in the Bible in which JESUS CHRIST, during his agony and death, called upon His heavenly father to:

Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.

Reverend KING then realized that if his Christian upbringing was what he feels it to be, he had to feel the same way about the shooting of his brother.

Reverend KING further commented that the murder of his brother has only served to make him see more clearly that violence is not the answer to the Negroes' problem.

Reverend KING stated that during the several contacts he had with his brother on April 4, 1968, his brother gave no indication that he had received any information indicating an attempt on his life would be made on that date. On the contrary, his brother seemed to Reverend KING to be overly jubilant in that he, the brother, felt that he was making progress in obtaining a desirable solution for the sanitation strikers in Memphis, Tennessee.

Reverend KING advised that after his arrival in Memphis, Tennessee, late on April 3, 1968, until after the shooting of his brother, he, Reverend KING, had left the Lorraine Motel on only one occasion, that being around noon, April 4, 1968, when he, in the company of Mrs. LUCRETIA WARD of Louisville, Kentucky, who was also staying on that date at the Lorraine Motel, went to a nearby dry cleaning establishment and drugstore to make some purchases. On this occasion, they were gone from the motel but for a short time and Reverend KING observed nothing unusual or indicative of any indication that harm might befall his brother on that date.

Reverend KING further commented that prior to his above visit to Memphis, Tennessee, he had last personally seen his brother in Washington, D.C., in February, 1968, exact date not recalled. However, he frequently telephonically was in contact with his brother and during none of these contacts did his brother indicate to him that any open threat upon his life had been made. However, Reverend KING

commented that he knew his brother lived with the thought in mind that efforts might be made to assassinate him and Reverend KING feels such an effort did occur in Birmingham, Alabama, several years ago, when first Reverend KING's home was dynamited and about 20 minutes later, the motel at which his late brother was then staying was also dynamited.

It was explained to Rev. KING that the matter of the protection of a prisoner would be the responsibility of the prison officials in whose custody the prisoner might be. Rev. KING stated he understood this.

As noted in re mirtel, as of 4/15/68, Rev. A. D. WILLIAMS KING reportedly was in Atlanta, Ga., and was scheduled to return to Louisville late 4/17/68. Telephonic efforts by SA WARREN L. WAISH on the morning of 4/18/68 to reach Rev. KING at his home in Louisville were negative. A message was left with his son for Rev. KING to telephonically contact SA WALSH on his return to Louisville.

Later on the morning of 4/18/68, SA WALSH telephonically contacted the Zion Eaptist Church in Louisville where Rev. KING is pastor and was advised that Rev. KING had not yet returned to Louisville. At 5:15 p.m. on 4/13/68, SA WALSH telephonically reached Rev. KING's wife at his residence, and she advised that Rev. KING had not yet returned to Louisville, but was expected momentarily. SA WALSH explained to Mrs. KING that he desired to talk with Rev. A. D. WILLIAMS KING because of the report that Rev. KING had been in Memphis, Tenn., at the Lorraine Motel on the date that his brother had been shot. Accordingly, it was felt he might possibly have information of value in connectin with instant investigation. Mrs. KING stated she would have her husband promptly contact SA WALSH upon his return to Louisville.

Not having heard from Rev. A. D. WILLIAMS KING as of 10 a.m. 4/22/68, SA WALSH telephonically contacted his home and reached him there. Rev. KING advised he had received the message for him to call SA WALSH, but he had been so busy he had not as yet had the opportunity to set up the appointment. He advised he would be available in the office of his church at noon, 4/22/68, for interview.







On 4/22/68, Mrs. JEAN JETT, 19 Lake Circle, Mableton, Georgia, was recontacted during which time she advised she was employed for the W. F. Grant Department Store during November, 1965, instead of November, 1964. She reiterated that an individual who was employed in the camera department looked similar to the picture of GALT appearing in the Atlanta Constitution on 4/18/68. She stated that she believed this individuals first name was ERIC but cannot remember his last name. She recalled, however, that the other employees of the store called the individual CURT. Mrs. JETT further stated that she believes this individual discontinued work for the W. T. Grant Department Store around Christmas, 1965. She stated that he spoke with an accent and often spoke of countries in Europe. Mrs. JETT stated that she cannot furnish any additional information to the information that was furnished the Atlanta FBI Office on 4/18/68.

On 4/22/68, Mr. WILLIAM SIMMONS, Merchandise Manager, W. T. Grant Company, 1378 Bankhead Highway, Mableton, Georgia, advised after a review of store records, that the individual who was employed in the camera department was CURT ULBBID. Mr. SIMMONS observed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, aka ERIC S. GALT, and stated that RAY is definitely not ULBRID. SIMMONS further stated that ULBRID was approximately 24 years old in 1965 and that he left W. T. Grant Department Store to take a management trainee course at the Americana Hotel on Spring Street. SIMMONS stated that he has seen ULBRID approximately two times since ULBRID discontinued employment.

FAULKNER, Box 35, formerly Box 15, Midland City, Alabama, advised that he last saw his son, BILLY JOE FAULKNER, on the evening of April 2, 1968, when he stopped by the house to pick up some clothes. At that time BILLY JOE FAULKNER told his father that he had moved from Atlanta, Georgia, and had quit his job at Square D Electronics, Inc. FAULKNER stated that his son is an electrician and did live in a rooming house in Atlanta, Georgia. He further stated that his son usually contacts him every month and that when he determines his son's present whereabouts, he would immediately contact the FBI. FAULKNER further stated that his son has worked in Dallas, Texas; Pensacola, Florida; and has served thirteen years in the United States Air Force.

He described his son, BILLY JOE FAULKNER, as white male, age 40, 6 tall, 170 pounds, brown hair, and blue eyes.



The following investigation was conducted at Albany, Georgia, by Special Agent ROBERT S. KENNEMUR:

On April 13, 1968, D. C. BRADLEY, Manager, Citizens Pawn Shop, 204 South Jackson Street, Albany, Georgia, telephone number 435-4641, advised that during World War II he had lived with a woman named AVIE CHRISTIME CORBELL GAIT, who was the wife of FREELAND GAZT. BRADLEY stated that he lived in various towns in the Southeast with Mrs. GALT until FREELAND GALT came out of the Army during 1945. He stated that Mr. and Mrs. GALT were both from a little town about 12 to 15 miles outside of Columbus, Mississippi. BRADLEY stated that he only saw FREELAND GALT one time and this was in Jacksonville, Florida, right after he came out of the Army. He stated that he would estimate FREELAND GALT to have been about 20 or 21 years of age in 1945, 6 feet tall, 170 to 175 pounds, dark complexion and blond hair. BRADLEY stated that after GALT came out of the Army, he stopped seeing Mrs. GALT, and the last time he had heard from them they were living in Memphis, Tennessee, in 1945.

BRADLEY further advised that Mrs. GALT's father was named DAN CORBELL and he worked at an ammunition dump in the little town 12 to 15 miles out of Columbus, Mississippi, where Mrs. GALT's home is located.

BRADLEY stated that he was furnishing this information for whatever value it might be in view of the publicity being given in the local press regarding the Federal Bureau of Investigation's search for a person by the name of GALT in connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.
