Attorney General Ramsey Clark today announced that James Earl, Ray, an escaped convict being sought in connection with the fatal shooting of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, has been located in London, England.

FBI Director John Edgar Hoover said that Ray, who has used the name of Eric Starvo Galt and other alias was detained by officers of New Scotland Yart at 11:15 a.m., London time this morning. Ray was traveling under the name of Ramon George Sneyd and had two Canadian passports in that name in his possession; one passport had been issued at Ottawa on April 24, 1968, and the other had been issued May 16, 1963, in Lisbon, Portugal, by the Canadian Embassy in that city. Mr. Hoover advised that Ray was located based on information furnished by the FBI to New Scotland Yard. At the time of his detention, Ray was passing through British Immigration officers and was planning to take a flight to Brussels, Belgium. Mr. Hoover said that Ray is now being

held in London's Cannon Row Police Station under maximum security conditions. Mr. Hoover further advised that Ray was armed with a fully loaded pistol which was found in hip pocket. He was wearing glasses and was his dressed in a light colored raincoat, a sports jacket and gray trousers. Director Hoover advised that Ray's arrest was the direct result of intensive investigation by the FBI pursued in all 50 states as well as in Canada, Mexico, Portugal, England, and other countries. In particular, Mr. Hoover singled out the outstanding cooperation received from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and from England's New Scotland Yard. FBI Director Hoover pointed out that Ray was detained in England based on his use of fraudulent documentation - a passport - and also on the fact he was carrying a concealed weapon. A first degree murder indictment was returned by the Shelby County Grand Jury in Memphis, Tennessee, on May 7, 1968, charging Ray, and necessary extradition proceedings will be initiated shortly. According to Mr. Hoover, Ray was added to the FBI's list of 10 Most Wanted Fugitives on April 20, 1968. Mr. Hoover stated that the 40-year-old Ray is an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri. He was received at the institution on March 17, 1960, to serve a 20-year

sentence following conviction in St. Louis for armed robbery and for operating a motor vehicle without permission of the In April of 1967, he was reported missing from the state penitentiary; and on July 20, 1967, based on information indicating Ray had fled from Missouri, an FBI complaint was filed at Jefferson City charging him with unlawful flight to avoid confinement for armed robbery. On April 17, 1968, the FBI filed a complaint at Birmingham, Alabama, charging him under the name of Eric Starvo Galt with conspiring to violate the civil rights of Dr. King in violation of Title 18, Section 241 of the United States Code. This FBI complaint charges that: "On or about March 29, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, . . . Eric Starvo Galt and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate Martin Luther King, Jr., . . in the free exercise or enjoyment of a right secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy, Eric Starvo Galt did, on or about March 30, 1968, purchase a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama " Immediately after the fatal shooting, a 30.06 rifle with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main Street in Memphis, which overlooks the Lorraine Hotel

and Motel where Dr. King was staying. Mr. Hoover said FBI Agents determined that the rifle had been purchased on March 30, 1968, from a gun dealer in Birmingham and that the telescopic sight was also purchased from this dealer. On April 19, 1968, Mr. Hoover announced that a systematic and exhaustive search of latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against the fingerprints of the over 53,000 persons for whom "wanted notices" had been posted in the files of the FBI's Identification Division led to the determination that Galt and Ray were identical.

FBI Agents also identified him as the owner of an abandoned 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was located in Atlanta, Georgia, on April 11, 1968. As Eric Galt, he had purchased a Mustang from a private citizen in Birmingham on August 30, 1967, From that date until it was abandoned in early April, 1968, the car was driven more than 19,000 miles.

Mr. Hoover stated that the fugitive's travels in the Mustang included trips to Los Angeles, New Orleans, Birmingham, Memphis, and Atlanta, as well as Mexico. He visited Mexico in October and November, 1967. He made a trip to Canada earlier in 1967 before purchasing the Mustang.

According to the FBI Director, while in Montreal, Canada, in the Summer of 1967, Ray enrolled as Eric Galt

for a correspondence course in locksmithing offered by a school in New Jersey. He also took a course in bartending in Los Angeles earlier this year, graduating on March 2, 1968. In addition, he also took dance lessons in Long Beach, California, from December, 1967, to February, 1968.

Mr. Hoover said that a summary of the FBI's investigation in this case, together with the findings of the FBI Laboratory and the results of fingerprint examinations by the Identification Division, will be made available to Tennessee authorities.



Ray: The Whole Truth

The fact that fugitive James Earl Ray has been traced and captured in London is comforting reassurance that authorities have been diligently at work, despite their virtual silence during the past two months.

The apparent fact that he will be held by British authorities for at least another week may irritate many Americans.

Some Negro militants already are expressing cynicism about the case, saying that the murderer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. will never be brought to justice, that if Ray is guilty, he will nonetheless escape on legal technicalities.

So the country feels a tug to get the investigation and trial over with as soon as possible.

It is an impulse Americans should resist. Ray should be afforded every legal protection, both under British and American law. For us in particular, it will be a test of the majesty of law over passion.

Dr. King sought justice for black people and other disadvantaged people. Certainly any short-circuiting of Mr. Ray's procedural rights would mock the justice in whose name

the case will be tried and the cause for which Dr. King died.

In addition to the goal of even-handed justice, Americans have a great need to know the truth in this case—the whole truth.

To have James Earl Ray end like Lee Harvey Oswald, with his lips sealed forever to truth or falsehood, would be disastrous to the nation's internal stability. There is strong evidence that more than one person was involved in Dr. King's assassination. No one is interested in having Ray or any other suspect serve as a patsy for other participants—especially a dead patsy.

If Ray is guilty, then the mere fact that he is still alive suggests the slaying was part of no elaborate espionage scheme. Professionals would not leave a careless, high-living suspect around for questioning. If he were part of some less professional conspiracy, then his life is in danger the closer he gets to home.

Justice will not suffer if Ray's return and trial are delayed by his employing every procedural delay the law allows.

Justice and truth both would suffer if anything prevented a full and orderly exposition of the facts in this case. (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

The information Tuesday was the first indication that Ray, who used the alias Eric Starvo He said he was told by the Galle extensively, had been in

Atlanta before the assassination. His actions here remain a mystery.

JACK NELSON, Southeastern Bureau Chief, LosAngeles Times, telephonically contacted me at my home 9:00 PM 6/12/68. He stated that his newspaper was interested in learning how RAY got from Atlanta, Georgia, to Toronto, Canada, and I advised him that I could not make any comment. Mr. NELSON stated that he talked to a person in the Department of Justice on 6/12/68, who told him that the FBI did not know how RAY got from Atlanta to Toronto, and Mr. NELSON said he sort of doubts the truth of that statement. I again informed him that I could make no comment.

Mr. NELSON then referred to the article in the Atlanta Constitution for 6/12/68, concerning a rooming house where RAY had stayed in Atlanta, and he stated that he had determined this rooming house was located at 113 Fourteenth Street, NE, that he had been making inquiry, and he said he felt that if RAY lived in a rooming house subsequent to the assassination, that it would be a different address. He did not ask for any comment concerning this and none was given.

CHARLES V. TYSON, Manager, Hertz Rental Agency, Albany, Georgia, furnished the following information:

On April 19, 1968, he received a telephone call from an unidentified male who claimed to be calling from Cordele, Georgia, asking if he would have a car at the Albany Airport for JAMES E. BODKER. The caller stated BODKER had a credit card.

Mr. TYSON was not present when this individual showed up to rent a car, but learned from two of his employees, WILLIAM YEOMAN, and DOTTIE OLIVER, that at 12:15 p.m. on April 19, 1968, a white male identifying himself as JAMES E. BODKER rented a 1967 Ford Galaxie, four-door hardtop, white over blue, Vehicle Identification Number 7A56C2O7625, bearing 1968 Georgia License 8J5039. The car was to be returned at Albany, Georgia, on April 22, 1968, and was to be used in the vicinity of Albany, Georgia. BODKER used a Shell Oil Credit Card, in renting the car. He gave his home address as 14341 South Avalon, Dolton, Illinois, and claimed to be manager of Suburban Motors, address not given. He gave Illinois Driver's License Number B32644533030.

The vehicle has not been returned as yet and TYSON has made numerous telephone calls to locate either the car or BODKER. No warrant has been taken as yet. He checked with Shell Oil Company at Tulsa, Oklahoma, and was told the credit card issued to BODKER had never been used before and was one of a promotional group mailed to college seniors. The description given by his employees placed BODKER beyond the college age. Since Dolton, Illinois, is a suburb of Chicago, Illinois, TYSON obtained the telephone number of Suburban Motors in Chicago, Number 312-388-5280, and called them on April 29, 1968, and April 30, 1968, but received no satisfaction. He talked with a Mr. HANNA, who claimed to be manager of Suburban Notors. HANNA furnished virtually no information

except to say BODKER was a part-time employee and was not there.

Mr. TYSON made available the Hertz Rental Contract with BODKER, and requested that it be returned to him after it had served its purpose.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

WILLIAM YEOMAN, an employee of Hertz Rental Agency, Albany, Georgia, furnished the following information:

Date May 2, 1968

He was present on April 19, 1968, when DOTTIE OLIVER rented an automobile to a white male claiming to be JAMES E. BODKER. He only viewed this individual for approximately fifteen seconds and described him as a white male, about 30 years of age, 5'll", 165 pounds, dark brown wavy hair, slightly reddish tint combed back, dark complexion, slender build, neatly dressed wearing open neck sport shirt and dark slacks. He viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated that the individual he saw on April 19, 1968, as JAMES E. BODKER bears a close resemblance to the 1968 photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and a close resemblance to the head-on 1960 photograph of RAY.

YEOMAN stated he could not be positive concerning the 1960 profile photograph of RAY. In Mr. YEOMAN's opinion, the individual claiming to be BODKER could possibly be identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

The following investigation was conducted by SA SCOTT T. FENSTERMAKER:

AT ATLANTA, GEORGIA

On May 4, 1968, Mrs. GEORGE PHILLIPS, 84 Twelfth Street, (ASKED THAT HER IDENTITY BE PROTECTED), advised as follows:

ULYSSES LAMB, also known as BUDDY, had moved into her rooming house at the above address on about January 11, 1968, and left there around February 8, 1968. He had worked at Lamb Johns, 1859 Peachtree Street, as a cook; however, he quit the job there shortly before he moved out and worked for several days at a restuarant next to the motel, which is across Seventh Street from the Peachtree-Seventh Building. When he moved out, he said he was going to work at a barber shop in Riverdale.

When LAMB moved in, he said he had a television set, but he never moved it in. As far as PHILLIPS knows, LAMB had no car. The only friend that LAMB ever mentioned was a girl he had met named CORA. One night he had a fight with another boarder, an alcoholic named KIRK RUMPF. RUMPF's current residence is 3729 Clairmont. While LAMB lived in Mrs. PHILLIPS' boardinghouse, PHILLIPS considered he acted suspicious since he never talked about his past and seemed to think that someone was "after him".

LAMB is described as follows:

Sex Male White Race 35 to 40 Age Brown Hair Blue Eyes Fair Complexion 5' 11" Height 175 lbs. Weight Scars and Marks None noticeab,

PHILLIPS was impressed by LAMB's resemblance of the published pictures of JAMES EARL RAY.

Several days after the KING funeral, PHILLIPS received a call from a person who identified herself as a girl friend of LAMB, named CORA MERRITT, telephone number 753-9007. This caller advised as follows:

She was calling to inquire about LAMB's whereabouts, and she called Mrs. PHILLIPS to see if she knew that LAMB used to live at that address. LAMB had told her that he had killed MARTIN LUTHER KING and asked her to hide him. He said he had stolen a white Mustang to do it. It is the had told her this before news of the white Mustang had been publicized. The had told a boyfriend about this and he had in turn told the FBI. When she was questioned by the FBI, she denied that LAMB had ever told her this since she felt that there was nothing to it. LAMB had also told her he had previously stolen a car in Riverdale and had taken it to Spartanburg, North Carolina.

A boarder, ROGER SESSIONS, has seen a man walk by the house, which he believes is JAMES EARL RAY. Mrs. PHILLIPS had seen him also and thinks he resembles the photographs of RAY and also resembles LAMB. It is possible he is LAMB, but Mrs. PHILLIPS is not sure.



In an effort to locate JAMES EARL RAY, now a Top Ten Fugitive, the following investigation is set forth:

Prior investigation determined RAY has rented safe deposit boxes since his escape from prison.

Agents receiving assignments in this matter are to contact personally an officer of the bank branch, and with the cooperation of the Safety Deposit Box Teller, conduct the following specific investigation:

- (1) Exhibit photos of RAY to Safety Deposit Box Teller to determine if RAY has been into vault.
- (2) Review their Safety Deposit Box name file to determine if they have or have had a box rented in the following names:
 - a. JAMES EARL RAY
 - b. ERIC STARVO GALT
 - c. W.C. HERRON
 - d. HARVEY LOWMYER
 - e. JAMES MC BRIDE
 - f. JAMES O'CONNER
 - g. James Walton
 - h. JAMES WALYON
 - 1. JOHN WILLARD

- (3) Determine everyone who has entered Safety Deposit Box on April 5, 1968, and April 12, 1968. Will eliminate everyone who has entered a box on these days as being RAY.
- (4) Determine owner of all new boxes rented from 3/18/68 to 4/12/68 and eliminate as being RAY.
- (5) Determine owner of all boxes closed on 4/5/68 to 4/12/68 and eliminate as being RAY.

BASIS FOR ELIMINATION:

- A. The Safe Deposit Box Teller will normally know a large percentage of Safety Deposit Box Holders and can eliminate them as being RAY.
- B. Those holders not known to the teller can be eliminated by a check of the bank's central records. If box holder has maintained a checking account, savings account, or has done business for a year with the bank, or is known to bank employees, eliminate him.
- C. If none of the above eliminate holder, a review of the City Directory or credit check can eliminate holder as possibly being RAY.
- D. If the holder cannot be eliminated in the above manner, the agent assigned this bank or branch will be held personally responsible for going to the address of the box holder to conduct appropriate investigation to eliminate him as being RAY. KEEP IN MIND SUBJECT IS ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

Agents having more than one location to check are to contact banks in order as listed in assignment.

Any positive information should be brought to the attention of the SAC immediately.

Upon completion of assignment, negative investigation can be reported at the end of this serial, noting
