached Form C.246, which she stated were items left by SNEYD. These items were immediately taken to the S.C.B. i/c Identification Branch for his attention. No evidence of fingerprints was found on these goods that could be identified with the suspect RAY in this case. Other persons interviewed at this address, without result, as follows:

14. Mrs. SZPAKOWSKA also identified the photo of BRIDGMAN as the man who rented the room at her home, but she failed to recognize the F.B.I. picture of RAY. Mr. SZPAKOWSKA, as well as tenants NAFVALIS, BAROFARO and C. JOLLYMORE were interviewed but they could not supply additional information concerning the suspect.

15. At this point most members of C.I.B. General were beginning to check the various sources locally in an effort to identify SNEYD & BRIDGMAN. Metro P.S., O.P.F., Postal Investigation, Department Motor Vehicles (names of registered car salesman), Retail Credit Bureau, and all names of SNEYD in the Toronto Telephone Directory. All C.I.B. and S.I.B. records were checked as well as arrangements made to receive the passenger list of persons on Flight 600 BOAC dated 6 MAY 68 and Flight 601 BOAC 21 MAY 68.

16. Sgt. A. Sikora, S.C.B. i/c Identification Branch, together with Sgt. J.B. Tomalty, S.C.B. Co-ordinator, and members of C.I.B. General patrolled to both 962 Dundas Street West and 102 Ossington

Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, where a complete and thorough search was made of the rooms occupied by the person in question in an effort to gather evidence connecting the suspect with the captionally-noted case or to identify this person. This search proved negative.

17. Neighbourhood enquiries were conducted, as well as local banks, dry-cleaning establishments, and grocery stores in an effort to identify this man using the name SNEYD as well as to locate associates or places he might have frequented with no results.

18. Pictures of SNEYD & BRIDGMAN as well as the Passport Application and Statutory Declaration were received by facsimile from Headquarters; Telex CIBLO50 summarizing this investigation was dispatched to the Commissioner, information "A" Division. Special Agents J. McManis and W. Campbell, F.B.I., Buffalo, N.Y. arrived to assist in this investigation.

5 JUN 68

19. A meeting took place in the offices of the Metro Toronto Police Department with members of M.T.P.D., R.C.M.P. and F.B.I. present. The purpose was to make the M.T.P.D. aware that the suspect was using the particulars of a member of the M.T.P.D., that the suspect had spent one month in Toronto which no doubt would require their attention in one phase or another, and to advise that the F.B.I. Agents were at our Office for liaison purposes direct to U.S. sources if necessary.

20. Miss Lillian SPENCER, Manager, KENNEDY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD., Toronto, Ontario, was contacted and requested to come to this Office to be interviewed. She readily agreed and after being interrogated for some time she gave the attached voluntary statement.

21. The ARCADE PHOTO STUDIO was visited and the negative of Paul BRIDGMAN was asked for. Mrs. AGNEW stated she valued the negative at \$20.00 and without this payment she refused to produce same. Immediately Cst. Giffin obtained a Search Warrant under Section 58(1) C.C. seized this negative as well as Bill of Sale 11 APR 68. Exhibit Report C.245 dated 6 JUN 68 attached.

22. A check was made at Vital Statistics regarding the name SNEYD to determine whether or not someone might have applied for a birth certificate under this name. A printed letter signed by Raymond George SNEYD dated 4-16-68, listing the necessary details of the birth, father's name and mother's name including mother's maiden name, was found. See photostat copies of this document attached. This document was turned over to our Identification Branch for examination after which the original was returned. Copies of this document, as well as the letter located at the Travel Agency signed by SNEYD were forwarded via air direct to the F.B.I. Office in Buffalo, New York.

Dundas Street West and interviewed Mrs. Sue Fung Loo. This interview was conducted in the Chinese language and although Mrs. Loo did not want to sign any statements, she agreed to answer all questions. She advised that CHAYU appeared at her door during the evening of 16 APR 68 and enquired about the room for rent. Mrs. Loo had a sign "Room to rent" in the front window of her home. CHAYU paid her \$9.00 Canadian money and made arrangements to move in 19 APR 68. He was carrying a newspaper at this time. On 19 APR 68, CHAYU appeared at this address and took possession of the room. He carried no luggage, had only one suit of clothes, did not buy any new clothes, did not bring any liquor into the house, nor was he seen driving a car. He indicated he worked a night shift in a hotel, she remembered he was out all night and slept during the day while at this point. Mrs. Loo further added that although he moved in on the date in question, he was not seen by her again until 26 APR 68. She had a short conversation with him at which time he indicated he went back to Montreal. She then assumed Montreal might be his home. A few days after he returned from his trip, an unknown male described as tall, fat, husky, appeared at the door with a letter. She called him in; a very short conversation took place between the two men, after which the visitor left. Mrs. Loo could provide no further identification concerning this person, although she knew he was not a postman nor could she describe him as a delivery man of any type. Annoted, CHAYU first paid Mrs. Loo on 16 APR 68, he paid for the second week on 16 APR 68 and the third week 2 MAY 68, where he was last seen. Mrs. Loo discovered him missing on either 10 or 11 MAY 68. She does not know exactly when he left this address. Mrs. Loo's husband Tan Loo was questioned at this time, but he could offer no information concerning this case.

24. On this date, I was informed by the officer i/c C.I.A. that the suspect under investigation here had been positively identified by the F.B.I. as James Earl RAY, wanted by the F.B.I. for the murder of Dr. Martin Luther KING Jr.

25. Det. G.A. Giffin and I, accompanied by C/M B. A. Giffin, Polish interpreter, interviewed FANNIA WILKINS, 102 Washington Ave., Toronto, Ontario. This woman declined to give a written statement but agreed to co-operate with investigating members. She advised that a Paul WILKINS appeared at her door on 9 APR 68 to rent a room. A sign was in the front window advertising a room to rent. He paid \$10.00 per week for rent, Canadian money, and stayed for two weeks. He told Mr. Giffin that he was a car salesman; however, she thought it strange as WILKINS was not seen to drive a car. He allegedly worked days but was sometimes late during the day. He owned a brown sports jacket, black pants, black tie and tan shirt as well as a tan and blue coloured raincoat. He carried a small suitcase, colour unknown, but a plaid design inside. No associates could be ascertained nor was he visited by anyone. The letter arrived addressed to him and although he saw the letter on the small table where all letters for boarders are placed, he refused to pick up the letter. This letter, from 70 Belmont Street, Toronto, the address of WILKINS' residence, was located on the person of the suspect.

26. Mrs. SHUKOSKA added that she recognized SMYD as a man wanted for the shooting of KING. She had seen pictures in the newspapers. She immediately told her husband to call the police; however, he laughed at her and convinced her it was not so. She therefore gave the matter no further thought.

27. Mr. J. H. HILL, Registrar-General's Department, Vital Statistics, was contacted and advised of the investigation, especially dealing with his department. During a check at this point, a printed letter applying for a birth certificate signed by Paul Edward SMYD, listing the same information as the letter found concerning SMYD, was found. This document was also examined by the Identification Section with negative results. It was ascertained that a birth certificate applied for by SMYD had been returned to the Department.

28. P.C. Raymond George SMYD was questioned at length by Det. Sgt. R.G. March, M.T.F.O., and Cpl. J.B. Dunlop, Toronto C.I.B. Attached please find copies of voluntary statement given to these members by SMYD.

7 JUL 68

29. At the suspect had now been identified as RAY, every effort was being made to determine associates, movements, habits and any other information that might be available at this point with a view to locating RAY, as well as any person who might have assisted him. All newspaper enquiries were again made in both Canadian Avenue and Dundas Street West. Members also began a check of all consulates in the City in the event RAY may have made arrangements for a Visa to another country from here; hotels, dry-cleaning shops, photo studios, as well as further checks at Vital Statistics, all enquiries using the photo as an aid. No information of value was gained.

30. At Vital Statistics I was informed by Mr. E. HILL, Assistant Deputy Registrar General, a very simple method to gain information concerning a person's name, correct date and place of birth, father and mother's names, as well as the mother's maiden name. All newspapers in this City keep on file all editions printed. It is a very easy task to locate in Toronto copies of local papers printed for any year where a person can check the birth announcement for the required information. Toronto Registrars are adopting this practice to obtain birth certificates for persons over twenty-one years in order that they can frequent beverage rooms. In this case, it will be noted RAY had the necessary particulars to secure birth certificate for both SMYD and SMYD, even though he never did have possession of the actual certificates. The manner in which he acquired this information regarding SMYD and SMYD is not known at this time; however, as pointed out, it is not difficult.

31. Mr. Paul SMYD, 83 Cassidara Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, has the same particulars and was using them to obtain birth certificates.

any knowledge of RAY and as far as can be ascertained at this point, BRIDGMAN is completely innocent of any connection with this investigation.

32. Canvassing of hotels, banks, car dealers, Post Offices, dry-cleaning establishments continued on this date by C.I.B. members. Through co-operation with Mr. CHAMSON, Security Department, BOAC, the passenger and crew manifests for both 6 MAY 68 and 21 MAY 68 were obtained and checked. Also the name of Mr. & Mrs. D. KILBOUR, 212 Burns Ave. East, Whitby, Ontario, the passengers directly in front of RAY, were forwarded. These people were contacted but they do not remember RAY. The persons directly behind RAY and those across the aisle from him on 6 MAY 68 booked one-way passage, therefore, it is assumed these people are from somewhere overseas.

33. Information was received from Headquarters that RAY had left London and was known to have gone to Lisbon, Portugal. It was also ascertained that RAY had used his return ticket from London to Toronto on the purchase of a ticket from London to Lisbon, after which he was issued a return voucher valued at \$14.60, BOAC Voucher No. 06104443731. A request was received to contact BOAC, Toronto, Ontario, to put a stop notice on this voucher and to supply any information available. Mr. CHAMSON was again contacted, however, he informed that this voucher is similar to a traveller's cheque, accepted by travel agencies and airlines throughout the world. He also added that it would be practically impossible to put a stop notice on this voucher. It could be from one month to one year before this voucher would finally end up in their local files. This matter was not pursued further.

6 JUN 68

34. I was advised by the Officer i/c C.I.B. that RAY was apprehended at the London Airport by Scotland Yard.

10 JUN 68

35. Telex CIB1507 was received from the Commissioner relating to clothing and items found in RAY's possession. Telex CIB1094 dispated 11 JUN 68 from this Division.

36. A systematic check of all banks in an area bounded by Brock, Bloor, Jarvis and Front Streets was begun by members of this Section in an effort to link RAY with any money transactions either locally or with the U.S.A. Results will be reported.

11 JUN 68

37. Information was received to the effect that Mrs. CHAMSON indicated to newspaper reporters that a man had called at her home asking for BRIDGMAN. She was contacted by myself, accompanied by Det. Henry KILBOUR in this regard. Det. KILBOUR, who speaks Polish, translated

r the interview. Mrs. SZPAKOWSKA advised that three or four days after BRIDGMAN moved out, a young man about thirty years, 5'10", dark blond, round face, wearing a 3/4 length coat appeared at the door and asked if BRIDGMAN lived at this address. He showed her BRIDGMAN's name type-written on a piece of paper. When she replied that he moved, the man left. She did not know the man, he did not show any identification nor does she know what agency, if any, he represented. She was asked why she had not related this event during her numerous contacts with investigators earlier whereupon she stated she thought she had told us. At this point she admitted she was thoroughly confused by the events of the past week especially by her encounters with various newspaper men and photographers. It will be noted in para. 25 that on 6 JUN 68, she was interviewed with the assistance of C/M B. BRISAC, at which time Mrs. SZPAKOWSKA advised that BRIDGMAN had no associates nor was he visited by anyone. This phase of the interview was explored at that time and no mention was made of anyone asking for BRIDGMAN after he left. Due to Mrs. SZPAKOWSKA admitted a confused state of mind, I place some doubt that a young man asked for BRIDGMAN; however, every effort will be made to identify this person.

38. Mr. Robert McHAULTON (DB: 26 MAR 17) 10 Bellehaven Cresc., Toronto, Ontario, appeared at M.T.P.D. Headquarters and identified himself as probably being the "fat man" who delivered the letter to SHAYD, 962 Dundas St. West, Toronto, Ontario. He stated that he used the phone booth just up the street from this address, found an open letter addressed to SHAYD, realized the address was just a few houses away, walked up to the door and delivered same, telling SHAYD he found it in the phone booth. Cpl. J.C. Dunlop and Det. Sgt. R. Marsh interviewed this man and subsequently had him positively identified by Mrs. Loo. There is no doubt that McHAULTON is innocently connected with SHAYD. In view of the publicity given all known persons involved with this investigation by the press, McHAULTON asked that his identity not be released to the press. This request has been respected at this point.

39. Various avenues of investigation are underway at this time, checking on persons who allegedly believe that had some association with RAY during his stay in the Toronto area. A map of Toronto found at 962 Dundas St. West has an area circled in pen at Queen Street and Ossington Avenue, which is close to where RAY lived as BRIDGMAN; the Vital Statistics Office circled, and four areas marked in the eastern section of the City. Investigation is continuing to determine what connection these marked areas have with RAY.

40. An Eric S. GAULT, one of the aliases used by RAY was previously checked on in Toronto on 19 APR 68. The man here is Eric St. Vincent GALT, Supervisor, UNION CARBIDE CANADA LIMITED, home address 49 Leckham Drive, Scarborough, Ontario. He is a trusted employee and known to be in Toronto on the date in question. See Telex CIB996/2 received from the Commissioner and Telex CIB736 sent from "00" Division 19 APR 68.

2. Further to Para. 24, as you are aware, the positive identification of the Toronto suspect by the F.B.I. came as a result of handwriting comparison of one of the attached letters to the Department of Vital Statistics.

3. The BOAC manifest referred to in Para. 32 showed SNEYD as a passenger on Flight 600, however, their manifest for the proposed return flight on 21-5-68 did not list this name. This information was relayed to Ottawa by telephone and we believe was assistance to Scotland Yard in determining that RAY had exchanged the return portion as detailed in Para. 33.

4. It might be mentioned that the laundry marks referred to in your telex CIB 1507 have been checked against the records held by the O.P.P., negatively. They suggest they might have originated in Montreal last summer or in the U.S.A. prior to RAY entering Canada.

5. We have no concrete information that anyone knowingly assisted RAY during his stay in this city, however, all aspects are receiving continuous attention and further correspondence will be forthcoming as information of value becomes available.
