

EDDIE JEAN GRIFFIN, Route 1, Billingsley, Alabama, advised that he owns a 1961 Ford, and produced a tag receipt indicating that 1968 LAlabama license number 4-4163 was issued for his car. He further advised that this car was in his possession in Autauga County, Alabama, during 4/21/68, and, to his knowledge, it has never been in Texas.

BUDDY HOWORTH, Personnel Department, Bushog Mfg. Company, advised that his records reflect that GRIFFIN reported for work 7:00 a.m. on 4/22/68.

In view of fact that car reportedly seen in San Antonio late 4/21/68, is owned by a Negro male who stated he has not been in Texas, it would appear that the anonymous caller gave incorrect license number to San Antonio office. Accordingly, no further investigation is being made and no insert is being submitted concerning this incident UAC.

advised that they were listening to the car radio and the news of the shooting of MEDCAR EVANS was broadcast and the three of them were drying to figure out a route to Memphis which would bypass possible road blocks. the conversation which took place KNIGHT recalled SPARKS and WING discussing the fact that SPARRS had been offered a \$10,000, payment to kill MARTIN LOTAER KING. They did not elaborate on this other than to indicate that when both were in the state penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, some "agents" had come to interview SPARKS concerning this alleged offer and payment and that he had "run them off" meaning that he had refused to talk to the agents about the matter.

was quizzed thoroughly concerning this incident and advised that it was not discussed further, nor would SPARKS mention who had approached him with the offer.

stated that SPARES is perfectly capable of committing a murder and is a known hater of Negroes. According to KNIGHT, SPARES is not known to make jokes and it was believable to that an actual offer was made to SPARES by someone.

For the information of offices receiving, DOWALD ECOMENE SPARKS is presently incarcerated at Fort Payne, Alabama and has been incarcerated during the period of the MARTIN LUTRER KING nurder which would definitely eliminate SPARKS as a suspect.

forwarded to the Bureau an original and 7 copies of a letterhead memorandum showing information received from a detective of the Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, considered by Jackson a reliable individual who is acquainted with members or former members of the WKKKKOM. In reporting this information that was overheard as general rumor among Klansmen and he did not know the source, was doubtful of its truthfulness.

The information in substance was that on 3/17/65, advised that he had received unverified information that in 1964, the original Knights of the KKK of Mississippi had hired a "killer" from the State of Oklahoma to murder MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. when KING was in Jackson, Mississippi. This "killer" was known as "TWO JUMPS" and came to Jackson, Mississippi to "case" the layout and while in Jackson, stayed at the Terrymore Motel. He was to use a high-powered rifle with telescopic sights. This deal allegedly fell through when the Klansmen could not raise the \$13,000 demanded by "TWO JUMPS."

also reported "TWO JUMPS" was allegedly also the killer of a Bureau Top Ten fugitive later identified as JOHN GIBSON DILLON. "TWO JUMPS" allegedly killed DILLON at the Flamingo Motel in Jackson, Mississippi and thereafter transported the body to Oklahoma or Kansas where it was dumped in an old well.

The Oklahoma City Division by airtel of 4/8/65, advised Bureau and Jackson Division that complete background in the case involving Top Ten Fugitive JOHN GIBSON DILLON did not substantiate that DILLON was killed in Mississippi. From facts available to Oklahoma City, it was doubtful in fact if DILLON was killed in Mississippi.

The Jackson Division on 4/2/65 interviewed described by Jackson as a notorious confidence man and gambler who had at that time been under development as an informant of the Jackson Division for some two months.

was asked if he knew an individual named DONALD SPARKS or GENE SPARKS to which he promptly replied, "Who, TWO JUMPS?" He was thereafter shown a photograph of DONALD EUGENE SPARKS, Tulsa, Oklahoma Police Department Number 38224 dated September 7, 1963. promptly identified this photograph of SPARKS as being identical to the person he has known for many years as went on to relate that SPARKS got "TWO JUMPS." the nickname of "TWO JUMPS from his ability as a cowboy and according to SPARKS was an excellent "broncho buster" and could ride almost any horse. considered SPARKS to be an extremely hard and tough individual who would not hesitate to kill anyone. Extensive investigation was conducted in several field offices to concretely identify "TWO JUMPS" and from the identification of Jackson, Mississippi, it was felt that DONALD EUGENE SAPRKS was identical to "TWO JUMPS."

Investigation by the Jackson Division at the Terrymore Motel in Jackson failed to disclose any registration that could be identified as being that of SPARKS. In addition to the above identification of SPARKS as "TWO JUMPS", was interviewed at Phoenix on 1/26/65. This informant advised he knew DONALD EUGENE SPARKS and was well aware that SPARKS' nickname is "TWO JUMPS."

Based on this identification on 5/14/65, an attempt was made to interview DONALD EUGENE SPARKS, Inmate Number 71755, at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary. Following his being advised of his rights, SPARKS stated at the outset he would not furnish any information. He did deny being contacted by anyone at any time to commit a murder and said he did not kill anyone for money or any other reason. He denied ever being hired by anyone in the South and specifically in Mississippi to commit any murder. He denied knowing anyone connected with the Ku Klux Klan.

SPARKS at this time stated he had never cooperated with any police officers and did not intend to start doing so now. He said he had been contacted by numerous officers and would appreciate it if police officers would not bother him again since they wasted his time, as he was working in the plumbing shop in the Penitentiary and could not be away from his job. SPARKS terminated the interview by getting up and leaving the room.

By airtel to the Bureau dated 5/17/65, in case "WHITE KNIGHTS OF KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI, RACIAL MATTER", the Bureau was advised of the attempted interview with SPARKS. Additionally, 9 copies of an FD 302 dated 5/17/65, was furnished to the Jackson Division. This showed the interview with SPARKS. At that time, it was the considered opinion of Agents that had worked cases involving SPARKS, his associates, and Agents who handled the former case involving former Top Ten Fugitive JOHN GIBSON DILLON, that information that SPARKS was hired to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and that he did kill DILLON was not accurate nor truthful information. It was pointed out that following DILLON's murder there was a massive amount of rumor, speculation and hearsay information circulated among the criminal element concerning the death of DILLON. It was this hearsay information that was probably being reported by Jackson's informant in all honesty.

The Bureau's attention is directed to the fact that is the subject of a current pending file, Oklahoma City 92-588, Bureau file 92-9329. He is an Oklahoma ex-convict, Burglar, Armed Robber, who travels extensively throughout the United States. He was last interviewed by Bureau Agents, 3/5/68, where he was living at Bartlesville, Oklahoma. He was at that time employed at Jeanie's Lounge in Bartlesville.

A further review of the ledger maintained by GARNER for 1968 reflects that WILLIAM EARNEST HARPER, 704 Benning Drive, Columbus, Georgia, was assigned to Room 8, 107 14th Street, on 1/22/68, paying \$15.50. He subsequently paid \$10.50 and \$23.40 for this residence through the period 2/19/68, or possibly 2/26/68.

She stated this individual definitely was not over 25 years of age, was at least 6'2" tall, and weighed, in her opinion, in excess of 200 lbs. She stated that her husband is 6' tall and weighs 190 lbs., and she is certain this individual is a little taller and considerably heavier. She stated this individual claimed he had come in from Arlington, Virginia, was en route to Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, Ala., and either indicated he was related to former President WOODROW WILSON or that he was named after former President WOODROW WILSON. At one time, he also indicated he was going to Birmingham, Alabama, while talking to a young peoples group at the Church that evening. She stated this man had closs set eyes, a thick neck, and rounded shoulders, and after personally viewing the photograph of RAY, she was of the opinion that the man she saw was too young and weighed too much.

Mrs. DEVANE stated that on 4/17/68, while eating lunch in the Varsity Restaurant, Atlanta, a man walked by in front of her who, in her opinion, closely resembled the TV pictures she saw that evening of ERIC STARVO GALT. She stated, however, this man could not have been over 25 years of age, was very clean cut; however, his hair appeared to be dark brown or almost black and was growing out from a crewcut. She stated she has never seen this man before or since, and she had no idea where he might now be.

On 4/19/68, Mr. DWIGHT GUINN, who is in charge of all curb boys, and FRANK GORDY, owner, Varsity Restaurant, advised after a conference with all employees that none had come forward and indicated they had ever seen anyone resembling JAMES EARL RAY at the Varsity.
