SUBJECT: MUSGROVE, Joe Bailey

1. The following paragraphs summarize information relayed telephonically to the Bureau, and are forwarded to you for confirmation and for your files.

2. On 28 April 1968, our representative in Addis Ababa reported that Doctor Klaus Steer, a West German citizen and Director of the African Scientific Department, E. Merck Aktiengesellschaft, Karmstady, Germany, visited the American Embassy, at the request of the local German Ambassador, and reported that he had seen a man in Lagos, Nigeria on 23 April 1968 who strongly resembled newspaper photographs of Eric Stavro Galt, who is currently wanted in connection with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King. Dr. Steer said that he saw the Subject at the desk of the Bristol Hotel on the afternoon of 23 April when both were checking out of the hotel. Dr. Steer was accidentally given the hotel accounting receipt for the Subject, on which he noted "Name: Joe Musgaque, Room No: 403, Receipt No: D 52138, Account No: 08325." In a short conversation with Subject, Dr. Steer learned that Subject was employed by the "Wilder Oil Company" and was en-route to Warri, Nigeria on an 18 month contract. Subject told Dr. Steer that he had recently arrived in Lagos from Las Palmas via Accra on Nigerian Airlines.

3. The above information was relayed to the Bureau upon receipt by our duty officer on 29 April 1968. We were advised that the Bureau records did

not contain information on Subject or the Wilder Oil Company. We then requested our representative in Lagos to investigate this matter through unilateral means and through liaison.

4. On 29 April, liaison in Lagos checked the Bristol Hotel and determined that a Joe Musgrove, an American employee of McDermott Overseas Incorporated, arrived in Lagos on 23 April from Las Palmas and stayed in Lagos until 26 April, when he was to leave for the Midwestern State (Warri). Our representative received this information on 30 April 1968, and then visited Mr. Ray Landry, a U. S. citizen, Acting Chief of the McDermott Company, and obtained the following information from a personnel file: Joe Bailey MUSGROVE departed the U. S. on 9 October 1967 for employment with McDermott Nigeria. He has been resident in Nigeria since that date, except for the period 10-23 April, when he went to Las Palmas on leave. Date of Birth: [REDACTED] Occupation: Welder. Home Address: P.O. Box 1002, Farmington, New Mexico. Married, wife in U. S. Father: Banks Musgrove, 1017 East Garden (city and state not recorded).

5. Our representative also obtained a passport photograph of the Subject from the McDermott Company and is forwarding the photo to our Headquarters. Later on 30 April, liaison informed our Lagos representative that the Subject holds a U. S. Passport Number [REDACTED] issued in the U. S. and valid until 4 October 1970.

FBI Intensifies Search for Ray

Local Federal Bureau of Investigation agents said Saturday the Bureau has intensified its search for James Earl Ray, Missouri prison escapee, sought in connection with the gunshot slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., April 4.

The Bureau has appealed, they said, to newspapers all over the nation, asking them to again run photographs and information about Ray, in an effort to possibly locate the wanted man through someone

who might recognize him from the photo.

Ray has been added to the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" and he is also sought under an alias, Eric Starvo Galt.

A federal warrant charges Ray, under the Galt alias, with conspiring to interfere with a constitutional right of a citizen, and he is also wanted on a charge of unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery.

A white American, born in Alton, Ill., March 10, 1928, Ray

In order to cover the possibility that subject may have died since commission of the crime, the U. S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and they advised that no central records of unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested that each state may maintain such a record in their Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency.

There is no known Federal law requiring the maintenance of such information; and it is possible that if any record of unidentified dead is maintained, it would only be maintained at local police departments, morgues, medical facilities, or the like.

Each office covering state capitals should check to ascertain if such records are maintained, and if so, should check records for the period from 4-5-68, to date, for any information which might possibly identify subject Ray with unidentified deceased person over that period.

If there is no central record repository maintained in the various states or nationally in the case of Mexico and Canada, you should, in connection with your contacts with law enforcement agencies on this case or other Bureau matters, make appropriate inquiries relative to

JACKSON, aboard the same flight, advised SA BOYD D. ADSIT that they recall no one by the name of CARL RAY being aboard that flight and neither recognized any picture of JAMES EARL RAY as being that of any person aboard the flight.

On 5/4 and 5/5/68, all hotels in Denver and all motels in vicinity Stapleton International Airport were checked for reservation by CARL RAY with negative results.

At around 10:00 P.M. on 5/8/68, Mr. CHARLES LOPEZ, who resides at Garcia Hall, DH-23, New Mexico State University, and is a graduate student there, advised he was in the Loretto Shopping Center on 5/8/68, around 5:00 P.M., at which time he visited Bay's ^{Day's} Greeting Card Center, at which time he saw an individual who in some ways resembled the photograph of subject RAY. He then went home and took out his "Time Magazine" and there was an article on RAY. In reading the article and looking back, he thinks the man he saw was about 5'10", a white male, about 40, 175 pounds, blue eyes and brown hair. He did not know anymore about it and did not determine what he was wearing or much about him except that he was apparently having something gift wrapped.

He could furnish no additional information.

On 5/9/68, MARGARET DAY, the proprietor of Day's Greeting Card Store in the Loretto Shopping Center, Las Cruces, N.M., observed a photograph of subject RAY and all of the poses available at the time, and stated that she does not recognize this as an individual who did business with her shop around 5:00 P.M. on 5/8/68, however, she did recall an individual who was in there about that size around 5:00 P.M. who bought a "monkey pod" wooden tray for \$10 and stated that he was taking it to his secretary and wanted to make sure it was small enough to carry on an airplane. Her impression was that he was taking the trip on a plane, but she did not determine anything else concerning him. He paid in cash and departed without her learning how he was traveling, where he went and what he was doing. She concluded that from his general appearance and comparison with photographs of RAY available, that it was not JAMES EARL RAY.

In accordance with memos to all agents 4/24 and 26/68, contacts have been maintained with all mass communications media in the Resident Agency territory covered by the Las Cruces Resident Agency for leads on JAMES EARL RAY. It has been assured that all of these people have photographs appearing on the wanted flyer for this individual. Local Police Departments have identification orders and wanted flyers on this individual properly displayed.

The following investigation was conducted by SA PAUL L. DORRIS:

AT ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO

On April 22, 1968, the New Mexico State Police issued an item to all of their stations, both by radio and teletype, concerning this subject. This item is numbered Q349.

On April 22, 1968, an item was given to LISA HOLGUIN, Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office, concerning this subject.

Wanted fliers concerning this subject are on display at both the New Mexico State Police in Albuquerque and the Albuquerque Sheriff's Office.

The similar photographs of the subject have been attached to these wanted fliers at the New Mexico State Police and at the Albuquerque Sheriff's Office.

On April 25, 1968, one MAURO SANMARTIN, 1901 Hinkle S. E., Albuquerque, New Mexico, telephone Chapel 34273, came to the Albuquerque Office and stated that LISA HOLGUIN of the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office had sent him. He was advised that any information he developed concerning the whereabouts of this subject while in Mexico be furnished to the Mexican Police authorities.

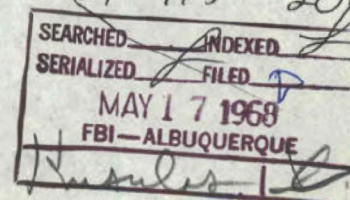

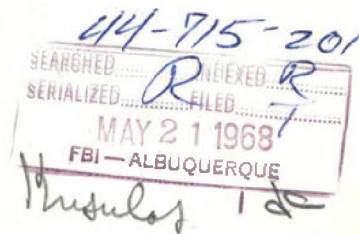

The following investigation was conducted on 5/17/68 by SA JEAN G. HUGHES at Hobbs, New Mexico:

AGNES HEAD, Editor, Hobbs Flare, 114 East Dunham, advised she has published information concerning JAMES EARL RAY previously, due to public interest. She advised her paper is strictly a "local news" paper and thusly did not want RAY mats or proofs. Her paper, additionally, is offset and the furnished mats are not useable.

RAYMOND WATERS, Editor, Hobbs News-Sun, 201 North Thorp, advised he would cooperate in any way possible with law enforcement authorities. He took one (1) each of the RAY proofs and Mats, as well as one (1) copy of the recent RAY photo. He advised this RAY information would be published at an early date in his paper.

On 5/17/68, MANNING BERNARD, Detective Division, Hobbs PD, advised RAY does not fit the description of the UNSUBS in what few unsolved ~~at~~ robberies the PD is working.

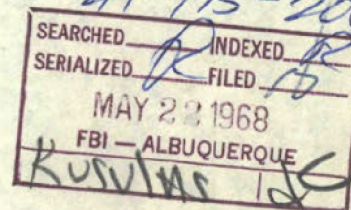
