



CHURCH was subsequently interviewed by the writer and stated he had been residing at the La Posoda Motel since 3/29/68 and had not left Gallup. CHURCH also provided papers which indicated he was employed by the University of Colorado, and was studying for his degree.

On 4/19/68, the records of the La Posoda Motel, as provided by PAUL GORE, Manager, were examined and revealed that CHURCH had been registered at the motel since 3/29/68. GORE stated additionally that he had seen CHURCH every day since his arrival.
