



Results of examination:

The previously submitted bedspread, specimen Q13, is composed of brown cotton fibers, green cotton fibers and green rayon fibers. Brown cotton fibers, green cotton fibers and green rayon fibers that could have come from the Q13 bedspread were found on Q95, Q97 through Q104 and Q106 and in the Q117 sweepings. No such fibers were found on Q89 through Q92 or in the Q114 through Q116 sweepings.

Caucasian head hairs like the hairs previously found on the Q13 bedspread, in the Q15 zipper bag, on the Q26 towel, on the Q29 and Q30 socks and on the Q38 hairbrush were found on Q35, Q97, Q99, Q100 and Q103. These hairs could have come from the same person. It is pointed out that hairs do not possess enough individual microscopic characteristics to be positively identified as originating from a particular person. Caucasian head hairs were also found in the Q114 through Q117 vacuum sweepings. Some of these hairs are like the Q13, Q15, Q26, Q29, Q30 and Q38 hairs and could have come from the same person. Some of the hairs from Q114 through Q117 are different from the Q13, Q15, Q26, Q29, Q30 and Q38 hairs and did not come from the same person. No hairs were found on Q89 through Q92, Q98, Q101, Q102, Q104 or Q106.

The Q89 through Q91 floor mats are composed of translucent red plastic. No brand names are indicated on the mats. The letters "HIS" are hand printed on the back of each mat, apparently with a felt tip marker. The significance of the letters is not known.

Specimen Q92 is a black and gray plaid rubber mat. No marks were found on Q92.

Specimens Q94, Q108 and Q109 are standard items furnished with Mustangs.

Specimen Q95 is a dark blue short-sleeved sweat shirt of medium size. No labels or laundry marks were found on Q95.

Specimen Q96 is a black and white rubber sandal for the left foot. A label on the bottom bears the following: "MEN'S = N SHOE SIZE $7-8\frac{1}{2}$ JAPAN"

Specimen Q97 is a twin-bed size, fitted, white bed sheet. Specimen Q99 is a white pillowcase. A white laundry tape is present on Q97 and Q99. The following is printed in black on each tape: "2-OR-3" It was concluded that the marks on these tapes did not originate from the machine which prepared the laundry tapes on the Q69 shorts and the Q70 T shirt.

Specimen Q98 is a black and white shirt jacket. The following is present on the label of Q98:

M RN19788 65% DACRON 35% COTTON 15-15- MONTICELLO SHIRT JACKET TAPERED"

Specimen Q100 is a twin-bed size, fitted, white bed sheet. The sheet is in two pieces. The two pieces are stitched together with yellow thread and white thread. Inquiry at a department store in Washington, D. C., developed the following information concerning Q100: It is a #3 grade irregular seamed sheet. Most such sheets even if manufactured in the United States are seld in other countries. If sold in this country, they are sold in low class "illegitimate stores." Such sheets do not bear the manufacturer's name.

Specimen Q101 is a black short-sleeved shirt. The following is present on the label of Q101:

"ARTURO ROSETTI CUSTON TAILORED -L- 190% COTTON MADE IN U.S.A. RN15722"

Specimen Q102 is a pair of clive green walking shorts. The following is present on the label of Q102:

"HONG RONG DIPLOMAT CUSTOM TAILORED 65% POLYESTER FIRE 35% SUPER FINE COTTON WAIST 34"

Specimen Q103 is a light plnk, looped pile cotton rug that measures 24" by 56g". No labels were found on Q103.

Specimen Q104 is a feather pillow that measures about 19" by 24". The pillow has a specification label. The back of the label is stamped "9 1967."

Specimen Q105 is a container for a Polaroid camera, possibly a model 230. No label was found on Q105.

Specimen Q106 is a pair of men's stretch socks with no label.

Other than the laundry tapes on Q97 and Q99, no visible laundry marks were found on any of the cloth items listed above. No invisible laundry marks were found on any of these items.

No buttons are missing from any of the garments listed above.

The Q107 hunting knife has a blade that measures 3/9/16" in length. The blade is rusty. The words "GESCO JAPAN" are imprinted on one side of the blade and the number "45" is imprinted on the other side. The word "GESCO" is stamped on the sheath.

Specimen Q116 is a flat-tipped Stanley brand screedriver.

Specimen QIII is an "ANCO" brand windshield wiper blade. Part of the rubber has been torn off.

Specimen 9112 is a "Personne" double-edge razor blade. No hairs were found on 9112.

The K30 and K44 through K59 solls from Memphis are different from the soil found on the previously submitted Q13 bedspread in physical characteristics and composition. Therefore, the soil from the bedspread did not come from the sources of K30 and K44 through K59.

No soil similar to the soil from the bedspread was found in Q113, Q143 through Q158, Q160 and Q161 or on the Q163 tire and wheel. None of these soils from the car originated from the source of the soil on the bedspread.

Although nothing was noted which would aid in the determination of the original sources of specimens Q113, Q143 through Q146, Q148, Q149, Q151, Q152, Q154 and the soil from Q163, they are suitable for comparison purposes. Specimens Q147, Q150, Q153, Q155

through Q158, Q160 and Q161 are either too limited in amount or too mixed with miscellaneous debris to be of value for significant comparisons other than for elimination purposes.

The soils from the car were different from K30 and K44 through K59 in physical characteristics and composition and, therefore, did not come from the sources of K30 and K44 through K59.

No soil of value for significant comparison was found on QS9 through Q106 or in the vacuum sweepings, specimens Q114 through Q117. The mineral debris in Q114 through Q117 consists of typical car floor debris, a mixture of miscellaneous materials from numerous sources. No mineral debris of apparent significance was found in Q114 through Q117.

The scrapings from under the glove compartment, Q159, do not contain blood.

The Q162 liquid was identified as water. No traces of any alcohols such as used in windshield wash were identified in this specimen.

Results of examination:

Numerous hairs were found on the Q164 and Q165 bed sheets. The hairs include brown to black head, pubic and limb hairs of Caucasian origin. Also, one dark brown head hair of Negroid origin was found on Q165. The range of characteristics exhibited by the Caucasian hairs suggests that they are from more than one person. Some of the hairs are deteriorated and dirty, similar to hairs from floor debris.

A few of the Caucasian head hairs from Q164 and Q165 are similar in some microscopic characteristics to hairs previously found on items from the Mustang and Memphis scene but do not match in all microscopic characteristics. The possibility that these hairs originated from the same source could not be eliminated.

No fibers were found on Q164 or Q165 that could be associated with the QB bedspread or with other cloth items previously submitted from the Memphis scene or from the Mustang.

The Q171 keyhole saw is old. The brand or source of Q171 could not be determined.

Some similarities were noted between the handwritten word "florida" and other variations of this word appearing on Q167 when compared with available writings attributable to Eric S. Galt. The limited nature of the writings on Q167 precluded a more definite opinion.

The hand printing on Q170 (Jimmy Owen) is upperand lower-case, while previous hand printing on items received has been upper-case letters. For this reason, it could not be determined whether this name was prepared by Galt; however, differences were noted.

The printed words " $^{P}_{E}$ TTED" and either "PUNCH" or "BUNCH" were faintly inscribed on the newspaper designated Q169. Any significance of this is not known.

No previous road maps similar to Q166 have been received.

On 4/16/68, AT 1802-C furnished the following information:

This informant advised with regard to the data provided by the informants of the Memphis PD, that the man known as "DUKE" is probably DUKE MAINOR, a known burglar who has lived in Memphis, Atlanta, and in the Youngstown, Ohio, area. This informant advised that MAINOR is extremely well known to all old-time burglars in this area, and his brother "FLEAGLE" MAINOR is presently serving a sentence in the USP-A.

This informant advised that a group of burglars, some of whom live and work in the Memphis, Texnessee, area, along with others from Atlanta and from the Birmingham, Alabama, area, have recently become involy€d in a car ring case which appears to be headed by LEO CKUMLEY.

This informant advised that CRUMLEY, a known car thief, is presently living in Anniston, Alabama, and can be reached there at telephone # 236-8490.

Informant advised that CRUMLEY's constant companion is TERRY MAYES, aka. Terry McCrory, a white female who is living also in this area and can be reached at telephone #831-4383 at Anniston, Alabama.

The informant advised that MC CRORY and CRUMLEY are expected in the Atlanta area approximately 4/17 or 18/68 and that MC CRORY is scheduled for a court appearance at Fulton County Superior Court approximately 4/22/68 in connection with a stolen car 6 -104% charge.

This informant advised that he understands that CRUMLEY has established a farm or a location somewhere near Anniston, Alabama, where cars are being disassembled and identification numbers are being changed in such a skillful fashion that the automobiles have gone undetected even when they have been located by police officers in the course of arrests.

The informant said he heard that some of these automobiles, principly late model Oldsmobiles, have sold for as much as \$2500 as stolen cars, because of the skillful work on the part of CRUMLEY and his associates.

This informant said that the data indicating that CRUMLEY has some "high up" contacts in the State of Alabama, who are assisting him, is also entirely accurate. This informant said that he was attempting wa obtain the release on bond of an individual in Anniston, Alabama, but that the State of Alabama had filed a warrant as a hold and the informant was unable to obtain the release of this individual for this reason. The informant said he explained this matter to CRUMLEY and CRUMLEY immediately went to the informant's telephone where he dialed a long-distance call to Talledega, Alabama, where he talked to an individual and explained that he wished the warrant to be withdrawn.

The telephone number used by CRUMLEY at this time was 873-6904. The informant advised that CRUMLEY spoke for some length of time to the person answering the telephone and he then turned from the call and told the informant that the warrants would be withdrawn within a few days.

Informant advised that two days later this warrant was withdrawn as a hold from the man in Anniston, Alabama, and the informant was able to affect the release of this man and his return to Atlanta.

Informant is of the firm conviction that CRUMLEY is paying some relatively high ranking individual in the State Government of the State of Alabama, possibly in the Attorney General's Office or in the Board of Pardons and Paroles for the State of Alabama to affect releases of individuals and to assist CRUMLEY. The informant said he finds it difficult to believe that either CRUMLEY or TERRY MC CRORY would permit anyone near them who had committed a major offense of any kind as this would in turn draw attention to CRUMLEY's activities which are relatively wide spread.

Informant advised that he received a telephone call from an individual in Cleveland, Tennessee, who identified himself only by saying that he knew the informant through mutual acquaintances and this individual wanted to know how he could get in touch with CRUMLEY as he understood CRUMLEY had a "first-class car operation" going and this individual wished to contact him to furnish automobiles.

Informant said he does not believe CRUMLEY will be willing to discuss anything at all with anyone representing law enforcement no matter how serious the offense. Informant said he thought, however, that should the photograph of the subject GALT be obtained that it could be pointed out to CRUMLEY and that some questions might be asked CRUMLEY by the informant.

Informant said that he knows of only two individuals in Georgia who are directly connected with this organization in Alabama and he identified them as JOHN OSCAR LUCK who is presently confined to the Fulton County Jail on charges of possession of burglary tools and JOHN RAYMOND WALDEN who was recently arrested by the Atlanta Police Department on charges of harboring a fugitive. WALDEN is presently on bond awaiting trial.

Informant said he is absolutely certain that neither LUCK nor WALDEN will be willing to discuss this matter in any way, that both are extremely antagonistic towards law enforcement and that he thought the only way WALDEN would be willing to speak to anyone regarding this matter would be under the assurance that charges against him presently pending would be dropped in response to his assistance.

Informant repeated that he found it very difficult to believe that the individual responsible for the murder of Dr. KING would be an individual associating directly with this group of burglars who are extremely careful to refrain from calling attention to themselves and their activities in any way and he did not believe they would tolerate the presence of anyone responsible for an act of the signifigance of that in captioned case.

Informant said if a photograph can be made available he will show it to CRUMLEY and to TERRY MC CRORY as this is possible and he will advise if any information comes to his attention regarding the identity of the person previously identified by the Memphis informant.

As a further note, informant advised that if the identity of the official supposedly connected with CRUMLEY is desired, the informant will receive a copy of his long distance charges for the month of March and will furnish the telephone number of the individual called at Talledega, Ala., or as an alternative the informant sufgested that this telephone number be obtained from the telephone company by this office.

On 4/22/68, Mr. T. H. WALTERS, Captain, 2637 Hedland Drive, East Point, Georgia, viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, aka, and could effect no identification. He pointed out that rarely does he have any opportunity to observe the passengers on a flight.

On 4/23/68, Mr. F. H. ALLEY, 4135 Welcome All Terrace, College Park, Georgia, co-pilot on Eastern flight 328, advised after viewing photographs of subject he could not effect an identification as subject's photographs are completely unfamiliar. Mr. ALLEY suggested that the routine on all of Eastern's flights to Toronto is for the Eastern Airlines Ticket Agent to board the plane at Buffalo on the last stop prior to entering Canada and make available to all passengers declaration forms for customs to expedite the passengers' entry into Canada. Usually, on their flights there/are no more than 10 or 12 passengers left for Toronto and/in his opinion had subject been on an Eastern flight stopping at Buffalo, the Eastern Airlines ticket agent there/would be in an excellent position to recognize him. He also pointed out that Stewardesses CORINTHIA HICKS and RUTH HARRIS, both of whom are Negroes, remained on the flight from Atlanta until arrival in Toronto. Miss JOCELYN BREAKMELL got off
