Enclosed for transmission to the FBI Laboratory are eight Thermo Seal Marking Machine Tapes, yellow in color, bearing code 20R-3.

ROBERT BERMAN, proprietor, Famous Cleaners, 3454 N. W. 7th Avenue, Miami, Florida, advised that his laundry does laundry and dry cleaning for several small cleaning establishments in the Miami, Florida area. He advised that he uses code 20R-3 about once every three weeks for the Royal Palm Cleaners, 4016 Royal Palm Avenue, Miami Beach, Florida. BERMAN believes that a yellow tape probably would have been used at least two or three times since April, 1967.

BERMAN advised that he is checking his records in efforts to determine the exact dates since April, 1967, that code 20R-3 has appeared on yellow tapes for the Royal Palm Cleaners. Thus far, BERMAN has determined this code was used on yellow tape for the Royal Palm Cleaners on September 28, 1967, and October 24, 1967.

BERMAN advised that he has not replaced any of the type characters in his Thermo-Seal marking machine since he purchased it three years ago. The model number of his machine is H5M4 and the serial number is 32647.

He further advised that approximately three or four months ago the Thermo-Seal tapes changed somewhat and he is now using the new variety. He also stated that he replaces the blades in the machine that cuts the tapes about every three months.

BERMAN made available eight yellow tapes, produced by his machine, bearing code 20R-3, which are being furnished the FBI Laboratory for comparison purposes.

AT QUANTICO, VA.

On 4/17/68, Mr. C. F. MEEKS, Marine Retail Outlet, Building 2011, Marine Corps Schools, advised SA JOSEPH A. AMMERIN, JR., that the Thermo-Seal marking machine listed as assigned to this building is not here. He suggested the Post Laundry as being the only place on this base having such a machine.

On 4/19/68, Capt. DENNIE DAMON, in charge of Building 2031, MCB, advised SA AMMERIN that this building has never had any Thermo-Seal machine in it.

On 4/19/68, Capt. PHILIP CISNEROS, Post Laundry, MCB, advised SA AMMERIN that his records show that he has a Thermo-Seal marking machine assigned to him with serial number 32665. He stated that he has never used laundry marking 02B-6 or -2B-6 on any of his clothing. This is not a Quantico laundry marking. His markings are usually a number, a letter, and then another number, for example 77K6. This indicated ticket number of 77, K for the name of the person handling the laundry, and 6 for the number of pieces in this bundle. He stated that he did not know of any organization in this area who would use such a designation.

King Murder Case Takes Mysterious Twist

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI)—The search for the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. has taken another mysterious twist and was turned toward Florida today.

The FBI Monday night issued a pickup order for Eric Starvo Galt and asked that it be transmitted to all law enforcement agencies in Florida. The order said Galt had used the aliases of Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard.

It made no mention of James Earl Ray, the 40-year-old escapee from the Missouri State prison. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover had said fingerprints proved Ray was the same person as Galt.

The FBI in Miami refused comment. Earlier Monday, the FBI in Washington clamped a lid on any public progress report on the manhunt. The policy was expected to prevail until a suspect is captured or some dramatic new development occurs.

★ ★ King's Father Says He Was Threatened

DETROIT (AP) — Dr. Martin Luther King Sr. says he received a threatening telephone call the day after his son was buried, and, "I'll have to listen now since they did make good."

"But, he said, 'I'm still un-

fraid. I' going to preach continually as I always have." He said he has been getting "dangerous calls" for a long time.

The elder king, pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist church in Atlanta, spoke at a news conference in Detroit Monday.

His visit to Detroit had been scheduled before Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was shot in Memphis, Tenn., by an assassin April 4.

His late son "was 80 years ahead of his age," said the elder King, who pledged "To do all I can to carry out the program and commitment of my son," and asserted that unless the United States faces up to its racial problems, all will be lost.

Subject has been identified as JAMES EARL RAY, aka Earl James Ray, W. C. Herron, Earl James, James McBride, James O'Conner, James Walton, James Waylon, Jim, and who has also used the names ERIC STARVO GALT, Harvey Lowmeyer and John Willard, in connection with this case. Wanted Flyers #442 and #442-A have been issued and an I.O. is in preparation.

The automobile identified as having been purchased and being driven by subject at the time of the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was found abandoned in Atlanta, Ga., and was impounded on 4/11/68, by the Bureau.

Investigation has shown that subject was an escapee from Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Mo. This is the same institution from which GEORGE BEN EDMONDSON, a Top Ten Fugitive, escaped while subject was an inmate there. Much publicity was given to the fact that EDMONDSON was apprehended in Canada. It must be assumed that subject was aware of this fact. It is also noted that much publicity has been given to investigation on the border of and in Mexico.

Further, investigation has developed that subject's uncle, EARL RAY, was found dead in Buffalo, N.Y., in 11/59. His former address was shown to be Albany, N.Y., on the death certificate. The fact that EARL RAY had resided in New York State prior to his death was known to the subject's brother and it must be assumed that subject was also aware of this.



Result of examination:

The size and style of the numerals and letters on K172 through K175, as well as those appearing on some other known specimens received, are the same as corresponding portions of the laundry tapes appearing on the Q97 sheet and the Q99 pillow case.

Because of the lack of identifying features on which to base a definite opinion, it could not be established that one of the machines used to prepare K172 through K175 was used to prepare the questioned laundry marks. Of these known specimens, only K175 has the letters "O" and "R" spaced the same as on the Q97 and Q99 tags. There are an insufficient number of known specimens available imprinted "20R-3" to assess the significance of this feature; however, prior examinations indicate this factor alone is not sufficient to identify a laundry tag with a particular machine.

During recent racial disturbances following assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, four subjects were arrested in Chicago, Illinois, for illegal wearing of uniform.

Additionally, other subjects were arrested in different parts of the United States for the same offenses. In each instance, prosecution was authorized by the USA under the illegal wearing of the uniform statute.

Inasmuch as Federal troops and/or National Guard units are being utilized more frequently during riotous conditions, the opportunity becomes greater for people to disguise themselves in the uniform of the armed forces.

Therefore, when racial disturbances arise, all agents should be particularly alert for violations of this statute.

All agents should insure that local PDs are cognizant of our jurisdiction in these matters, and all such matters discovered by the local PDs should be promptly reported to this office.

Lone Slayer Sought in King Case

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — There is no significant evidence to indicate that more than one man was responsible for the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., according to U. S. Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark.

Clark made the statement when questioned by newsmen about a possible conspiracy behind the King death.

"We could make a long, long list—as long as the imagination of man runneth—of people who could possibly be involved in this," Clark said. "But there's no significant evidence that it goes beyond the single actor."

The Attorney General made no mention by name of James Earl Ray, who has been charged by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with conspiracy in the April 4 murder of King.

Clark did say he still feels sure an arrest will be made soon.

"I was hopeful an arrest would be obtained before now," he said. "The individual being sought is in a very difficult situation and it will be difficult for him to avoid arrest."

Clark was in Atlanta over the weekend to speak at an Emory University Law Day Luncheon. His speech was concerned primarily with the alienation of the Negro in American society through poverty and discrimination and with the role of the policeman in preventing riots.

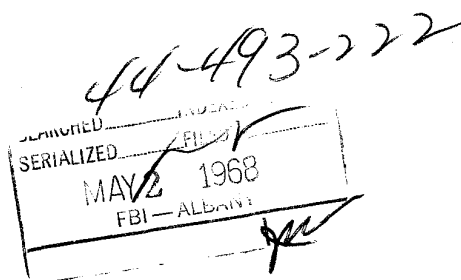

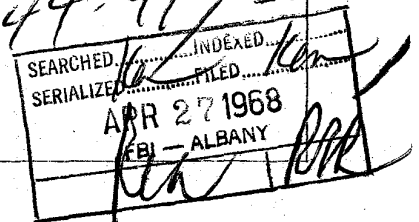
