WILLIAR advised that her mind was hany as to dates. She said she is in the process of growing up and finding herself and has been very interested in Astrology, Scientology and the metaphysical theories of the Rosicrucians in this regard.

WILLIAR said she lived at the St. Francis Apertment Notel, Los Angeles in November and Documber, 1967 and left there just before Christmas, moving to an apartment on Chriton way, Los Angeles. While at the St. Francis she met a girl named NARIE who worked as a barmaid in the Sultan Rose of the St. Francis. MARIE was a friend and possibly a relative of CHARLES STEIN and his sister, RITA STEIN. WILLIAR was under the impression that MARIE and RITA were from Now Orleans. She met RITA at MARIE's apartment and met CHARLES STEIN as the residence 5666 Franklin Street, Los Angeles where RITA STEIN also lived with her four children.
