The following investigation was conducted by SE VINCENT H. MC PEAK at Albany, New York:

On 5/20/68 Miss LAURA GALLUZZO, New York State Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, Albany, New York, advised her department maintains records for unidentified dead in New York State; however, these records do not contain a fingerprint record of deceased. Miss GALLUZZO advised that possibly fingerprint records for unidentified dead in New York State would be maintained at local police departments.

PUBLICITY ON REWARDS OFFERED

Each Special Agent in Charge and Legal Attache is instructed to promptly remind their established cooperative news sources, in a discreet and tactful manner, of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King. This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

PCI advised that MACE "edges off" gambling action on the trotters to Albany bookies.

PCI advised that he is convinced from his observations over the years that there is no organized gambling syndicate controlling Schenectady gamblers.

PCI advised that one "TRIP" described as W,M, 55-58,150, black hair, Italian operates a store on Main Street, Johnstown and has connections with employees of leather companies, who steal merchandise and sell same to TRIP.

Upon receipt of information from Supervisor O'CONNOR it was immediately recalled that this mix office and all police agencies in Vermont have had many problems with WARREN RICH in the past. He has spend most of his life in the Vermont State Hospital and the rest in the Vermont State Prison. There was a time when he and his son who is also a habitual criminal were on the street in 1966. They and two others, FNW first name unrecalled NOVAK and WILTIAM SMITH toured to the midwest and were arrested in Missouri. RICH and his son were there only a khort time and apparently were released and sent back to Vermont. Whether WARREN RICH met RAY in the Missouri State Penitentiary is very questionable and if he happened to have seen him there it would have been for a very brief time.

Upon the return of RICH and his son to Vermont his son was arrested and admitted to the State Prison. Soon after RICH alleged that his son was being mistreated, that the prison was corrupt, etc. etc. He kan received wide and recognition for his allegations and for several weeks was interviewed by everyone. The governor was in on it etc. and at the conclusion no basis was found for any of his allegations.

He said he is always doing this and his file is full of this type information. Dr. Brooks stated he then claimed to the insurance company that his expenses at the State hospital should be paid to him on his policy. As we know there are no charges

Dr. BROOKS did determine that through other members of the staff including Dr. JARRETT that RICH commented to another patient, FNU LANGLOIS, that he kniew JAMES RAY in prison in Missouri. A ANDEREX This conversation took place prior to RICH'S release on 4/25/68 and at about the time information was in the papers and on TV about JAMES RAY. He said LANGLOIS is still in the hospital and wouldn't have been capable to making the call to Albany.

I asmuch as RICH is a mental case and wx a publicity seeker no effort is being made to interfiew him re whether he made the call to Albany. Chief HEBERT and Dr. BROOKS both few certain he did and wanted noted that he is probably hoping that the FBI will call upon him so that he can go to the papers etc. for additional attention.

HEBERT stated that even though he <u>cannot believe</u> that RICH has any contact with RAY he will be alert to this possibility in view of the particular case. He said he will report any movements or activities of RICH that seem pertinent

PUBLICITY ON REWARDS OFFERED

The Bureau, by letter dated 5/20/68, advised that each SAC and Legal Attache is to promptly remind their cooperative established news sources in a discreet and tactful manner of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King.

This money now totals at least \$100,000.

THE BUREAU FURTHER ADVISED THAT THE FBI SHOULD NOT BE PUBLICIZED AS THE SOURCE OF THIS REMINDER.

Bureau futher advised by R/S dated 5/22/68 that in the event of inquiries regarding the identity of the sources of the reward money offered in the MURKIN case, established sources may be confidentially advised that according to a compilation set forth in the 4/27 edition of the "Commercial Appeal", Memphis, Tennessee, \$25,000 each has been offered by the "Commercial Appeal" and "Scripts-Howard Newspapers", and that in addition, businessmen and citizens in Memphis have offered several thousands more and the Memphis City Council has underwritten the reward up to a total of \$100,000.

DAVID LAUGHLIN, D.B.S., 32 Pleasant Street, Woodstock, Vermont, on 5/31/68, advised that he had an emergency patient that day who he treated for a tooth ache, and the man closely resembled JAMES EARL RAY. He said he tried to obtain some information from this person as to where he was from and learned only that this person had been in Indiana, Arizona and Florida. He was very reluctnat to talk.

This individual furnished his name as WILLIAM LEONARD, and stated he was working at the Woodstock Inn, Woodstock, Vt. He was described only as being between the ages of 35-40, and generally answered

the description of RAY.

The Doctor advised that this individual paid him with a roll of dimes, and he noted that he had an expensive piece of bridge work in his mouth, and that his other teeth were generally in bad shape. He claimed that an expensive piece of bridge work with the other teeth bad is an unusal thing to see.

The above information was furnished to SA MEE telephonically on this same date. This in view of the writers scheduled in-service. One copy of this memo has been forwarded directly to SA MEE.

Mr. RICHARD TOMKINSON was reinterviewed at his residence, 97 Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs. He said that on Saturday morning, May 25, 1968, he was successful in contacting NELSON SCHAUB through Saranac Lake, New York telephone 891-0403. He said he looked through his personal effects on that date and came up with this number, which is in a building which includes the Montgomery Ward store, Saranac Lake. He said that after a couple of calls, he was successful in contacting SCHAUB at this number. SCHAUB said he had been trying to get in touch with TOMKINSON. TOMKINSON said he urged SCHAUB to come to Saratoga Springs on May 27, 1968, as he wished to talk on an important matter. TOMKINSON mentioned to SCHAUB that he could not go to the Saranac Lake area because one of his own cars had been involvedin an accident. said this was true. TOMKINSON also advised that he would be leaving the area on business in a couple of days and there was certain information he had to have from SCHAUB which was very important. He also feigned an interest in the 1966 or 1967 gold Cadillac which SCHAUB owned as a replacement vehicle for TOMKINSON's wrecked car.

SCHAUB told TOMKINSON he would come to Saratoga Springs if possible. They agreed to meet at an apartment building owned by TOMKINSON at 641 North Broadway, Saratoga Springs.

SCHAUB did come on that date to Saratoga Springs and enroute, he told TOMKINSON he had trouble with the car which he drove, as it nearly threw a rod. The car, a 1957 Ford, Vehicle Identification No. 7EG208167, blue in color, was left behind 641 North Broadway. SCHAUB, not finding TOMKINSON there, apparently walked to TOMKINSON's residence and arrived there between 5:00 and 5:30 PM when TOMKINSON was out. He waited until about 6 PM when TOMKINSON came back. When he saw TOMKINSON, SCHAUB mentioned what had

happened to the 1957 Ford, but mentioned that on the way from 641 Broadway to TOMKINSON's residence he had spotted a 1961 white Mercury Comet for sale by a private owner. They went off together and SCHAUB purchased this car from an unidentified former owner for \$125. He took the license plates from the Ford and put them on the Comet. He gave the registration and keys to the Ford to TOMKINSON to hold because he was not sure whether he would ever come back for the Ford or have TOMKINSON junk it instead.

TOMKINSON exhibited a New York registration indicating that a 1957 Ford, VIN 7EG208167, was purchased from PATRICIA A. BICKEL, 743 Myrtle Avenue, Albany, New York, on February 28, 1967. It was purchased by NELSON R. SCHAUB, Saranac Lake, New York. The registration number was 8168799, license 2499AC.

After buying the car, TOMKINSON went by the apartment building to make up a bed in a room for SCHAUB in the event that he wished to stay overnight. While there, TOMKINSON told SCHAUB that he had checked out certain information pertaining to rewards in connection with the producing of JAMES EARL RAY. He said he told SCHAUB that there was no direct reward being offered by the Federal Government, and that much of the reward money was offered by the city of Memphis. SCHAUB indicated to TOMKINSON that he wanted to forget the matter because he wanted to stay alive. SCHAUB indicated that either one or both of them could be dead before the information got far enough to do any good.

TOMKINSON said that since SCHAUB did not appear to want to talk further in this regard, he was not in a position to press him further and they went back to TOMKINSON's house and ate dinner before going to the Saratoga Raceway where they saw the races and did not discuss the matter further.

After the races, they went to the Spa Diner, where SCHAUB mentioned he had been to a meeting at the Armory in Lake Placid, New York, since he and TOMKINSON had last visited.

Some of the people involved in the conspiracy were present there, but the purpose of the meeting was for another reason. It was apparently a well publicized affair, and SCHAUB mentioned that a couple of the doctors were there. He mentioned that "the doctor" was there and volunteered that he was not a surgeon.

SCHAUB also told TOMKINSON that he had sold his Cadillac around May 14, 1968, to a woman for \$3300.

From the Spa Diner, SCHAUB dropped TOMKINSON off at his home between 1:00 and 1:30 AM on May 26, 1968.

RICHARD TOMKINSON, 97 Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs, New York, telephone 584-3071, was interviewed at the Glens Falls Resident Agency. He said he is the president of Delaware Corp., a vending machine company, which is incorporated in the state of Delaware and he gives as its address c/o Postmaster, Little Creek, Delaware.

TOMKINSON advised that on Monday, May 6, 1968, around suppertime, NELSON SCHAUB, who resides in the Saranac Lake, New York area, came to the TOMKINSON residence alone. invited him into the house and while Mrs. TOMKINSON and the three TOMKINSON children were in the kitchen area, SCHAUB and TOMKINSON conversed in the living room. Almost at the outset, SCHAUB said to TOMKINSON, "How much guts do you have?". TOMKINSON said he asked SCHAUB what was on his mind. SCHAUB replied to the effect, "I think the guy deserves a medal and instead of that there's a price on his head." It was quickly understood by TOMKINSON that SCHAUB was talking about the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING SCHAUB agreed with TOMKINSON's conclusion. SCHAUB then approached TOMKINSON about a means by which they could make a lot of money legitimately, from the U.S. Government, and that TOMKINSON could realize \$50,000 for very little effort. SCHAUB explained that he understood that reward money for locating JAMES EARL RAY was in the amount of \$100,000. They terminated the conversation at this point because the TOMKINSONs were ready to eat dinner and SCHAUB was invited.

No discussion concerning the above matter was held during the meal, but afterward, SCHAUB and TOMKINSON decided to go to Saratoga Raceway, a harness racing track, at Saratoga Springs. Enroute to the track, SCHAUB mentioned to TOMKINSON that SCHAUB was interested in getting the reward money for RAY. However, people high up in Government were apparently also involved in the conspiracy, and he wanted to make no inquiries
