FRED C. JONES, who resides in Apartment 1, at 113 14th Street, Atlanta, was interviewed at his place of employment, The Albert Pick Motel.

JONES advised he had previously been interviewed by Bureau Agents and he had told them everything that he knew concerning the individual they appeared to be interested in. JONES was advised that it had now been determined that the man in which the FBI was interested had resided in Room 2 at 113 14th Street and was a different individual other than the one previously discussed with him.

JONES advised that he had never seen the individual who had resided in Room 2 subsequent to March 24 and was not even aware this room had been occupied at that time since he had heard no sounds or seen anyone entering or leaving this room.

JONES further advised that he could not recall ever seeing a white Mustang in the vicinity of 113 14th Street, nor could he identify from description or artist's conception, the individual who had resided in Room 2 at 113 14th Street.

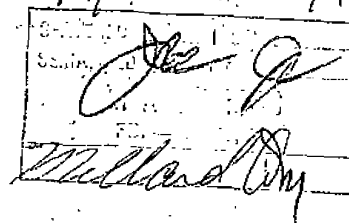

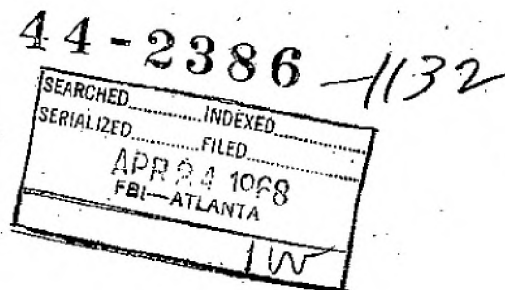
Re: SUSPECT ON FLIGHT 133, EASTERN AIRLINES

On 4/24/68, Capt. W. R. BOMAR stated he was the pilot on Eastern Airlines Flight 133 on 4/12/68, and he was shown photographs of subject and stated he has no recollection of ever having seen anyone who resembles the subject. Capt. BOMAR added that he has little, if any, contact to observe passengers on flight. Capt. BOMAR stated that the majority of passengers left the plane at Houston and comparatively few went on to Corpus Christi.

On 4/24/68, D. K. SMITH advised he was Second Officer on Flight 133, Eastern Airlines, and on viewing photographs of subject stated he cannot recall seeing anyone resembling subject on Flight 133 on 4/12/68.

On 4/24/68, Miss MARLYN NAWROCKI stated she was a stewardess on Flight 133, EAL, from Atlanta to Houston on 4/12/68. She viewed photos of subject and stated she cannot recall anyone who resembled subject or was on flight 133 on that date. Miss NAWROCKI stated she cannot recall either Mr. GILCHRIST or suspect being on opposite sides of the plane on that date. Miss NAWROCKI stated that almost all of the passengers deplaned at Houston on that date.

A Mrs. OGLESBY, 1898 Jonesboro Road, S. E. said that she had been in a neighborhood grocery store and a man fitting the description of ERIC GALT had come into the store, purchased a package of cigarettes and then went into the woods (apparently adjoining the store).

Date April 18, 1968

Mr. PERRY HAMPTON HUFF, 1230 Rendwood Drive, S.E., advised that on the Wednesday, April 3, 1968, before Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's death, he was at the Crown Service Station at 331 Auburn Avenue and was playing checkers with Mr. ALONZO BRYANT, the manager of the station. He stated he had arrived at about 11:00 a.m. and the checker game was being held directly in front of the three pay telephone booths on the premises. He noticed that two men were near the booths. One was inside and the other was standing outside the booth holding the door open. He stated the man inside the booth looked into the directory and apparently wrote a number down on a small pad and then made a call. HUFF advised this continued for about 40 to 50 minutes, making a number of calls. HUFF stated he thought the men had worked for Dr. KING or SCLC and were simply preparing to go to Memphis. At this time, the checker game had moved around the corner and the men were still at the phone booth. HUFF stated this was the last time he saw the two men and he did not think to look to see if they were still in the booth when he left the station at about 12:30 p.m.

HUFF described the man in the booth as being about thirty to thirty-five, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 170 to 180 pounds, sandy hair which he said was a long, shaggy crew cut. He stated the man was in shirt sleeves, but he could not describe his clothing further.

HUFF described the man outside the booth as being in his thirties, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 140 to 150 pounds, wearing dark pants.

HUFF stated he really did not get a good look at the second individual.

HUFF added he did not think of these men until sometime after KING's death. He said that when he saw the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT published on the night of

April 17, 1968, he thought of these men in the booth. HUFF was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, with eyes both open and closed, as well as an artist's conception of the assassin, and he advised that there was a very strong resemblance between the photograph and the man in the booth.

HUFF advised there were other people at the station playing checkers and observing the game; however, he could not recall the names of any individuals who might have been there.

Mr. JERRY HUBBARD, 1483 Joyland Place, Apartment F-5, telephone 622-4244, advised that on Wednesday, April 3, 1968, the day before the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he arrived at the American Legion Home at 345 Auburn Avenue, where he works, at approximately 9:00 a.m. He stated that shortly thereafter he crossed the street to the Crowd Service Station, 331 Auburn Avenue, which is directly across the street from the headquarters of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). He stated that he was not sure of the time of his arrival at the station, but when he did he noticed two white men standing near the pay telephones on the premises of the service station. HUBBARD advised that one man was inside a telephone booth using the telephone, and the other was standing outside, very close to this booth. He stated that there was a checker game going on near the telephone booths, and as Dr. KING left his office across the street one of the men at the station said, "There goes Dr. KING." At this point the man in the booth turned and looked quite surprised. He added that he left the station sometime after lunch and that these two men were still there.

HUBBARD described the man in the booth as being in his late twenties or early thirties, 5 feet 9 to 11 inches tall, dark hair which was longer than a crew cut and parted on the left. He estimated the man's weight as being between 150 and 165 pounds, but added he was not very good at judging weight.

HUBBARD stated that the man in the booth resembled the published photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT. HUBBARD, upon being shown the artist's conception of the assassin, as well as two photographs of GALT, one with eyes open and one with eyes closed, stated he would hesitate to identify the man in the booth as being identical with the photographs, and added he remembered the man had a slightly protruding Adams Apple.

HUBBARD described the man outside the booth as being in his late twenties or early thirties, 5 feet 7 to 9 inches tall, 150 to 165 pounds, and stated he was not certain of his weight. HUBBARD stated this individual walked with a limp in his left leg.

Mr. EDDIE INMAN, an employee on the night shift at Crown Service Station, 331 Auburn Avenue, Atlanta, advised he was not on duty at the service station on April 3, 1968, but had heard from other people that there were two white men at the station for an extended period of time on that date. Mr. INMAN stated that on April 16, 1968, at about 4:30 or 5:00 p.m., he noticed a white man at the service station having arrived in a cream colored station wagon with red and white Alabama plates. He advised the man parked the car a distance of approximately 60 feet from the three telephone booths and walked to the booths and made a call. INMAN stated that the man remained in the station for approximately 1½ hours or more, and advised he was awaiting a phone call. This man never received a call and at approximately 6:00 or 6:30 p.m. he left.

INMAN stated that while the man was waiting for his phone call, he was constantly looking in the direction of the front door of the SCLC Office on Auburn Avenue. INMAN described this man as follows:

Sex: Male  
Age: In his thirties  
Height: 5 feet 11 inches  
Weight: 150 pounds or less  
Build: Slim  
Hair: Brown, a little longer than a crew cut  
Characteristics: A limp in his right leg

INMAN stated he believed the man had an artificial leg.

INMAN was shown photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT, with eyes open and closed, and also an artist's conception of the assassin. INMAN stated he was certain that the man in the photographs was not the man in the booth.

ALEXANDER MOORE, Assistant Manager, Crown Service Station corner of Hilliard Street and Auburn Avenue directly across the street from the Southern Christian Leadership Conference headquarters, advised that he recalls Reverend ROBERT BEAN coming to his place of business on Tuesday, April 16, 1968, during the mid-morning hour which he believes was sometime after 10:30 because another worker, OLEN ALLEN, who comes to work at 10:30 was already at work.

MOORE advised that Reverend BEAN told him that he had become suspicious of a white man in a station wagon that he had noticed parked in MOORE's station for quite a long period of time and that he had noticed that the man was standing in front of some telephone booths looking over at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference headquarters.

MOORE advised that he observed this person for a few minutes and he, too, became suspicious and that he obtained the following description of the individual:

He stated this individual was driving a yellow for door, late model ranch station wagon, bearing Alabama tag 1 A 69013, license tag was red and white in color, but year not noticed.

Mr. MOORE stated that he noticed that this man had some type of razor or radio in his pocket. MOORE said he talked to the man and that the man told him he came over from Birmingham to Atlanta to pick up a check. The man

said that he did not realize that Atlanta was as big a city as it was. MOORE said that he noticed that when the man walked, he had a bad right leg and that when he wanted to put his leg on a box, he lifted it up as if it might have been deformed in some way. The man told MOORE that he was waiting for a telephone call.

MOORE said that the man also remarked in connection with the remark of Atlanta being so big that he had noticed helicopters picking up money at banks and this also made him think that Atlanta must be a large city.

MOORE stated that this man was still in Atlanta as of the evening of April 17, 1968 since he saw him at a snack bar at the Atlanta Stadium on the evening of April 17, 1968.

MOORE said that this individual was standing in front of the telephone booth facing the Southern Christian Leadership Conference headquarters and looked at it for a long period of time.

MOORE said that he talked on the telephone for about 30 to 40 minutes and in all he thinks this individual may have been in the station for as long as one and one-half hour to two hours.

MOORE stated that ROBERT EVANS, a Negro laborer who works helping brick masons, was in the station at that time and observed this person closely. He said that he thinks EVANS can furnish more information concerning this individual than anyone else.

LEONARD GUZZINO, owner of Leonard's Tavern, Patterson, Louisiana, advised on 4/22/68, that on the date of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's funeral, an individual watched the entire funeral on a TV at his bar. This individual appeared very interested in the funeral but hardly spoke during the entire time. This individual was described as white male, age 40, 5'8", 175 lbs., blond hair, long and thin, ruddy complexion, protruding teeth, driving about a 1965 Oldsmobile, blue - green in color, Ga. license 3-JA-277, year not known. Mr. GUZZINO said the individual appeared to be traveling through and this individual resembled photograph of RAY which he saw in the newspaper on 4/20/68, but does not resemble photograph of GALT which he also saw on TV and in the newspaper.

New Orleans subsequently advised on 4/24/68, that the license number should be 35-A-277.

Records of Georgia Bureau of Motor Vehicles reflect that 1967 Georgia license 35-A-277 is listed to J. L. LAWSON, Route 2, Canton, Ga., for a 1966 four-door Oldsmobile, SN 358696D102255; 1968 Georgia tag 35-A-277 is listed to a JAMES P. Mr. D. A. DODD, Supervisor, Crew Scheduling, Delta Airlines, Atlanta Airport, on 4/23/68, identified the stewardesses aboard DAL Flight 725 on 4/1/68, as SYLVIA PAGE, DIANE MOSELEY and SUE STUMLER. DODD advised that SYLVIA PAGE is currently on a leave of absence, having recently been married.

SUE STUMLER, Stewardess, DAL, was interviewed on 4/23/68, at the Atlanta Airport, and advised that on 4/1/68, she was the First Class Stewardess on Delta flight 725. She advised in this capacity she received passengers at the front of the plane and recalled receiving a rifle case from a male passenger. She advised as is customary, she brought the case to the pilot's cabin and stored it there until termination of the flight in Atlanta, Ga. She advised DAL policy does not require that any record be made indicating the name of passengers bringing weapons on plane.

The published wanted flyer of JAMES EARL RAY was exhibited to Miss STUMLER and she advised she recalled having seen photo on television but could not connect it with passenger bringing weapon on plane.

DIANE MOSELEY, 532 Cleveland Avenue, Apt. 12-C, Hapeville, Georgia, advised on 4/23/68, that she was on duty in the tourist section of DAL Flight 725 on 4/1/68, with SYLVIA PAGE. She advised that her duties required her to remain in the rear section of the plane while the passengers boarded and that she does not recall a passenger bringing a weapon case on the plane. She also advised SYLVIA PAGE was in the rear of the plane and would not have been in a position to observe this. Miss MOSELEY advised based on the limited description available, she could not recall the individual described in referenced airtel.

The published wanted flyer of JAMES EARL RAY was exhibited to Miss MOSELEY who advised she was unable to identify him.

In view of information furnished by Miss MOSELEY it appears as though Stewardess SYLVIA PAGE would not have been in a position to observe incident or identify individual, and in view of her unavailability, she will not be interviewed.

Mr. BEN GOODIN, currently employed as salesman, Schantzmeier Ford Company in Jefferson City, Missouri, advised the Kansas City Office he was previously employed for a period of six years as chef at the Missouri State Prison. During this period Subject JAMES EARL RAY was directly under his supervision.

GOODIN knows RAY, during this period, to have been a close associate of one LEWIS DOWDA. DOWDA is described by GOODIN as a racist and in view of the close relationship which existed between DOWDA and RAY would consider him a possible accomplice in captioned matter.

GOODIN stated both DOWDA and RAY were involved in the drug traffic at the prison during their incarceration, both as sellers and users, stating RAY utilized amphetamine tablets in barbituates, shooting them.

SA HOWE advised Kansas City Office indices list DOWDA as subject, AT 26-41621.

Review of this file indicates DOWDA <sup>arrested</sup> by SAS, this division, 9/28/67, at which time residing 1565 Austell Road, Austell, Georgia. Complaint on which arrest based dismissed by AUSA, St. Louis, Mo. 1/26/68.
