On 4/15/68, JOE SEGAL, operator, D'Arcy Cleaners and Laundry, 2487 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo, New York, was contacted re laundry mark in referenced communication. He had Textile Marking Machine #R33554 and advised that Machine #32031 was formerly owned by him but was traded in about two years ago and was sent back to the company in Syracuse, New York. He explained his method of marking laundry as follows:

The first character is a letter, which represents a particular account; the next two are numbers representing lot number; the last one or two characters are bundle numbers. He said the first three characters on his mark are 15 point type and the last two are 18 point type. The color of the laundry mark changes every day with the exception that a red laundry mark is routinely used for "special work" every day. He said the only time a letter "B" is used is on the University of Buffalo account; but in all instances, the letter representing the account is the first character in the mark. He said the machine could, however, be so manipulated to arrange the characters in any sequence desired. But, it could not possibly prepare a laundry mark identical to the one in the photograph.

SEGAL was asked if he knew of the location or ever heard of Frank's Laundry in Buffalo. He said Frank's Laundry used to be located on Guilford Street but is now out of business and has been for some time.

The following subjects were contacted on 4/16/68:

MARION CLYDE MILLER. aka Mrs. Robert Augustus Miller PRI - GHETTO Buffalo file 170-189

Captioned, co-owner of a small grocery store located in the Negro community of Rochester, advised she has heard nothing concerning any organized group or groups professing violence in the area; however, many of her friends and customers have expressed both anxiety and grief over the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, as well as over the growing tendency of some Negroes in other communities to resort to looting and other forms of violence. From these contacts, she believes that a definite possibility exists in Rochester, for an outbreak of violence.

In light of the problems that exists in Rochester in the summer of 1967, and the speed in which the matter was controlled has made many local residents believe that very strict and possibly even punitive action may be taken by the police against looters and arsonists. anything were to develop, it would most likely come from a single act or incident involving a Negro and someone connected with a police organization.

She stated that she had heard, through news media, about the "Poor People's Campaign" and the march on Washington, D. C., but that she has heard nothing of it locally.

Many Rochester Negroes in her immediate area have "sub-standard" living quarters, but the vast majority of her neighbors, although their respective homes look shabby from the outside, have been nicely and tastefully remodeled on the inside as the people realize they would have difficulty moving out of their neighborhood into either a better Negro neighborhood or even a mixed community. Since these Negroes have put their time as well as money into their homes, the subject believes these people would react immediately to quash, as well as they could, any destructive or property-damaging activity which might arise.

As far as "communication" between the leaders of the Negro community goes, she has listened to many local persons who have college educations plus speak on what is being done, and most people listem themselves. However, the adults realize that things are being done, that many of their "leaders" are earnestly trying to better the lives of the low-income Negro families, but that these efforts take time and cannot be achieved overnight. Again, it will be the younger adults and teen-agers who will both instigate and participate in any violence that might occur. Basically, these participants will be either high school drop-outs or young people who will hope to profit by such activity in the form of goods and merchandise obtained from looting.

Subject both concurred and participated in the conversation held with his wife, MARION MILLER, and the writer, and added that he believed the Rochester Police have been trained to a high degree in handling riots, looting, etc., and that most police officers are dreading another outbreak of violence in the inner city. From what he observed from previous incidents, however, he also feels that there are some police officers who would relish the chance to come into the Negro area and "beat heads."

Again, concurring with his wife, MILLER believes that a single incident of a Negro being arrested in the Negro neighborhood and force of any king being used to subdue him could bring up a violent reaction.

Subject, a white male, operating a gas station and auto mechanic and body repair shop in the center of an all Negro neighborhood, advised he has talked with both his own Negro employees and with a great number of his steady customers, and to date, has heard nothing regarding any concerted or organized effort to create violence in the city. He went on to state that by and large, the people he is in contact with are gainfully employed, drive decent automobiles, keep them in fair to good condition, and would suffer greatly should any destructive action take place. He feels that there are some "young and surly bucks" in the neighborhood who would enjoy starting something should they have a cause and that once a riot would get started and the looting would begin, many more would join in to just "get what they could" in the way of looting before others would get there first.

Since being contacted by the writer, the subject stated he has taken an interest in the local newspapers and radio news broadcasts pertaining to the efforts of the Urban League and the FIGHT organization. Most Negroes he has come in contact with are not aware of what these and other agencies are doing, only that something is not being done immediately and for them.

Pertaining to housing in his neighborhood, the subject related that he believes, as do most Negroes in the area, that those who complain about poor housing have never done anything on their own to improve the homes and places in which they live, but instead, sit back and complain that they do not get anything better for free. He has seen what he believes to be city officials or possibly social workers, in and out of the Negro area and feels that the conditions must be being brought to the attention of "city hall" concerning some of the delapadated houses

in the area.

As far as Negro objectives; SALERNO believes the Negro community wants to be treated on an equal basis with the white people, although there are some Negroes who feel that "equal" actually means much more latitude as far as with the police. It would be difficult at this point, for any policeman to arrest a beligerant Negro and not create a disturbance of some degree.

On the morning of 4/25/68, the writer interviewed Mrs. MARTHA FREDERICK, RN, Staff Nurse, Chemung Co. Health Dept., residing at 1803 Turner Road, Elmira (RE 4-0130) and Mrs. KATHLEEN MANNIX, RN, parttime Staff Nurse, Chemung Co. Health Dept., residing 1305 West Church St., Elmira (RE 2-4305), at the Elmira PD. The writer was referred to the above by Capt. J. EDWARD HORIGAN (NA), Elmira PD when it was determined that these women had come to the Elmira PD to report information concerning captioned matter.

FREDERICK and MANNIX advised that in the period 4/17-21/68, they had each made routine visits to the residence of a woman at first giving her name as BARBARA SPIKE, and later as Mrs. JOHN VELIA, Apt. #3, 361 W. Gray St., Elmira, in connection with her having given birth on 3/27/668, in Elmira to a premature infant.

Each of the above nurses had seen and spoken to a man at this residence identified as JOHN VELIA, DOB 3/28/30, and had independently reached the conclusion that he closely resgembled the published newspaper photographs of the subject. They furnished general physical descriptions, and Mrs. MANNIX advised VELIA had his right thumb bandaged and stated he was being treated by Dr. JOHN BURKE.

The writer formerly had BARBARA SPIKE as a UFAC subject, and it was certain from description and background furnished by FREDERICK and MANNIX that the woman they referred to was identical with this former Bureau subject. The writer also recalled that SPIKE was known to have absconded from parole at Elmira with one JOHN VELIA, also a former NYS parolee.

FREDERICK and MANNIX advised that the VELIA's advised them that they had come to Elmira by bus shortly before the baby's birth on 3/27/68, from Akron, N.Y. JOHN VELIA advised he is now employed as a truck driver for the Elmira trucking firm of Dimon & Bacorn.

On 4/25/68, GEORGE C. GOULD, JR., Area Supervisor, NYS Division of Parole, advised that neither BARBARA SPIKE nor JOHN JOSEPH VELIA are presently on parole, but he knows them both and recalls that they have been living together, last known to have been residing in a trailer in Akron, N.Y. GOULD furnished an October, 1965 photo of VELIA, and it was determined that he does bear a resemblance to subject's published photographs. JOHN JOSEPH VELIA was born 3/28/30.

On 4/25/68, available photograph of JOHN JOSEPH VELIA was exhibited independently to FREDERICK and MANNIX and each positively identified him as being the individual they saw at SPIKE's residence and believed to resemble the subject.

On 4/25/60, GRACE PARLO, office of Dr. JOHN H. BURKE, JR., 507 West Water St., Elmira, advised her records reflect that JOHN VELIA, 361 W. Gray St., Elmira, a white male born 3/28/30, is being freated by Dr. BURKE for a fractured right thumb. PARLO stated that her records further reflect that JOHN VELIA has an old deformaty of the right index finger.

Inasmuch as investigation has determined that the suspicious individual reported by FREDERICK and MANNIX is in fact JOHN JOSEPH VELIA, no further investigation being conducted.
