Mrs. ESTELLE PETERS, Manager, Piedmont Laundry, Pick-Up Station, 1168 Peachtree, Northeast, home residence 1033 Milam Terrace Apartments, Clarkston, Georgia, home telephone number 433-4024, business telephone number 892-1467, advised that on April 1, 1968 shortly before 10 a.m. a white male came into the laundry and placed four undershirts, three underdrawers, one pair of socks, one wash cloth, as well as dry cleaning consisting of one pair of trousers, one coat and one tie and gave her the name ERIC GALT. She stated that she asked him if he spelled ERIC as ERIC and he replied yes and proceeded to spell his last name as GALT.

Mrs. PETERS described the dry cleaning and the coat to being a black checked coat with small check blocks and being an ordinary man's suit coat. She said it was not a sport coat or blazer, but an ordinary suit coat.

She described the trousers as a gray on the darker side and the tie as being black with tan and brown diagonal stripes.

She stated that GALT told her that he did not want any starch in his laundry and wanted the laundry folded.

An artist's sketch of GALT was exhibited to Mrs. PETERS and she advised that she could not say whether or not the sketch resembled GALT. She said she would not be in a position to state whether she could identify GALT if she were to see him again.

Mrs. PETERS continued that she recalled GALT as being in his thirties and slightly taller than Special Agent KANE, who is six feet in height and approximately the same weight as Special Agents KANE and ROSE whose weights are approximately 185 pounds.

GALT was clean shaven, neat with ordinary complexion. She failed to notice any particular regional accent and did not notice any peculiar marks or clothing characteristics. She did not recall his attention at the time the laundry and dry cleaning was placed April 1, 1968.

Mrs. PETERS advised from her ledger maintained by her in the usual course of business, the lambery and dry cleaning of GALT was picked up between 3 and 10 a.m. possibly closer to 9 a.m., on April 5, 1968 by the same individual who placed the laundry on April 1, 1968. She did recall that he was one of the earlier customers in the day and was of the opinion that he picked the laundry up earlier than he deposited the cleaning and laundry. To the best of her recollection, GALT entered the laundry and stated that he was there to pick up the laundry and cleaning of ERIC GALT.

At the time he obtained the completed laundry and dry cleaning, he was abrupt and short in his manner of speech giving her the impression that he was in a hurry or had a car parked in an area where he should not have parked. He appeared impatient while waiting for her to locate his laundry and cleaning. GALT paid for the laundry and cleaning in cash and she was of the opinion that he walked North on Peachtree Street toward Fourteenth Street after leaving the Laundry. She was unable to furnish his mode of on April 5, 1968 other than to stated that he did appear to be well shaven and neatly attired. Mrs. PETERS explained that the only area visible to her on Peachtree Street has prohibited parking and that his car, if he had one, would not have been parked immediately in front of the Laundry. Both times GALT was observed he appeared to be alone and she did not associate any other person with GALT. not obtain the impression that GALT was depositing cleaning and laundry for anyone other than himself although she did not assign or mark the laundry. She did assign the dry cleaning

items and was of the opinion that they would have been his clothing.

Mrs. PETERS produced a laundry slip from her transactions of April 5, 1968 indicating that ERIC GALT on April 1, 1968 deposited nine items of laundry described as three drawers, four undershirts, one pair of socks and one wash cloth. The notation appeared on the laundry slip "No Starch and Folded", indicating that the laundry would have been placed in a small rectangular stapled package. The laundry mark EGC83 would have been affixed in indelible black pencil in all the laundry items at the main plant of the Piedmont Laundry prior to laundering. She explained that the EG would indicate the customer as ERIC GALT and the C83 is the designation for her pide-up station. In addition, the laundry slip indicates the marker as A Lot 10 which she explained as being the laundry designation and the lot number. A 19-30 appears on the laundry slip and she explained this as meaning the ledger and entry number utilized by her in her bookkeeping system. The total amount of the laundry was \$1.16.

In addition, she furnished a green dry cleaning slip dated April 1, 1968 bearing the name ERIC GALT which has the dry cleaning tag 8 over 755 would have been placed in each dry cleaning item by staples and this is the Laundry's designation to identify the dry cleaning. The dry cleaning slip reflects one coat, black check; one pair of trousers, gray and one tie, black with tan and brown stripes were deposited on April and claimed on April 5, 1968 by GALT at a total cost of \$1.55.

Mrs. PETERS furnished the above described laundry and dry cleaning slips indicating they were prepared by her April 1, 1968.

Mrs. PETERS explained that no laundry slips are issued to the customer by the laundry and the laundry and the customer would not have been issued a slip to claim his laundry

and dry cleaning as all of these items are handled by the laundry personnel only.

Mrs. PETERS recalled that GALT made no other remarks or any conversation giving her any other impression. She had no recollection of any prior transactions with GALT.

On 4/11/68, FLOYD AYERS, an individual who has in the past contacted the Atlanta Office, telephonically contacted the reporting agent and advised that because of his participation in the MARTIN LUTHER KING funeral services, he had received numerous threatening phone calls from an unknown apparently white male individual. AYERS advised that he was making this matter known to the FBI because he lacked faith in the local law enforcement and was of the opinion they were making no efforts to resolve this matter.

AYERS advised that he has always been in the past on a close relationship with the DeKalb Co. PD but was recently advised by Detective IVY that the DeKalb Co. PD would prefer that he not contact them in the future unless it was on official business.

AYERS advised that on 4/9/68 the date of the KING funeral, he voluntarily went to the Ebenezer Baptist Church on Auburn Avenue and being a member of the crowd in front of the door of the church, he noticed that Mrs. ROCKEFELLER, the wife of the Governor of New York, was having some difficulty entering the church. He stated that he offered Mrs. ROCKEFELLER his assistance and escorted her through the crowd into the door of the church. He stated that after entering the church, WYATT WALKER, an individual who is known to him to have been affiliated with SCLC, thinking that AYERS was an official of some sort requested that AYERS continue to direct the dignitaries and personalities of the funeral to pre-arranged seats. explained that WALKER was concerned with the fact that numerous people in the church were vying for selected seats and were not adhering to the seating arrangements. AYERS stated that he then escored such dignitaries as JACQUELINE KENNEDY. Senator ROBERT KENNEDY and his brother, TEDDY KENNEDY, the ROCKEFELLERS and numerous sports and entertainment personalities such as WILT CHAMBERLAIN and FLOYD PATTERSON. He stated that his services

as an usher were televised at least locally in the Atlanta area and that because of that fact, he had received threatening telephone calls at his home.

After the conclusion of the funeral services at the Ebenezer Baptist Church, RICHARD NIXON had a slight discussion with AYERS at which time they discussed the possibility of a Republican headquarters being located in the Atlanta area in his forthcoming campaign. He stated that NIXON also requested to know at what location he could leave the procession leaving the Ebenezer Baptist Church and AYERS directed him to Courtland Ave. where NIXON departed the march. AYERS advised that in conversation with NIXON's security officer, name unrecalled, AYERS replied that through an undisclosed manner he was in some way affiliated or associated with the FBI.

It should be noted that AYERS contacted the Atlanta Office in which he furnished a civil rights complaint in which an active investigation was initiated and concluded. Through contact with numerous sources of the Atlanta Office, principally BOBBY KINARD, it has been determined that AYERS is an individual who wishes to associate with well-known personalities in an effort to utilize his association with these personalities to his best advantage. It could reasonably be assumed that AYERS might attempton to clikewise with his self-style association with the Bureau.

In view of the above, AYERS was severely admonished as to his statements of association with the Bureau and advised not to contact the Atlanta Office unless on official business or in the execution of his rights as a citizen. It was made clear to AYERS that he was not an agent or an undercover agent of the FBI or affiliated with the FBI in any manner. AYERS was also advised of the provisions of the Impersonation Statutes and stated that he was well aware of those provisions and would not imply in the future that he had any association with the Bureau.

The above information is being furnished to this file for information purposes.



The following investigation was conducted at Albany, Georgia, by Special Agent BOBERT 3. KRNNENUR:

On April 13, 1968, D. C. BRADLEY, Manager, Citizens Pawn Shop, 204 South Jackson Street, Albany, Georgia, telephone number 435-4641, advised that during World Wor II he had lived with a woman named AVIE CHRISTING CORRELL GALT, who was the wife of PREELAND GALT. BRADLEY stated that he lived in various towns in the Southeast with Mrs. CALT antil FREELAND GALT came out of the Army during 1945. He stated that Mr. and Mrs. GALT were both from a little town about 12 to 15 miles outside of Columbus, Mississippi. BRADLEY stated that he only saw FREELAND GALT one time and this was in Jacksonville, Florida, right after he came out of the Army. He stated that he would estimate FREELAND GALT to have been about 20 or 21 years of age in 1945, 6 feet tall. 170 to 175 pounds, dark complexion and blond heir. BRADIEY stated that after GALT came out of the Army. he stopped seeing Mrs. GALT, and the last time he had heard from them they were living in Memphis, Termessee, in 1945.

ERADLEY further advised that Mrs. GALT's father was named DAN CORBELL and he worked at an ammunition dump in the little town 12 to 15 miles out of Columbus, Mississippi, where Mrs. GALT's home is located.

BRADLEY stated that he was furnishing this information for whatever value it might be in view of the publicity being given in the local press regarding the Federal Bureau of Investigation's search for a person by the name of GALT in connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Mr. Daniel J. SMITH, 2328 Campbelton Road, Apt. D-3, S.W. Atlanta, advised that he is presently a school teacher in Atlanta where he has been teaching since mid-year of 1964. He further advised that he definitely was not in Birmingham, Alabama during October of 1967 as he only takes vacation during the summer months when he is off. In conclusion he stated that he has never resided at the Economy Room Housing, in Birmingham, as he has never even heard of the place.

Mr. DANIEL B. SMITH, Jr., was contacted at the phone No. of 284-5565 as he no longer resides at the address of 232 Glenrock Drive, Decatur, which was observed address where a home in the value of \$30,000 is located. We have address Mrs. Norman TERKELL stated that Mr. Smith has moved to build a nicer home add is waiting for it to be be built. When contacted by phone Mr. SMITH stated that he is not the correct SMITH, as he has not been in Birmingham for several years.

Thus, above eliminated as being present when GALT resided there due to negative mature of interviews.

He is the Special Delivery Carrier in Decatur. At 7:30 A.M., 4/18/68, he had an airmail special delivery letter for the occupant of Apt. 5, 175 Olympic Place, Decatur, Ga. He does not recall the place from which this letter was mailed nor does he remember the name of the addressee. He knocked on the door of Apt. 5 and a white male opened the door, stuck out his hand and took the letter. The man said nothing. A short time later, Mr. LEAVELLE read the "Atlanta Constitution of 4/18/68, and observed the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT. In his opinion, the party who took the letter at Apt. 5 strongly resembled GALT. He described him as a man between 35 - 40, 5' 11", 165 pounds, dark brown hair worn in a long flat top and he appeared to have not shaved for four or five days. Mr. LEAVELLE contacted the regular carrier, a Mr. ROWAN, who told him that the people in Apt. 5 had just moved in and that today was the first day he had mail for them. He did not know their names. / LEAVELLE advised this building is owned by a W.C. LEE, 3754 Wieuca Road, telephone 233-7430. This is located near Buckhead.

Attempts to contact LEE met with negative results.

Observations of this area reflect that 175 Olymic Place, is an eight unit apartment building consisting of four units upstairs and four downstairs, with each having a front and rear exit. Apt. 5 is an inner unit and is located on the ground floor. There is a Resident Manager in Apt. 7

At 12:15 p.m., on 4/18/68, a woman who refused to give her name contacted the Atlanta Office. She said that she is a waitress at Mammy's Shanty Restaurant on Peachtree Street. She said that on Friday, 4/5/68, she is sure that she served lunch to ERIC S. GALT, whose picture appeared in the newspapers on 4/18/68. She said she remembers the person vividly because she and another waitress were talking about the assassination of Dr. KING, and the other waitress commented that "They'll never catch the killer" whereupon the person she believes was GALT gave her a peculiar look. She said she could not recall his clothing except he was neatly dressed. She described his voice as being soft and very Southern. She said he was very polite and ordered london broil. She said that it would be easy to locate the check which would have been handled by GALT because he carried it up front to the cashier and paid his bill. She said his check would be the first or second check for a single at noon on 4/5/68, who had london broil, potatoes, and cobbler. She did identify herself as Waitress No. 27 and added that Mrs. KRAMER, the cashier at Mammy's Shanty, upstairs, would have the check. She said that GALT looked exactly like his picture in the paper except his hair appeared flatter than shown in the newspaper photograph.
