





INVESTIGATION AT BIRMINGHAM MUNICIPAL AIRPORT

The following investigation was conducted by SA CHARLES DONALD BYRON on 4/6/68:

Mr. J. H. KRUEGER, Reservations Clerk, Delta Airlines, observed an FBI sketch of the unknown subject in this case, and stated that the sketch is not at all familiar to him. He stated, however, that the name W. J. LEHMEYER did sound familiar and he believed that he sold this individual a ticket to Minneapolis via Memphis, Flight 595, on approximately 3/27/68; however, he could not be certain unless a check with the Delta office in Atlanta showed that his initials were on the ticket that was issued. He stated that he checks the baggage over the counter and did not remember handling a long, narrow, cardboard box such as could hold a rifle.

Mr. MAX RATLIFF, Ramp Service Agent, Delta Airlines, advised that he loaded the baggage onto Delta Flight 595, on 3/27/68, but he did not remember handling any long, narrow, cardboard box which could possibly contain a rifle. Mr. RATLIFF observed an FBI sketch of Unsub in this case, and stated that he was not familiar to him.

Mr. JERRY STEWART, Ticket Representative, Delta Airlines, observed the FBI sketch of the unknown subject in this case, and stated that he did not look familiar. Mr. STEWART stated that the only flights from Birmingham to Memphis in the afternoon or early evening are: Southern Flight 286, which leaves Birmingham at 5:11 P.M., and arrives at Memphis at 6:40 P.M.; Delta Flight 595, which leaves Birmingham at 6:23 P.M.; and Delta Flight 55 which leaves Birmingham at 11:56 P.M. He stated it was also possible to go to Memphis via Atlanta, but that this is seldom done.

Mr. GAYLE stated that he does not remember anyone purchasing a ticket within the last week who was carrying a long, narrow, cardboard box which could contain a rifle.

On 4/6/68, in the afternoon, Mr. J. T. JOHNSON, Malibu Apartments, Huntsville, Alabama, telephonically advised the Huntsville RA that he had some information concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Mr. JOHNSON advised he would come by the Huntsville RA later in the week and would furnish some names that he thought would be of assistance to the FBI.


On 4/9/68, Mr. J. T. JOHNSON, B-6, Malibu Apartments, telephone 883-1829, an employee of the Boeing Corporation, Huntsville, Alabama, appeared at the Huntsville RA and advised his father died and was buried in Nashville, Tennessee, on 1/4/68, at the Cosmopolitan Funeral Home, Nashville, Tennessee. JOHNSON advised he attended the funeral and at the funeral he met two individuals whom he felt could very possibly have been responsible for the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He named the individuals as follows:

- (a) E. W. McKNIGHT, about 40 years old, resides at 3013 Vanderbilt Place, Nashville, Tennessee, employed at the Ford Motor Glass Plant in Nashville.
- (b) A. V. OAKLEY, about 35, resides at 3503 West End Avenue, a very short distance from Vanderbilt University Campus.

JOHNSON said he based his belief that these two men may have been responsible for the assassination of KING. At his father's funeral he talked to these two men and they immediately began to talk to him about joining the Ku Klux Klan. JOHNSON advised that they got further into the racial situation and these two individuals advised the only way to stop the Negroes from hurting the white people in this country was to

take care of them with a well-placed shot from a high-powered rifle. JOHNSON advised both these men said they could do it and they would not hesitate to do it to RAP BROWN, STOKELY CARMICHAEL or MARTIN LUTHER KING. JOHNSON had no further evidence or information which would indicate that these two men were involved in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. During the course of the interview JOHNSON indicated that he based his belief primarily on the fact that he saw the artist's conception which appeared in the Huntsville paper on Saturday and felt that OAKELY looked similar to the man described in the Huntsville paper. The artist's conception as referred to in a memorandum to all Resident Agents was discreetly displayed to JOHNSON to determine if subject's may have looked similar to the person depicted in the artist's conception of the FBI.

He was advised of no information but just asked if he looked similar to the person in the FBI's artist's conception, and JOHNSON advised that neither of the men looked like this man due to the fact that both men had receding hair lines and longer faces.

The above information is being furnished to Birmingham for whatever action is deemed necessary in this matter.

In connection with investigation in instant matter. it was ascertained from file reviews that MANTIN LUTHER KING. JR. appeared at Wausau, Wis. on 5/12/67 in connection with a speech in that area. Subsequent to his talk, he held a press conference that same date. Investigation in Waysan developed that on the occasion of KING's appearance in that city, an anonymous chil was received by Wausau PD from a male caller who said he would "put a bullet through KING's head," The Wausau police at the time suspected that the caller may have been THEODORE J. MONIK, described by the FD as a possible mental case who equid have capabilities of committing violence.

The father of THEODORR is named HARVEY. The father at one time was employed as chef at the Lonar Supper Club, 3701 N. 6th, Wausau. THEODORE ADANK has in the past been employed as a chef at Ponderosa Restaurant in Wausau. It was ascertained on 4/8/58 that THEODORE ADANK left his employment and his whereabouts were marrows.

Investigation also developed in Instant matter that THEODORE has a brother named ALLAN PAUL DANK whose current whereabouts are also unknown. He was also described by the PD as being an individual capable of committing violence and also believed to be mentally incompetent.

At the news conference held by KING on 5/13/67 the aren was scaled off by police to insure that only newsmen were admitted. THEODORE ADMIK showed up on that occasion posing as a newsman, but was evicted by local police.

Above facts were telephoned to Bureau on 4/8/68 with the recommendation that fingerprints in the file on THEODORE and ALLAN ADARS be checked against latents found on the marder weapon in instant matter. Roply was subsequently received from Bureau on 4/8/68 that check of ADARS brothers prints against those taken from the marder weapon negative.

Investigation conducted at Vausau, Wis. by SAs GERARD J. KENNA and JOSEPH S. WALTER on 4/8/68 developed that THRODOGE ADAME has been unemployed and in Vausau area during past pertinent 2-week period. It was developed that he has a girl friend maned MARILER LAVORTE, 703; Jackson, Nausau. She nëvised upon interview that she has seen or been in contact with THEODOGE ADAME regularly, mentioning that she has had dinner with him each Friday evening during past several weeks. It is noted this would include 3/28/65. She mentioned that on 3/31/65 she also had dinner with ADAME at Stevens Point, Wis., as well as on 4/8 and 5/62, in Wausau.

JOB DREEZINSKI, who was interviewed at Little Jee's Tavern, lat St., Bausau, advised 4/8/68 that he was is company of THEODORE ADARK on two eccasions the weekend of 3/29-31/68. He could furnish no exact specifies as to where he may have been in THEODORE ADARK's company.

THEODORE ADAME was interviewed by SAS KENNA and WALERS on 4/8/68 and impressed interviewing agents as being semewhat of a mustal case. ADAME adviced he has been in Wansau during the entire recent 2-week period except for one occasion when he traveled to Milwaukee. Wis. for treatment at Wood, Wis. VA Center in connection with his medical disability pension. His only income appears to be the pension he receives from the Government. He said he returned from Milwaukee that same day, which was 3/25/68. He furnished the identities of another acquaintance and bartender in Wausau who could account for his presence in Wausau on 4/4/68. These individuals will be interviewed on 4/9/68 to further cooperate the opinion that THEODORE ADAME was apparently in Wausau during pertinent periods concerned in instant matter.

Investigation concerning ALLAN ADABE developed he has been absent from Vausau for the past 4 or 5 weeks. His whereabouts are unknown, although THEODERE advised his brother may be working for some construction firm in Chicago. He said

neither he or other members of his family have been in touch with ALLAN ADAME since he left wayons some rocks ago.

Enclosed for Birmingham and Memphis Offices are I photograph each of THEODORN and ALLAH ABANK as made available by the Vausac PD on 4/8/66. These photographs should be viewed by pertinent vitnesses at Birmingham and Memphis. In the event of any recognition, Milwankee should be notified immediately for further intensive investigation in this matter.

On 4/5/68, he called a girl friend at a Rochester, New York banking institution from Memphis, Tennessee, at which time he said he was going to Atlanta, Georgia, where he would stay at a Holiday Inn. At Atlanta, he said he planned to confer with some of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's successors.

Former SA WILSON had verified Dr. FRENCH's presence in Atlanta on 4/8/68, at which time Dr. FRENCH indicated he planned to stay in Atlanta until 4/10/68.

Buffalo does not know whether any handwriting of unsub in captioned case available. If available, it should be compared with Dr. FRENCH's handwriting.


