On 10/26/68, CS CI 569-5 made available to SA NACK O. RLLIS at Athens, Ohio, Page 31 of "Look" magazine, dated 4/25/61, Volume 25, No. 9. The page is enclosed for Atlanta, and a morox copy of the page exclosed for Hemphis and the Bureau.

CS CI 569-8 advised that this page is the beginning of the article, "The Second Battle of Atlanta," by GEORGE B. LECHARD, JR., Lock Staff Writer, and included on page 31 are two photographs. One photograph shows a marching Ku Klux Klamsman, and the other a Negro student demonstrator. Source advised he noted this article while thumbing through the old issue of the magazine. Being an artist himself, he noted the great similarity between the Ke Klux Klameman and the photograph of JAMES KARL RAY, photograph of RAY takes in 1966. Source states there is enough similarity between the Ku Klux Klansman in 1961 and RAY to be the one and the same person.

Source advised that the photo credit for the Klameman is the "Atlanta Journal" photographer.

The photo mentioned above appears in the 4/25/61 insue of "LOCK," however, the date the photo was taken is not known. However, the article mentions that "Both Eu Klux Klansmen and Negro students have marched in downtown Atlanta in recent months."

It is further noted that Bureau teletype to all SAC's, dated 4/19/68, captioned MURKIN, reveals RAY had been received at the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri, on 3/17/60.

If Atlanta does not know the identity of the Klamaman shown in the photo, it may be desirable to contact the "Atlanta Journal" to determine the date the photo was made.

Atlanta is requested to advise Cincinnati only should the Klansman in the photo be identified as RAY.

James E. Ray And His 'Plot'

MEMPHIS - A superb reporting and investigative job and the magazine story derived



therefrom (Look), unquestionably has contributed to a change of lawvers and postponement of the trial of James Earl Ray, originally set for Tuesday, November 12.

William Bradford Huie, veteran reporter and writer of Birmingnam, Alabama, has revealed all Ray's movements prior to March 23, 1968. His report goes into minute detail. (It must be kept in mind that the prosecution probably has all this material and more, from F.B.I. and other investigative sources. It is well, also, to understand that Ray is unstable and given to fantasy and lying.)

It is believed here that the Look articles were responsible, indirectly at least, for the decision by Ray to change attorneys. His selection of the Texan, Percy Foreman, who represented the late Jack Ruby and the heiress Candace Mossler, to replace Birmingham attorney Arthur J. Hanes, astonishes no one.

Ray gave Huie all possible cooperation to do the research in exchange for a fee of \$25,000. It is not believed possible Ray, according to Huie, had permission, and agreement, from attorney Hanes. For the past weeks there have been reports of disagreement between the two. The basis of this will, in time, be<u>come pu</u>blic.

Rays' Revelations
Huie, after detailing Ray's revelations made this conclusion in the Look article:

"Dr. King was to be murdered for effect. His murder was planned, not by impulsive men who hated him personally, though they probably did hate him, but by calculating men who wanted to use his murder to trigger violent conflict between white and Negro citizens . .

"He was to be murdered during the election year of 1968. Since he was to be murdered for maximum bloody effect, he was to be murdered, not while he was living quietly at his home in Atlanta, but at some dramatic moment, at some dramatic place where controversy was raging . .

"Preferably, he was to be murdered in Birmingham or Montgomery or Selma, since these cities were milestones in his career as an advocate of racial change . .

"Therefore, in this plot, Dr. King was the secondary, not the primary, target. The primary target was the United States of America."

Running through Ray's report to Huie is his acceptance of a "job" from a man met in Canada and identified only as "Raoul." Their story is a set of substantiated events more incredible than the cloak-and-dagger stuff of the more imaginative mystery writers. It includes driving a car across the Mexican border with something hidden in a tire. It describes, too, sealed packages brought across the Canadian border.

## A Conclusion

Huie's conclusion of conspiracy, in which Ray was used for a purpose beyond the mere murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., is one which has haunted this case from the beginning. This was not true of the John F. Kennedy or Robert Kennedy assassinations.

What we do not know, of course, is what the prosecution has ready. It is quite possible, indeed probable, that the Federal Bureau of Investigation provided a massive array of evidence.

It is necessary, as aforesaid, to keep in mind that Ray, on the record and by his admissions to Huie and others, is familiar with deceit, lying and fantasy. His record, criminal, army and these later admissions, reveal him as one often in a dream world.

The "plot," the packages and the tire used to carry some unidentified material into Mexico, may have involved narcotics or jewels.

So, the Ray trial assumes even more mystery and possibly of dramatics than before. Date:

On 12/27/68 Det. RALPH BROWN, APD, furnished the following information:

He just returned from Orlando, Fla., where he picked up WESLEY ALLEN GUNTHER. WM, age 28. GUNTHER is a check writer who has been traveling over all the United States and was recently apprehended and is being bound over in Fulton County Jail for forgery. Det. BROWN anticipates an indictment on him very soon and he will be bound over under \$5,000 bond for trial.

BROWN informed that one of the many aliases of GUNTHER is ALFRED RANDOLPH which he used quite extensively in Atlanta. GUNTHER is an allegal alien from Canada and he is originally from Kincaid, Saskatchewan, Canada. During last July and August, 1968, he was residing at 70 12th Street, Apt. 14, which according to BROWN was the same address where RAY was living. Other name used by GUNTHER was ALLEN WEST NEWMAN. He passed numerous checks in the Atlanta area in 1967 under the NEWMAN name.

The purpose of Det. BROWN's call was that the FBI might try to interview GUNTHER to see if he had any connection with RAY while living at 12th Street, Atlanta. BROWN informed that he has not questioned GUNTHER about RAY or any activities surrounding the RAY case.
