

During the course of this investigation Mr. JOE SELLIGMAN of Liberty Loan and Sporting Goods. 2112 Second Ave. North, related that the artist's conception is similar to an individual who, approximately two weeks ago, came into his business establishment and wanted to pawn a 30.06 Winchester. Model 70. rifle. Mr. SELLIGMAN related that this rifle had a scope, was in excellent condition and the individual paid \$250 for it. He described this individual as over 6' tall, 180 to 200 lbs., reddish-blonde hair, neat in appearance and no distinguishable accent. To the best of his estimation, this individual was about 40 years old. Mr. SELLIGMAN related that the individual wanted \$100 for the rifle and it was not accepted by his establishment. He related that he directed this individual across the street to the Peoples Loan Company, 2107 Second Ave. North, to BEN COOLEY.

Records of this pawn shop reveal that on 4/1/68, under pawn ticket 59688, Mr. MOODY HOPKINS of 1948-B Shades Crest Terrace, pawned a Model 70 Winchester, 30.06, with scope. He was described as a white male, 42 years of age, 6'3" tall, 200 lbs., blonde hair and blue eyes. He also pawned a set of golf clubs.

The Credit Bureau was checked by IC WILLIAM H. CUSHEN and it was determined that MOODY HOPKINS resides at his wife's former address, 1948-B Shades Cliff Terrace. Since the physical description does not match the UNSUB in the artist's conception, and HOPKINS' residence address verified, no further investigation was conducted in regard to HOPKINS.

MC CAY, when contacted, described Unsub as 5'6", very thin, blond hair, about 25 years of age, and after viewing most recent artist conception photograph, advised Unsub definitely not identical with individual she had referred to.

Look-alike LONNIE GREEN, formerly employed Pure Oil Station in English Village, was determined to be a young boy about 20 years of age, 5'11", 170 lbs:, true name DENNIS GREEN.

J. H. SCOTT, employee who is personally acquainted with GREEN, after viewing artist conception photograph (the most recent one), stated GREEN is definitely not identical with Unsub photograph.

The following barge companies, Birmingport and Cordova, were checked on 4/10/68, for the name ERIC S. GALT, as a former or present employee, and results set forth as follows:

Mr. ROBERT SMITH, Terminal employee, Triangle Refinery, advised his company employed no barge employees that facility; however, employment was obtained through Crochetts Barge Company, New Orleans, Louisiana.

At the Warrior and Gulf Refining Company, the following individuals viewed the artist conception photograph with negative results:

J. B. HOVEN F. C. WOODMAN RICHARD JETT

HOVEN advised that company employed no barge employees in this area.

BILL HOLMES, Gulf Fueling Station, and C. W. YARBROUGH, advised they see most barge employees during refueling process, and after viewing artist conception photograph, stated Unsub not known to them.

DOUGLAS ESTLE, Captain, Big Bear Barge, who was in dock, advised Unsub not known after viewing artist conception photograph, and advised all employees of his company are known by him.

ELBERT NE SMITH, Triangle Refineries, Cordova, Alabama, was contacted with negative results regarding identity of Unsub and artist conception photograph.

Mrs. GLORIA RIGSBY, Secretary, Vulcan Asphalt and Refining Company, advised on 4/10/68, that all employees working on barges that company are hired by Captain E. D. PARRA, Route 2, Box 295, Galliano, Louisiana, Telephone 504-632-7575.

A teletype was sent 4/10/68, to check employees with Captain PARRA.

On 4/10/68, newspaper morgues, "Birmingham News and Post Herald," were checked for 2/15/68, date on which MARTIN LUTHER KING made a speech in Birmingham, in an effort to locate photographs which might be productive with regard to identity of Unsub, with negative results. There were no photographs in either of the papers for that date.




Mr. COX advised that FARR indicated that he had been employed by JIM SKINNER Ford, Acipco, Ambulance Service, all of Birmigham, and had only recently returned from Vietnam. The mane listed his date of birth as Height 6'12", Weight 200 pounds. Mr. COX stated that FARR was well dressed; however, he diddnot observe what kind of car FARR was traveling in if any. He does recall that FARR indicated that he had four children and was separated from his wife, HELEN.

Mr. COX advised that they made an inquiry concerning FARR and found that he was not completely reliable and had been arrested by the Birmingham Police Department on a drugk charge.

It was noted that the description furnished does not correspond with that of suspect. This memo is being submitted for any action deemed advisable.





On 4/11/68, RICHARD MITCHELL, 2124 - 22nd Avenue, North, Birmingham, furnished the following information:

MITCHELL, a Negro male, age 57, formerly employed by Armour & Company, Birmingham, Alabama, advised he suffers from a lung ailment, which has caused part of the skin across his face to peel. MITCHELL resides in a six-room modern brick home at the above address.

MITCHELL advised that on Saturday, 4/6/68, he talked with and observed an individual in North Birmingham whom he believes to be identical to the person who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. MITCHELL advised that after he talked to and observed this man on either 4/6/68 or 4/7/68, he observed an artist's conception of the person who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING on television. At the time he observed this artist's conception, he immediately believed this person to be identical to the man he observed on 4/6/68 in North Birmingham.

MITCHELL stated he had told no one of his meeting this man or of his belief that he is identical with the killer of KING. He stated he did not want any harm to come to himself and he wished this matter to be kept confidential as he feared for his life. He stated he is a religious man, although he is not a preacher. He reads the Bible and he does not want any harm to come to the man he had observed and whom he believes is the killer.

MITCHELL stated he has confidence in the FBI and that is the reason he had contacted the FBI Office, as he believed the FBI would locate and apprehend this person without harming him or killing him on apprehension. He again stated that he had told no one of this, including his wife.

He advised that on 4/6/68, shortly after noon, he went to Loveless Furniture Store located between 29th and 30th Avenues on the west side of 27th Street North, Birmingham, Alabama, where he went to pay a gas bill. He stated when he walked out of Loveless Furniture Store a white man stopped him and asked where he could use the bathroom. He said he walked with the man to 30th Avenue North and pointed out Chandler's Barber Shop, 2626 - 30th Avenue North, where he could use a men's room. He stated the man left him and started walking in the direction of Chandler's Barber Shop.

MITCHELL advised that he then went to McEACHERN FURNITURE COMPANY, located on 27th Street North, on the west side between 31st and 32nd Avenues, North, to pay a light bill. He said after he paid his light bill he was walking south on North 27th Street between 30th and 31st Avenues, North, when he met this same individual he had previously talked to. He stated the man asked him, "Where can you get some beer around here?" He told the man to go two blocks south on 27th Street and on the left side there was a beer joint by the name of PEARL and PAT's near the L & N Railroad Station. He said he and the man walked together for approximately 1/2 block, where he stopped at York's Drug Store on the corner of 30th Avenue and 27th Street North. He stated he bought a bottle of Anacin at York's Drug Store and was in the store only two or three minutes when he came out and walked to Birmingham Trust National Bank, North Birmingham Branch, where he had parked his car, which is located on 30th Avenue and 26th Street North.

He stated he then drove his 1961 Valiant car from the Birmingham Trust parking lot onto 30th Avenue and 27th Street, where he turned south. He stated he observed the same man with whom he had talked previously standing on the east side of 27th Street near 30th Avenue.

He stated that in view of the short period of time, this man did not have time to walk to Pearl & Pat's, drink a bottle of beer, and return to 30th Avenue and 27th Street.

He described this individual as follows:

Race: White Sex: Male 5'8" Height: Weight: 150.1bs. Age: 35 Build: Slender

Light brown; then; came straight Hair: across forehead and stood up

approximately 3/4 inch.

Face: Thin

General Appearance: Neat; gave impression of being

a weak rather than a strong person physically and did not

appear to be healthy.

Peculiarities: Extremely nervous, as he recalls

they met a lady walking up the street and the man stepped aside, sideways, to let her by but still almost bumped

into the lady.

He stated the man did not appear to be drinking. The man was dressed in white shirt, which appeared to be slightly soiled although not dirty; dress pants of good quality; color of pants not recalled.

Artist's conception prepared in Birmingham Office was exhibited to MITCHELL, who advised that this appeared more like the man he had observed than the Artist's Conception he had observed on TV. Several photographs were exhibited to MITCHELL and although he made no positive identification of any photograph, he picked several which do resemble artist's conception of Unsub. He stated when he saw the artist's conception on television, he thought, "The man came to me. God bless him. Don't let anything happen to him or me."

The following investigation was conducted to resolve information furnished by MITCHELL:

Business section, North Birmingham, observed and 1966 Mustang bearing Alabama license 1A88354 was not observed.

D. W. MASSEY, Route 7, Box 759, Birmingham, barber, Chandler's Barber Shop, 2626 - 30th Avenue North, advised on 4/11/68 that he did not recall any individual coming to Chandler's Barber Shop on afternoon of 4/6/68 of similar description to Unsub. The artist's conception of Unsub was exhibited to MITCHELL and he said he did not recall observing any such individual. He advised there is an individual known to him by the name of "RENO" who does bear some resemblance to the artist's conception, who was in Chandler's Barber Shop on 4/6/68. He stated RENO is a white male, 5:11", age 45, 150 lbs., black hair. He said it is possible he was at lunch at the time the unknown individual came to the barber shop.

M. H. CHANDEER, 2321 - 33rd Avenue North, Birmingham, advised on 4/11/68 that he is the owner of Chandler's Barber Shop. He stated he is acquainted with MARVIN RENO and recalls him being in his barber shop on 4/6/68 and that RENO does resemble the artist's conception of Unsub in this matter.

He stated he recalled that RENO came to the barber shop to borrow money. He advised that shortly thereafter, exact time not recalled by him, on 4/6/68, he does recall a white male coming to his barber shop and asking him if he had a bathroom, and the man went to the bathroom. CHANDLER stated he had never seen this individual before and that people using the restroom in his barber shop do not come in and ask about using the bathroom; they go through the barber shop without making any statement regarding the bathroom. CHANDLER stated the man's statement in the presence of a lady, who was waiting on her son to get a haircut, made him mad at the time, which is the reason he recalls this incident. He stated he only glanced

at the man as he was busy working. He said he could not furnish a detailed description of this person, but he believed he was about 30 years of age, 5'8" to 5'9" tall, 145 lbs., nice looking, but looked physically weak. He stated he recalled the man was wearing a white shirt, slightly soiled, and he gained the impression the man was a "Wino" or a heavy beer drinker. After observing artist's conception of Unsub, Mr. CHANDLER stated he could not state positively that this man resembled the artist's conception but he was of the same general appearance from what he could recall. He stated that if this man should appear again in his barber shop, he would engage him in conversation and try to ascertain his identity; also, determine whether he was in an automobile and obtain the license number of the car and would contact SA J. T. ARNETT.

TONY GARNER, owner, Pearl & Pat's Cafe and Beer Parlor, 2813 - 27th Street North, Birmingham, furnished the following information on 4/11/68:

He stated he did not recall any customer in Pearl and Pat's who was a stranger to him on 4/6/68 except one man who was dressed in green work clothes and was a short heavyset man. The artist's conception of Unsub was exhibited to GARNER and he stated he did not recall ever seeing this person in Pearl and Pat's or any person whom he thought to be identical with the person in the artist's conception. He stated that LOLA MASTERS, waitress at Pearl and Pat's, was on duty 4/6/68 but she had moved within the past few days and her current address is unknown to him, but he believes she is residing in the Gardendale area and her husband's name is EDWARD MASTERS.

Efforts to contact LOLA MASTERS by telephone through information operator negative. Contacts with Sears-Roebuck Stores, where EDWARD MASTERS believed to be employed, negative. Sears stores contacted in downtown Birmingham, East Lake, Vestavia, Ensley and main warehouse. Information furnished that EDWARD MASTERS is not employed at these Sears-Roebuck Stores.

BERNICE WILLIAMSON, 2961 - 47th Avenue North, Birmingham, employed as a waitress at Pearl and Pat's Cafe and Beer Parlor, furnished the following information on 4/11/68:

She advised she was not on duty 4/6/68. After viewing artist's conception of Unsub, she stated she could not recall ever seeing an individual in Pearl and Pat's similar to artist's conception.

She stated that on 4/6/68 she and her small child were crossing the four-lane highway near Peoples Service Station, near the Blue and Gray Motel on Highway 31 North, when a white car passed her, at which time there was an explosion near her and her child. She said she thought a gun had been fired at her, but she now realizes that the explosion occurred near her feet and she believes a firecracker was thrown from the car. She pointed out that she is a colored person and the man driving the car was a white man. She stated he appeared to be in his early twenties, medium-small size, and his hair was of similar shape as that of the artist's conception, but she could not state whether the man actually resembled the artist's conception because she was not able to observe him very closely. She said the car he was driving was not a small sports car or exceptionally large, but was medium size, white in color, dirty, exact make and model unknown to her.



CLARKE contacted the following schools and individuals requesting a search of the school records regarding any instruction that may have been afforded to any student using the name ERIC STARVO GALT, HARVEY LOWMEYER and JOHN WILLARD, or similar variations thereof, during the period 1967 to date. In addition, the names of all students who fit the description of the subject were obtained.

Mrs. JESSIE ERWIN, Manager, Drivers Training School, Alabama Motorists Association, 2305 5th Avenue, North, advised that a review of Drivers Training School records regarding any of the names provided or similar variations thereof was negative. In addition, she stated that she personally observed every student of the school and no one fit the description provided.

J. NEWTON ATKINSON, Manager and Instructor, Atkinson Driving Instruction, 2515-B 7th Avenue, North, advised that his records failed to reflect anyone using any of the known names having ever received driving instructions by him. In addition, ATKINSON stated that no one in the past five years has received any driving instructions from him who fit the description of subject.

failed to show anyone by the name of GALT, LOWMEYER or WILLARD or any similar variations thereof having ever received driving instructions. NEWMAN stated he was not familiar with any student who fit the description of subject.

DOROTHY BENTON, Manager, Easy-Method Driving School, 8820 4th Avenue, South, advised that a search of the school records failed to develop anyone having received instructions using the names of GALT, LOWMEYER or WILLARD or similar variations. She stated that one student she had instructed approximately six months ago generally fit the description of the subject. A review of her records revealed the student's name to be JOHN HILL, 1515 10th Avenue, South, Birmingham. BENTON stated that HILL weighed approximately 200 lbs., 5'11", approximately 25 years of age, and had stated at the time of his instruction in September, 1967, that he was employed by the American Cast Iron Pipe Company of Birmingham.

BENTON viewed composite sketch of subject prepared by the FBI Laboratory and stated that it only bore a slight resemblence to HILL and pointed out that HILL's face was much fuller and at the time of instruction his hair style was different.

The following investigation was conducted by writer on this date in effort to identify the company that might have sold tires, three recaps and one Firestone tire that was found on 1966 Mustang at Atlanta, Ga. on 4/11/68:

On this date, JACK PARKER, Service Manager, LEE-RODGERS Tire Company, 311 s. 21st, Birmingham, Ala. advised as follows:

Each recapper normally identifies the tires that he recaps by either a company name, a number, or some "medallion" which would be located on the retred itself. For example, the code number is usually found on the inside of the retred and the brand medallion could be found on either side.

EACH recepper has his own tred that he uses on his tires and if he could view a photograph or cross section of the tred of the tires in question he could identify where that type of tred is used in the Birmingham area.

On this date, CARLEY HUGHES, Retail Sales, Firestone Store, 230 S. 20th Street, Birmingham, Ala. furnished the following information:

Approximately one year ago the company used what is called a DLC retred which was the regular tred which was not the wrap around type. The new model is called the DCL 100 tred which is the wrap around tire tred. Both types carry the #72 which is the code for the Birmingham stores and area and these recaps carry what is called a "medallion" with the wording "Firestone Quality Tred".

He advised should he see a photograph of the tires in question he would be able to tell where the tires were recapped if they were in fact recapped here. 44-1740 -


